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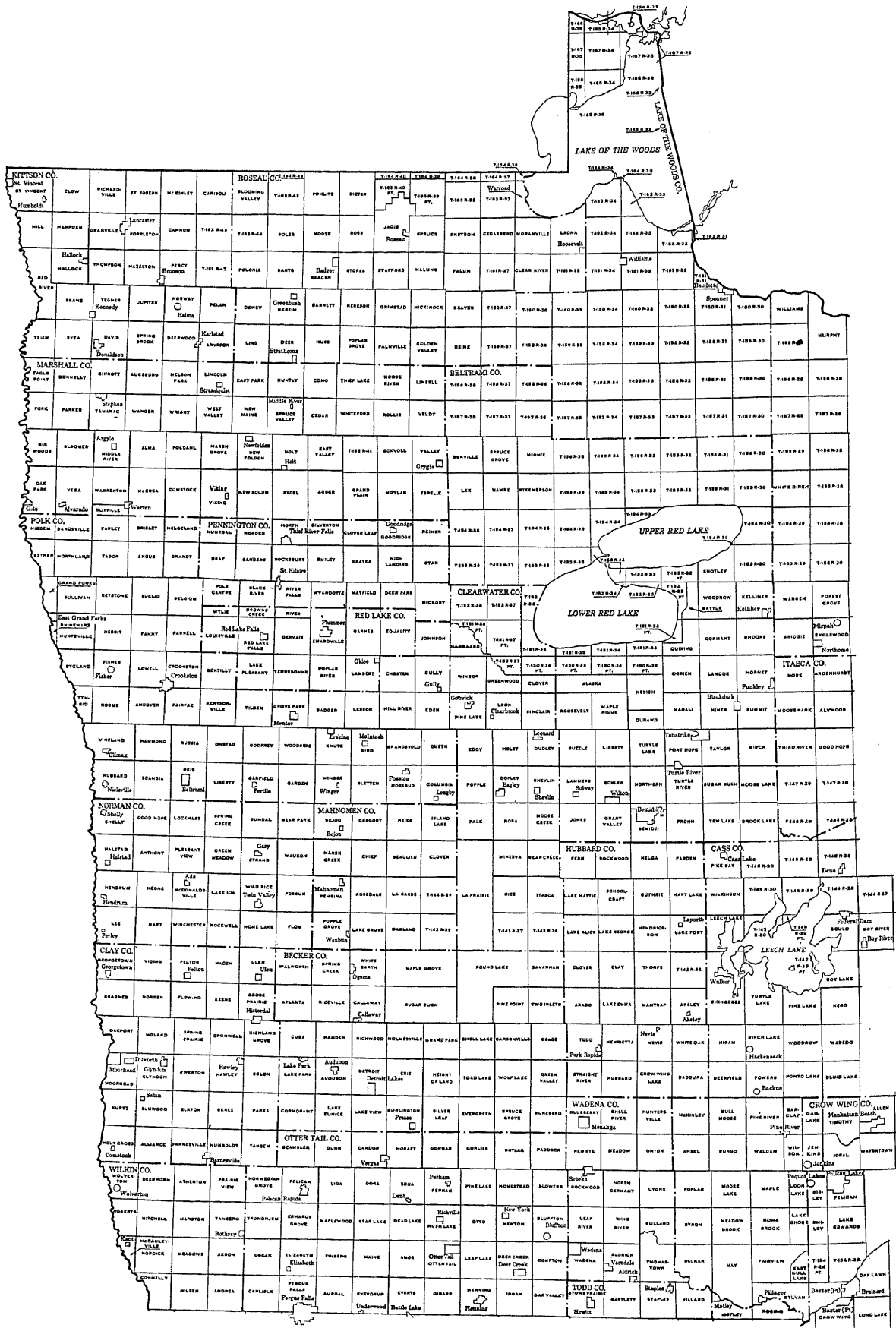

MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNSHIPS

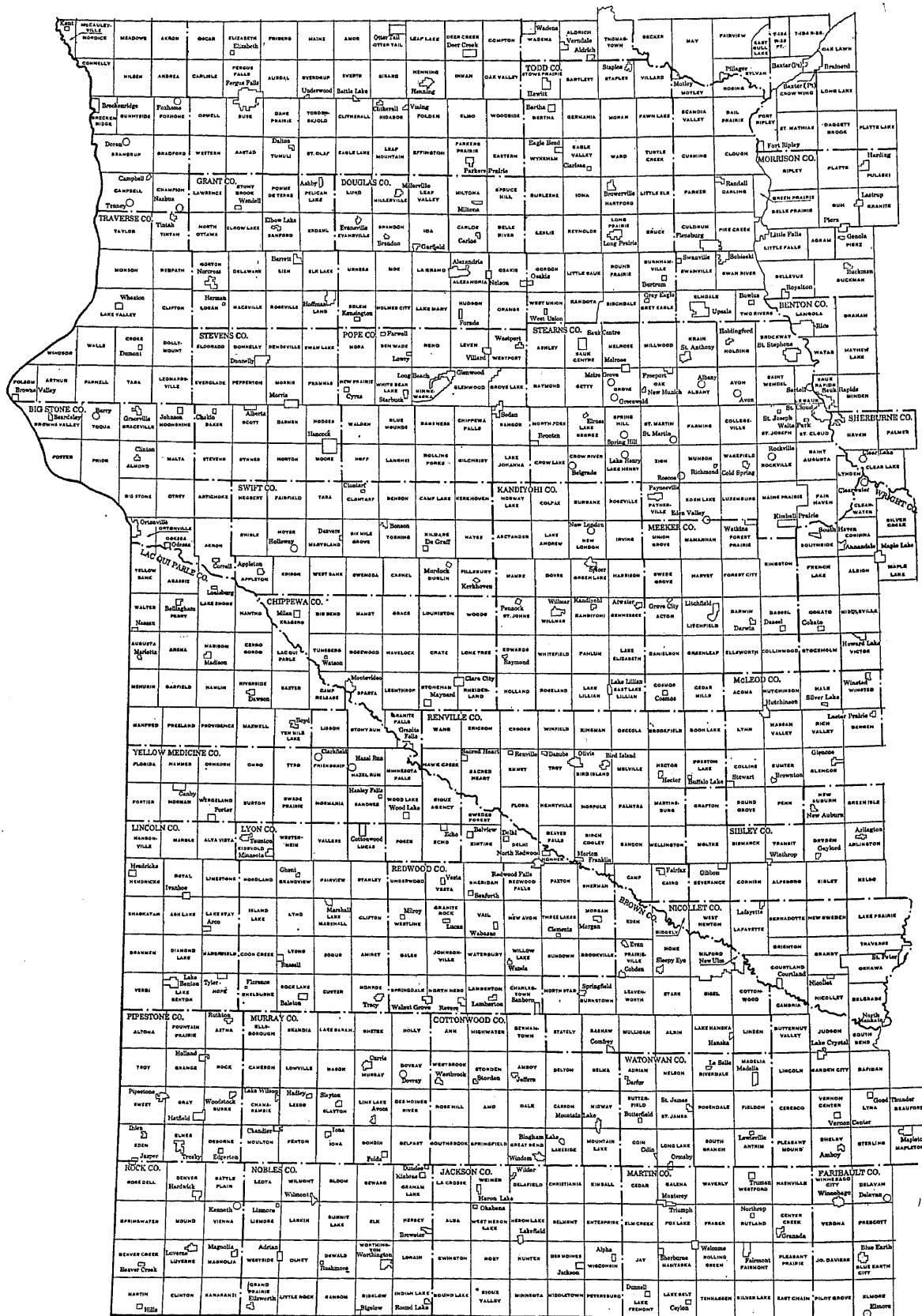


MINNESOTA—NORTHEASTERN PART

MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNSHIPS

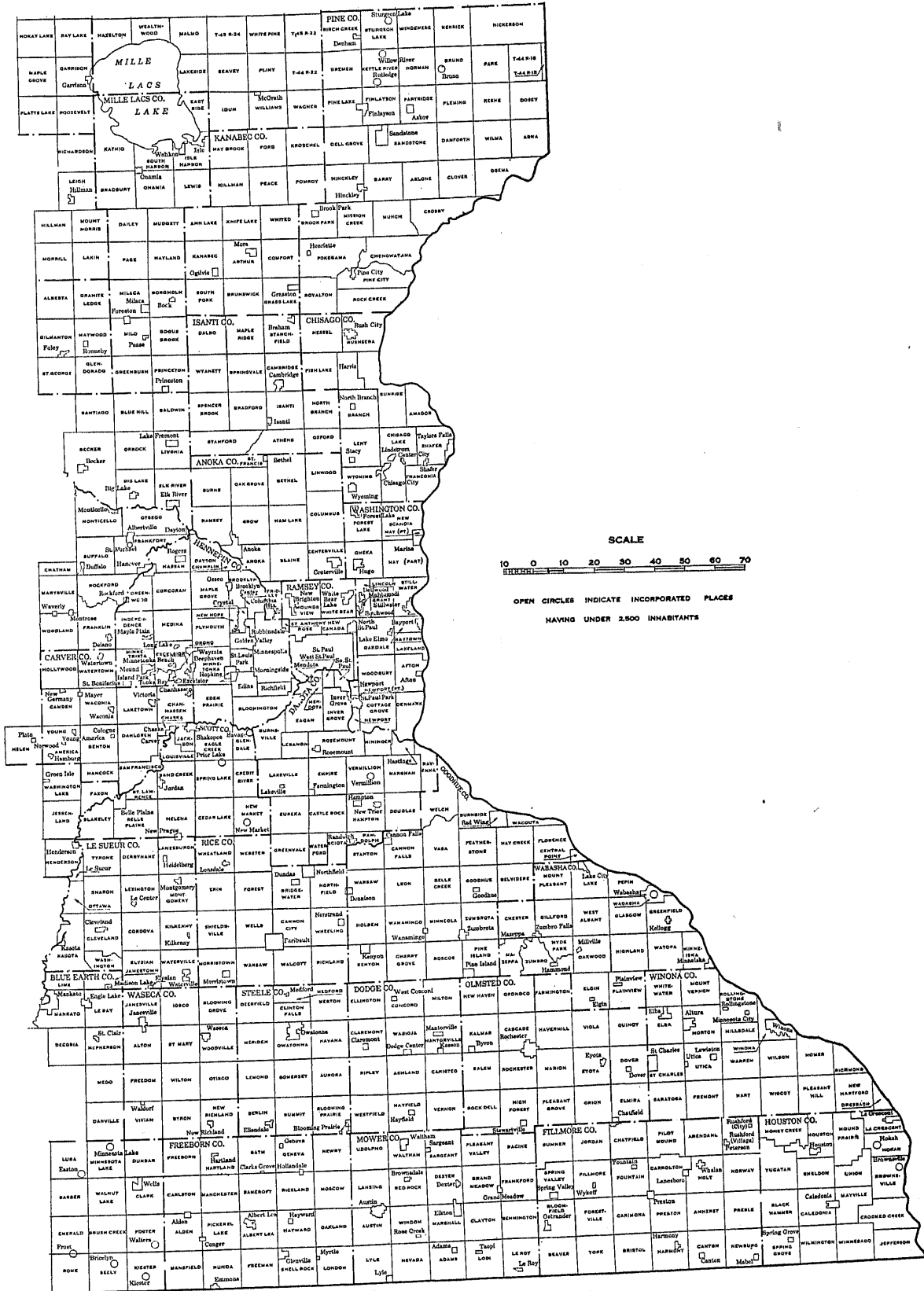

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—The Territory of Minnesota was organized in 1849 from unorganized area formerly within the Territories of Iowa and Wisconsin. It included an area now comprising the State of Minnesota and parts of North and South Dakota. In 1858 that portion of the Territory lying within the present boundaries of Minnesota was admitted to the Union as the thirty-second State. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 2,792,300, which represents an increase of 228,347, or 8.9 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 80,009 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 34.9, as compared with 32.0 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Minnesota from 1850,

the year in which the Territory of Minnesota was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Minnesota consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Nashwauk qualified as urban in 1930 but not in 1920 or 1940.

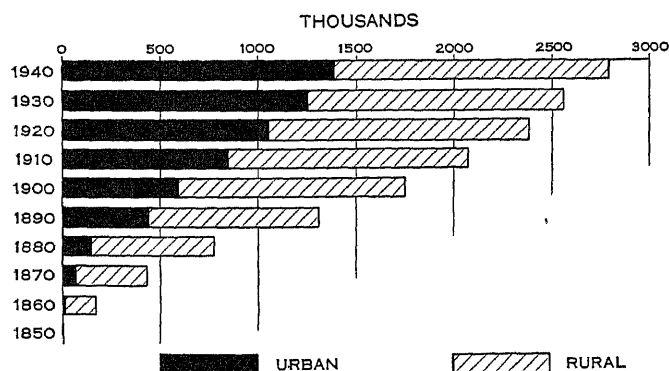

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Minnesota is shown by counties, townships,

cities, villages, and boroughs, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the Duluth-Superior and Minneapolis-St. Paul metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 and 7-A, and for the census tracts of the tracted cities and adjacent areas in tables 8, 8-A, and 8-B.

Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.—There are 15 incorporated places in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these incorporated places at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Minneapolis, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 492,370; and St. Paul, the capital of the State, had a population of 287,736.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 87 counties of Minnesota from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Of the 85 counties whose boundaries remained unchanged since 1930, 81 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 4 decreased. Part of Lac qui Parle County was annexed to Big Stone County in 1938. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Minnesota are the townships, some of the cities and villages, and 1 borough (Belle Plaine). There are 96 cities, 648 villages, and 1 borough, of which 579 villages, the 1 borough, and all but 1 of the cities (Wabasha) are independent of township organization and form primary divisions of the counties. The remaining incorporated places, each of which is a part of one or more townships, form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, cities, villages, and boroughs for the last three censuses. The population of the one city and the villages that constitute secondary divisions is shown in *italics* under the population of the townships

in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more townships in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first township. Where the place is located in townships in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

Where an independent city or village is located partly in one county and partly in another, the part in a given county is presented in the regular way as a primary division of that county, but, to make the presentation complete, the population is also shown, in *italics*, for the part outside that county and for the city or village as a whole. *Italics* are also used for the figures representing the population at censuses prior to 1940 of places that have recently been made primary divisions, to indicate that the figures, having already been counted, are not to be added in with the townships and other independent areas to make the county total.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory

in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Duluth-Superior metropolitan district (called the Duluth metropolitan district in 1930) and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Like several others, this district occupies territory in more than one State. In 1940 the Duluth-Superior metropolitan district had 157,098 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 155,390. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Table 7-A shows the population of the Minneapolis-St. Paul metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Minneapolis-St. Paul metropolitan district had 911,077 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 832,258. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities (and sometimes their adjacent areas) have been subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics.

In table 8 the 1940 population of the city of Duluth is shown by census tracts. In tables 8-A and 8-B, the 1940 population of the cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul, respectively, together with certain adjacent areas is shown by census tracts. These tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps. Since the tracts

were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses.

