

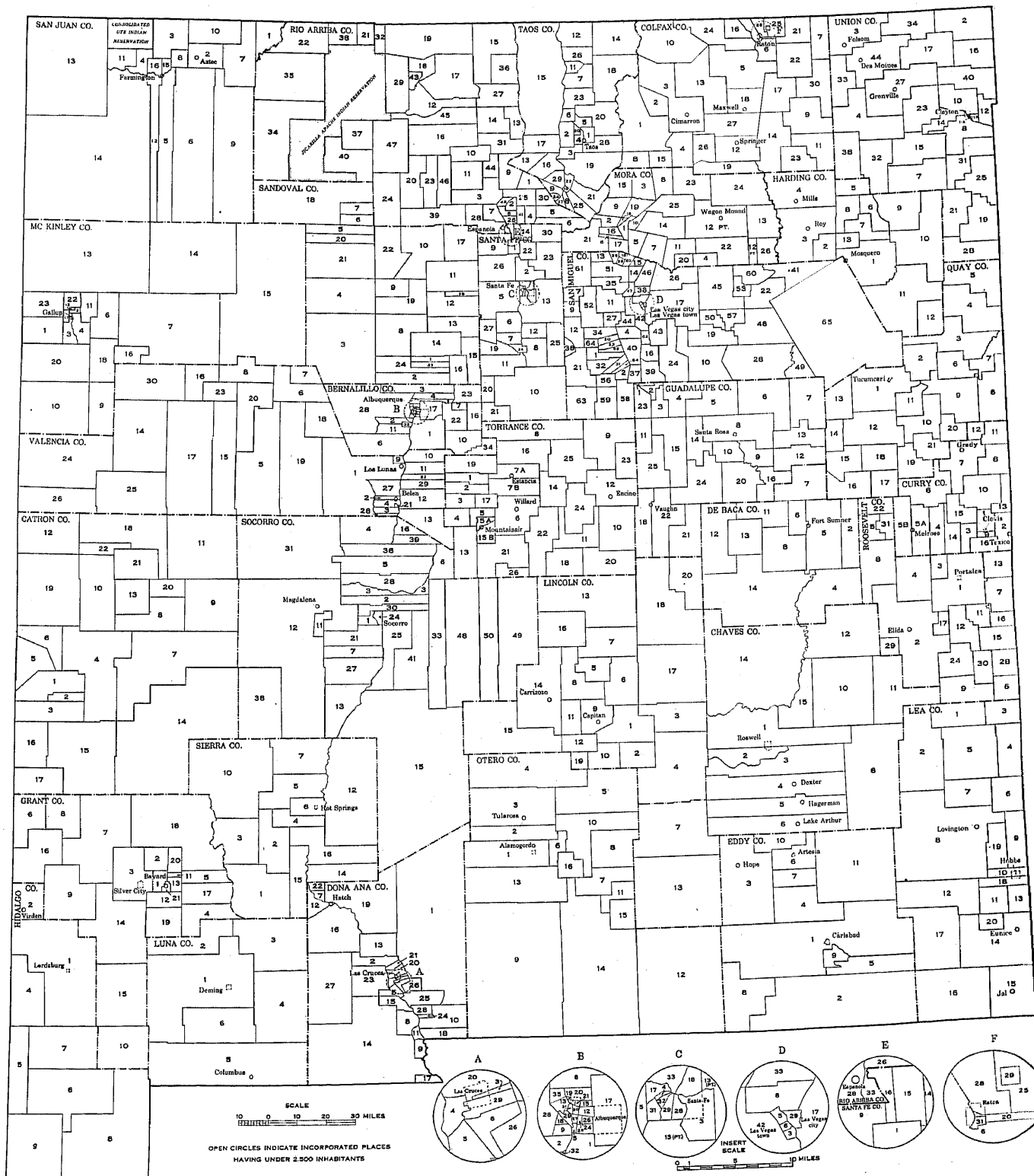

# NEW MEXICO

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—The Territory of New Mexico was organized in 1850 from the area now comprising the greater parts of the States of New Mexico and Arizona, together with small portions of Colorado and Nevada. In 1863, with the organization of the Arizona Territory, the boundaries of New Mexico were established as at present. In 1912, New Mexico was admitted to the Union as the forty-seventh State. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 531,818, which represents an increase of 108,501, or 25.6 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 121,511 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 4.4, as compared with 3.5 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of New Mexico from

1850, the year in which the Territory of New Mexico was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of New Mexico consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Hobbs was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit.

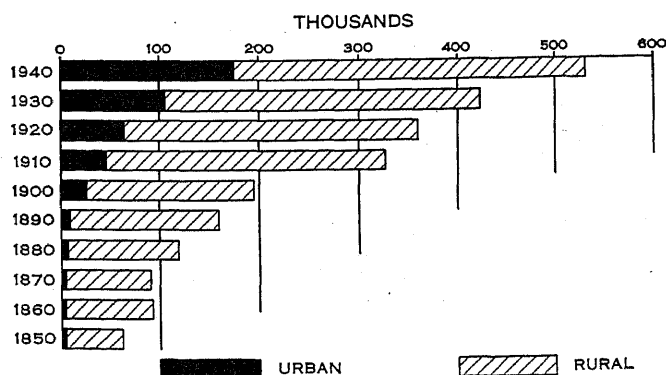

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of New Mexico is shown by counties, election precincts, cities, towns, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are five cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Albuquerque, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 35,449; and Santa Fe, the capital of the State, had a population of 20,325.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 31 counties of New Mexico from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population

per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Twenty-seven of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and four decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in New Mexico are called election precincts. (In Rio Arriba and San Juan Counties, there are Indian reservations that are separate from the election precincts.) The incorporated cities, towns, and villages form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 12 cities, 16 towns, and 35 villages. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions forms a part of some election precinct (or precincts).

DE BACA.—County totals for 1930 and 1920 include population (46 in 1930; 51 in 1920) of precinct 1, Dereno, annexed to 2 in 1932; population (32 in 1930; 58 in 1920) of precinct 9, Clancy Ranch, and population (45 in 1930; 55 in 1920) of precinct 10, Anal, annexed to 7; population (14 in 1930; 25 in 1920) of precinct 15, Walker Ranch, annexed to 4, in 1936; population (76 in 1930; 162 in 1920) of precinct 3, La Lande, annexed to 5 in 1938. Part of Fort Sumner village reverted to precinct 5 in 1931. Precinct 14 returned in 1930 as Ingleville; part annexed to precinct 12 in 1932.

DONA ANA.—Precinct 14 organized from parts of 5, 8, 9, 11, and 15 in 1924; precinct 24 organized from part of 10, and precinct 25 from parts of 1 and 6, in 1926, but not returned separately in 1930. Precinct 26 organized from part of 6 in 1930; precinct 27 from parts of 4, 5, 8, 15, and 23 in 1931; precinct 28 from part of 10 in 1932; and precinct 29 from part of 3, including part of Las Cruces town, in 1933. Part of precinct 9 annexed to 18 in 1930, and part of 18 annexed to 9, in 1931. Precinct 16 returned as Colorado, and precinct 23 as Picacho, in 1930.

EDDY.—Part of precinct 4 annexed to 1 in 1934, and part of precinct 1 annexed to Carlsbad city in 1938. Artesia town incorporated as a city in 1930.

GRANT.—County redistricted in 1932; comparative figures shown wherever possible. Part of precinct 3 annexed to Silver City town in 1938. Bayard village incorporated in 1938.

GUADALUPE.—County totals for 1930 and 1920 include population (63 in 1930; 172 in 1920) of precinct 19, Los Tanos, annexed to 8 in 1932; and population (26 in 1930; 103 in 1920) of old precinct 21, Benavidez, annexed to 7 since 1930. Total for 1920 also includes population (57) of precinct 17, annexed to 4 in 1924. New precinct 21 organized in 1937 from part of 22. Precinct 9 returned in 1930 as Puerto de Luna, precinct 23 as Canon Blanco, precinct 24 as Sanchez, and precinct 25 as Sombrillo.

HARDING.—County total for 1930 includes population (113) of old precinct 12, and population (37) of old precinct 13, annexed to 11; population (78) of old precinct 15, and population (94) of old precinct 16, annexed to 10; population (138) of old precinct 17, annexed to 4; population (278) of old precinct 18, taken to form part of new 9, in 1936; and population (60) of old precinct 9, annexed to 1 in 1938. Part of precinct 2 annexed to 3 in 1932; part of precinct 6 taken to form part of new 9 in 1936; and part of precinct 11, returned in 1930 as Lower Mosquero, annexed to 1 in 1938. Number of precinct 7 changed from 8, precinct 8 from 19, and precinct 13 from 7, since 1930. Mosquero village returned in 1930 as in Harding County only, and precinct 12, Pleasant Valley, as precinct 14, Logan.

HIDALGO.—County totals for 1930 and 1920 include population (1,113 in 1930; 1,470 in 1920) of precinct 3, annexed to 1 in 1934.

LEA.—County total for 1920 includes population (90) of old precinct 3, annexed to 5, and population (25) of old precinct 13, annexed to 14, in 1921. Parts of precinct 7 annexed to 6 and 8, and precinct 17 organized from parts of 12 and 14, in 1930. Part of precinct 11 annexed to 10, and part of precinct 10 taken to form new 13, in 1932. Precinct 18 organized from parts of 10, including part of Hobbs city, and precinct 11, and precinct 19 organized from part of 9, in 1936. Precinct 20 organized from part of 14 in 1938. Precinct 4 returned in 1930 as Harmony, and precinct 7 as Plainview. Lovington village incorporated as a town in 1930, and Hobbs village incorporated as a city in 1937. Eunice town incorporated in 1935.

LINCOLN.—Precinct 19 organized from parts of precincts 10 and 12 in 1931, and precinct 20 organized from part of 18 in 1936. Capitan village incorporated in 1937.

Total for 1920 also includes population (75) of precinct 54, annexed to 17 in 1920. Parts of precincts 41 and 60 annexed to 22, and new precinct 56 organized from part of 59, since 1930; precincts 64 and 63 organized from parts of 20 and 21, respectively, in 1931; part of precinct 6 annexed to 3 in 1930; new precinct 38 organized from parts of 12 and 21 in 1933; new precinct 49 and precinct 65 organized from parts of 28 in 1933 and 1937, respectively. Number and name of precinct 54, Lovato, changed from 58, Gonzales, in 1935. Precinct 16 returned in 1930 as Union; precinct 22, Sabinoso, as 41, Canon Largo; and precinct 41, Canon Largo, as 22, Sabinoso. Mosquero village returned in 1930 as in Harding County only.

25 SANTA FE.—County redistricted between 1920 and 1930 and partially redistricted since 1930; comparative figures shown wherever possible.

26 SIERRA.—County partially redistricted between 1920 and 1930, and again in 1936; comparative figures shown wherever possible. Number of precinct 1 changed from 13 in 1936.

27 SOCORRO.—County redistricted in 1921; comparative figures shown wherever possible. County totals for 1930 and 1920 include population (40 in 1930; 66 in 1920) of precinct 18, Water Canon, annexed to 12 in 1930; population (245 in 1930; 305 in 1920) of precinct 14, Old San Marcial, annexed to 13; population (72 in 1930; 59 in 1920) of precinct 40, Besoqueto, annexed to 25; population (123 in 1930; 567 in 1920) of precinct 42, Tokay, annexed to 41; population (61 in 1930; 275 in 1920) of precinct 43, La Mesa, annexed to 15 in 1938; population (38 in 1930; 69 in 1920) of precinct 45, Rosedale, annexed to 12 in 1939; population (135 in 1930; 194 in 1920) of precinct 46, Midway, annexed to 13 in 1938. 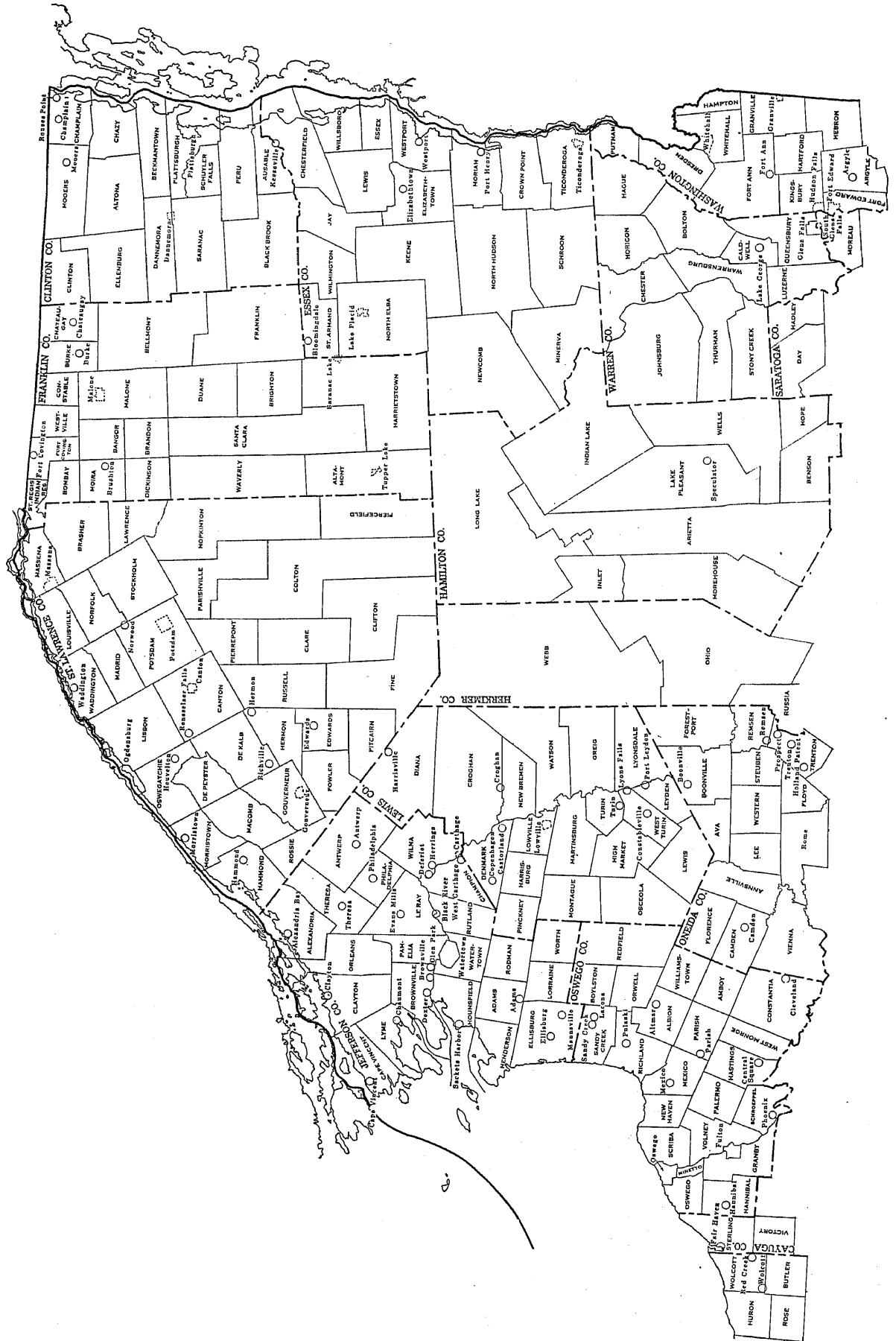
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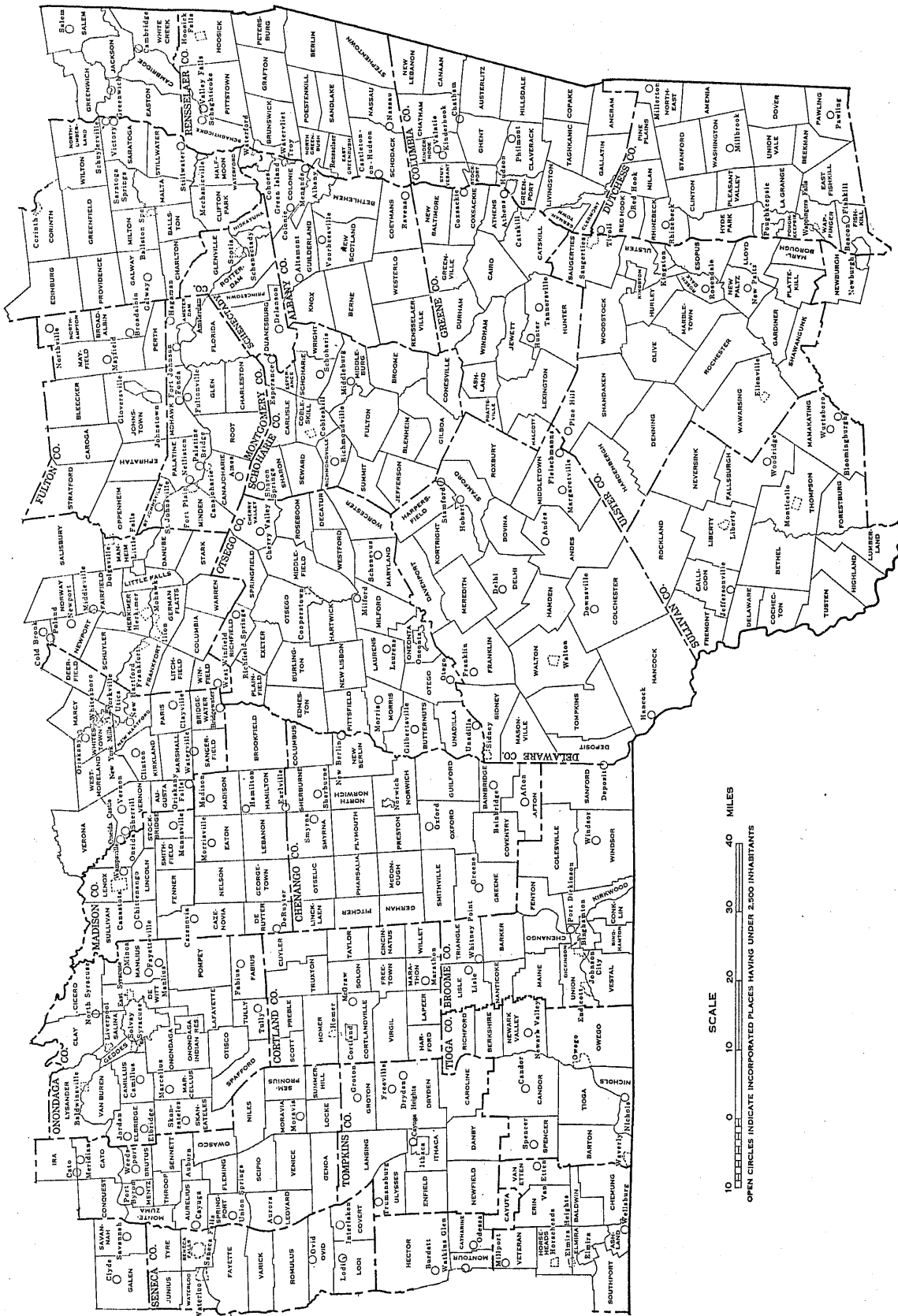
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NEW YORK—NORTHEASTERN AND EAST CENTRAL PARTS  
MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNS

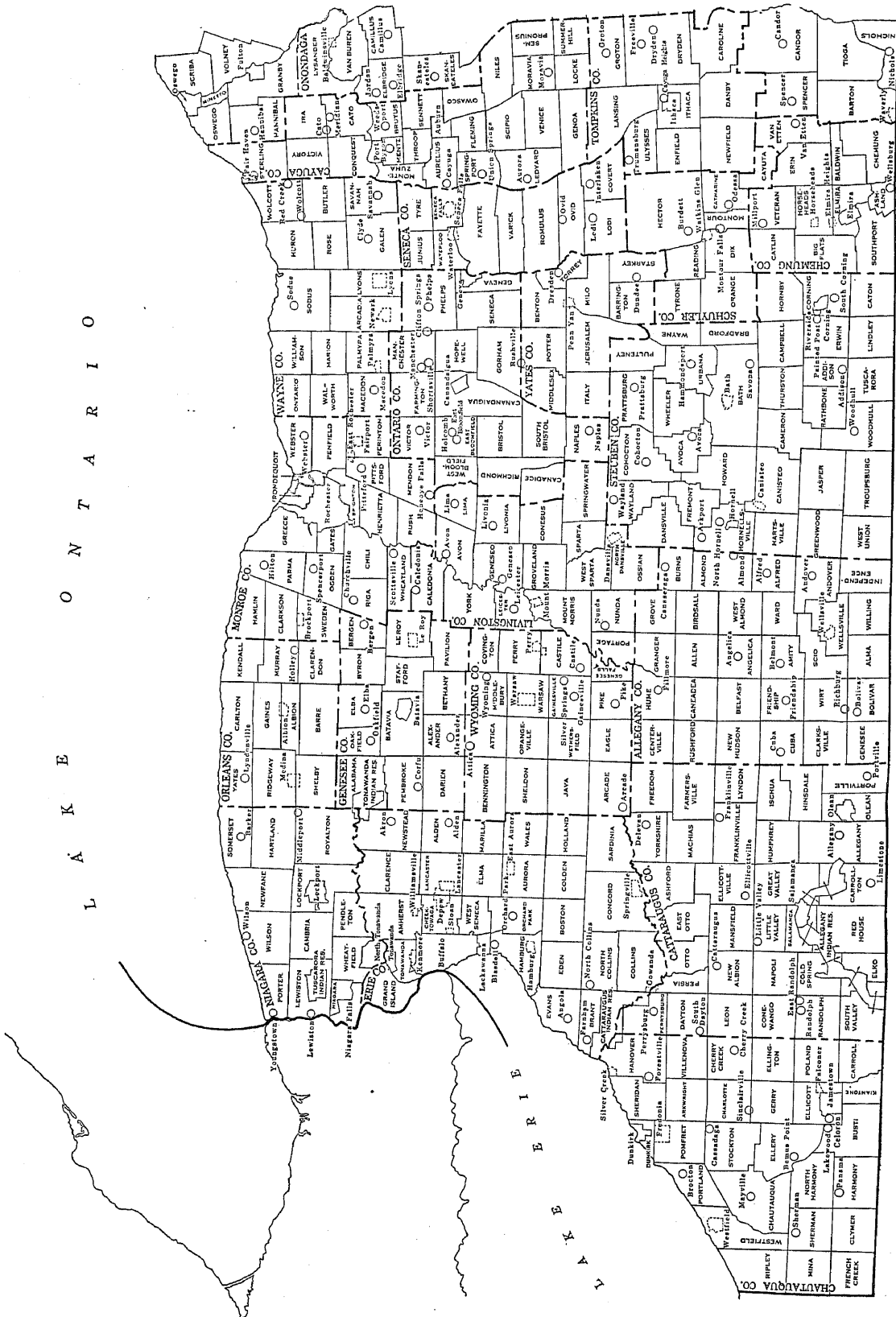

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—New York was one of the Thirteen Original States. In 1853, with the annexation of a small area from Massachusetts, New York assumed its present boundaries. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 13,479,142, which represents an increase of 891,076, or 7.1 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 47,929 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 281.2, as compared with 262.6 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of New York from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accom-

panying chart. The urban population of New York, as defined by the Census Bureau, consists mainly of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more. It also includes the population of one town<sup>1</sup> (not incorporated as a municipality nor containing any areas so incorporated) that had a total population of more than 10,000 and a population density of more than 1,000 per square mile. The remainder of the population is classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they meet the requirements. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they no longer meet the requirements. For example, Sidney qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940 but not in 1930.

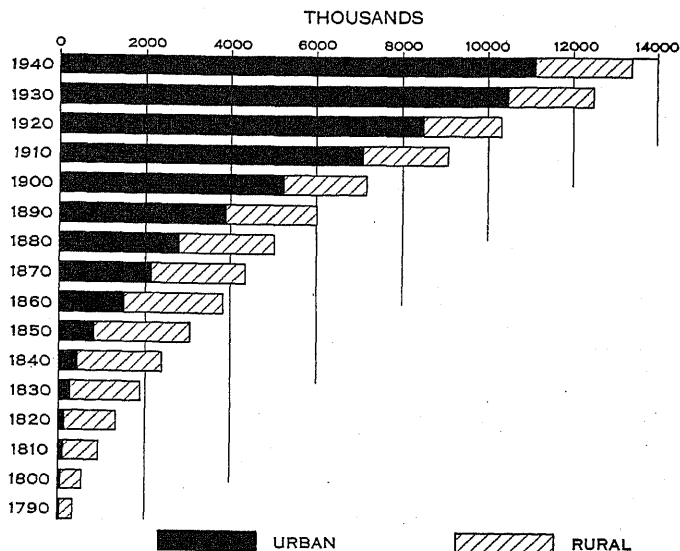

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of New York is shown by counties, towns, cities, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards or assembly districts. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 to 7-F and data for the census tracts of the tracted cities in tables 8 to 8-H.

**Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.**—There are 70 incorporated places in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these incorporated places at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. New York City, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 7,454,995; and Albany, the capital of the State, had a population of 130,577. The population from 1790 to 1940 of New York City and its five boroughs as now constituted is presented separately in table 2-A.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 62 counties of New York from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Of the 60 counties whose boundaries remained unchanged since 1930, 47 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 13 decreased. Part of Queens County was annexed to Kings County and part of Kings County was annexed to Queens County in 1931. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly

settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Albany-Schenectady-Troy metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. The Albany-Schenectady-Troy metropolitan district had 431,575 inhabitants in 1940, as compared with 425,259 in 1930. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Table 7-E shows the population of the Syracuse metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Syracuse metropolitan district had 258,352 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 245,015. Camillus and Manlius towns, Onondaga County, were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. These new areas had a combined population of 12,239 in 1940 and 11,686 in 1930.

**Census tracts.**—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities have been subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. Through the use of census tract data comparisons may be made from census to census. Tracts are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area, and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 and 1930 population of Buffalo is shown by census tracts.



Table 8-A presents the 1940 population of Rochester by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. The 1940 population by census tracts is shown in tables 8-B and 8-C for Syracuse and

Yonkers, respectively, and in tables 8-D to 8-H for the five boroughs of New York City. Comparative figures for 1930 are not shown because of extensive revision of tract boundaries since 1930. The tracted areas for these five cities are shown on the accompanying maps.