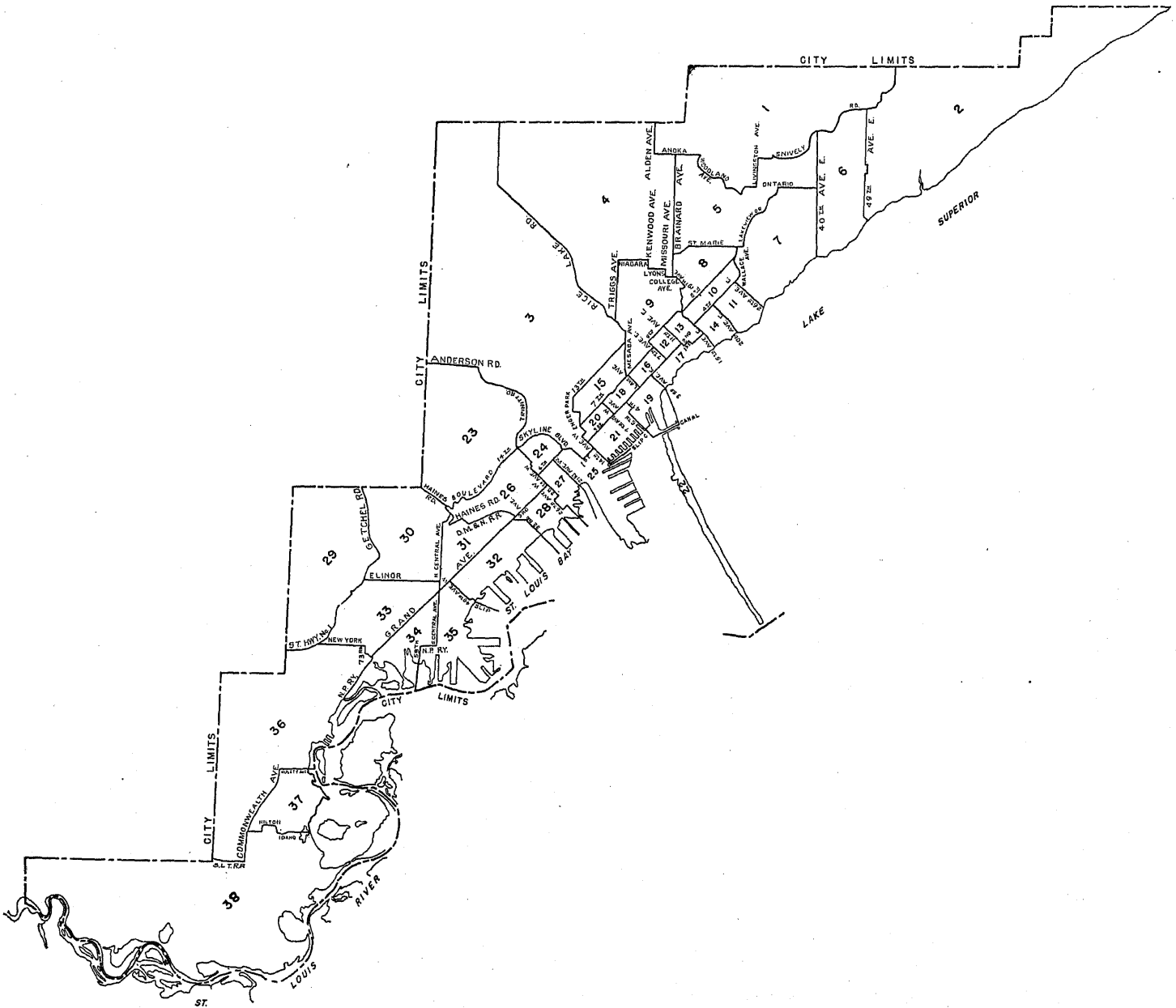

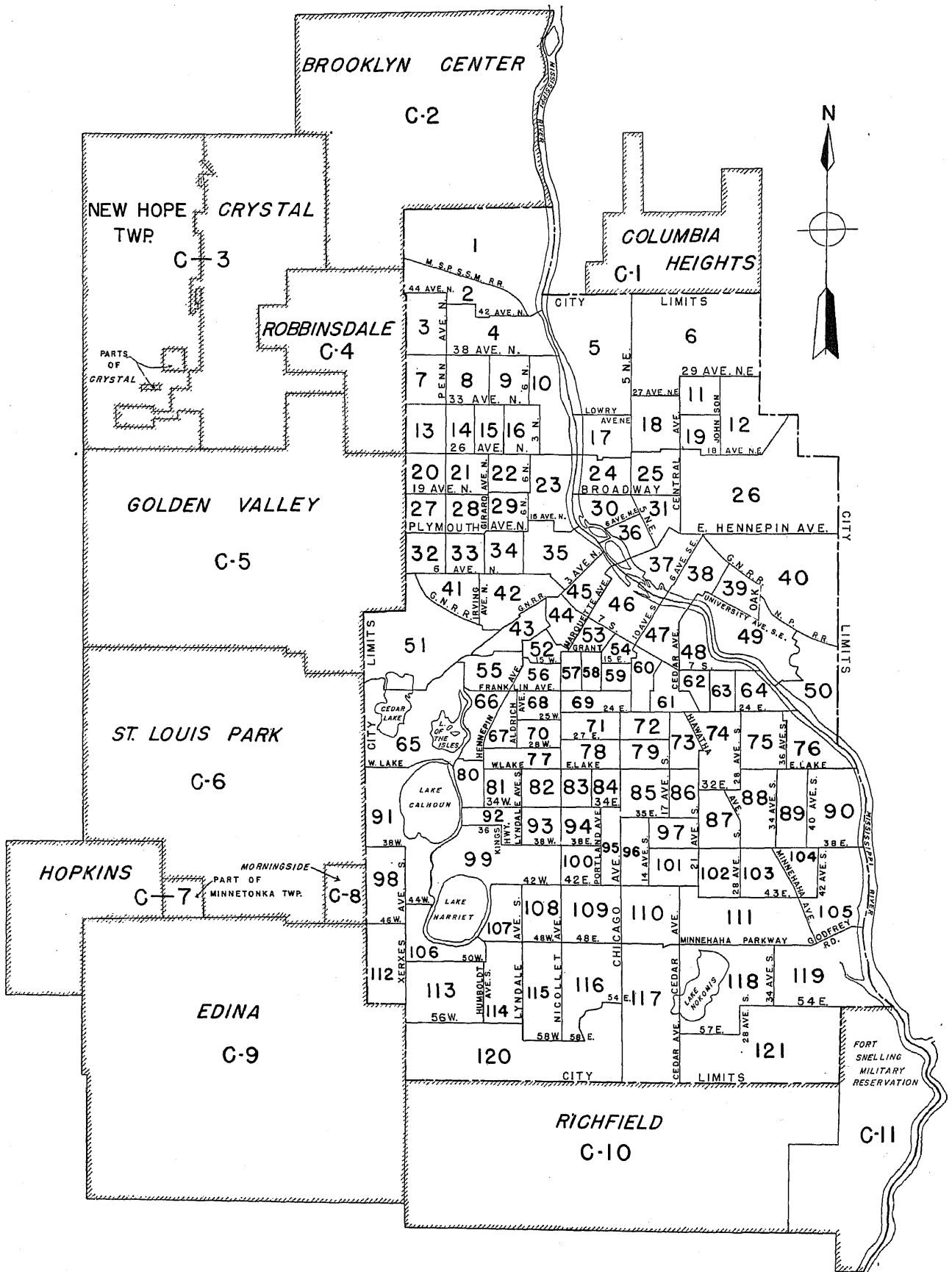

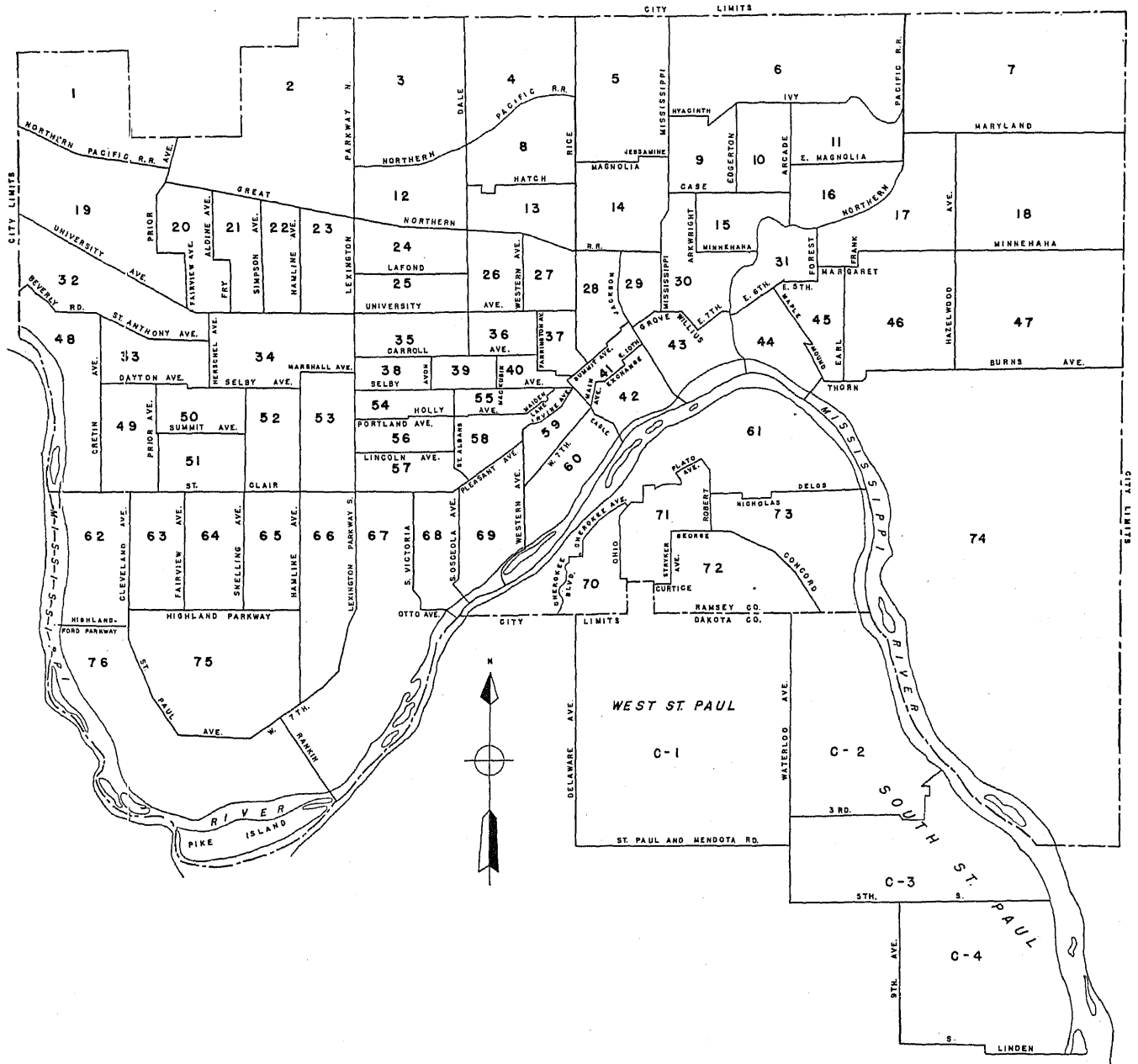
DULUTH BY CENSUS TRACTS



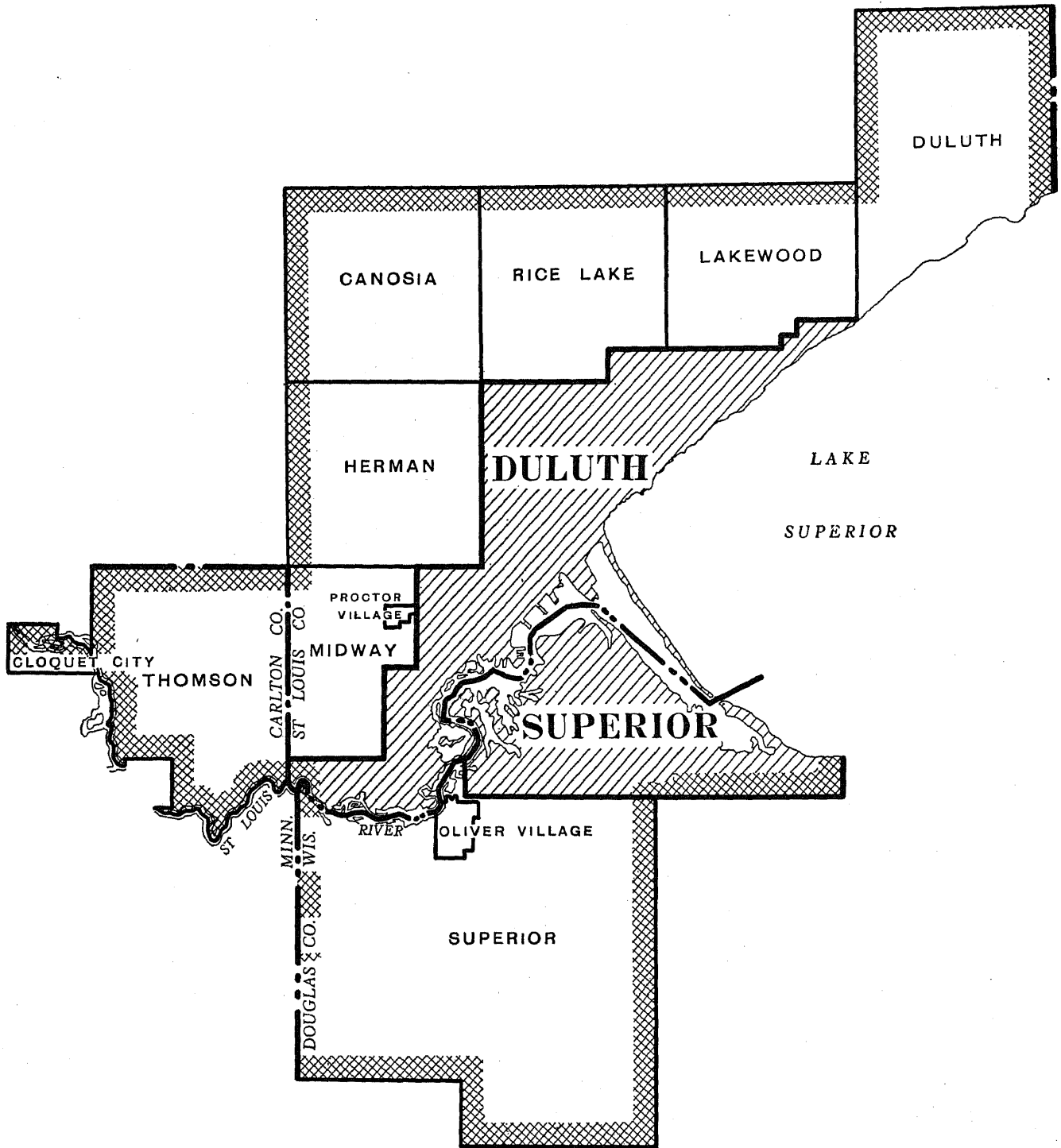
NUMBER OF INHABITANTS MINNEAPOLIS AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS



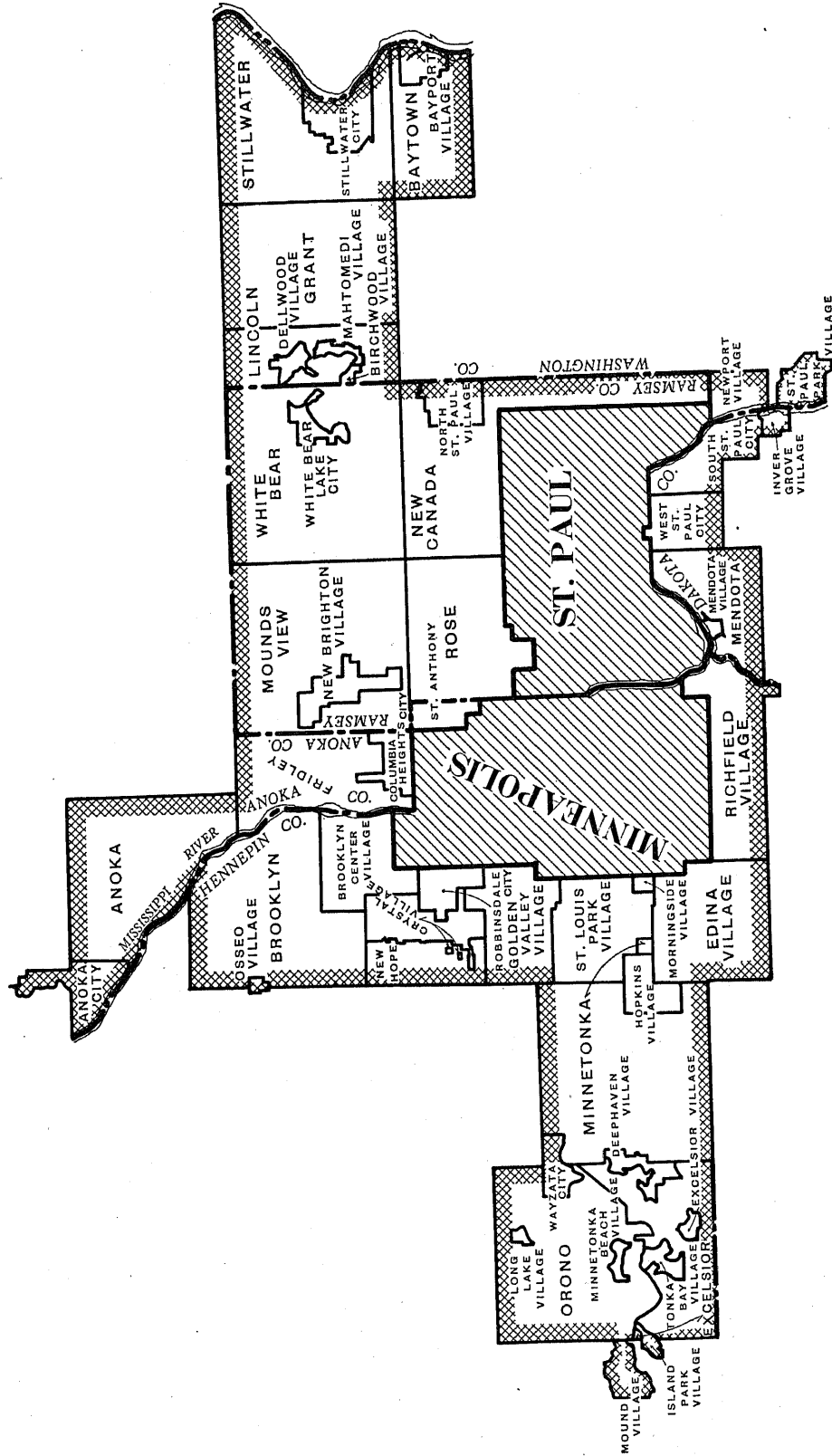
ST. PAUL AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS



DULUTH-SUPERIOR METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



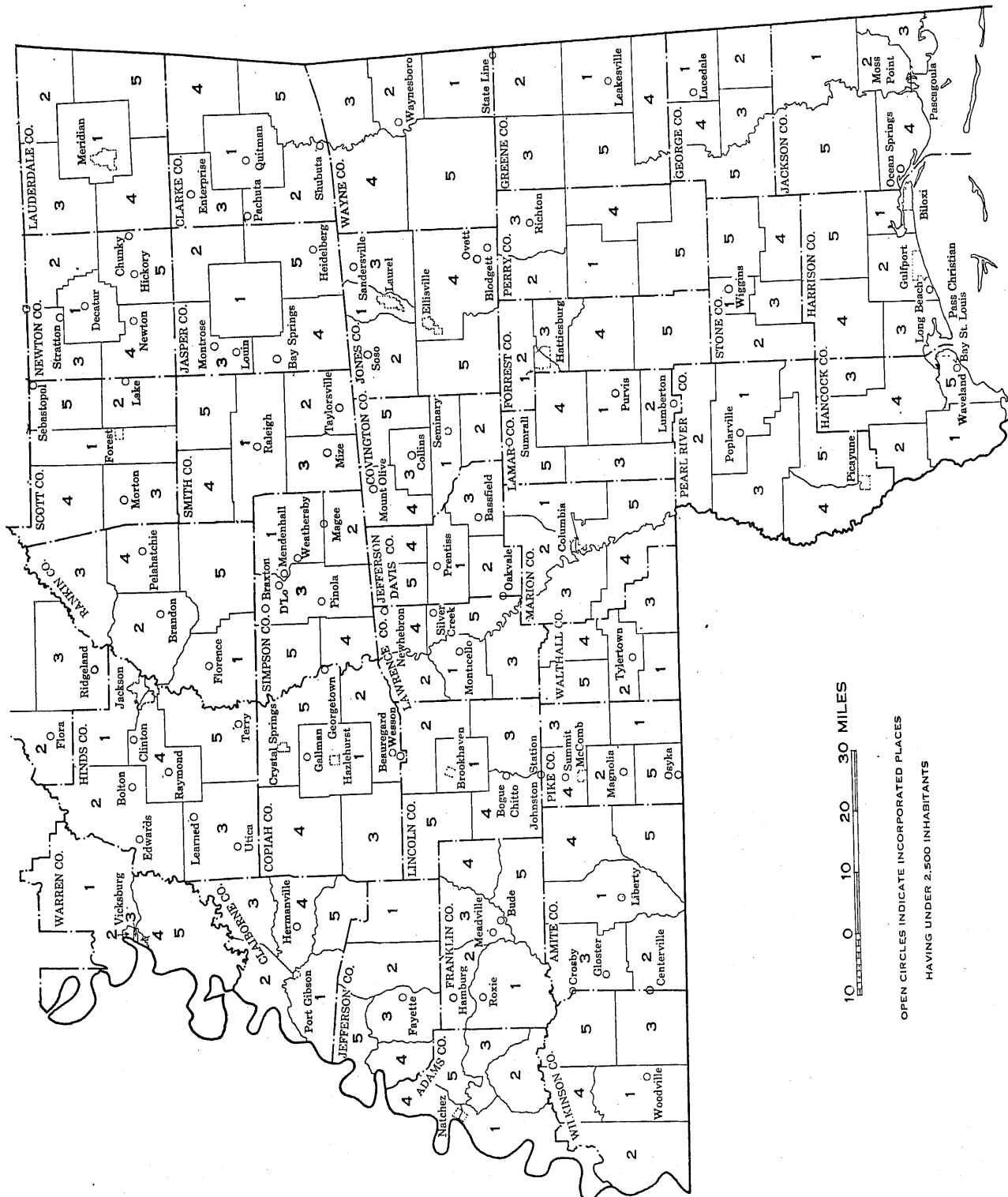

Population of the State.—Mississippi was admitted to the Union in 1817 as the twentieth State. The Territory of Mississippi was organized in 1798. In 1804, and again in 1812, its boundaries were extended. In 1817, a part of its area was taken to form the new Territory of Alabama, leaving the boundaries of the Territory of Mississippi substantially the same as those of the present State. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 2,183,796, which represents an increase of 173,975, or 8.7 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 47,420 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 46.1, as compared with 42.4 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Mississippi from 1800, the year in which the Territory of Mississippi

was first enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Mississippi comprises all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Crystal Springs was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit; for example, Okolona was removed from the urban list in 1930.