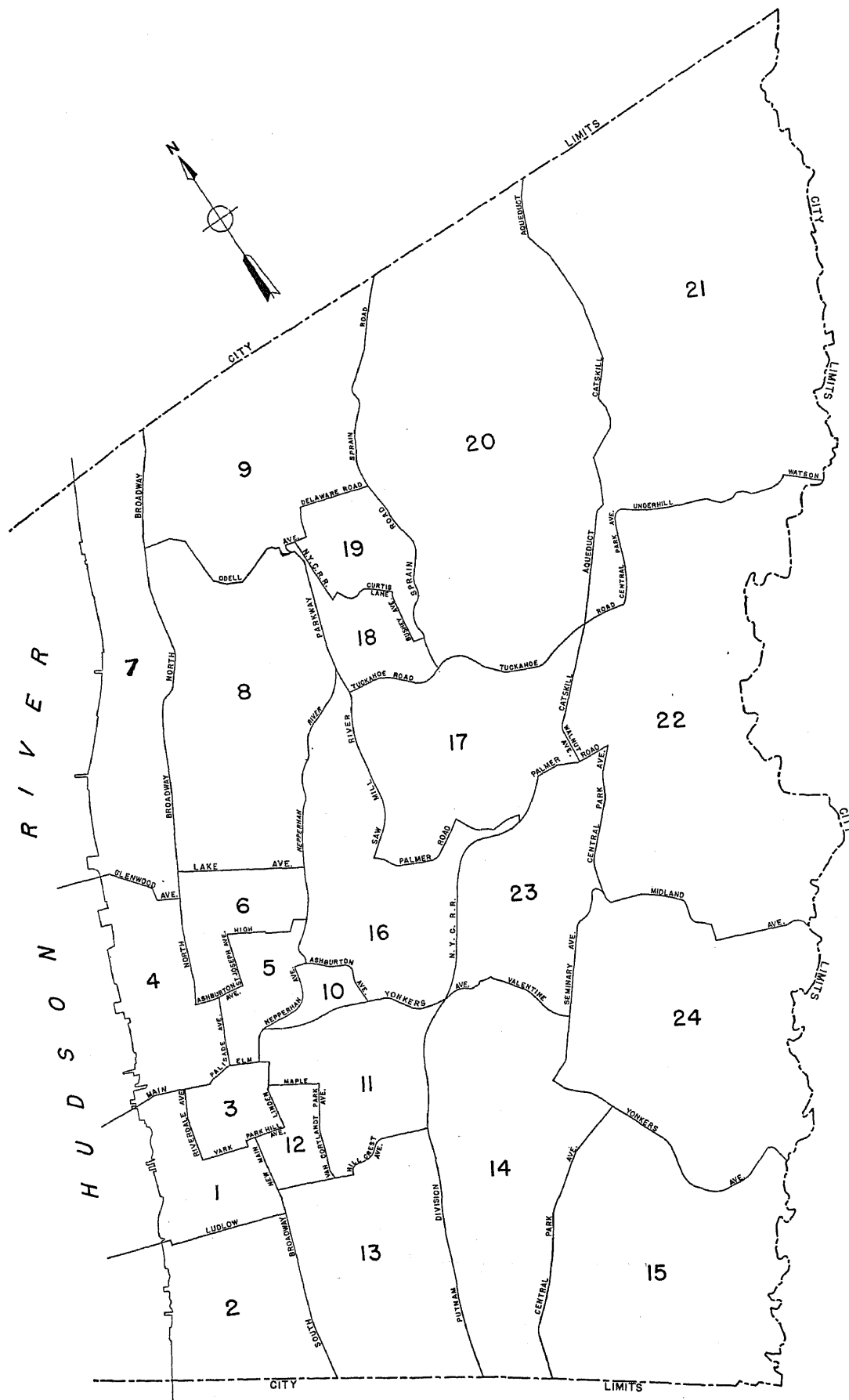
# NUMBER OF INHABITANTS ROCHESTER BY CENSUS TRACTS

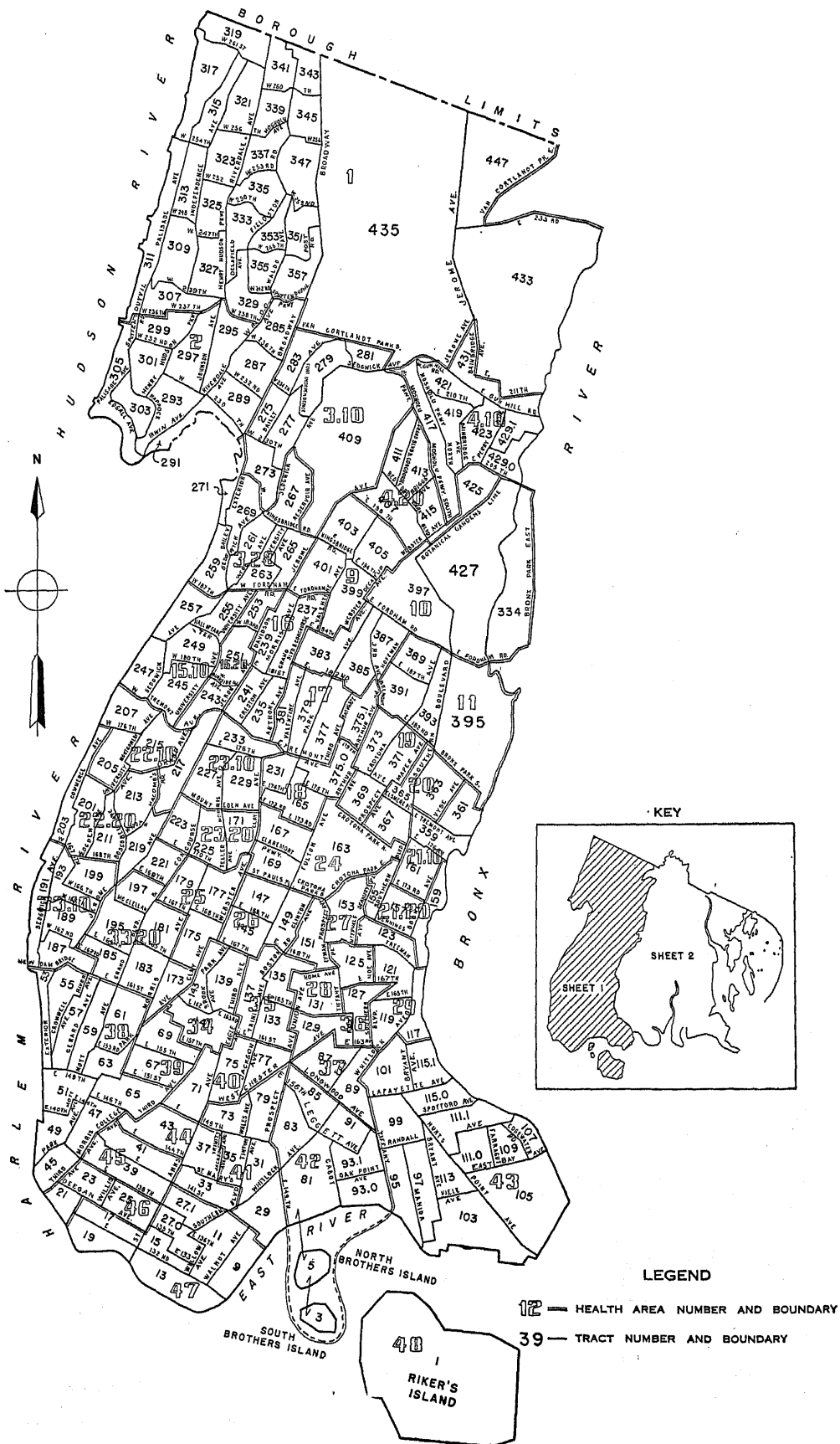

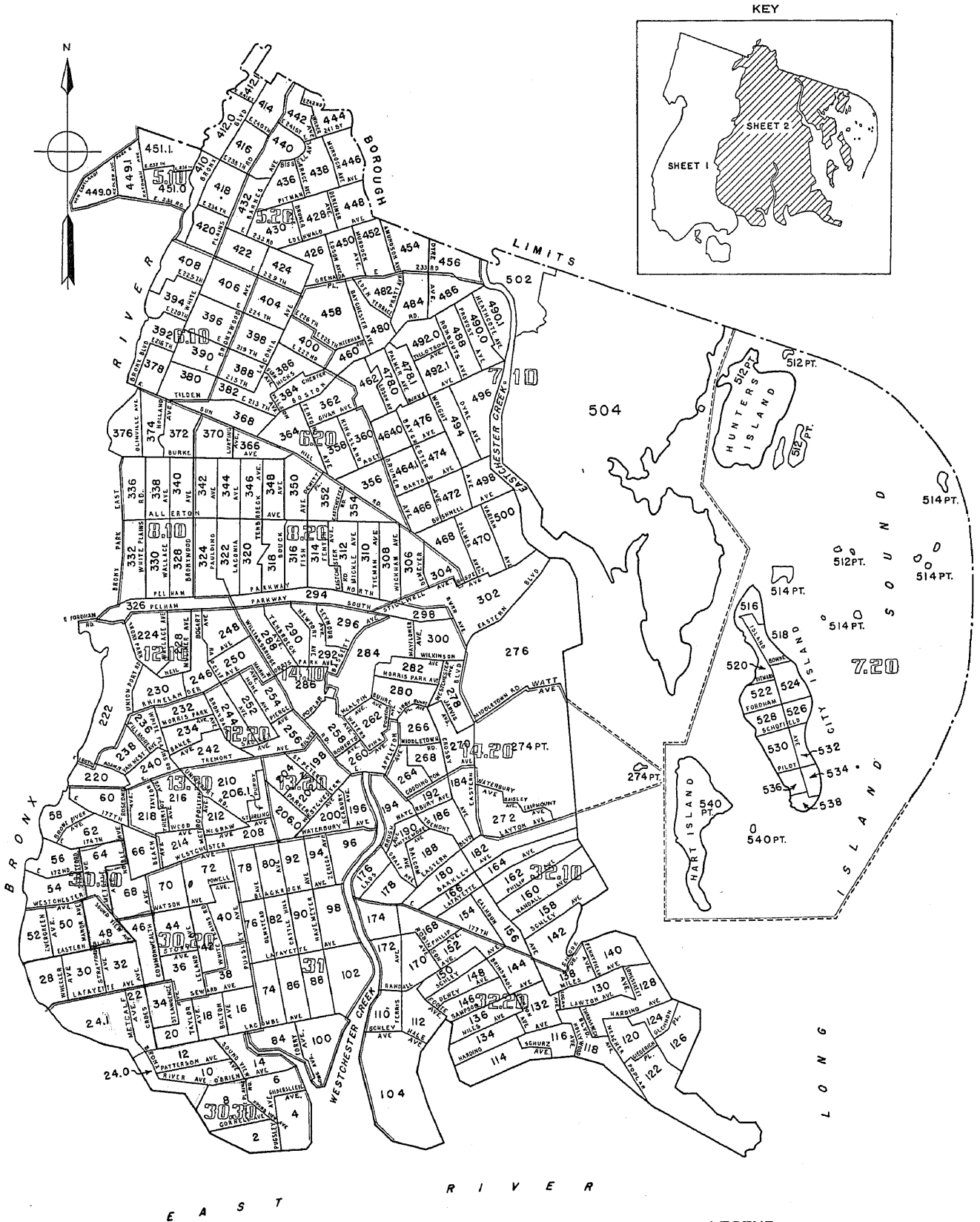

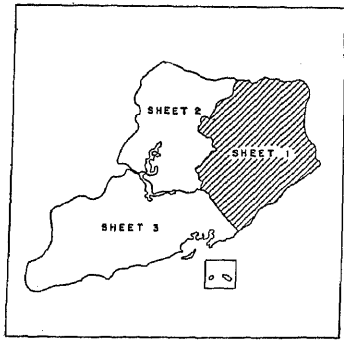


NEW YORK CITY BY HEALTH AREAS AND CENSUS TRACTS

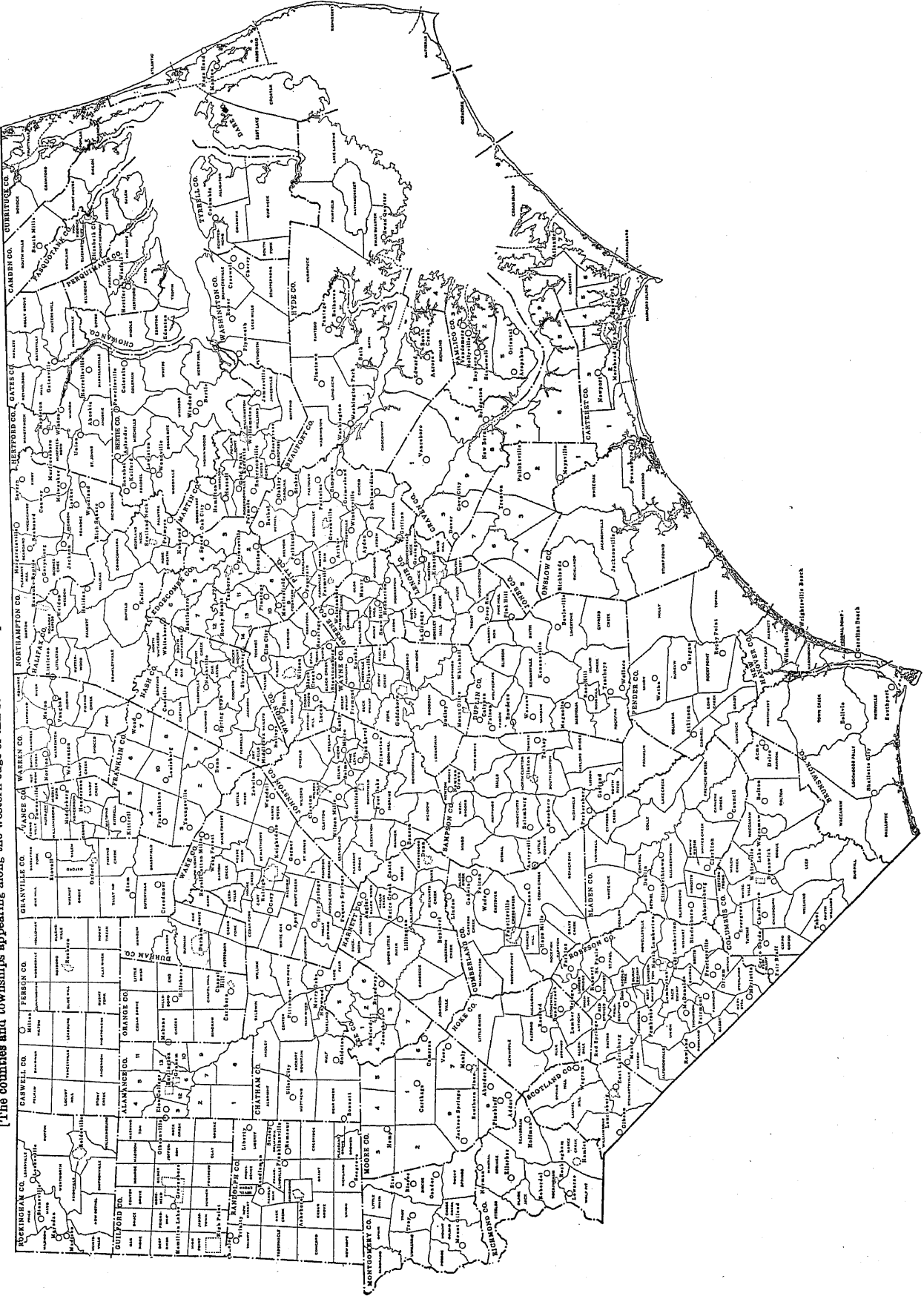

# NORTH CAROLINA

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—North Carolina was one of the Thirteen Original States. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 3,571,623, which represents an increase of 401,347, or 12.7 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 49,142 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 72.7, as compared with 64.5 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of North Carolina from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census

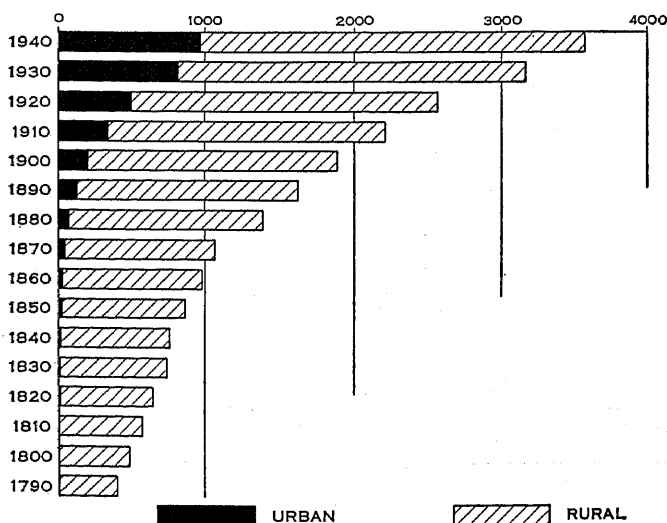
is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of North Carolina consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Brevard was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit; for example, Belhaven was removed from the urban list in 1920.