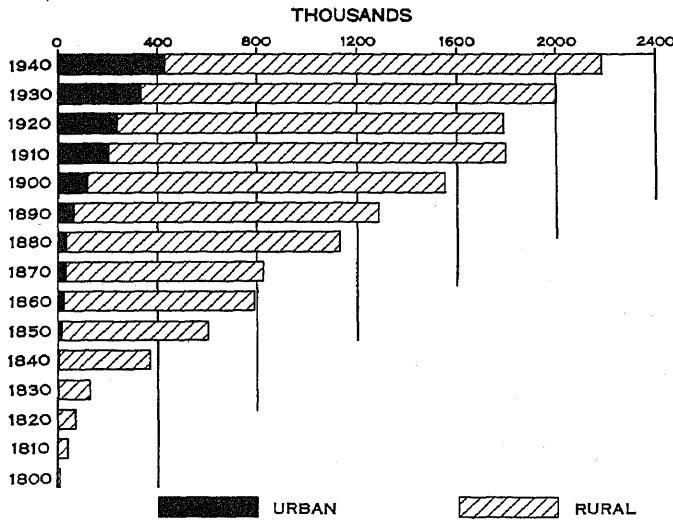

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Mississippi is shown by counties, beats, cities, towns, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards, and table 7 presents data for the Jackson metropolitan district.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are 12 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Jackson, the capital and largest city, had a population in 1940 of 62,107. The other 11 cities in this size-group are, in order of population: Meridian, Vicksburg, Hattiesburg, Greenville, Laurel, Biloxi, Natchez, Gulfport, Greenwood, Columbus, and Clarksdale. No new cities have been added to this size-group between 1930 and 1940.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 82 counties of Mississippi from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier

census reports. Seventy-two of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 10 decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Mississippi are called beats. The incorporated cities, towns, and villages form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 51 cities, 177 towns, and 67 villages. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated cities, towns, and villages, forms a part of some beat or of two or more beats.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by beats, cities, towns, and villages for the last three censuses. The population of the cities, towns, and villages is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more beats in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first beat. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

The Jackson metropolitan district is the only one in Mississippi. This district was defined for the first time in 1940.

Table 7 shows the population of the Jackson metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the

units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase between 1930 and 1940. In 1940 the Jackson metropolitan district had 88,003 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the same area had a population of 68,252.

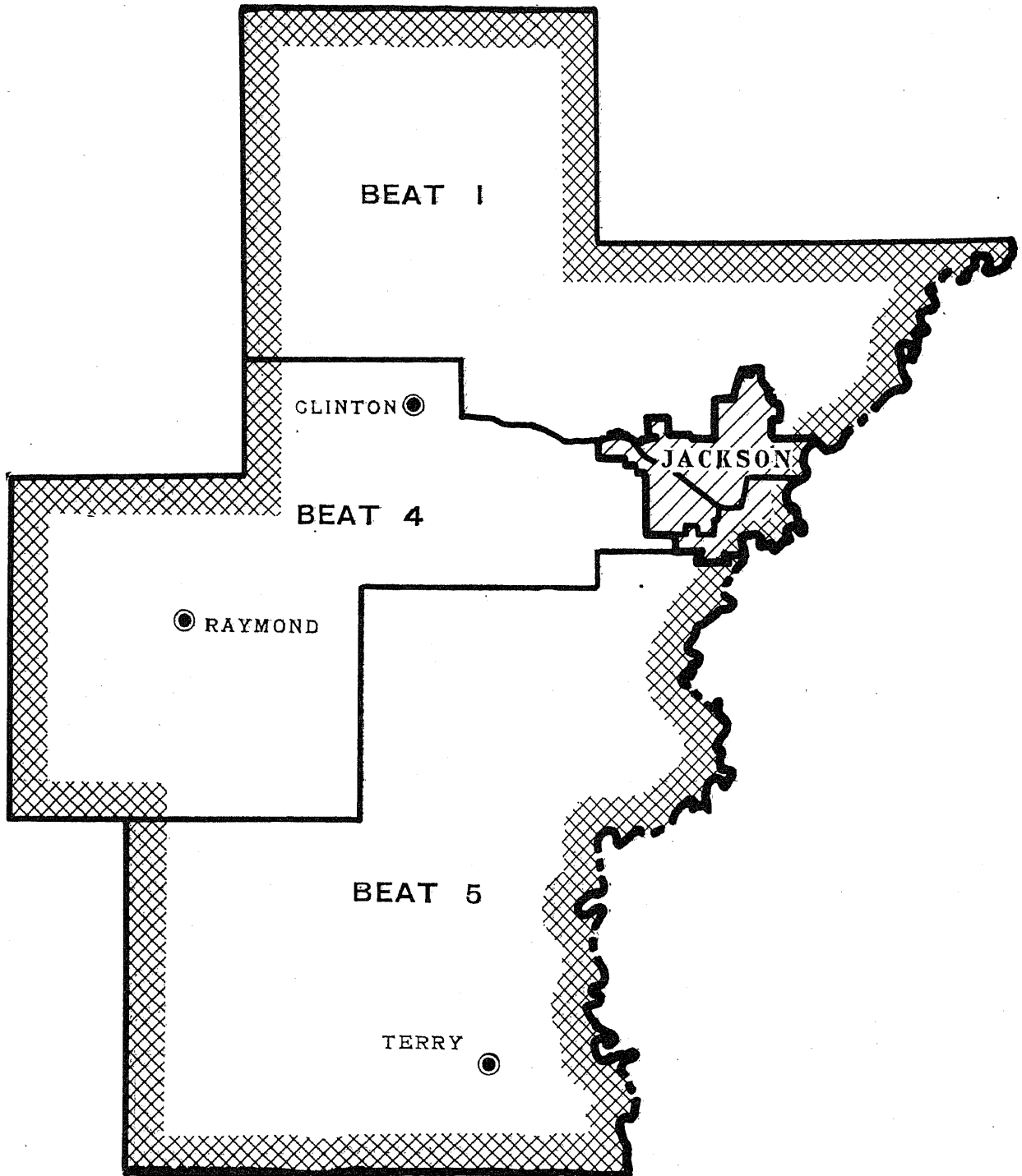

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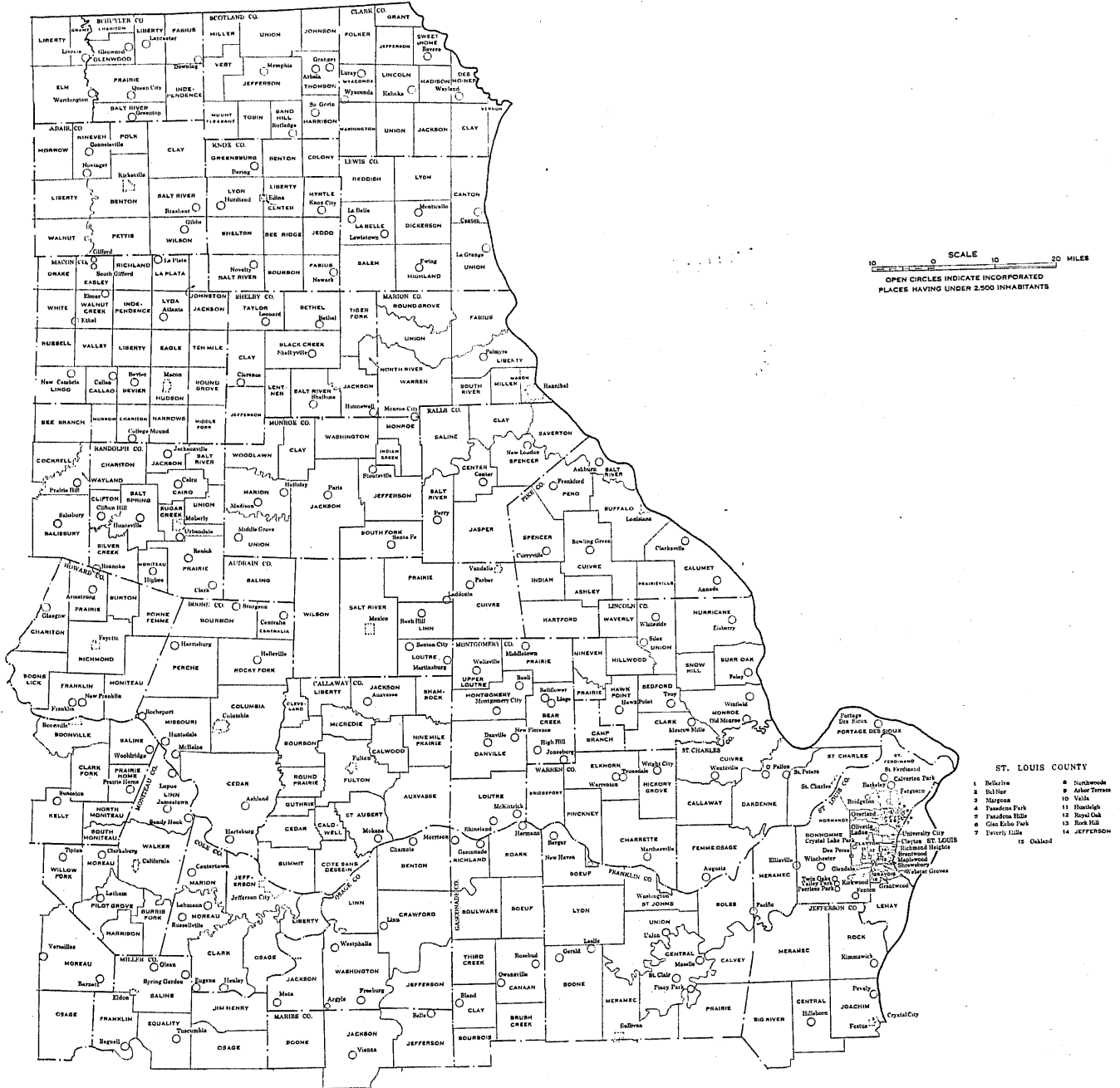
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MISSOURI—NORTHEASTERN PART

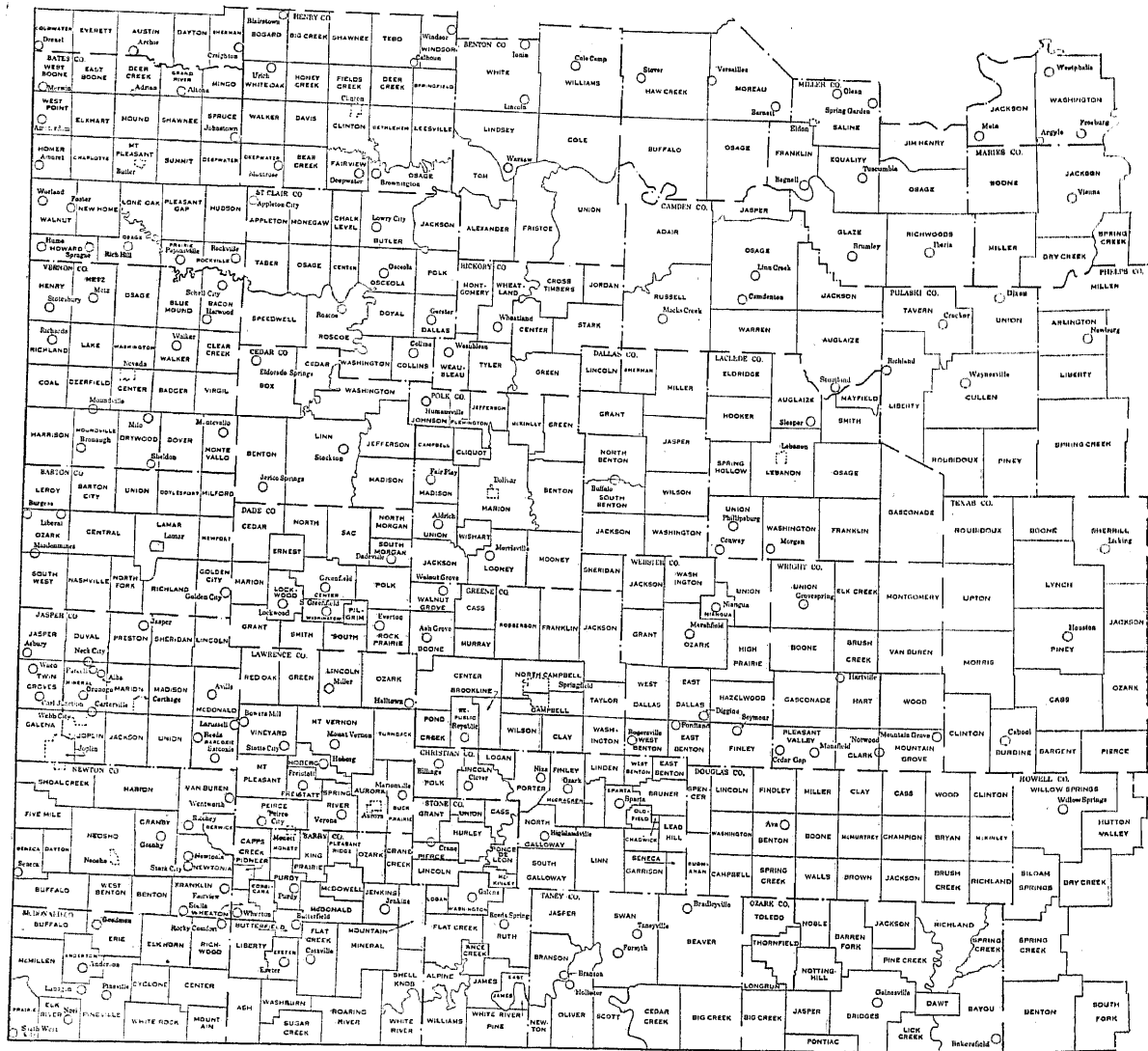
MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNSHIPS

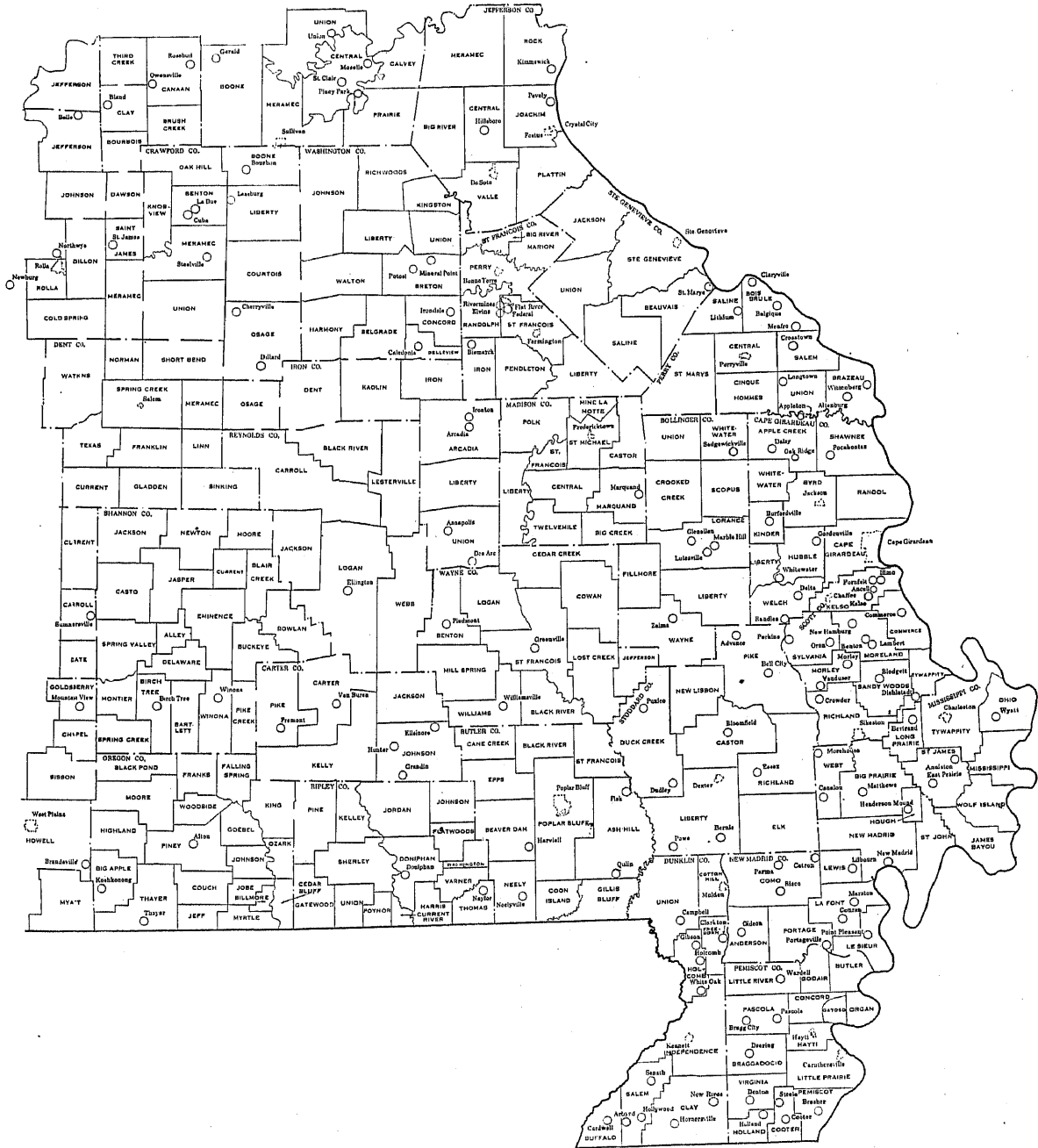

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Missouri Territory comprised, in 1812, all of the Louisiana Purchase except the part included in the State of Louisiana. The State of Missouri, formed from a small part of the Territory, was admitted to the Union in 1821 as the twenty-fourth State. In 1836, when the present northwest corner (the Platte Purchase) was added, Missouri assumed its present boundaries. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 3,784,664, which represents an increase of 155,297, or 4.3 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 69,270 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 54.6, as compared with 52.4 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Missouri from 1810 (the year in which Louisiana Territory was first

enumerated by areas that can be grouped to produce the area of the State at the time of its admission) to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Missouri consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Fayette qualified as urban in 1910 and 1930 but not in 1920.

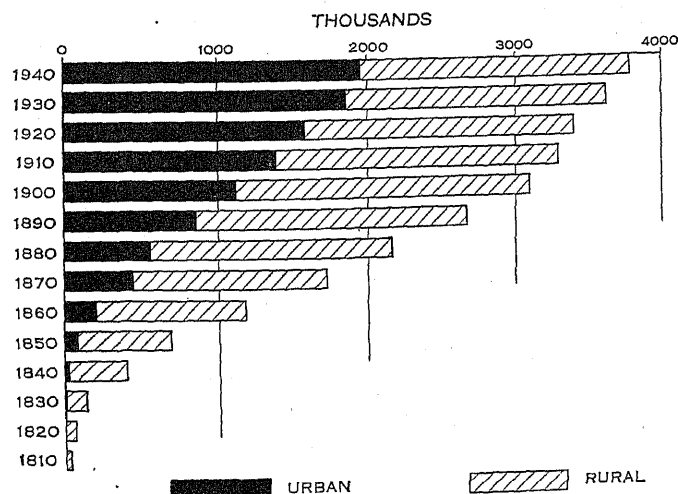

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Missouri is shown by counties, townships, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 to 7-C, and for the census tracts of Kansas City and of St. Louis and its adjacent areas in tables 8 and 8-A, respectively.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are 22 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. St. Louis, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 816,048; and Jefferson City, the capital of the State, had a population of 24,268.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 114 counties of Missouri and the independent city of St. Louis, which has the status of a county, from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those

published in earlier census reports. Sixty-one of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 53 decreased, as did the city of St. Louis. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Missouri are the townships. The incorporated cities (except St. Louis) and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 346 cities (including St. Louis) and 447 towns. Ordinarily, each of the secondary divisions forms a part of some township (or townships).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more townships in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first township. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Kansas City, Mo.-Kansas City, Kans., metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Like several others, this district occupies territory in more than one State. In 1940 the Kansas City, Mo.-Kansas City, Kans., metropolitan district had 634,093 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 608,186. Shawnee township, Johnson County, Kans. (population, 6,858 in 1940 and 5,768 in 1930), was included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities (and sometimes their adjacent areas) are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics.

In table 8 the 1940 population of Kansas City is shown by census tracts. In table 8-A the 1940 and 1930 population of St. Louis city and also the population in 1940 of certain adjacent areas is shown by census tracts. The tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps. Where no comparative figures are shown for earlier censuses, the tracts were not established until after 1930.

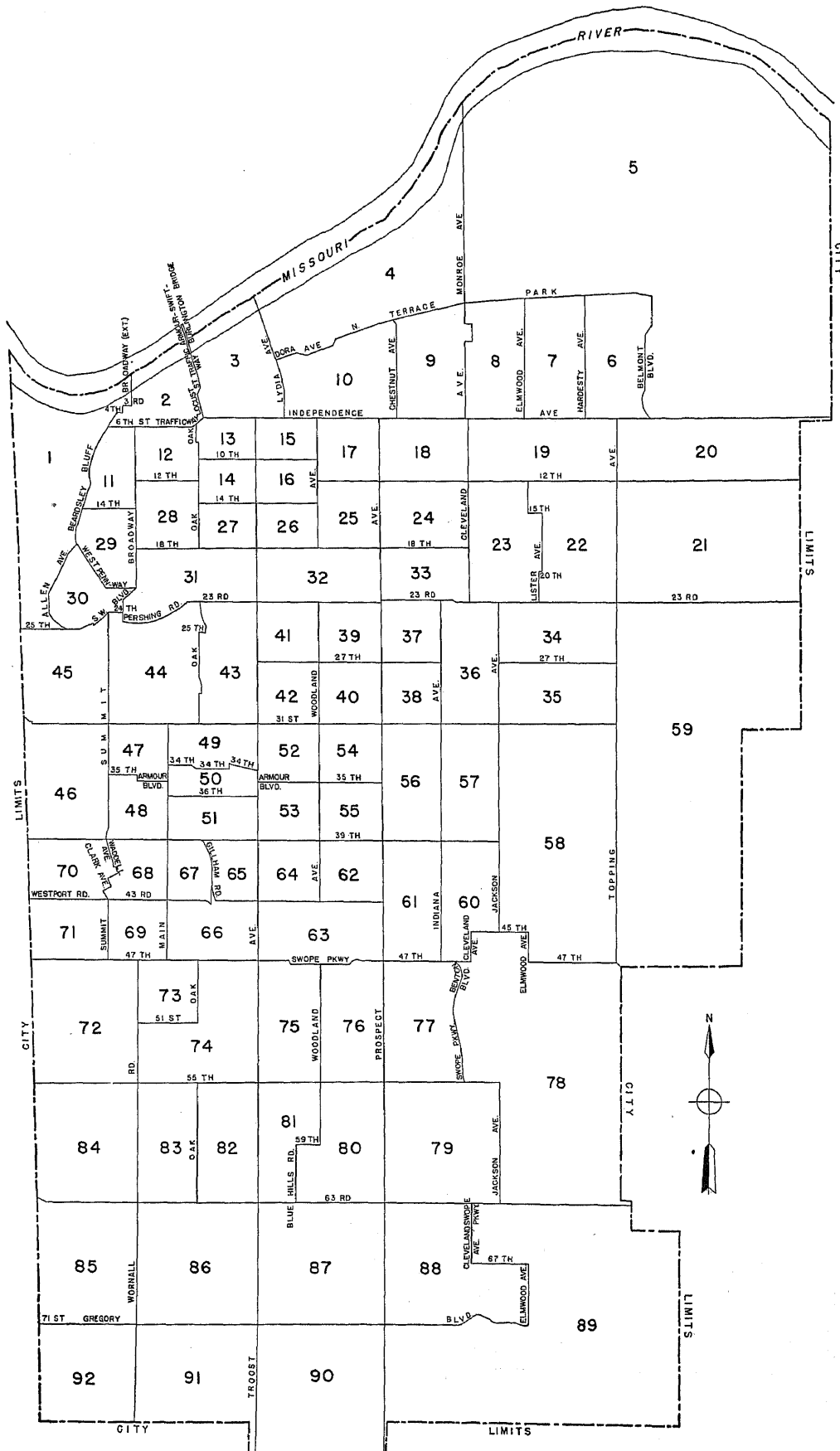

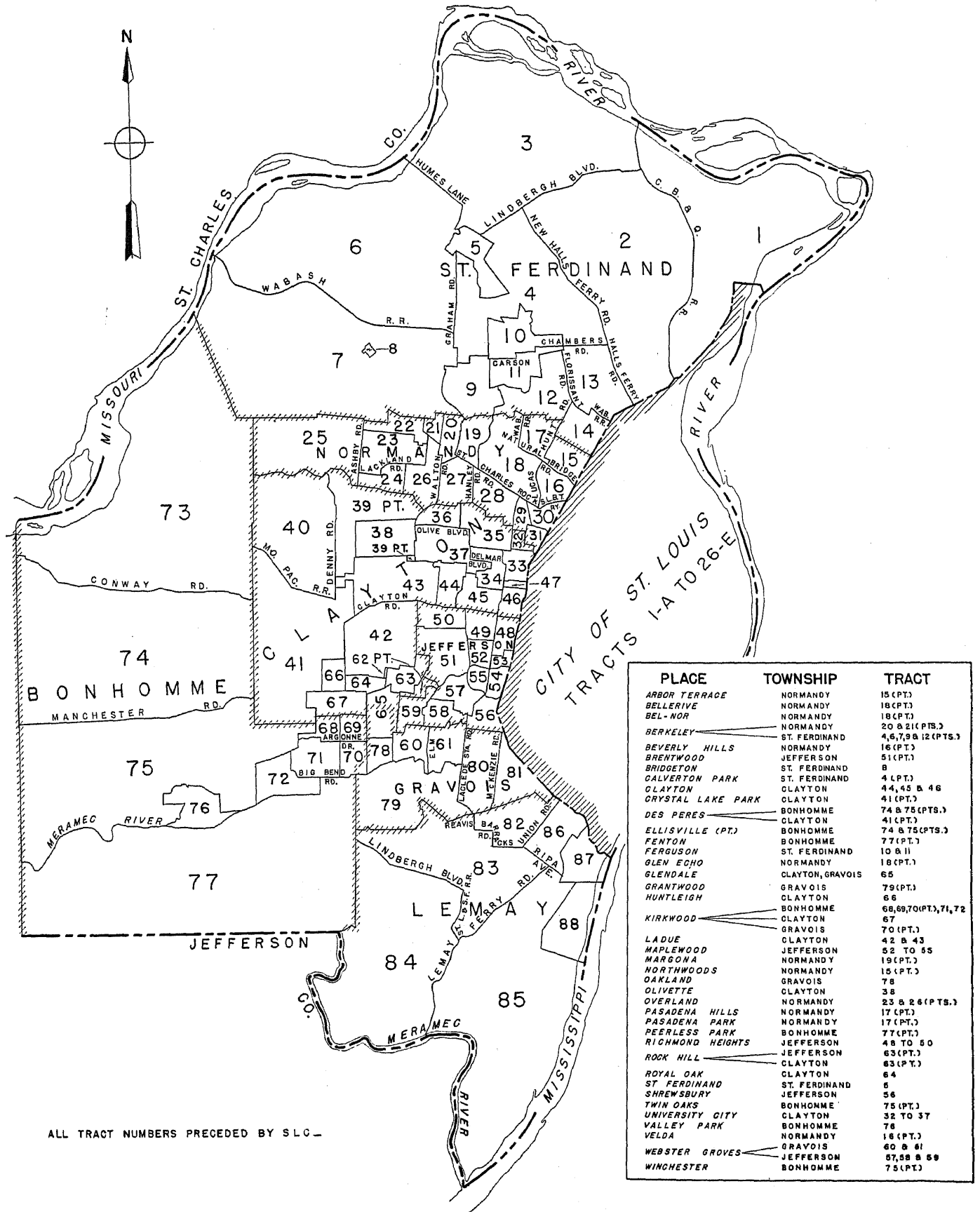

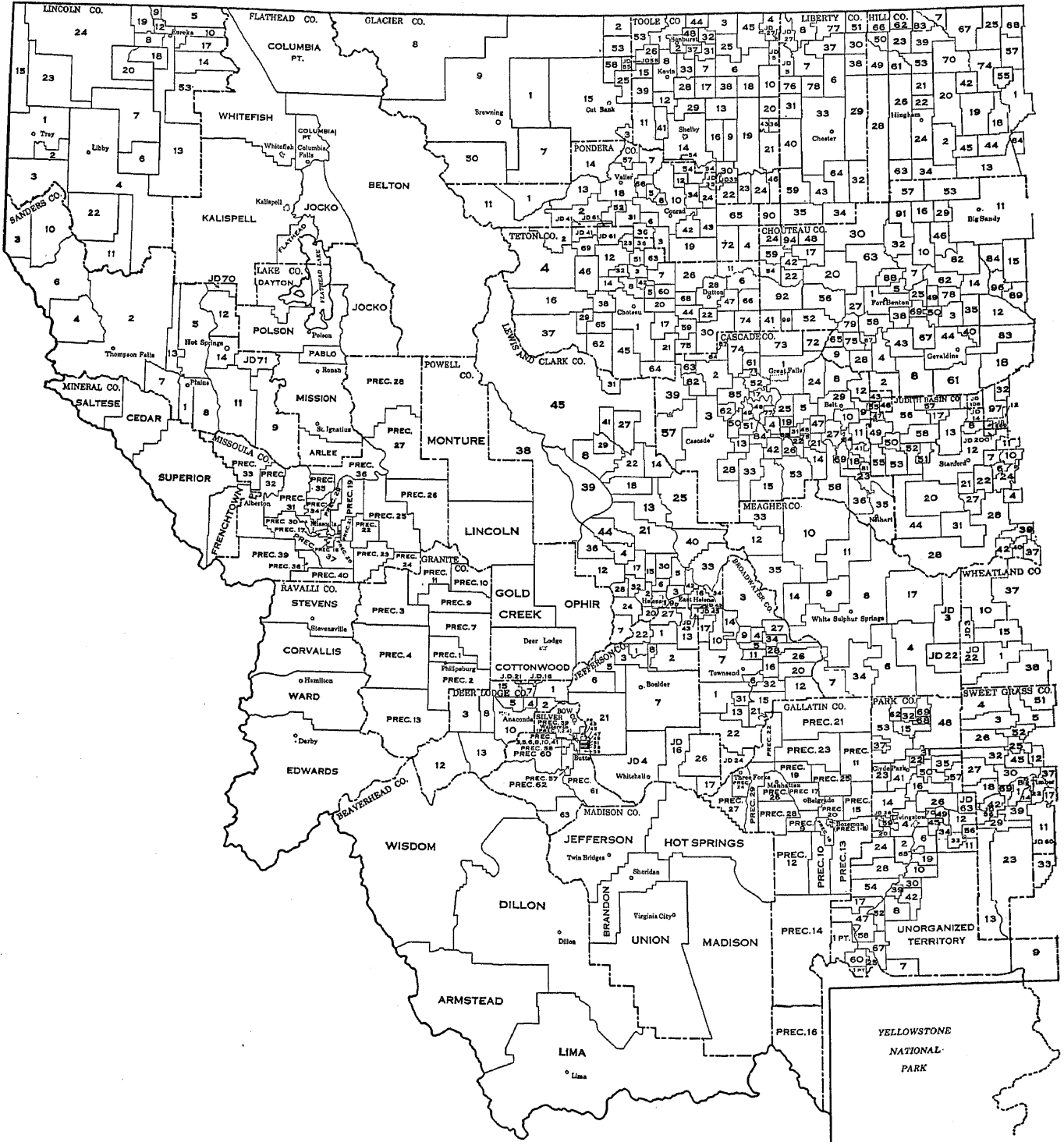

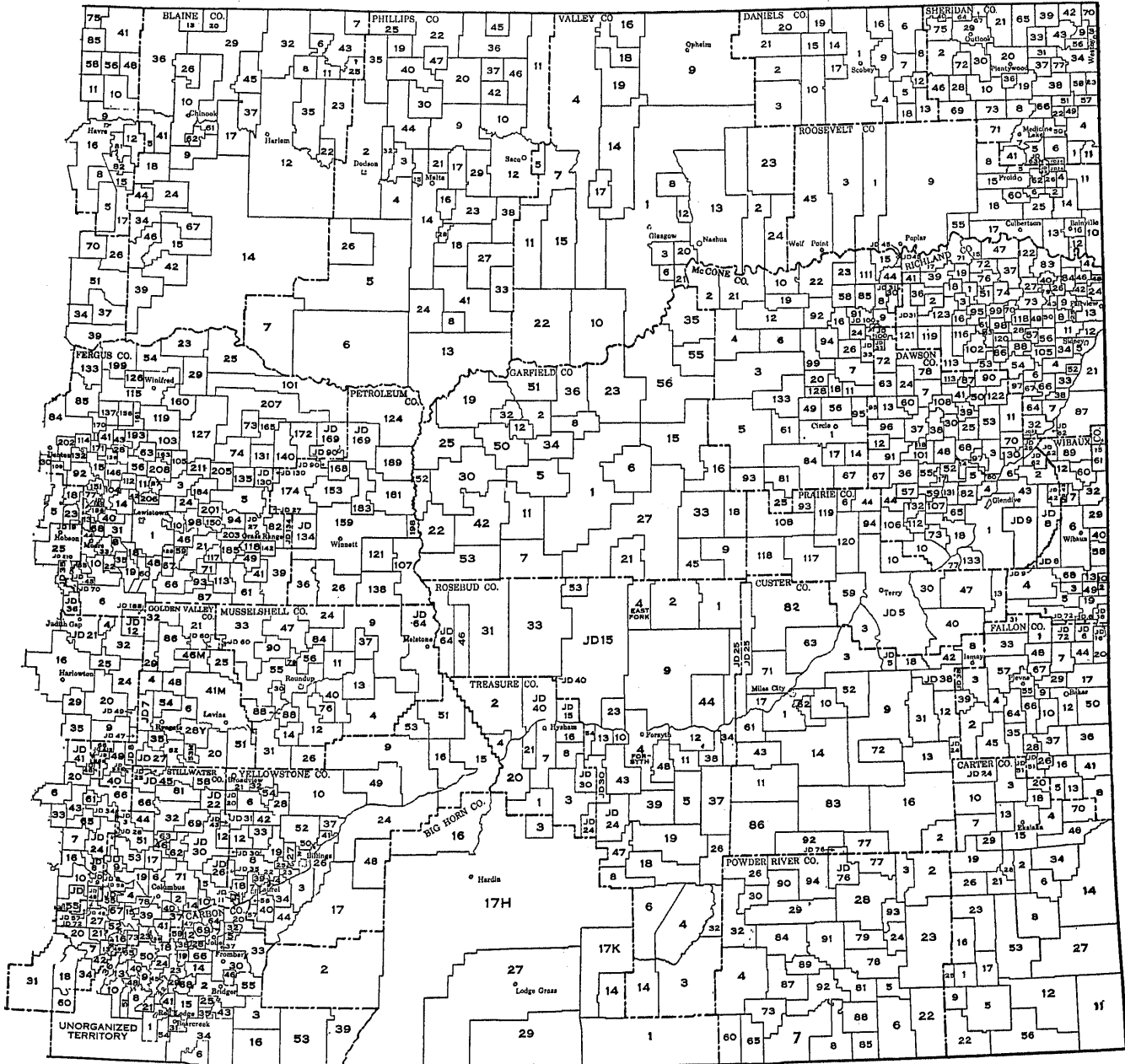

Population of the State.—Montana was organized as a Territory in 1864 from a part of Idaho Territory and was admitted to the Union as the forty-first State in 1889. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 559,456, which represents an increase of 21,850, or 4.1 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 146,316 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 3.8, as compared with 3.7 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Montana from 1870, the year in which the Territory of Montana was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the

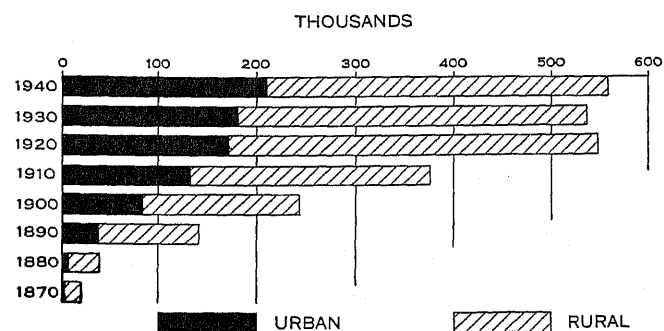
increase or decrease during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is also presented in this table and is shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Montana comprises all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Dillon qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940 but not in 1930.

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Montana is shown by counties, townships, school districts, election precincts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are six cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Butte, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 37,081; and Helena, the capital of the State, had a population of 15,056.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 56 counties of Montana from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Of the 55 counties whose boundaries re-

mained unchanged since 1930, 24 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 31 decreased. Part of Park County was annexed to Yellowstone National Park in 1932. Yellowstone National Park, part of which is located in the State, is independent of any county organization. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties of Montana are called civil townships, school districts, and election precincts. The incorporated cities and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 42 cities and 73 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of one or more townships, districts, or precincts.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, districts, precincts, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more precincts, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct. The population of the cities that comprise several entire precincts is presented in roman type, followed by the precinct population in *italic* type.

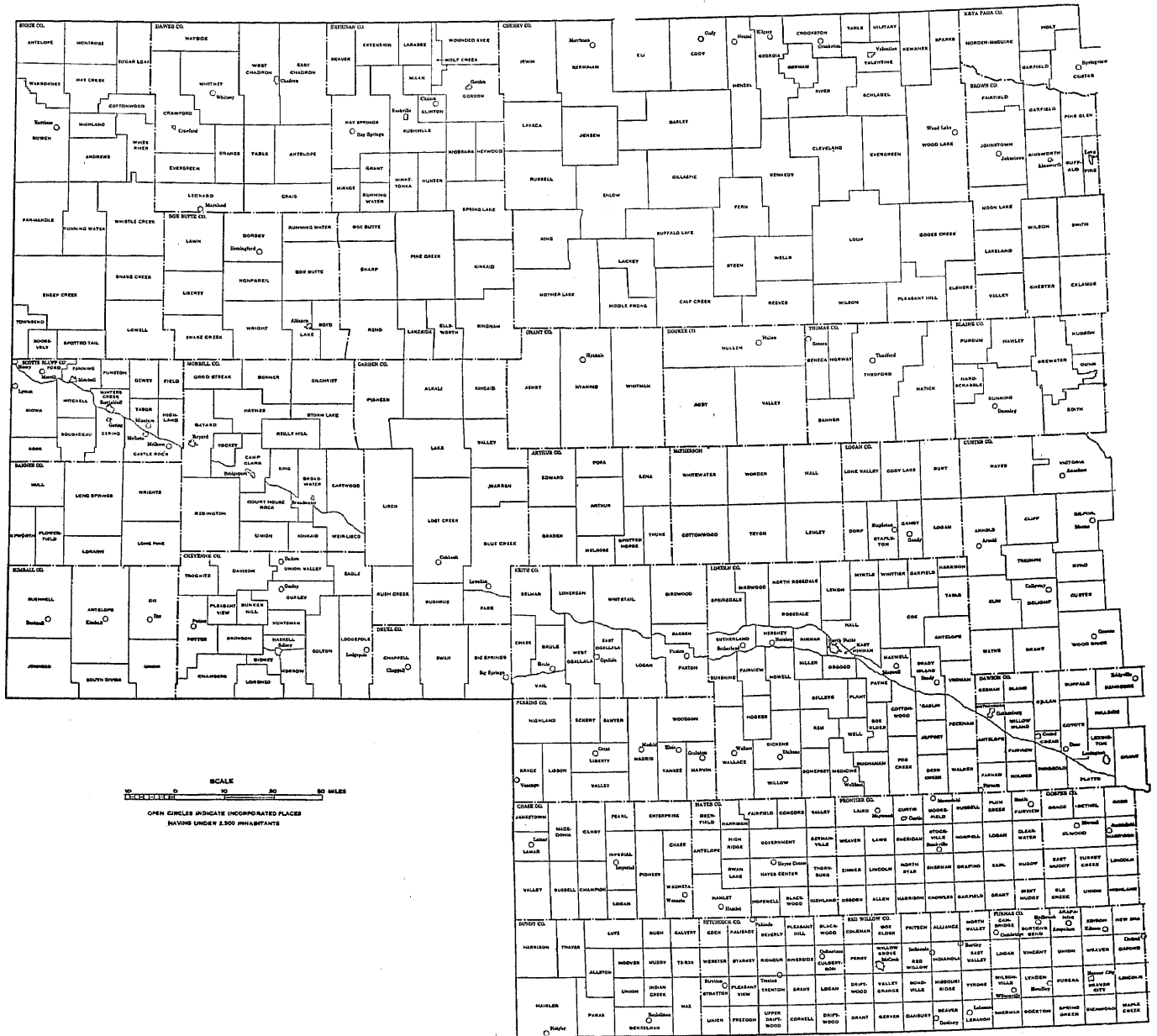

Population of the State.—Nebraska was admitted to the Union in 1867 as the thirty-seventh State, with boundaries substantially as at present. The Territory of Nebraska was organized in 1854 from unorganized territory, originally part of the Louisiana Purchase. At this time the Territory included, in addition to the area of the present State, areas now comprising parts of North and South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, and Colorado. The area of the Territory was greatly reduced in 1861 by the organization of Dakota and Colorado Territories. At the same time a small area was added to the western part of Nebraska Territory. In 1863 the area was again reduced by the organization of Idaho Territory. In 1870 and 1882, respectively, small tracts of land were annexed from Dakota Territory.