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of North Carolina is shown by counties, townships, cities, towns, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards, and tables 7 to 7-D present data for the metropolitan districts.

**Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.**—There are 26 incorporated places (cities and towns) in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these incorporated places at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Charlotte, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 100,899; and Raleigh, the capital of the State, had a population of 46,897.

**Minor civil divisions.**—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in North Carolina are called townships. The incorporated cities, towns, and villages form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 33 cities, 450 towns, and 5 villages. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of some township (or townships).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, cities, towns, and villages for the last three censuses. The population of the cities, towns, and villages is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more townships in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first township. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications.

A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit, but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory

in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

All of the metropolitan districts in North Carolina were defined for the first time in 1940. In each case, for comparison, the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase between 1930 and 1940.

Table 7 shows the population of the Asheville metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. In 1940 the Asheville metropolitan district had 76,324 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the same area had a population of 70,537.

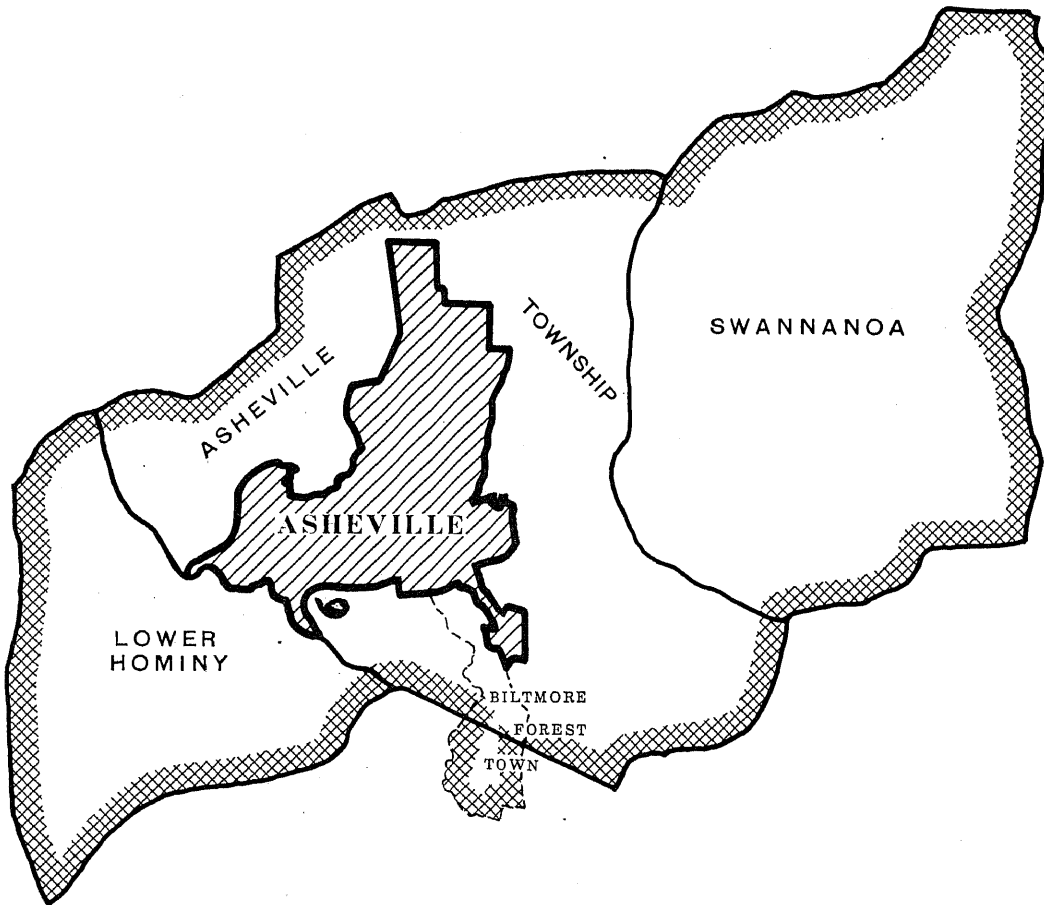

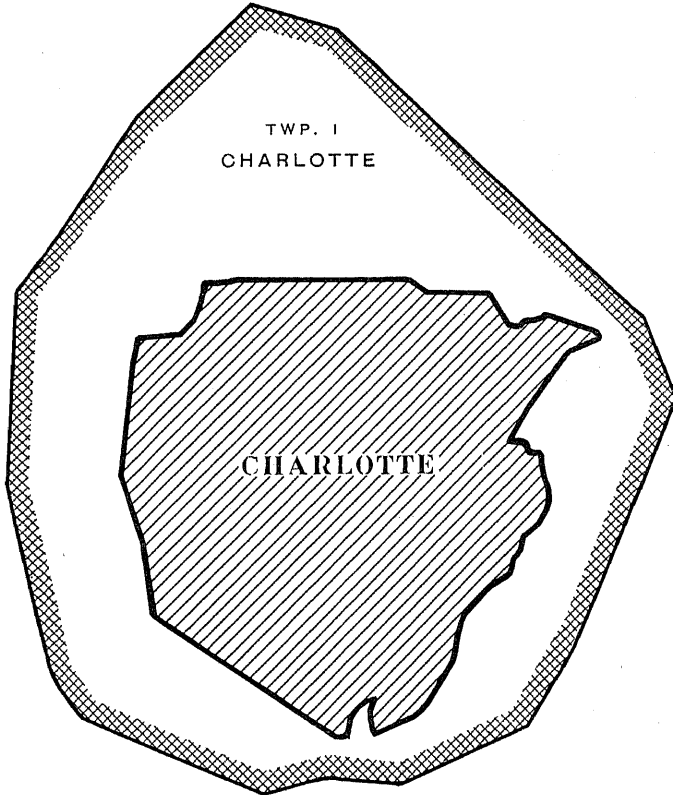

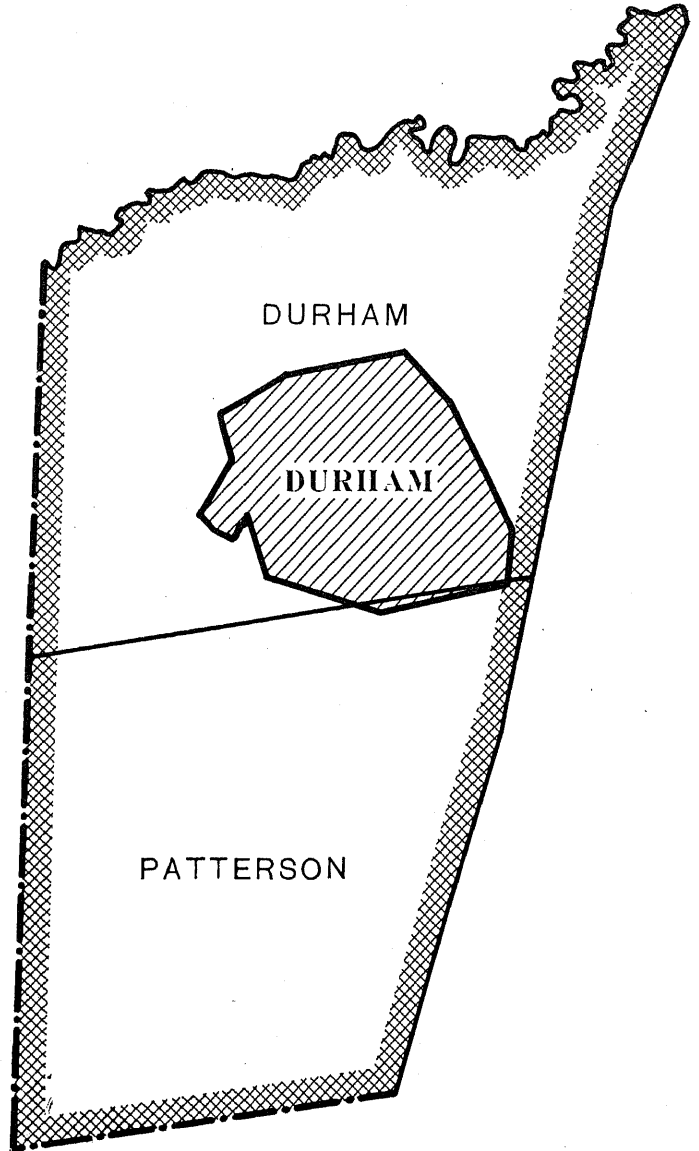
ASHEVILLE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



CHARLOTTE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

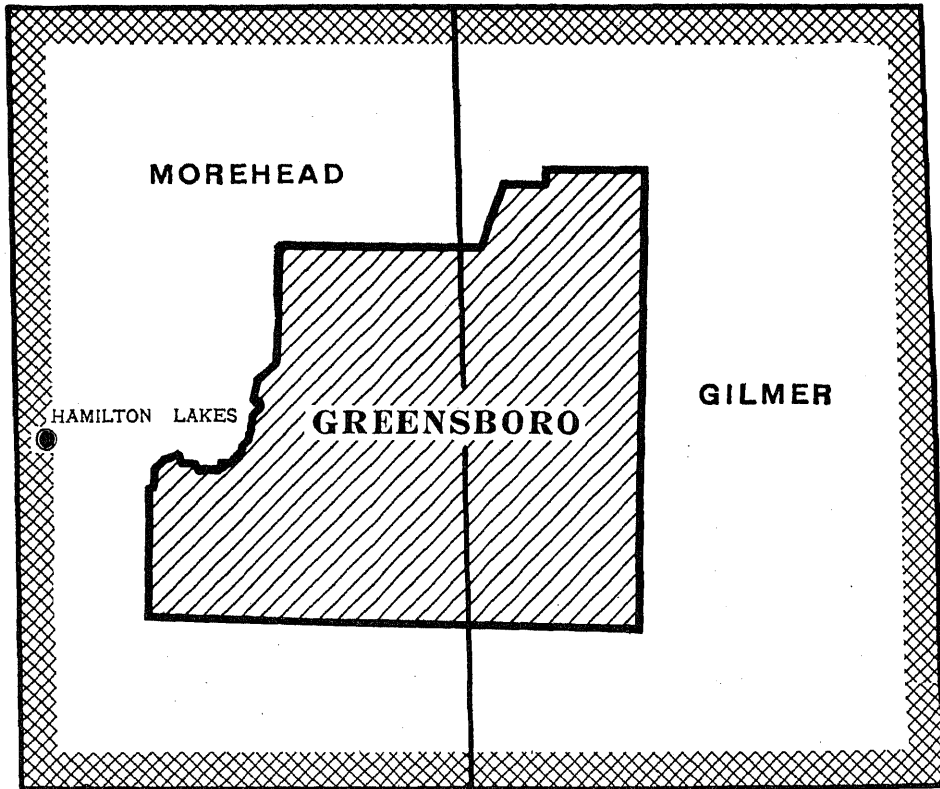


DURHAM METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

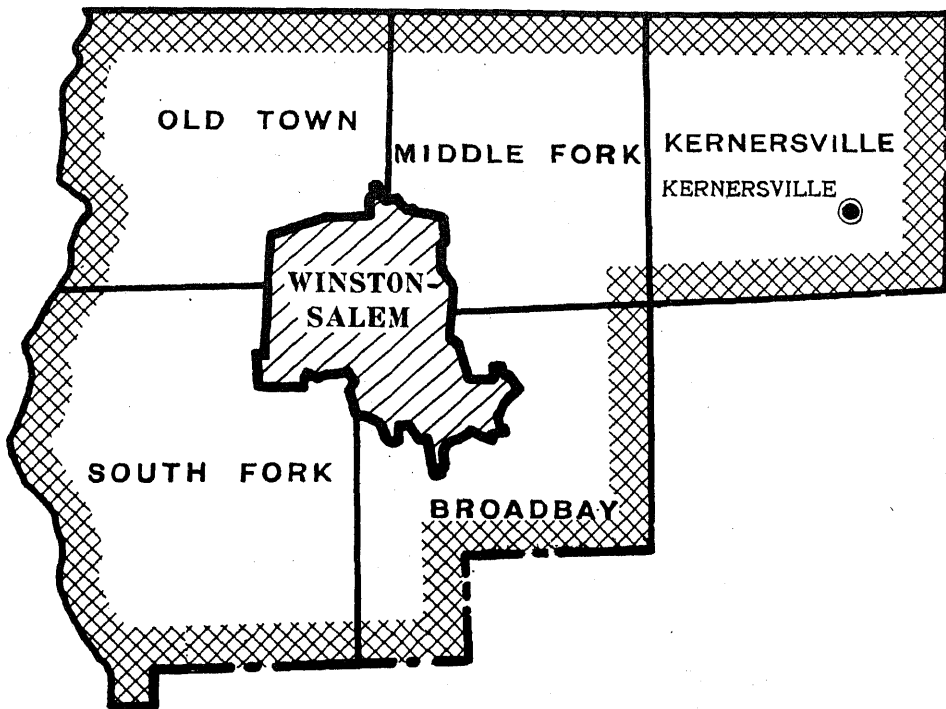


NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—North Dakota was organized as a State from a part of Dakota Territory, and was admitted to the Union in 1889. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 641,935, which represents a decrease of 38,910, or 5.7 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 70,054 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 9.2, as compared with 9.7 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of North Dakota from 1870, the year in which the Dakota Territory was first enumerated by areas that can be grouped to produce the present State area, to 1940, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of North Dakota consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population

being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Grafton was classified as urban in 1920 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit.