The population of Nebraska on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,315,834, which represents a decrease of 62,129, or 4.5 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 76,653

square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 17.2, as compared with 18.0 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Nebraska from 1860, the year in which the Territory of Nebraska was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Nebraska consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Ogallala was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit; for example, Aurora was removed from the urban list in 1940.

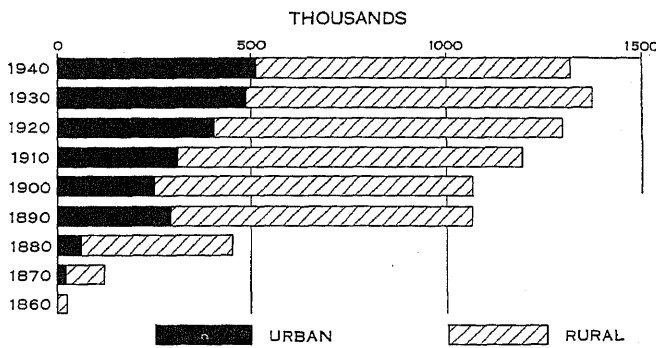

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Nebraska is shown by counties, election precincts, townships, cities, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards, and tables 7 and 7-A present data, respectively, for the Lincoln and Omaha-Council Bluffs metropolitan districts.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are nine cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Omaha, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 223,844 and Lincoln, the capital of the State, had a population of 81,984.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 93 counties of Nebraska from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Sixteen of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 77 decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Nebraska are the election precincts, townships, and some of the cities and villages. There are 106 cities and 425 villages, of which 81 cities and 2 villages (Burwell and Elyria) are independent of precinct or township organization and form primary divisions of the counties. The remaining cities and villages, each of which, ordinarily, is a part of one or more precincts or townships, form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by precincts, townships, cities, and villages for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and

villages that constitute secondary subdivisions is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions (precincts or townships) in which the places are respectively located. Italics are also used for the figures representing the population at censuses prior to 1940 of places that have recently been made primary divisions, to indicate that the figures are not to be added in with the precincts or townships and other primary divisions to make the county total (having already been counted once). Where an incorporated place is located in two or more precincts or townships in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct or township. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The following tables give data for the two metropolitan districts with the main central city in Nebraska. Part of the Sioux City district is also situated in Nebraska; data for this district are presented in the bulletin for Iowa.

Table 7 shows the population of the Lincoln metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. This district was defined for the first time in 1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase or decrease between 1930 and 1940.

In 1940 the Lincoln metropolitan district had 88,191 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the same area had a population of 85,840.

Table 7-A shows the population of the Omaha-Council Bluffs metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Like several others, this district occupies territory in more than one State. In 1940 the Omaha-Council Bluffs metropolitan district had 287,698 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 273,851. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

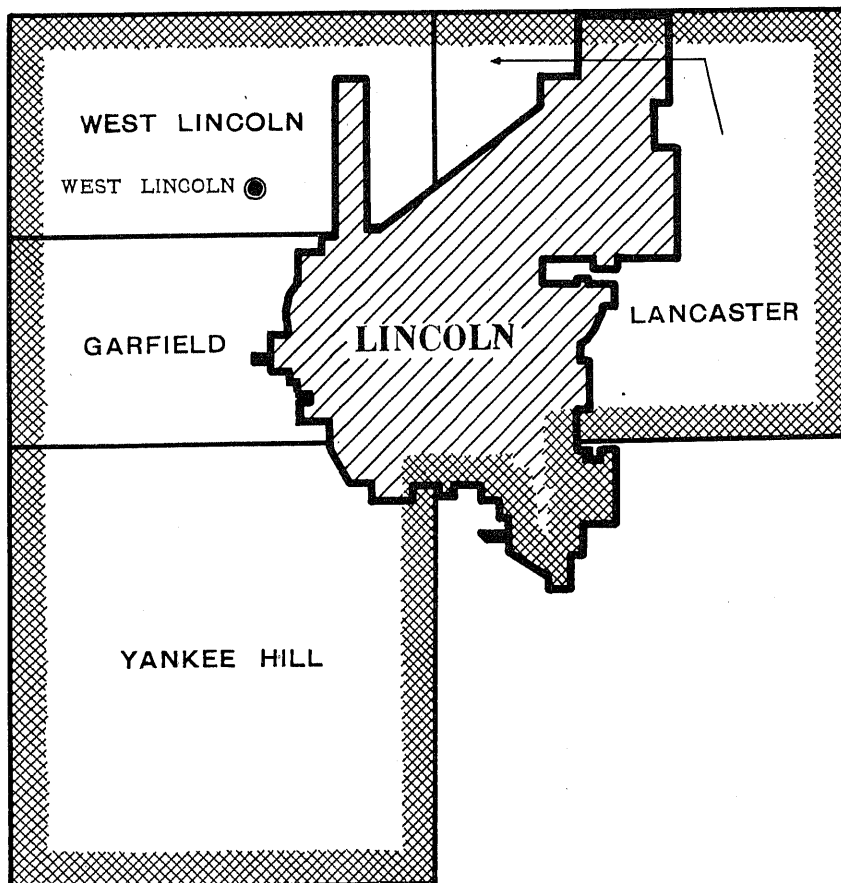

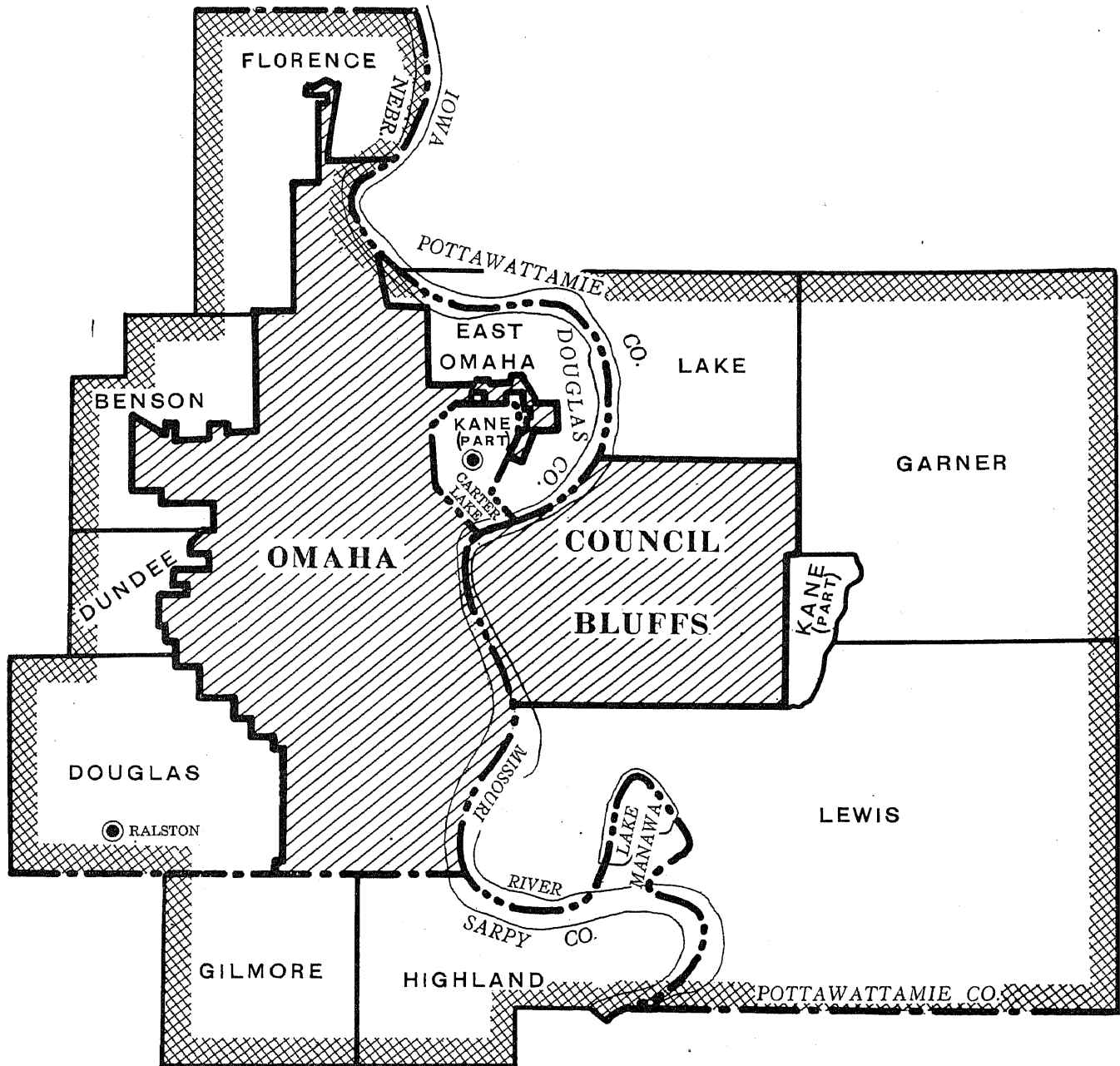

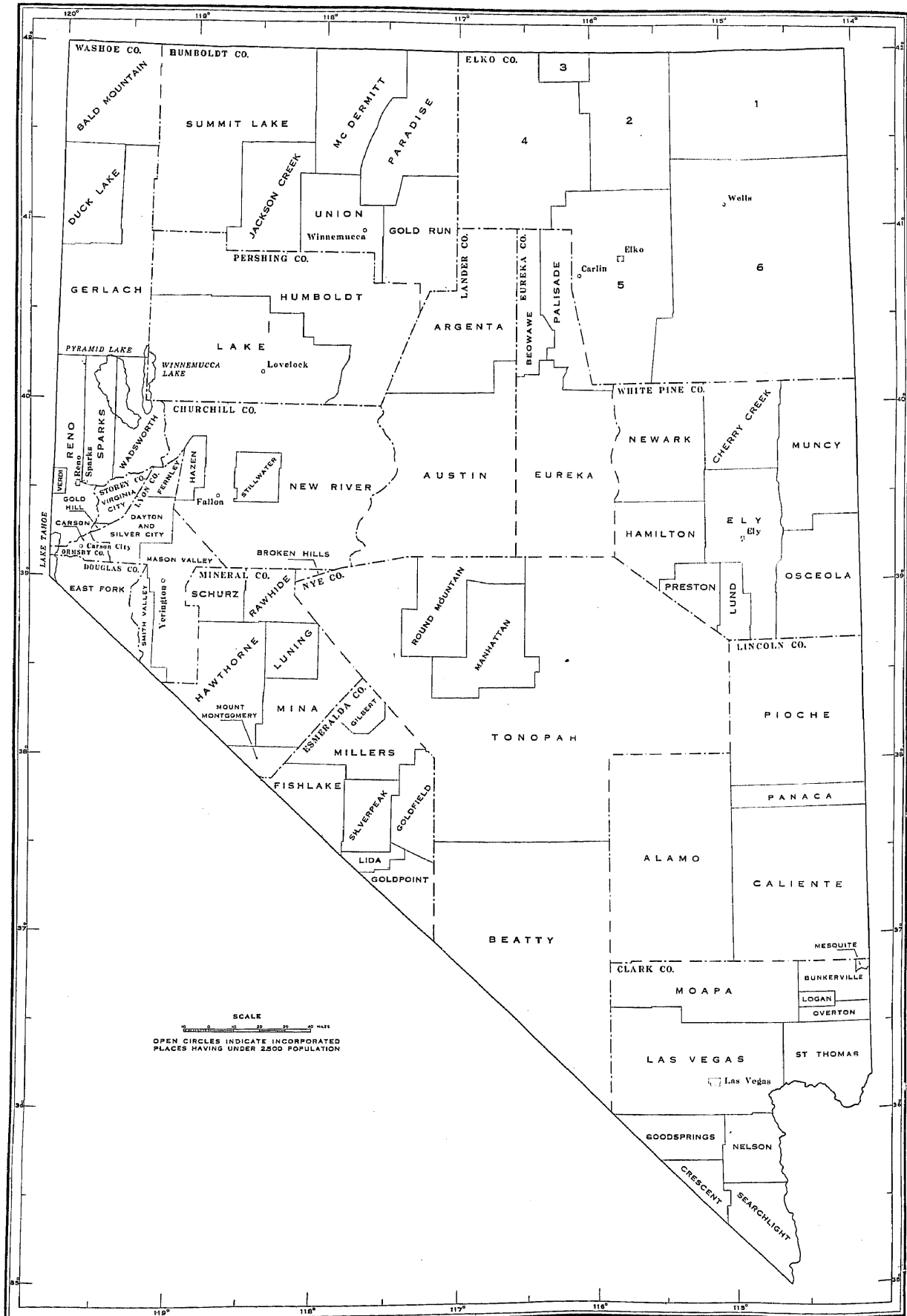

Population of the State.—Nevada was organized as a Territory in 1861 and was admitted to the Union as the thirty-sixth State in October, 1864. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 110,247, which represents an increase of 19,189, or 21.1 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 109,802 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 1.0, as compared with 0.8 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Nevada from 1860, the year in which the area now included in the State was first enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. This table also presents the urban

and rural population of the State at each census. The urban population of Nevada consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are, of course, not constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population in excess of 2,500; and places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Virginia City, a place of 10,917 inhabitants in 1880 and 8,511 in 1890, was reduced in size and later disincorporated.

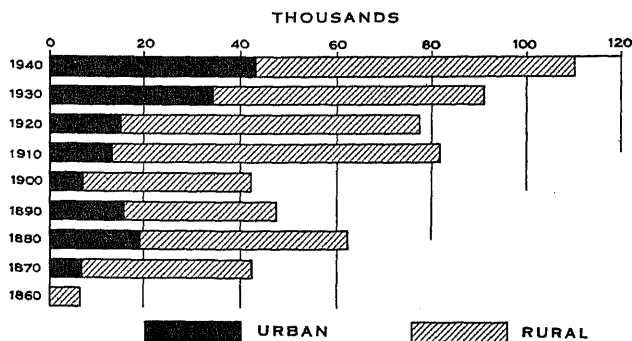
TABLE 1.—POPULATION OF NEVADA, URBAN AND RURAL: 1860 TO 1940

Cities of 10,000 or more.—Table 2 shows the population of Reno, the only city in Nevada with more than 10,000 inhabitants, from 1870, the first census subsequent to its incorporation, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 17 counties of Nevada from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Of these counties 16 increased in population between 1930 and 1940. This table also presents the urban and the rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930. No new counties have been organized since 1920, but part of Mineral County was annexed to Lyon County in 1933.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "Minor civil divisions." In Nevada the primary subdivisions of the counties are called townships, except that in one county (Esmeralda) judicial districts have replaced the older election precincts. The incorporated cities and towns in Nevada form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 10 cities and 2 towns, each forming a part of the single township in which it is located.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships (or districts), cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the townships in which the places are respectively located. Changes in the boundaries of primary divisions and incorporated places between 1930 and 1940 are indicated by footnotes on this table; and the most important changes between 1920 and 1930 are also noted.

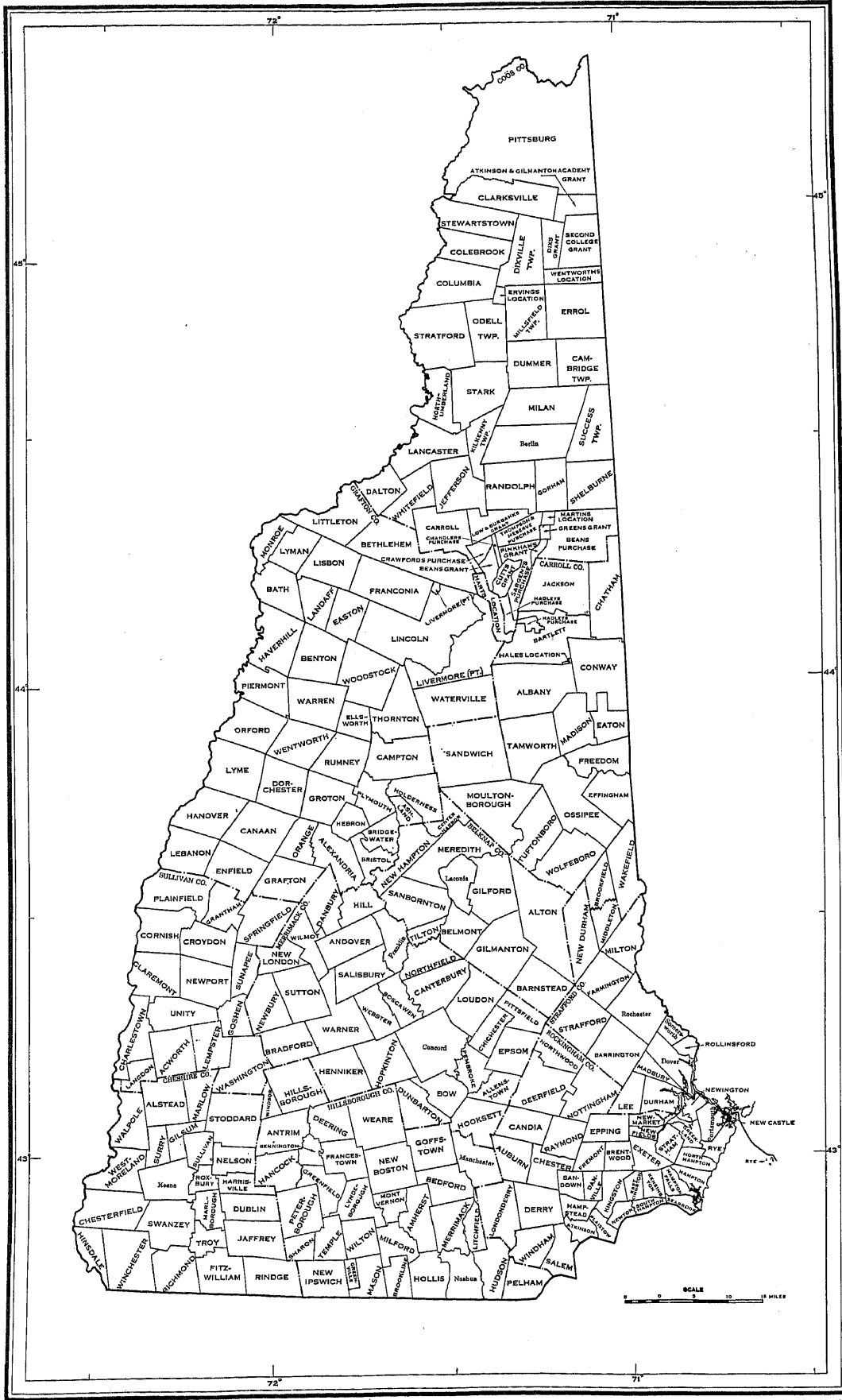

Population of the State.—New Hampshire was one of the Thirteen Original States. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 491,524, which represents an increase of 26,231, or 5.6 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 9,024 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 54.5, as compared with 51.6 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of New Hampshire from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is also presented in this table, and is shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The Census Bureau ordinarily defines urban population as that in incorporated places of 2,500 or more. The urban population of New Hampshire, however, consists of all persons living in incorporated cities (the smallest of these having more than 6,000 inhabitants) or in towns (townships) that were classified as urban under a special rule. In New Hampshire conditions are ex-

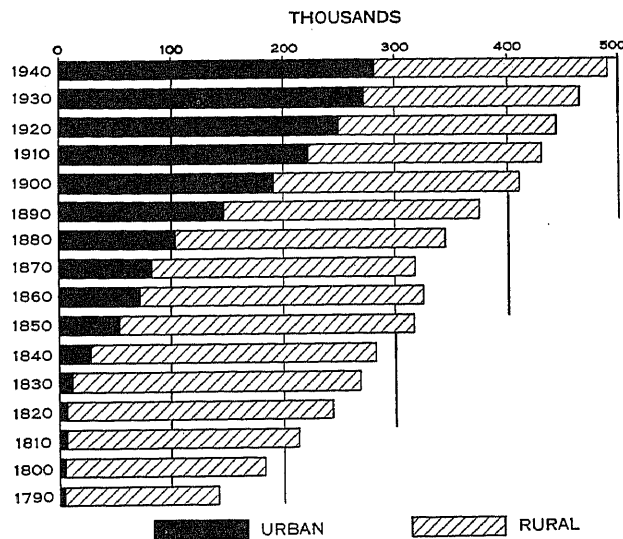
ceptional in that, in many cases, the compactly built portions of the towns are not separately incorporated nor politically distinct in any way from the rural territory within the same town. Consequently, if only the cities were counted in the urban population the classification would be quite inadequate. Hence, the urban classification has been extended to include those towns in which there is a village or densely populated area having more than 2,500 inhabitants and comprising, either by itself or when combined with other villages within the same town, more than 50 percent of the total population of the town. In 1940, as in 1930, there were seven such towns (Claremont, Derry, Exeter, Lebanon, Littleton, Milford, and Newport). The remainder of the population is classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places may be added to the urban list from time to time as they meet the Census Bureau's requirements, and places may likewise be taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they no longer meet the requirements.

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of New Hampshire is shown by counties, cities, towns, and other minor civil divisions, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards, and table 7 presents data for the Manchester metropolitan district.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are nine cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows for these cities the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The figures shown for the earlier censuses represent, in many cases, the population of the town prior to its incorporation as a city. Manchester, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 77,685.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The more thickly settled counties in New Hampshire are divided into towns and cities, but in Carroll and Coös Counties there are 5 "locations," 8 "grants," 7 "purchases," and 6 "townships." Several of these special minor civil divisions contained no population

and hence are not shown in table 4. The cities are primary divisions of the counties and not subdivisions of towns. There are 11 cities and 7 towns classified as urban under the special rule. There are no secondary divisions.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by cities, towns, and other minor civil divisions for the last three censuses.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit, but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

The Manchester district is not typical in that it includes only one town in addition to the central city, rather than a ring of towns surrounding or almost surrounding the city. The reason for the difference in this case is found in the fact that the city of Manchester includes not only the solidly built-up area, but a considerable amount of open country extending to the north,

east, and south of the main part of the city, so that only on the west does the growth of the thickly settled area extend to any great extent beyond the city limits.

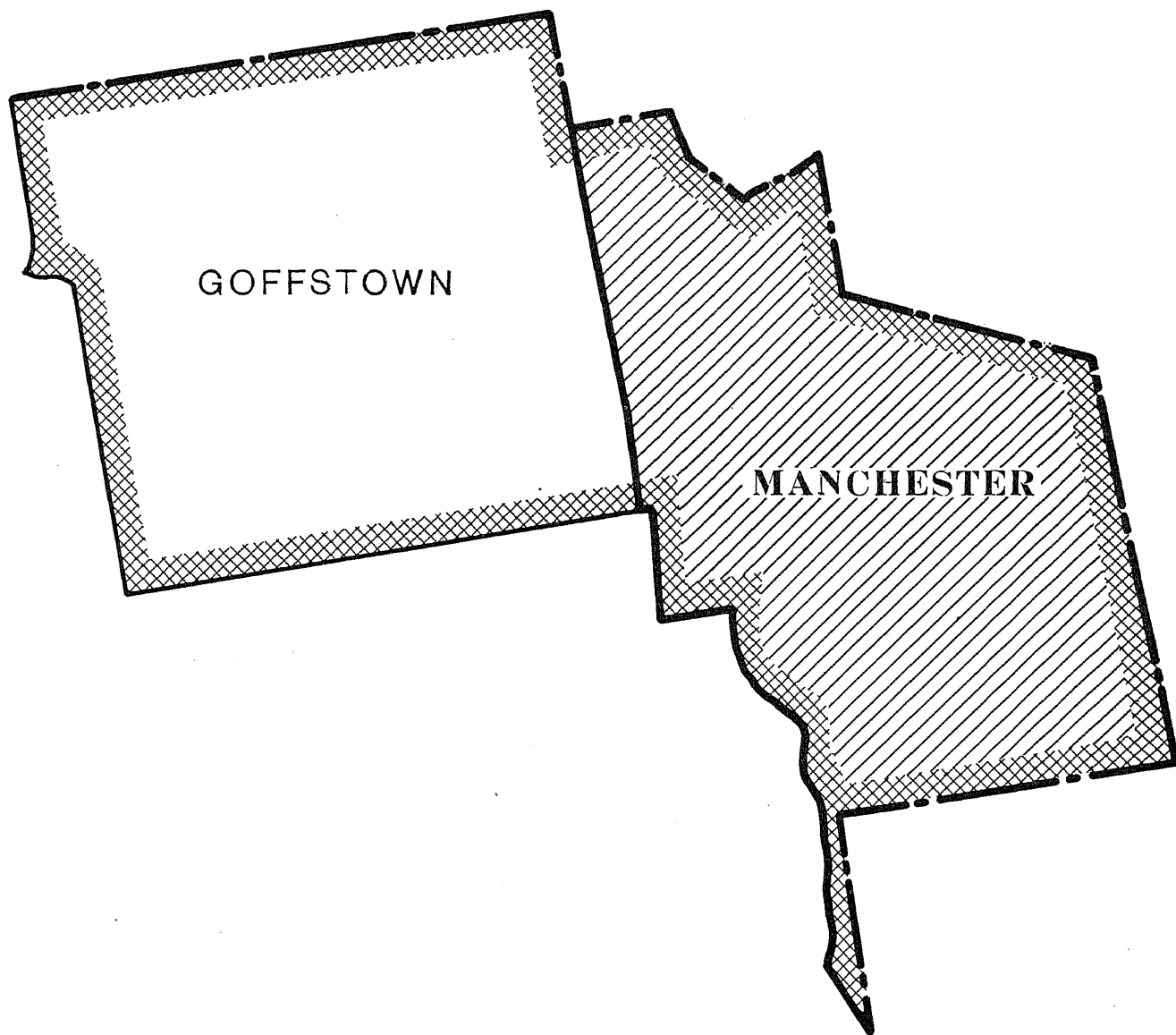
The Manchester metropolitan district was defined for the first time in 1940. Table 7 shows the population of the district and its constituent political units in 1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase between 1930 and 1940. In 1940 the Manchester metropolitan district had 81,932 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the same area had a population of 80,673.

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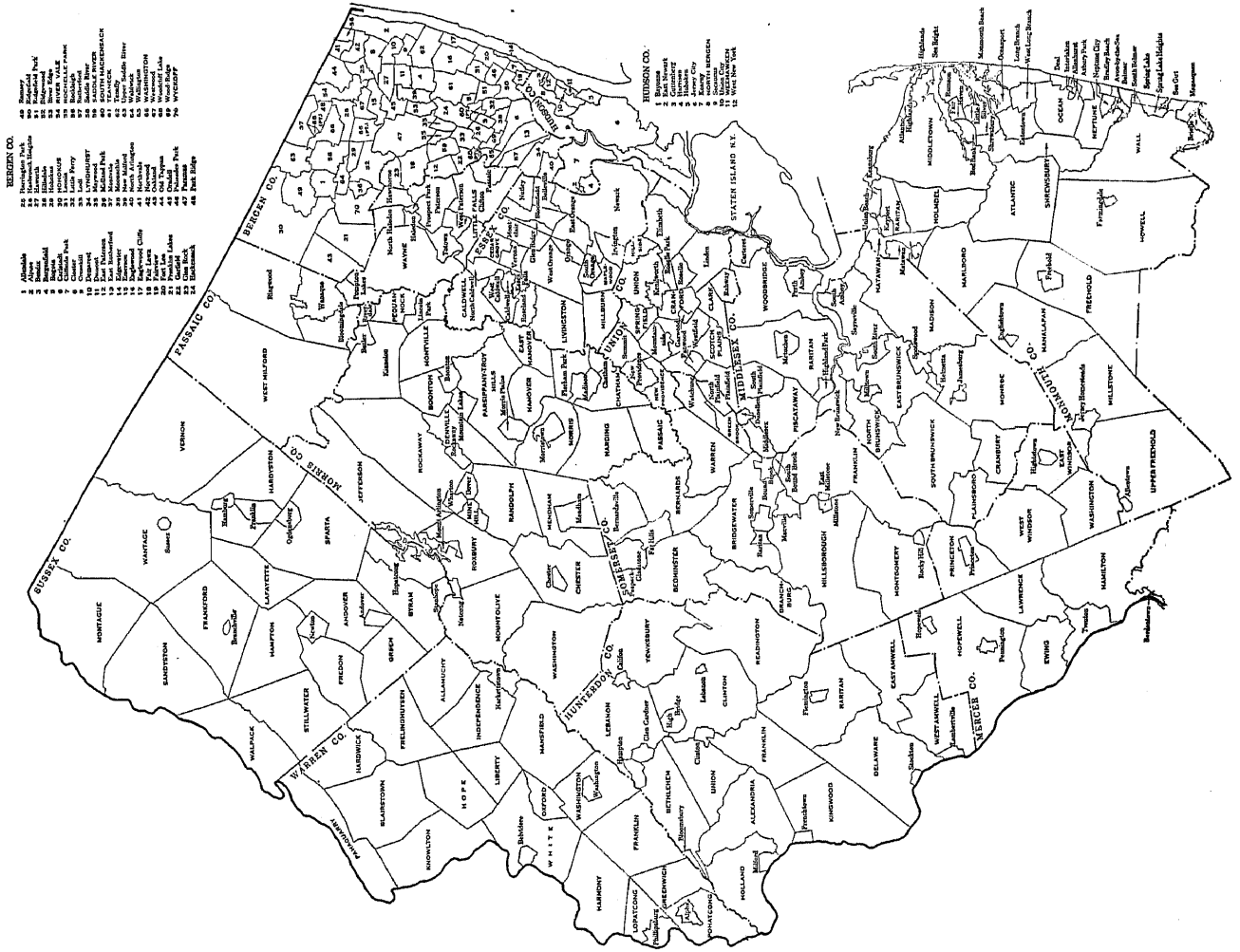
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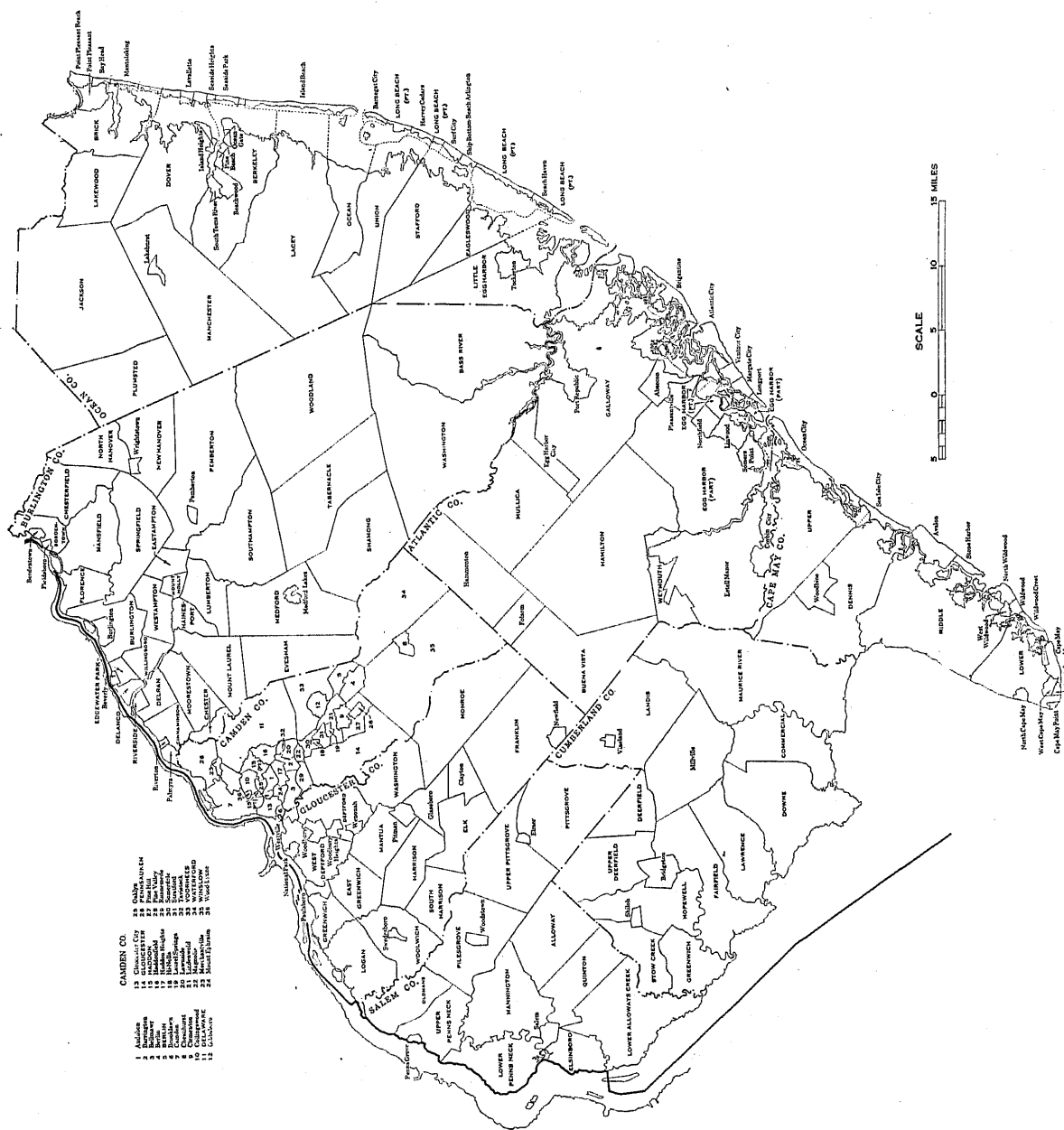
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MAPS FOR CENSUS TRACTS AND METROPOLITAN DISTRICTS

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—New Jersey was one of the Thirteen Original States. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 4,160,165, which represents an increase of 118,831, or 2.9 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 7,522 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 553.1, as compared with 537.3 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of New Jersey from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of

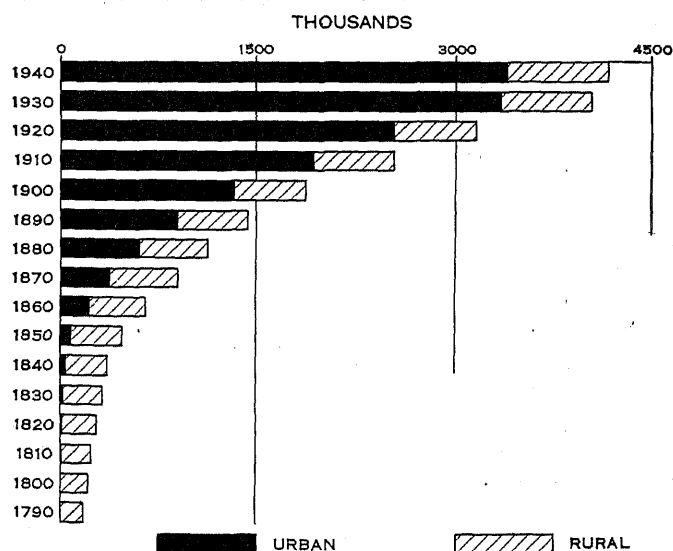
New Jersey, as defined by the Census Bureau, consists mainly of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more. It also includes the population of those townships (not incorporated as municipalities nor containing any areas so incorporated) which had a total population of 10,000 or more and a population density of 1,000 or more per square mile. The remainder of the population is classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they meet the requirements; for example, Millburn township was classified as urban under the special rule in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they no longer meet the requirements.

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of New Jersey is shown by counties, townships, cities, towns, boroughs, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards. Data for the Atlantic City and Trenton metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 and 7-A and for the census tracts of the tracted cities and adjacent areas in tables 8 to 8-F.

Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.—There are 57 incorporated places in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these incorporated places at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Newark, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 429,760; and Trenton, the capital of the State, had a population of 124,697.

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 21 counties of New Jersey from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county, and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Of the 17 counties whose boundaries

remained unchanged since 1930, 14 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 3 decreased. Part of Gloucester County was annexed to Camden County in 1931, and part of Middlesex County was annexed to Monmouth County in 1939. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in New Jersey are the townships, cities, towns, boroughs, and one village (South Orange). In addition to these

independent primary divisions, there are two villages (Ridgefield Park and Ridgewood), each coextensive with the township in which it is located. There are 52 cities, 23 towns, 255 boroughs, and 3 villages. Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, cities, towns, boroughs, and villages for the last three censuses.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Atlantic City metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. The Atlantic City metropolitan district had 100,096 inhabitants in 1940, as compared with 102,024 in 1930. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Parts of the Allentown-Bethlehem-Easton and the Philadelphia metropolitan districts are situated in New Jersey; data for these metropolitan districts are presented in the bulletin for Pennsylvania. Parts of the New York-Northeastern New Jersey and the Wilmington metropolitan districts are situated in New Jersey; data for these metropolitan districts are presented in the bulletins for New York and Delaware, respectively.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities (and sometimes their adjacent areas) are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In tables 8 to 8-F the 1940 population of the tracted cities is shown by census tracts. Table 8-C for Jersey City also gives the 1940 population by tracts for certain adjacent areas comprising the remainder of Hudson County. All the tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses.