URBAN AND RURAL POPULATION OF NORTH DAKOTA: 1870 TO 1940

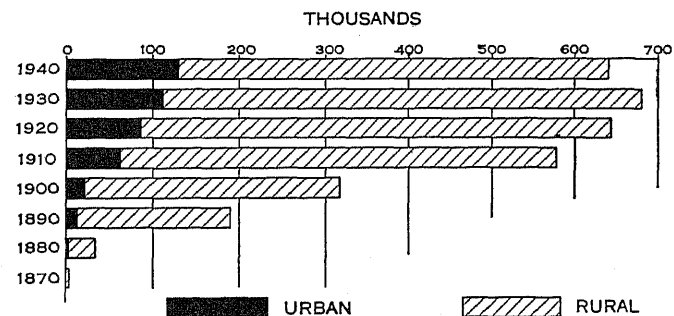

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of North Dakota is shown by counties, townships, cities, towns, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are four cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase during each decade. Fargo, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 32,580; and Bismarck, the capital of the State, had a population of 15,496.

**Counties.**—Table 3 shows the population of the 53 counties of North Dakota from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Ten of the counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 43 decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

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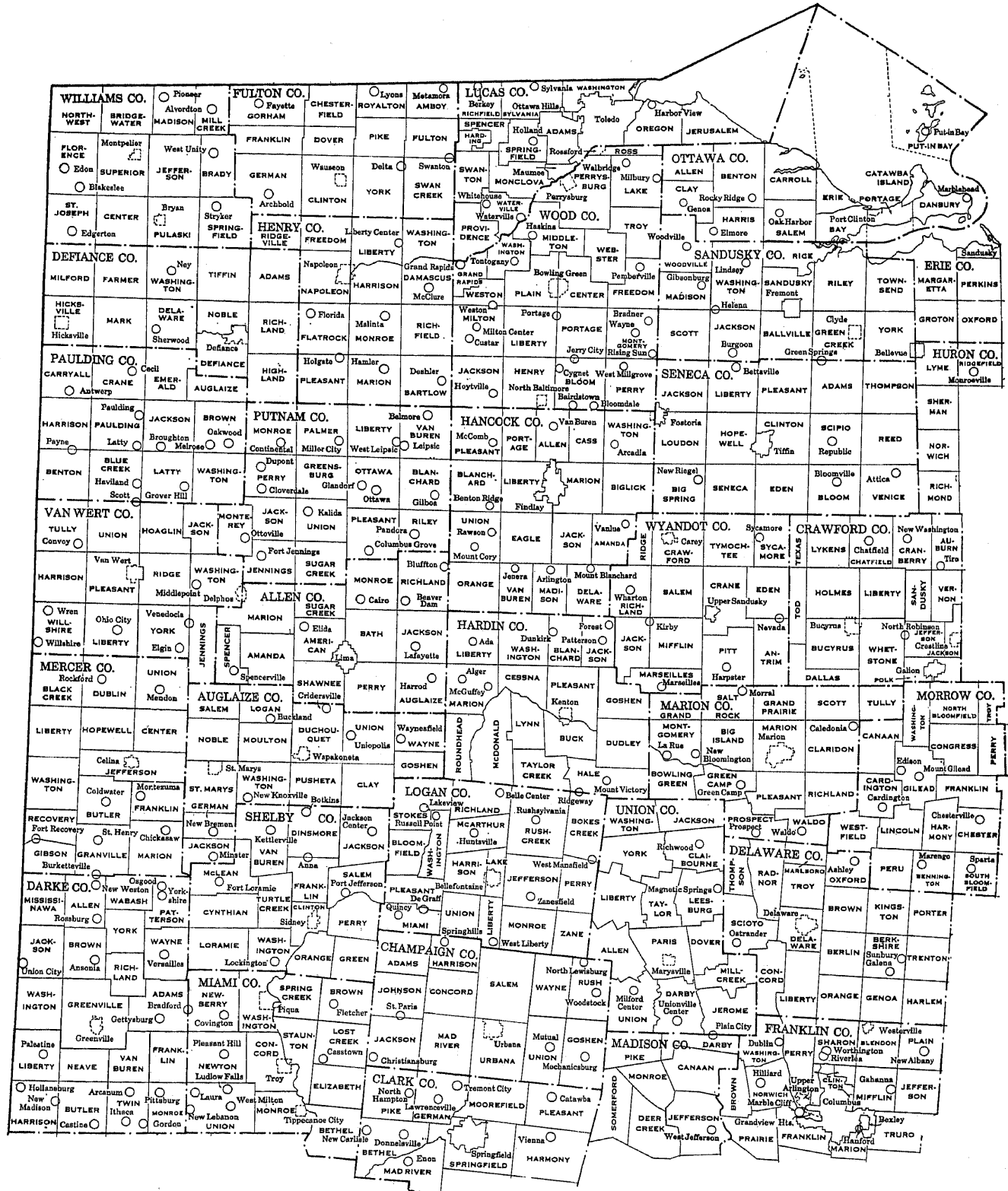

MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNSHIPS

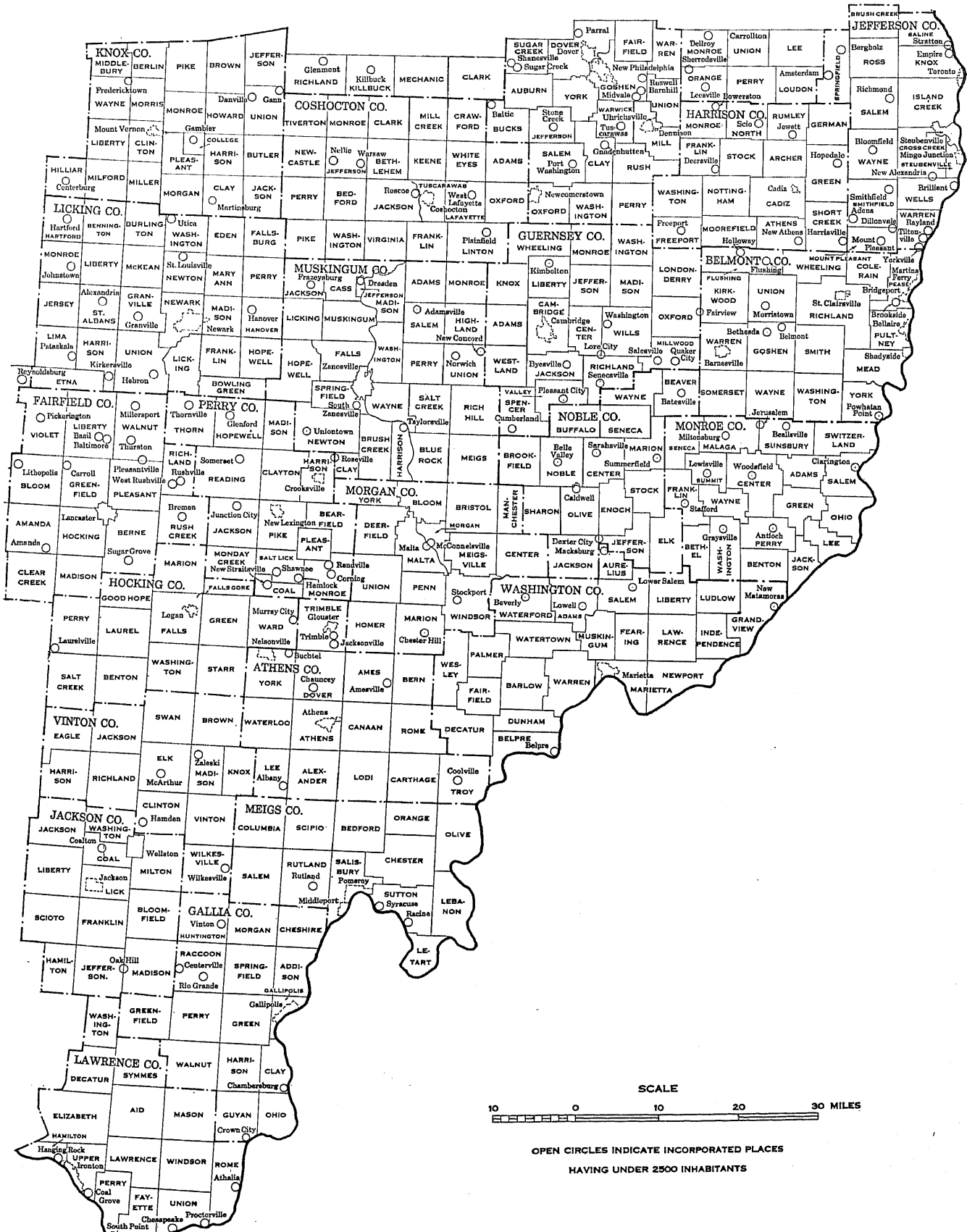

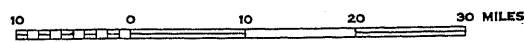
# OHIO—SOUTHEASTERN PART

# OHIO

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—Ohio was organized from a part of the Northwest Territory in 1802 and was admitted to the Union as the seventeenth State in 1803, with boundaries as at present. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 6,907,612, which represents an increase of 260,915, or 3.9 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 41,122 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 168.0, as compared with 161.6 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Ohio from 1800, the year in which its area was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each

decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Ohio consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Bay was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit; for example, Byesville was removed from the urban list in 1940.

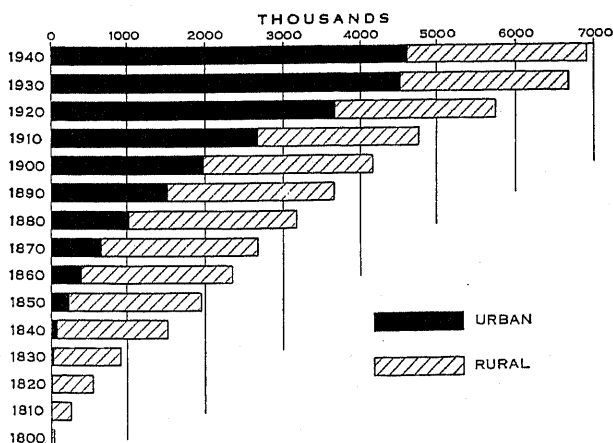

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Ohio is shown by counties, townships, cities, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 to 7-I and for the census tracts of the tracted cities and adjacent areas in tables 8 to 8-E.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are 59 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Cleveland, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 878,336; and Columbus, the capital of the State, had a population of 306,087.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 88 counties of Ohio from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Eighty of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and eight decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

<sup>1</sup> The urban-rural figures for 1940 for the State and for Greene and Wood Counties do not include corrections for Fairfield and Rossford villages indicated below. Urban figures for 1940 for Greene County include population of Fairfield village as originally reported (2,549). After completion of the urban tabulation, it was learned that the urban classification of this place was based on the erroneous inclusion of Patterson Field and U. S. Station Hospital (combined population, 1,140) within the village limits. Urban figures for 1940 for Wood County do not include population (3,912) of Rossford village. Information of the incorporation of this village in 1939 was received too late to include the place in the urban classification. These two corrections, if made, would result in a net increase of 1,363 in the urban population of the State, with a corresponding decrease in the rural figure.

**Minor civil divisions.**—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Ohio are the townships, and some of the cities and villages. In Ohio, a village reaching a population of 5,000 automatically becomes a city, and a city falling below 5,000 becomes a village. There is no act of incorporation, simply a change acknowledged by the Secretary of State after census figures have been published. Thus, changes in the city-village classification based on 1940 figures are not herein included, since they were not in effect on the census date, and those based on population changes between 1920 and 1930 are included for the first time.

There are 110 cities and 763 villages (with Rossford); 28 cities and 56 villages are independent of township organization and form primary divisions of the counties. The remaining cities and villages, each of which, ordinarily, is a part of some township (or townships), form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. Fostoria city and Mogadore village (included in the above figures as primary divisions of counties) are partly primary and partly secondary, by reason of the different classification of their parts in each of the two townships in which a part is located.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, cities, and villages for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and villages that constitute secondary divisions is shown in *italics* under the popu-

lation of the primary divisions (townships) in which they are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more townships in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first township. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

Where an independent city or village is located partly in one county and partly in another, the part in a given

county is presented in the regular way as a primary division of that county, but, to make the presentation complete, the population is also shown, in *italics*, for the part outside that county and for the city or village as a whole. *Italics* are also used for the figures representing the population at censuses prior to 1940 of places that have recently been made primary divisions, to indicate that the figures are not to be added in with the townships and other independent areas to make the county total (having already been counted once).