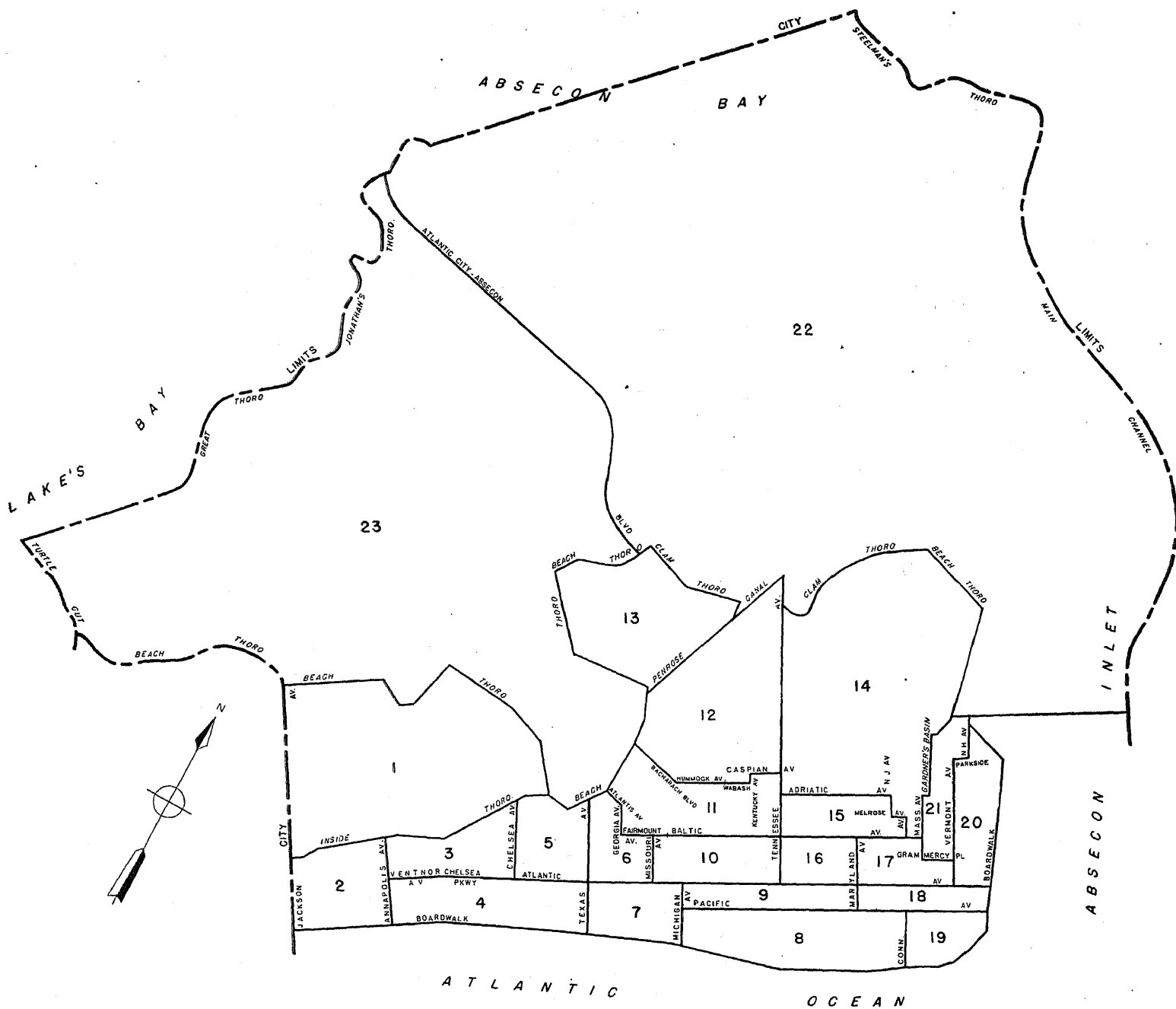

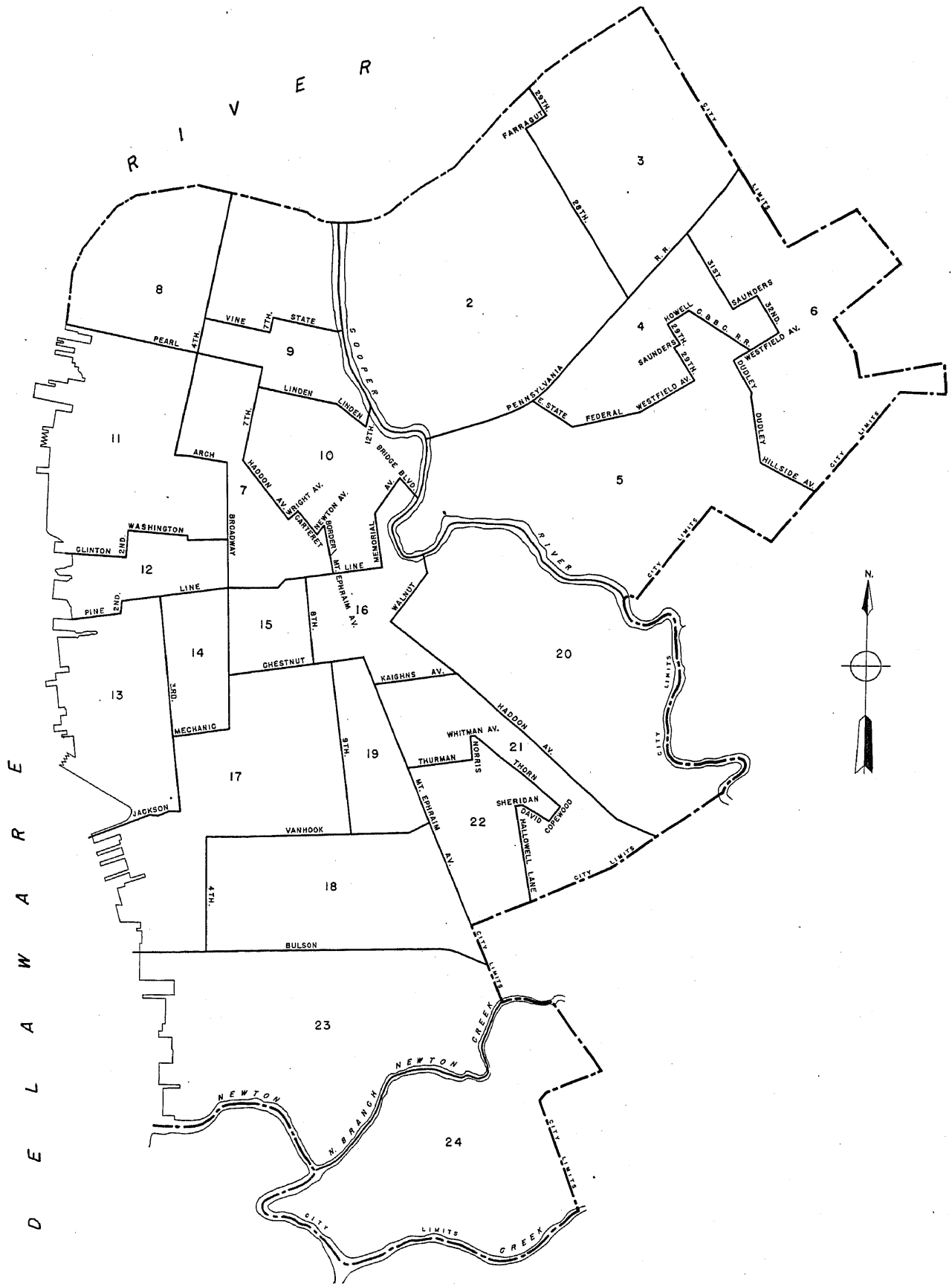

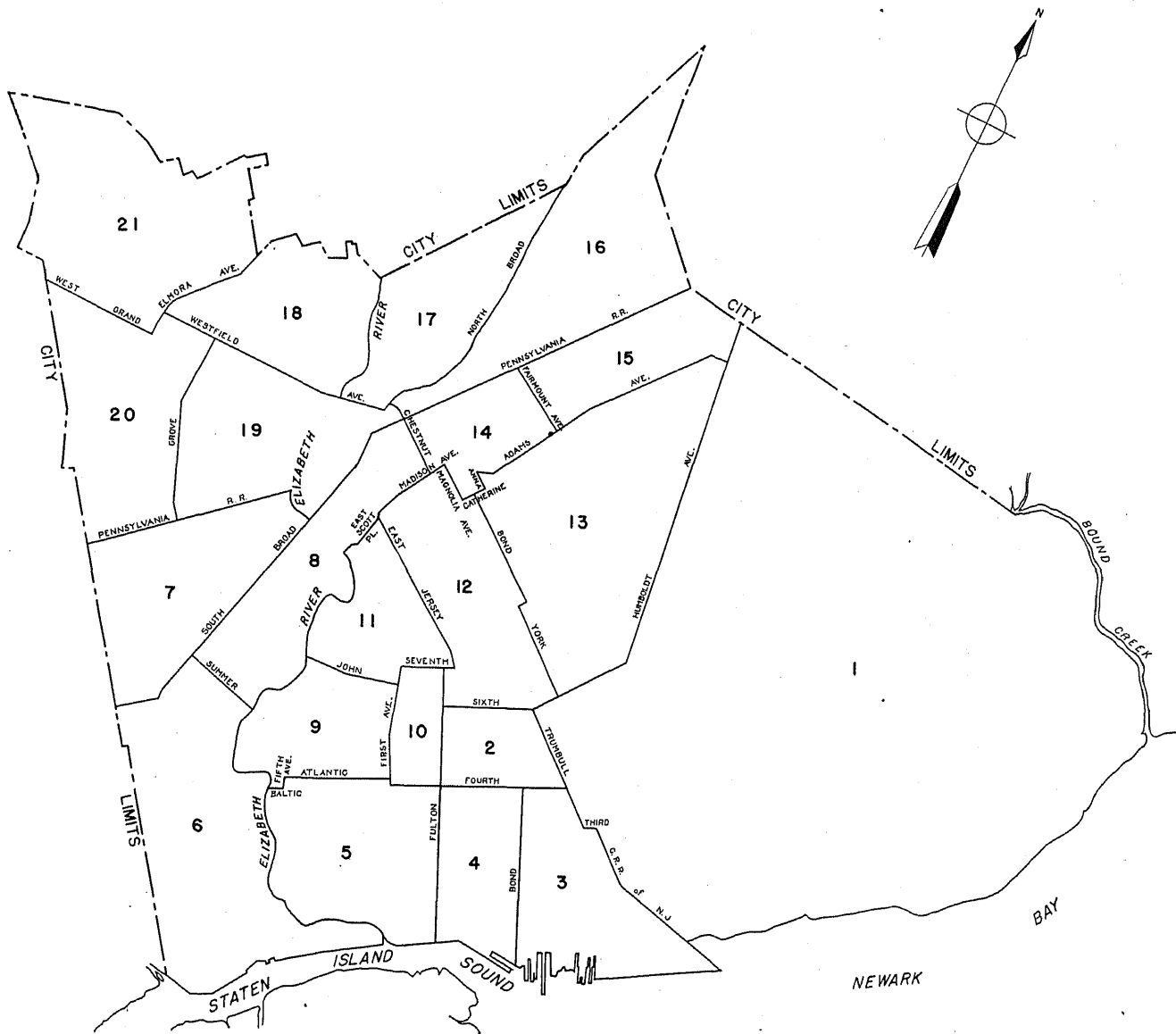
ATLANTIC CITY BY CENSUS TRACTS



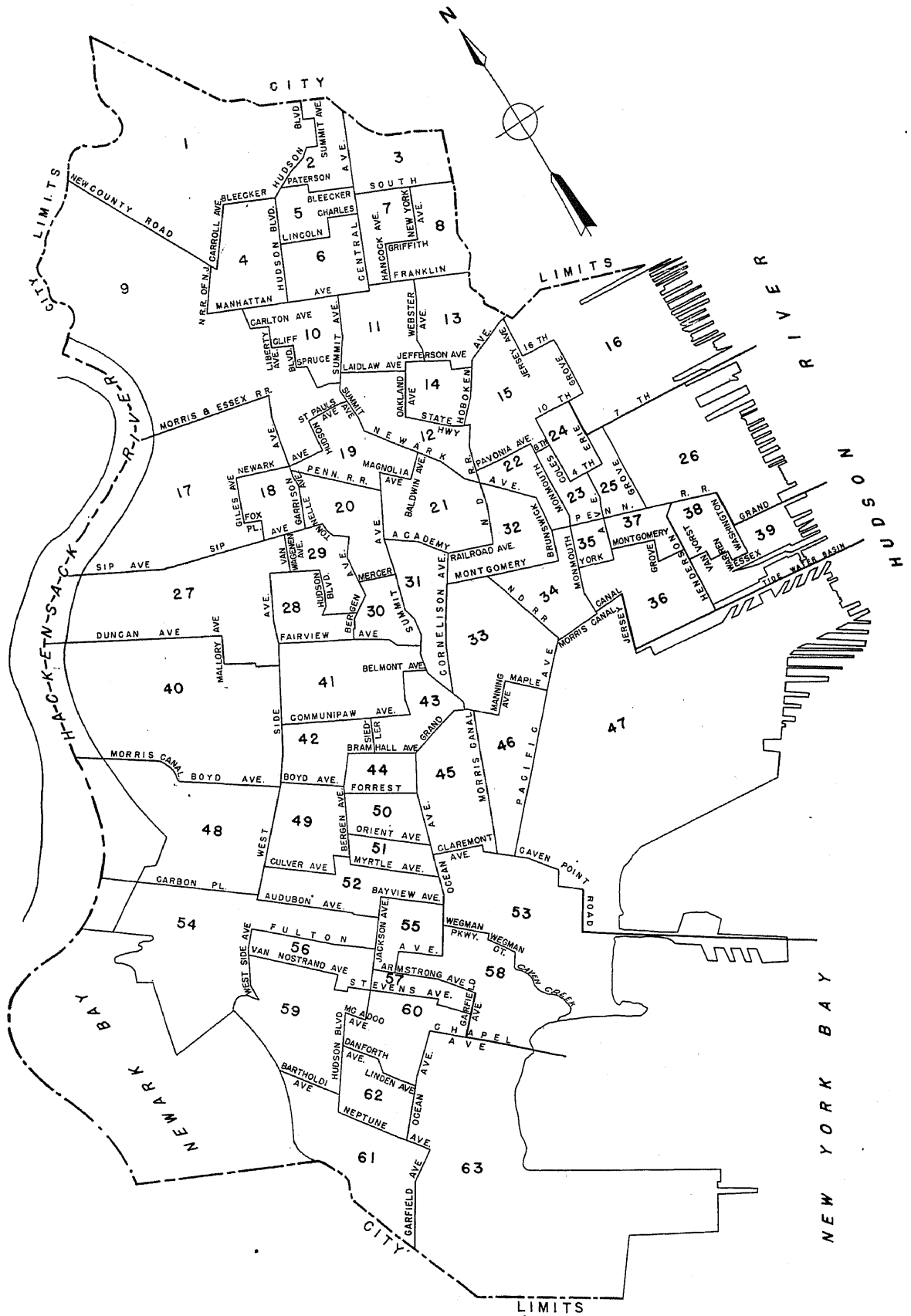
NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

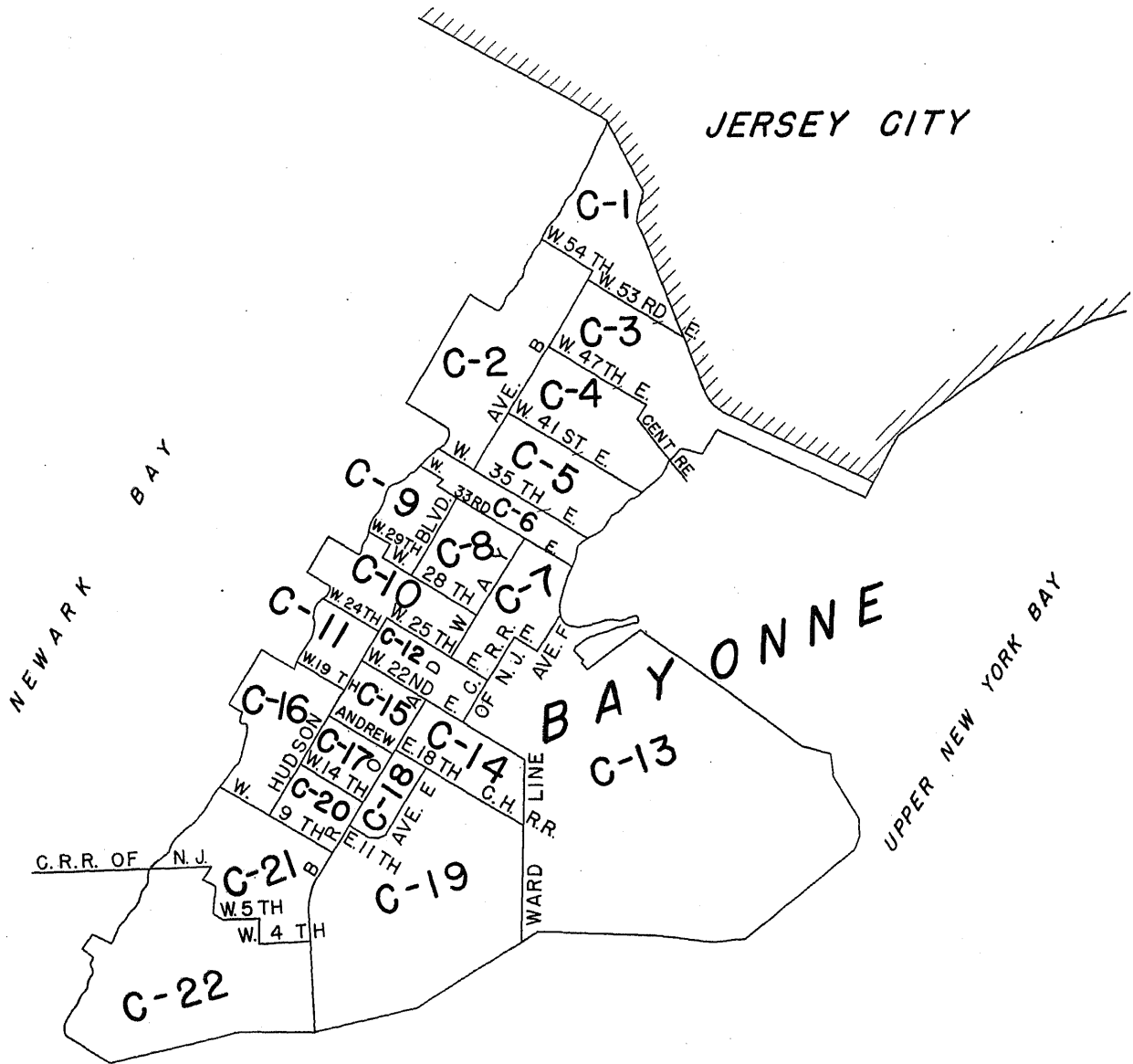

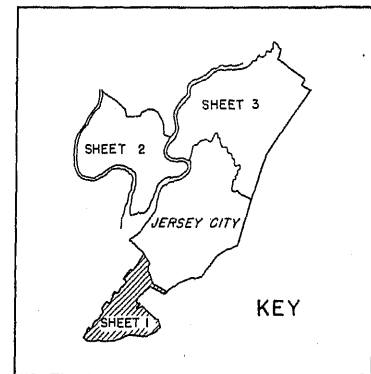
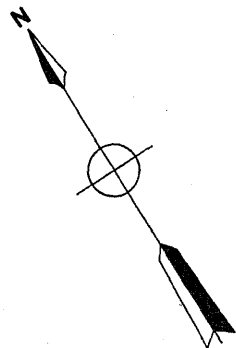


AREAS ADJACENT TO JERSEY CITY BY CENSUS TRACTS

Part 1.—Tracts in Hudson County (Bayonne)

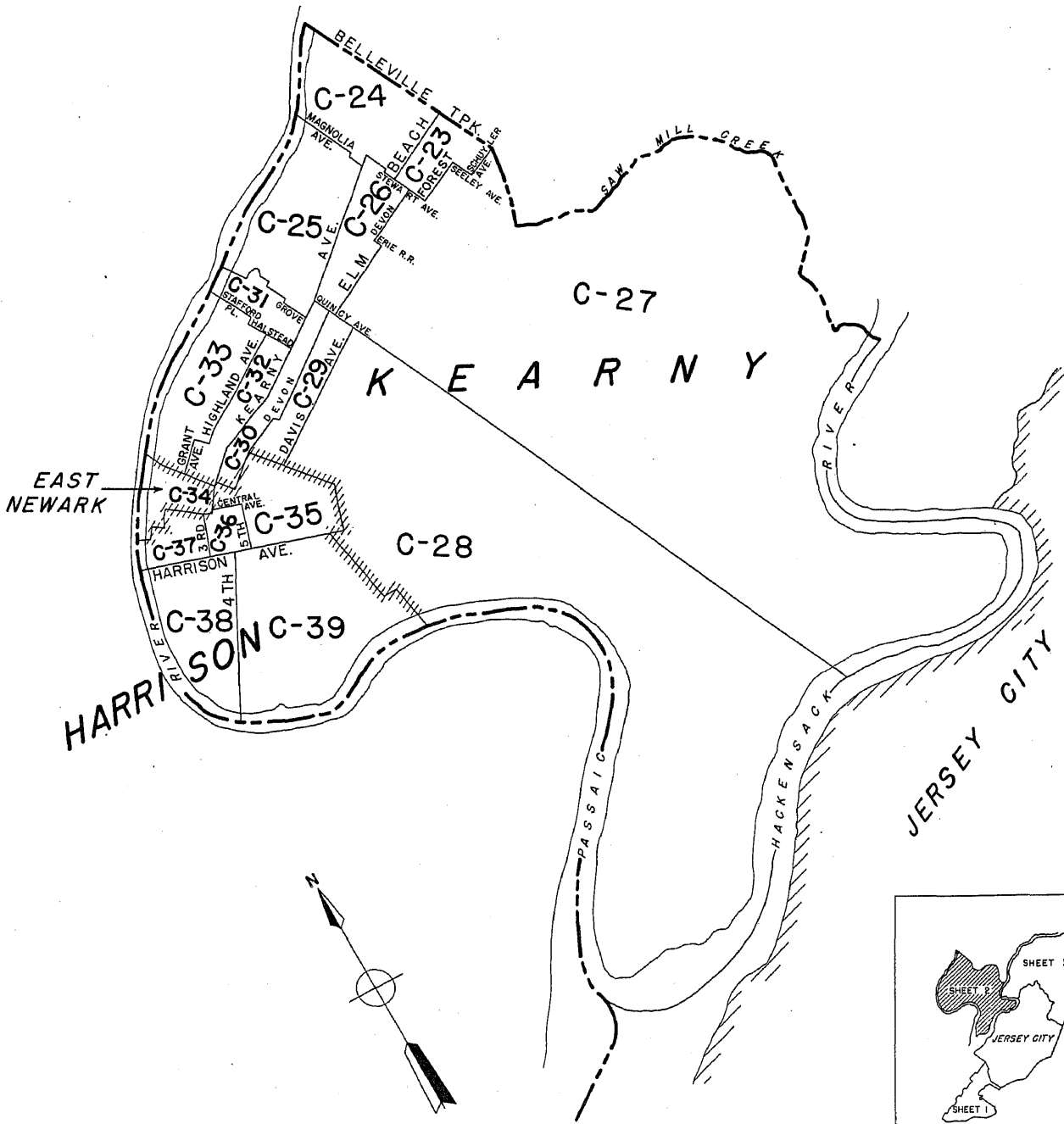


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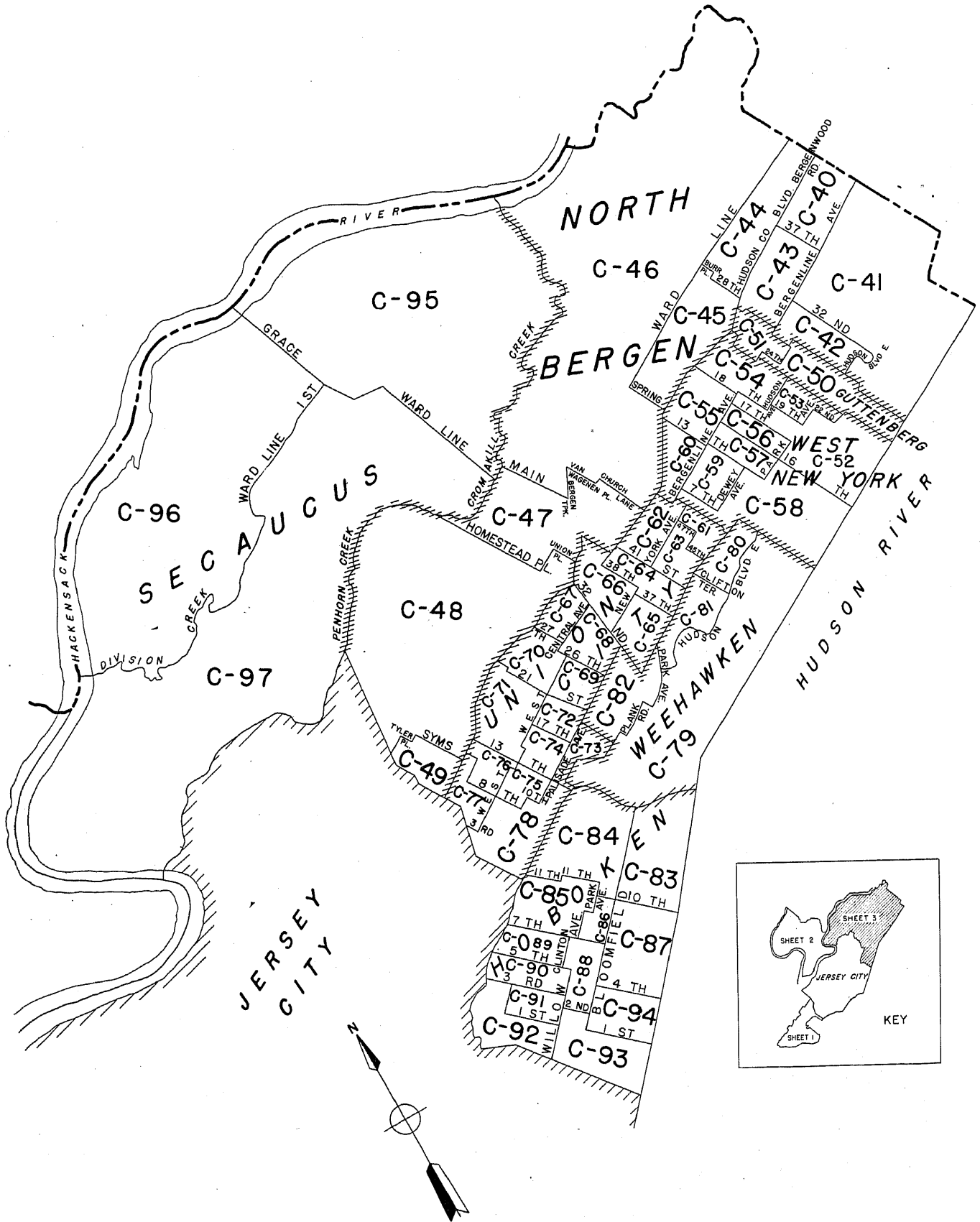
AREAS ADJACENT TO JERSEY CITY BY CENSUS TRACTS

Part 2.—Tracts in Hudson County (Kearny and Harrison)



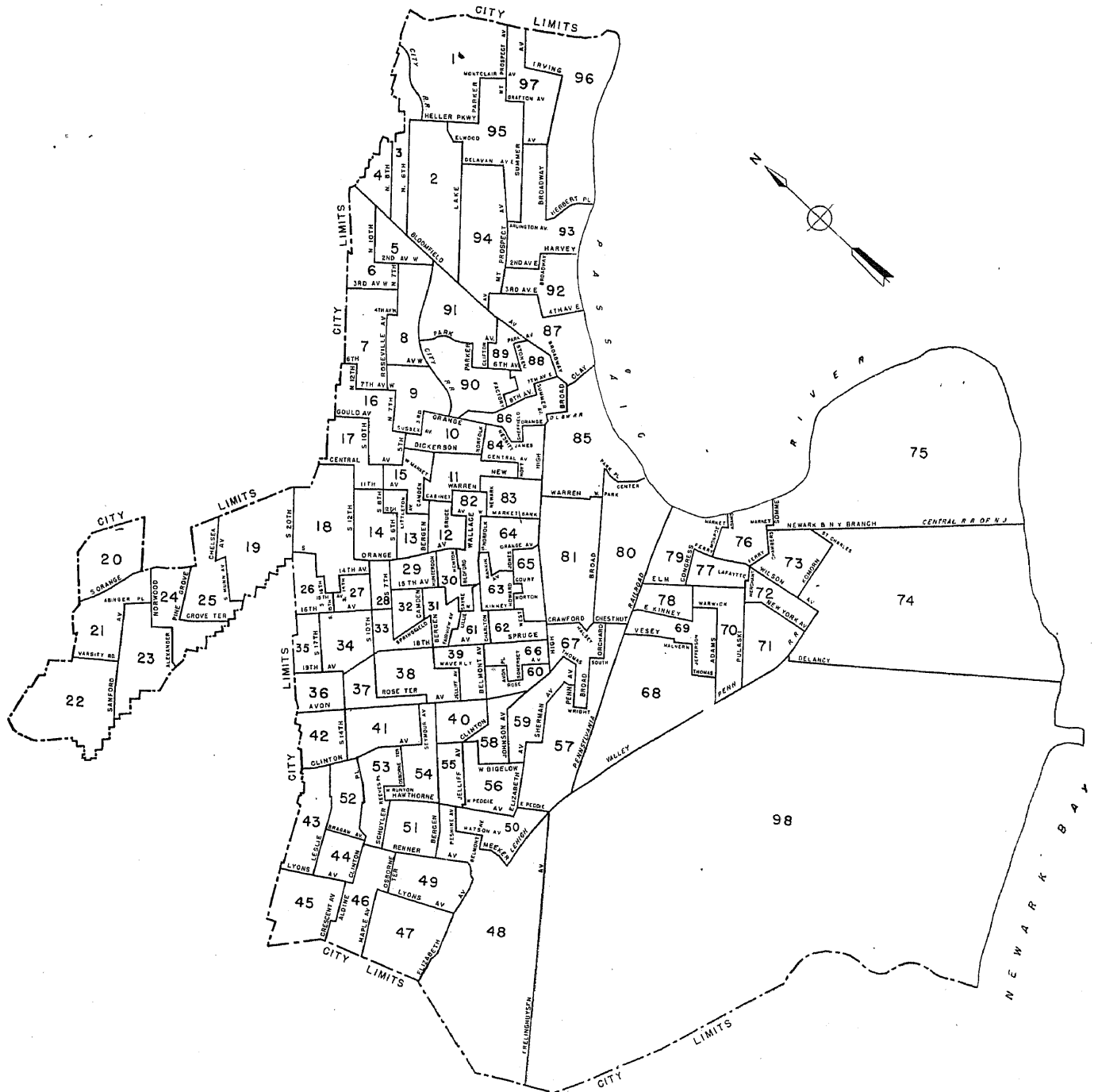
AREAS ADJACENT TO JERSEY CITY BY CENSUS TRACTS

Part 3.—Parts in Hudson County (Balance of County)

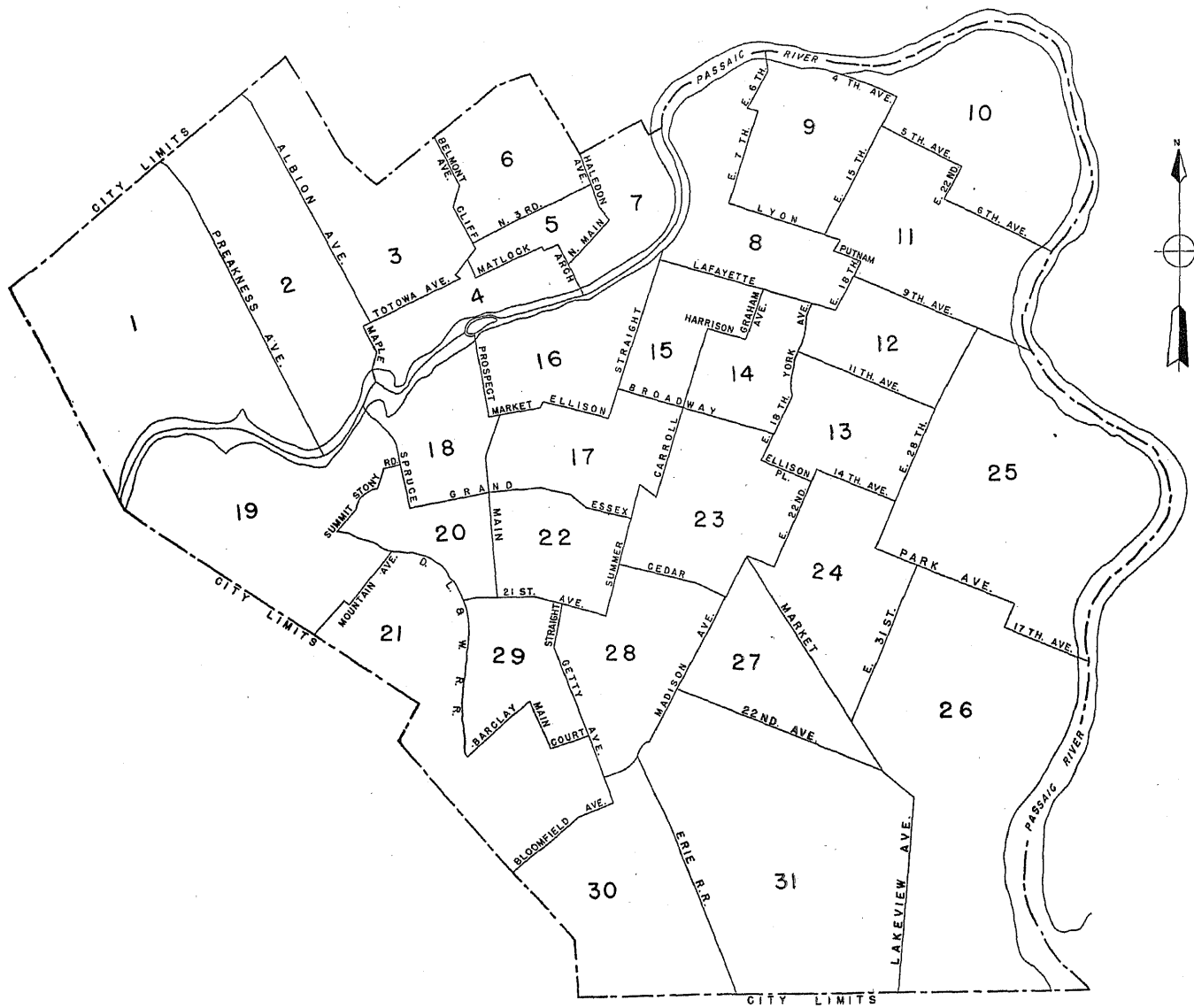

NEWARK BY CENSUS TRACTS

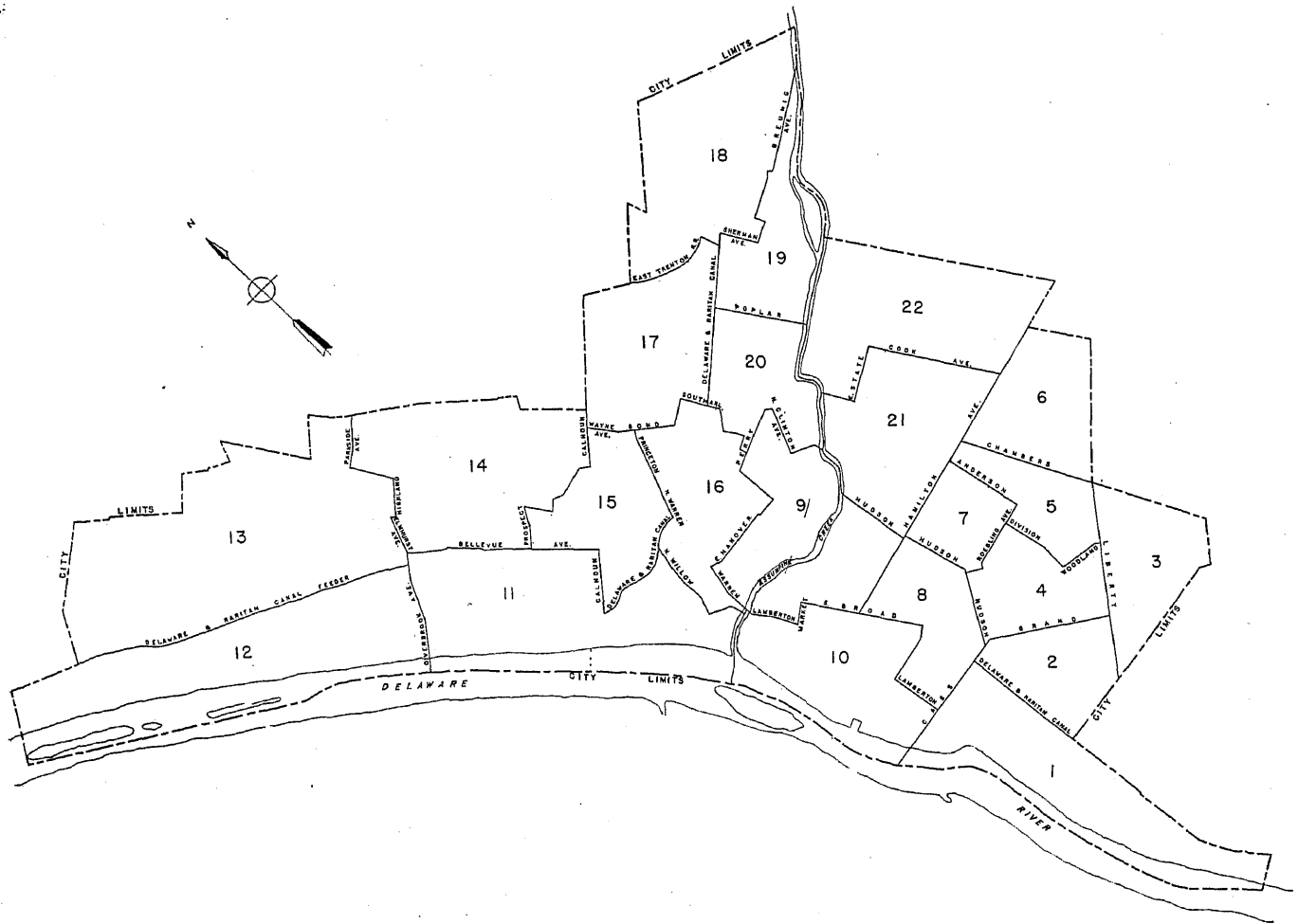


PATERSON BY CENSUS TRACTS