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with com-

mon economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The following tables give data for the 10 metropolitan districts with central cities in Ohio. Parts of the Huntington-Ashland and Wheeling districts are also situated in Ohio; data for these districts are presented in the bulletin for West Virginia.

Table 7 shows the population of the Akron metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Akron metropolitan district had 349,705 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 346,681. Ravenna township (population, 10,926 in 1940; 9,944 in 1930), in Portage County, was included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time.

Table 7-B shows the population of the Cincinnati metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Like several others, this district occupies territory in more than one State. In 1940 the Cincinnati metropolitan district had 789,309 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 759,464. Table 7-C shows the population of the Cleveland metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Cleveland metropolitan district had 1,214,943 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 1,194,989. Beachwood, Highland Heights, Mayfield, Mayfield Heights, Olmsted Falls, and Westview villages, and Olmsted township, all in Cuyahoga County, were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. These new areas had a combined population of 6,618 in 1940 and 5,265 in 1930.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities and sometimes their adjacent areas are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. Through the use of census tract data, comparisons may be made from census to census. Tracts are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area, and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In tables 8 through 8-E the 1940 and in some cases the 1930 population of tracted areas is shown by census tracts. Where no comparative figures are shown for the earlier census, tract figures were not prepared from 1930 census data. In tables 8 and 8-B, respectively, the 1940 and 1930 population of Akron and Cleveland and their adjacent areas is shown by census tracts. The tracted area adjacent to Cleveland includes the remainder of Cuyahoga County. Table 8-A gives 1940 and 1930 tract population for Cincinnati and 1940 data alone for its adjacent area. The tracted area adjacent to Cincinnati comprises the remainder of Hamilton County. The 1940 and 1930 population of Columbus by tracts is given in table 8-C. Table 8-D presents the 1940 population of Dayton and an adjoining area by tracts, and table 8-E gives 1940 tract data for Toledo. All the tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps.

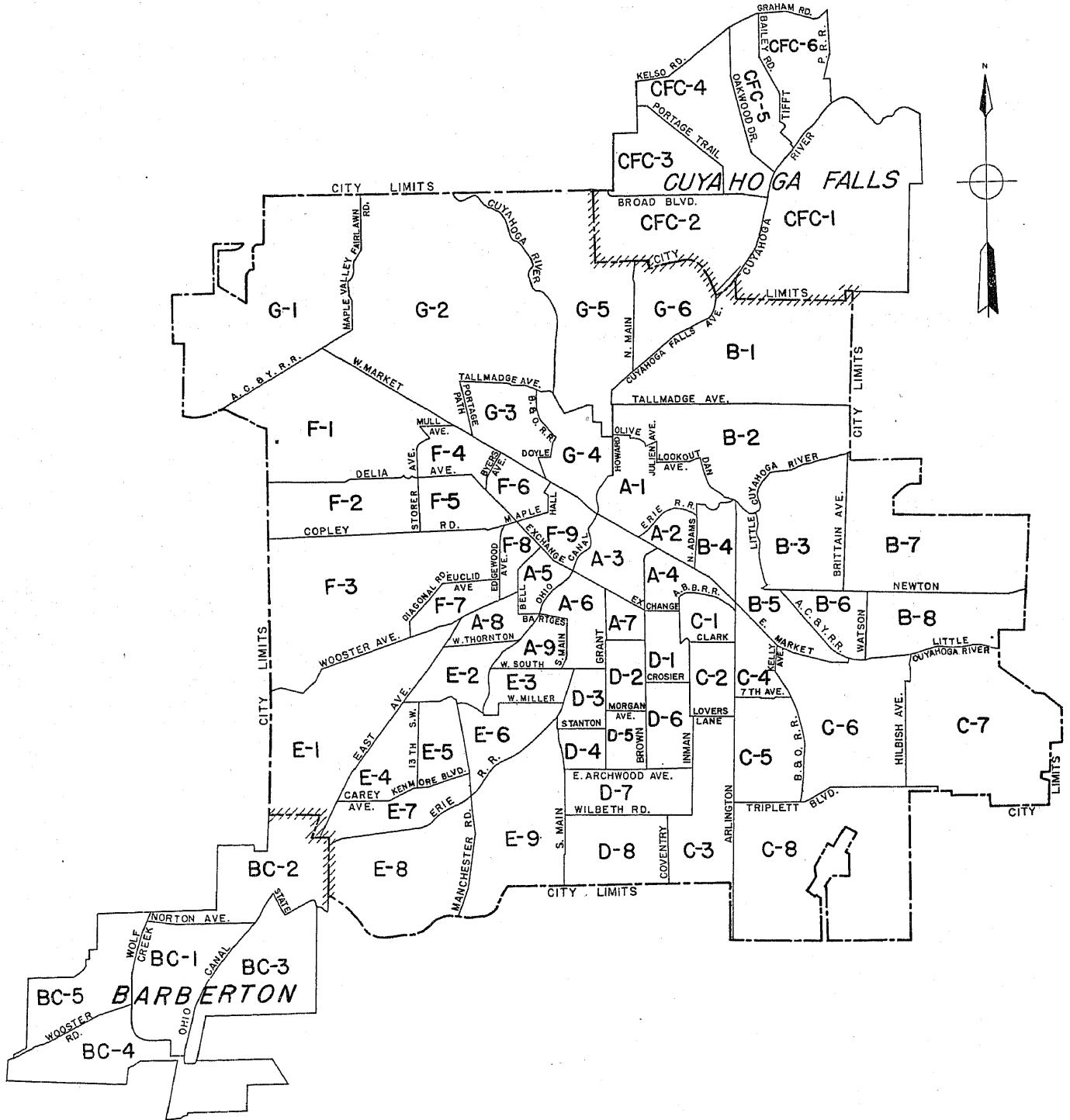

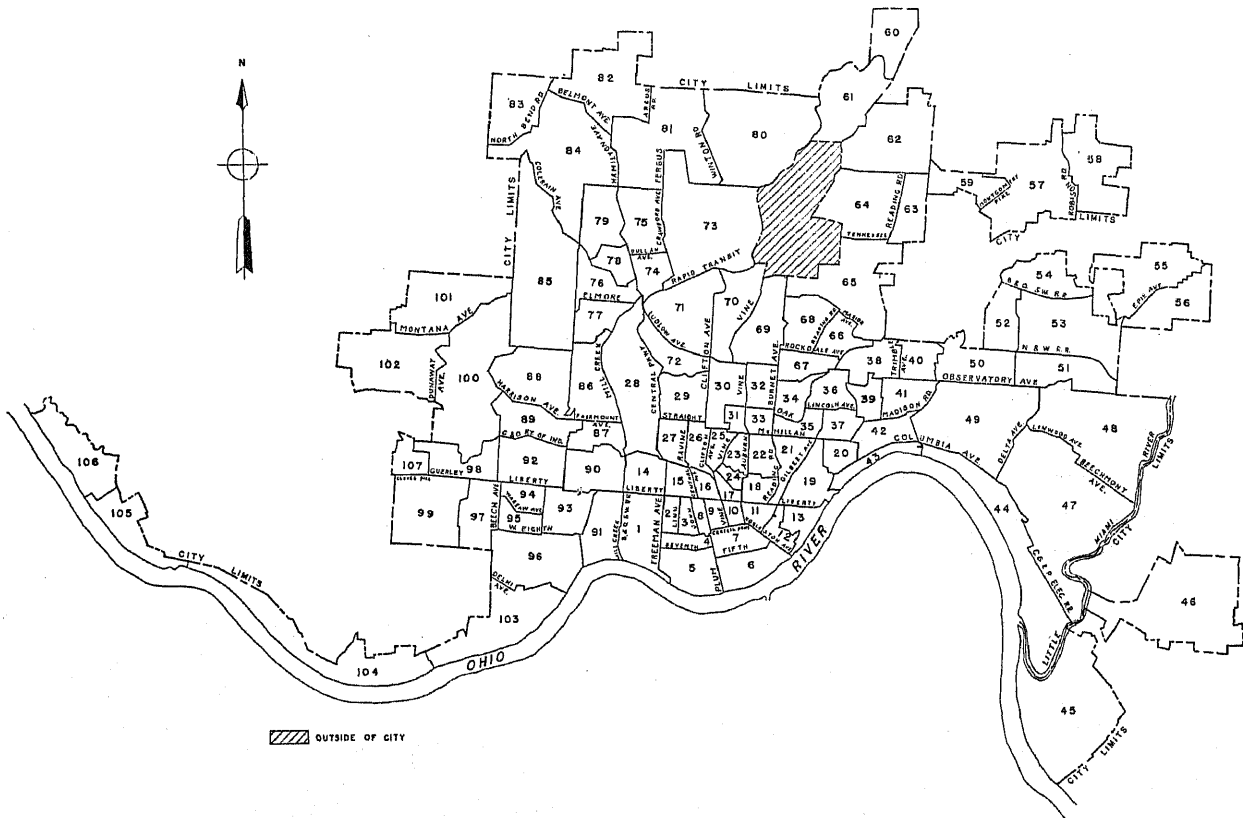

AKRON AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

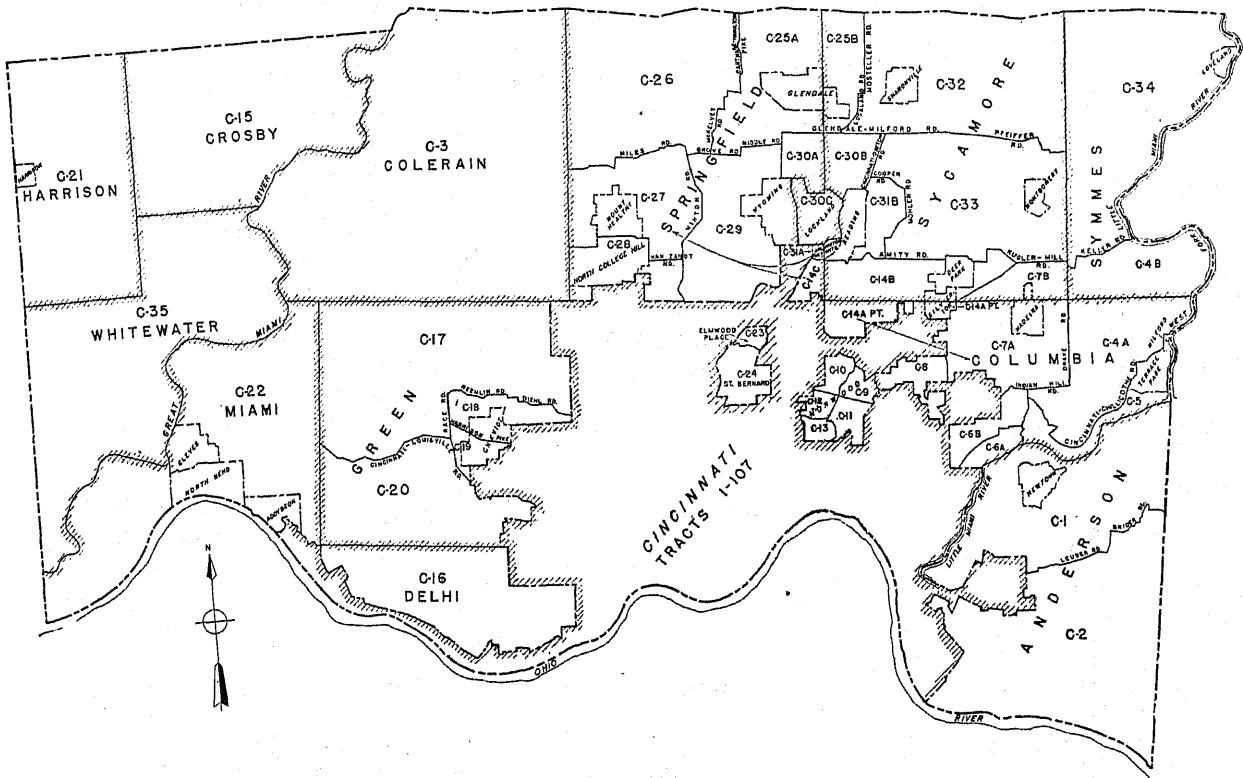


CINCINNATI AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

Part 1.—Tracts in Cincinnati city



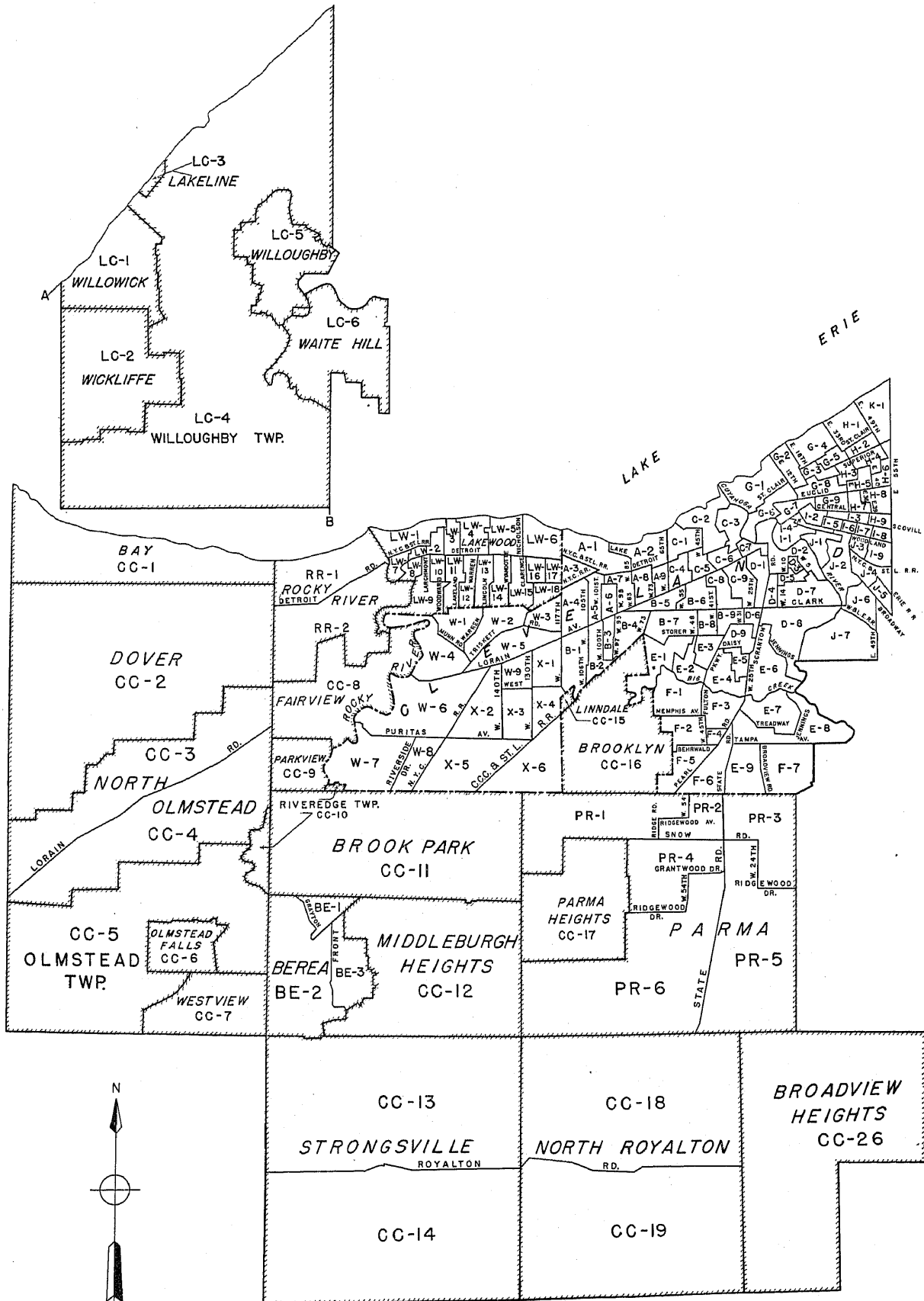

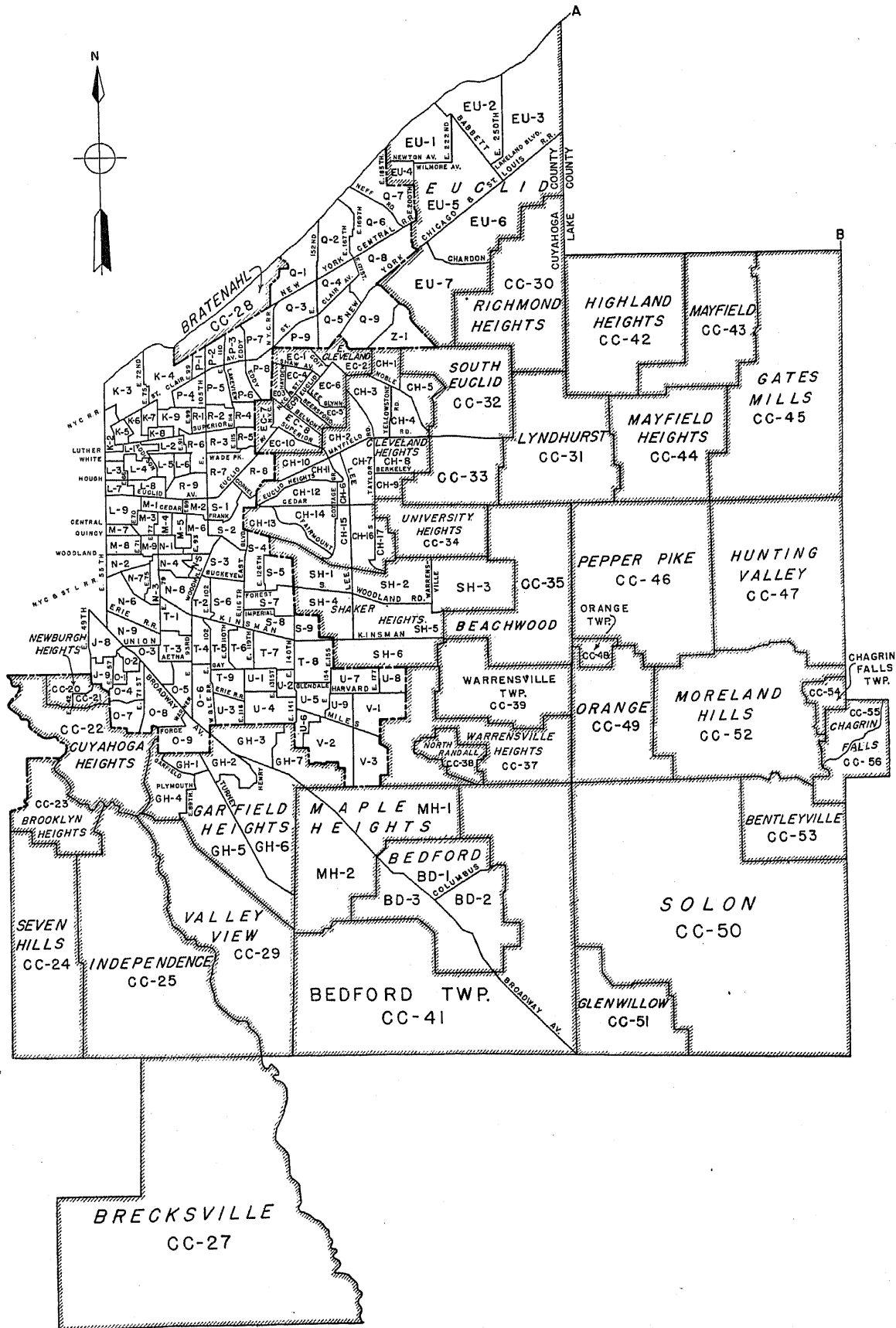
CLEVELAND AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

Part 1.—Tracts in Cleveland and in Cuyahoga and Lake Counties



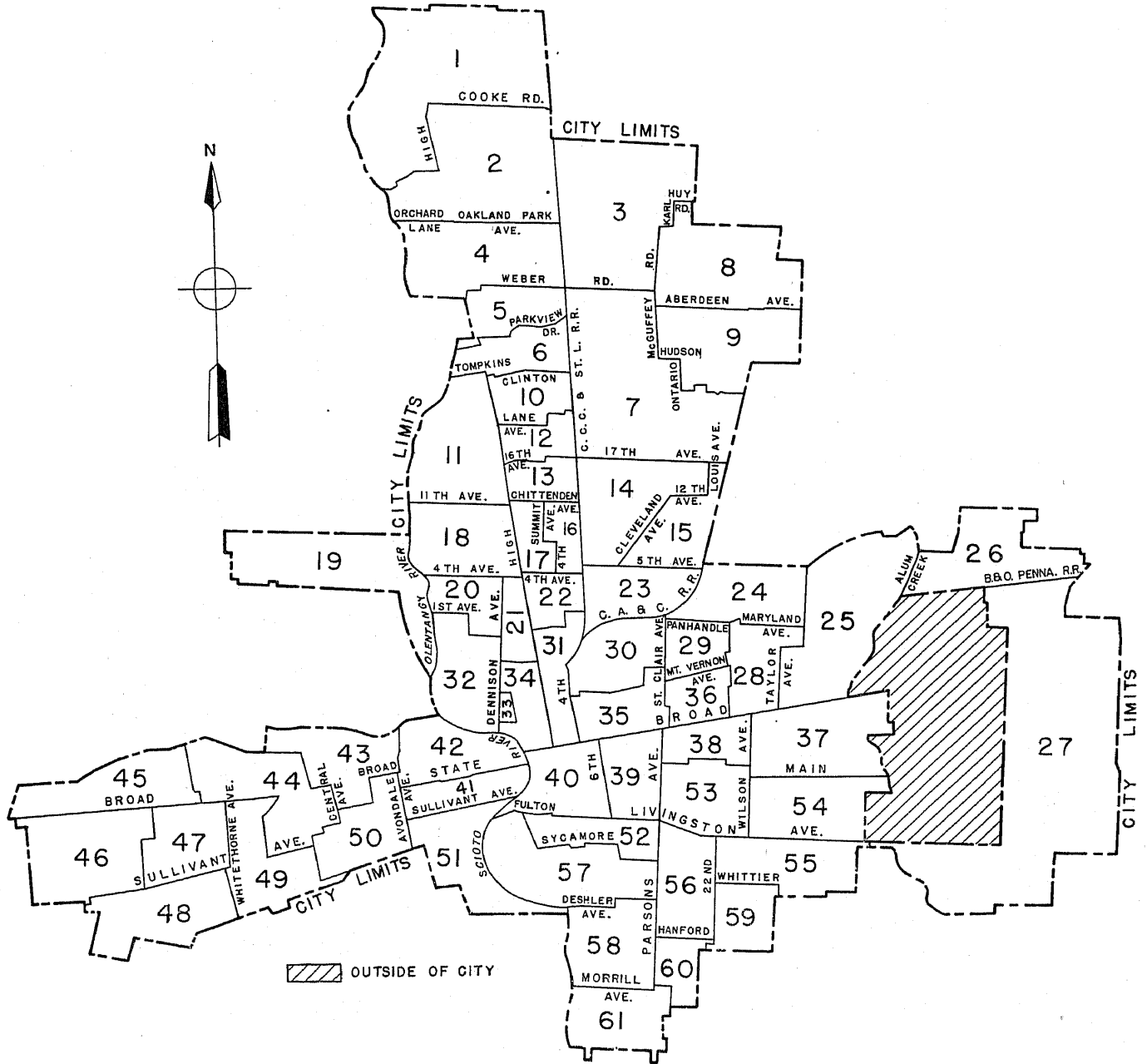

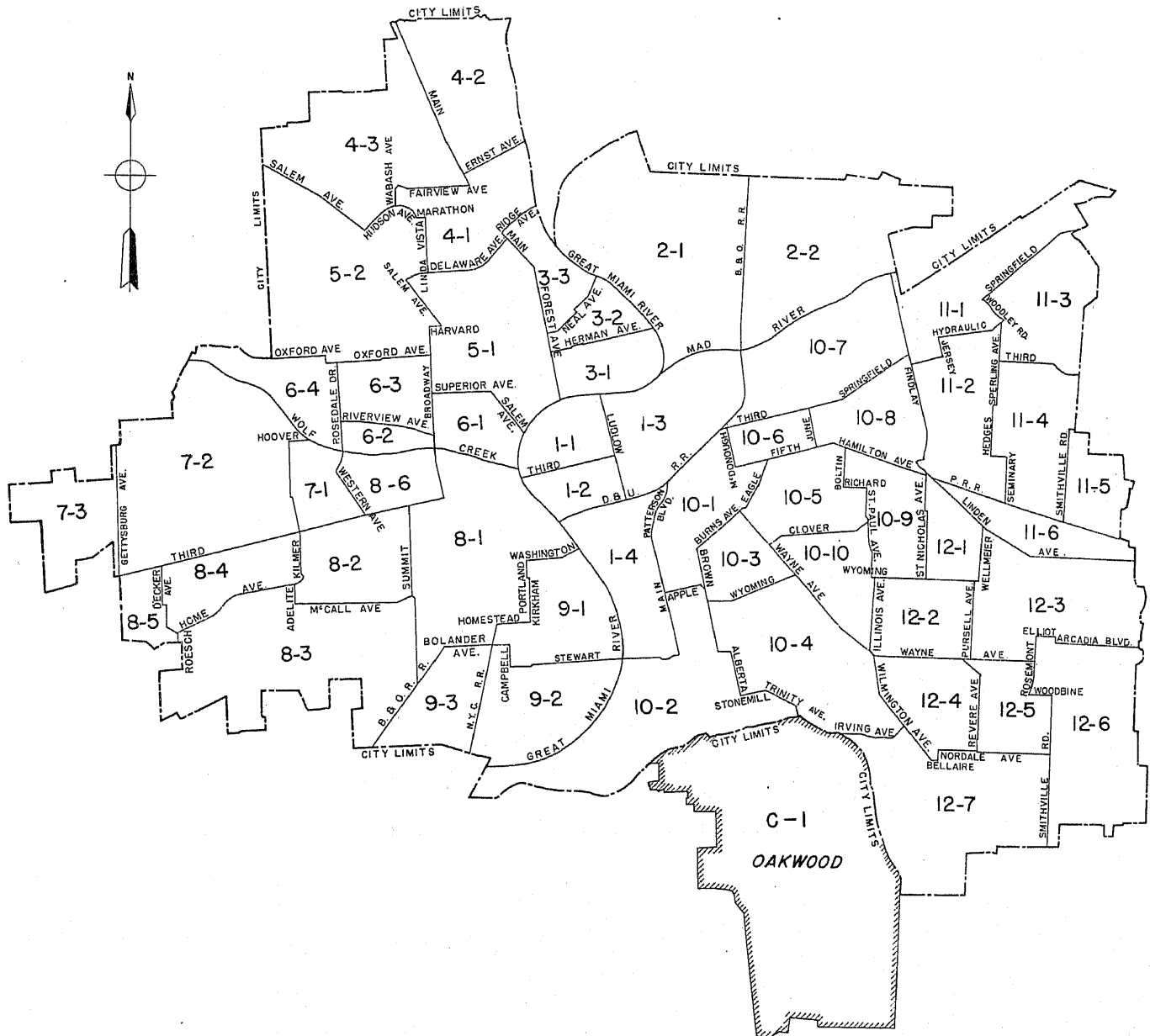

COLUMBUS BY CENSUS TRACTS

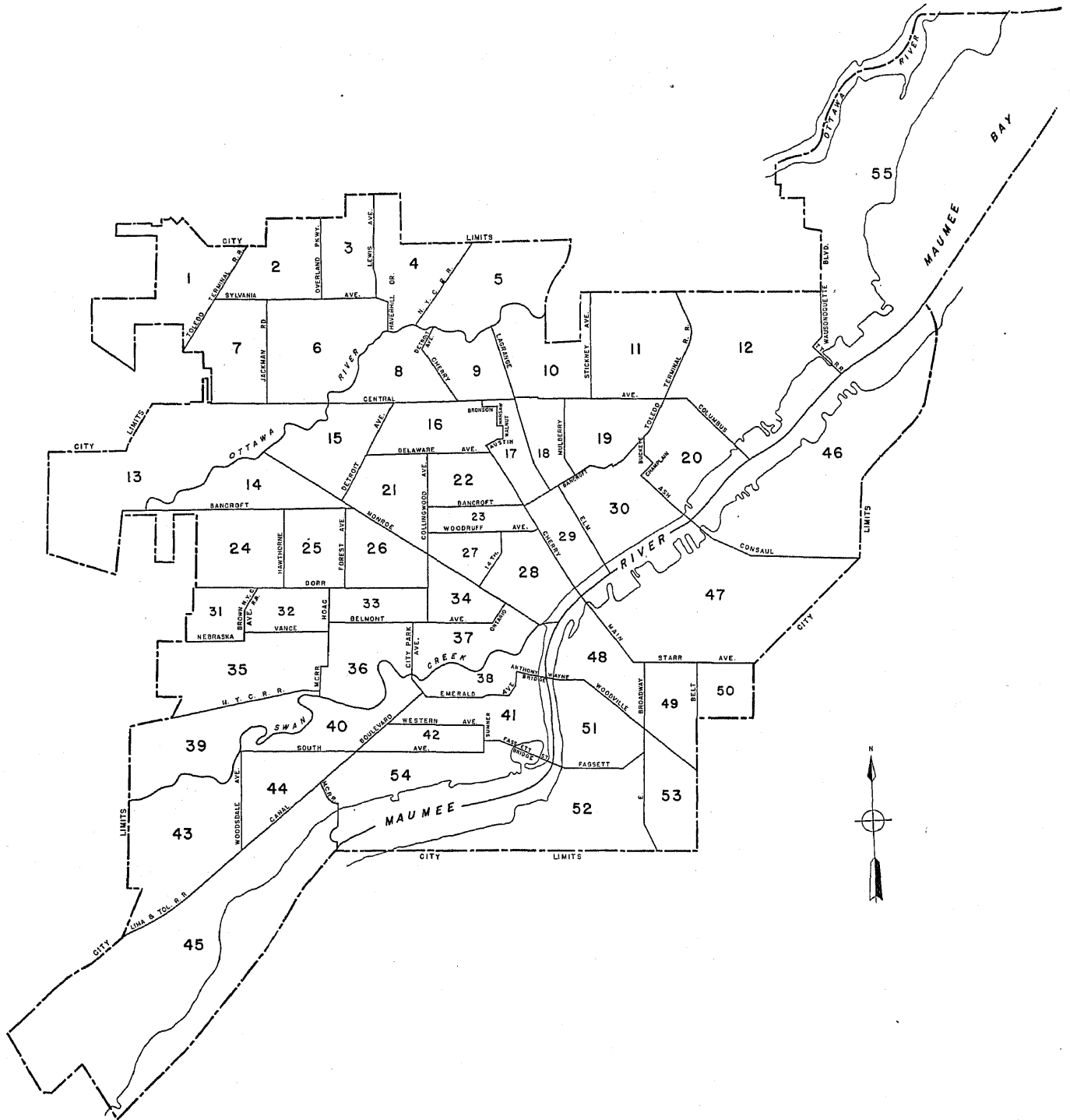


DAYTON AND ADJACENT AREA BY CENSUS TRACTS



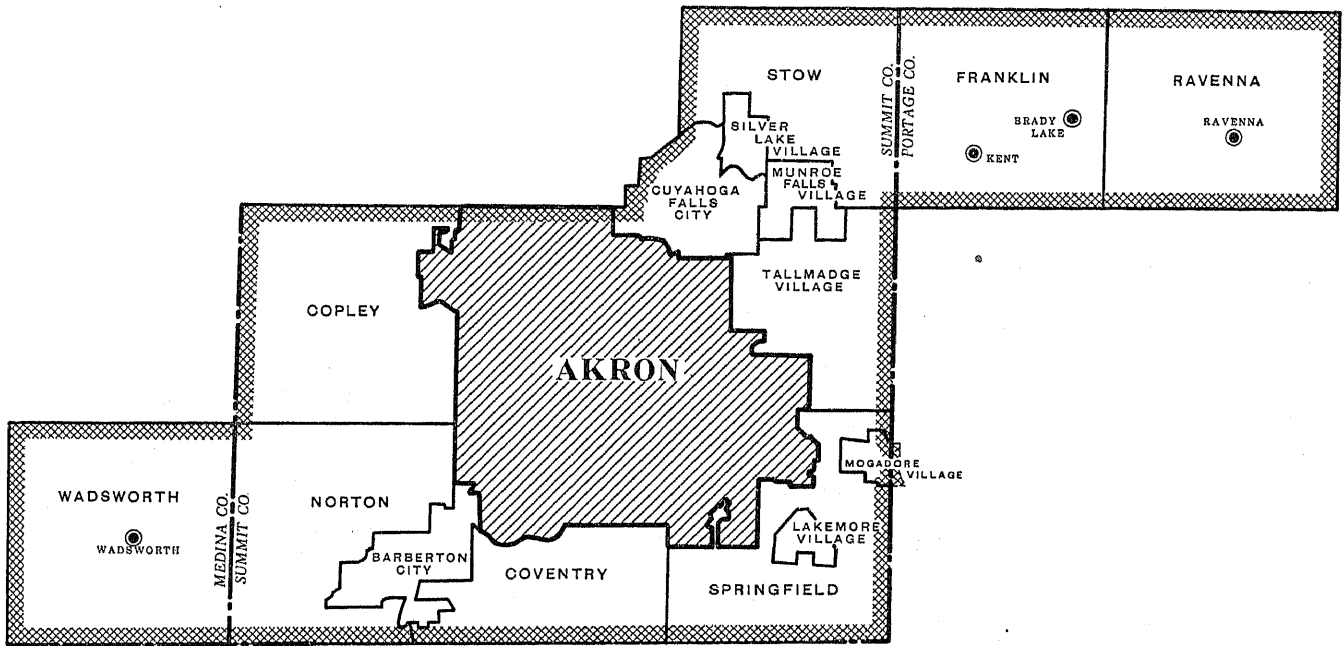

TOLEDO BY CENSUS TRACTS

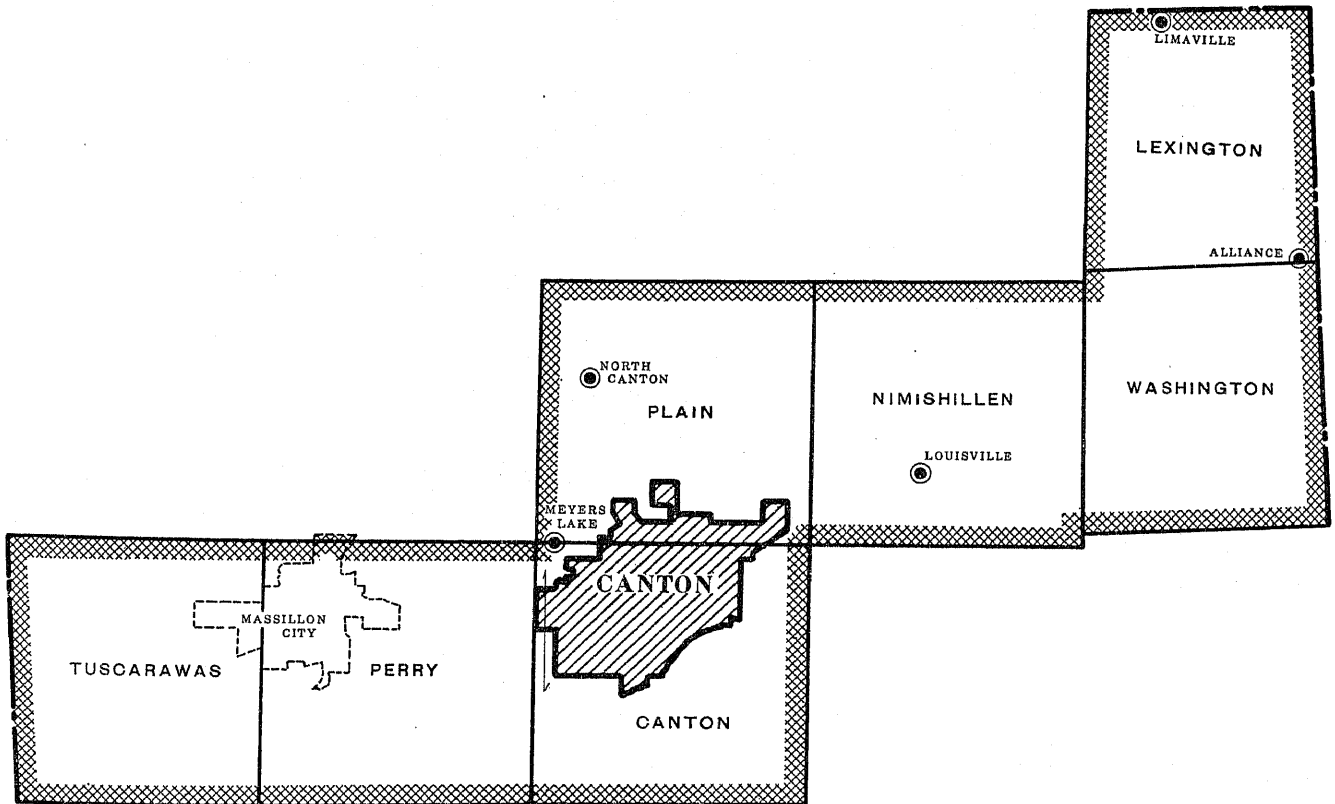




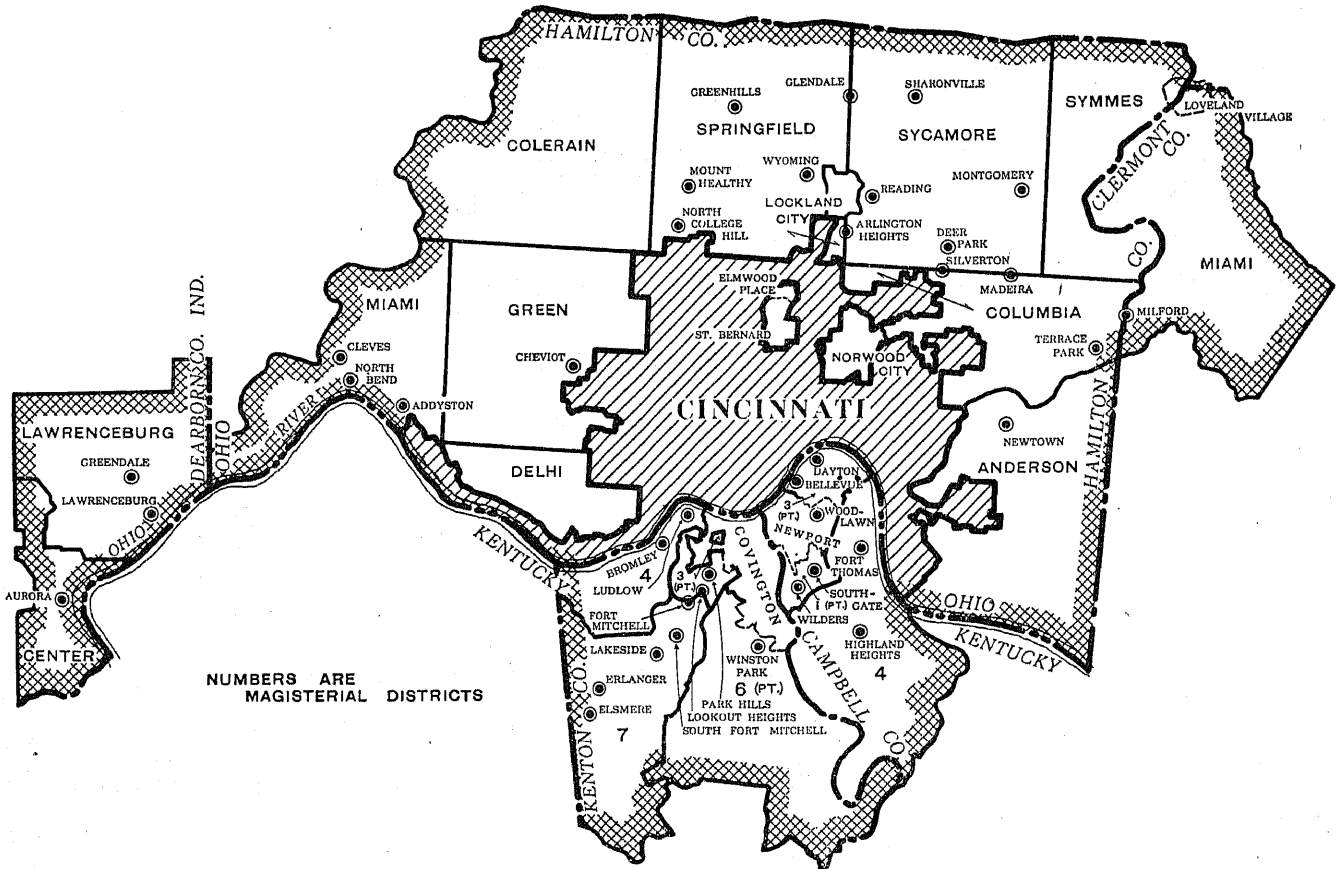
AKRON METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



CANTON METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

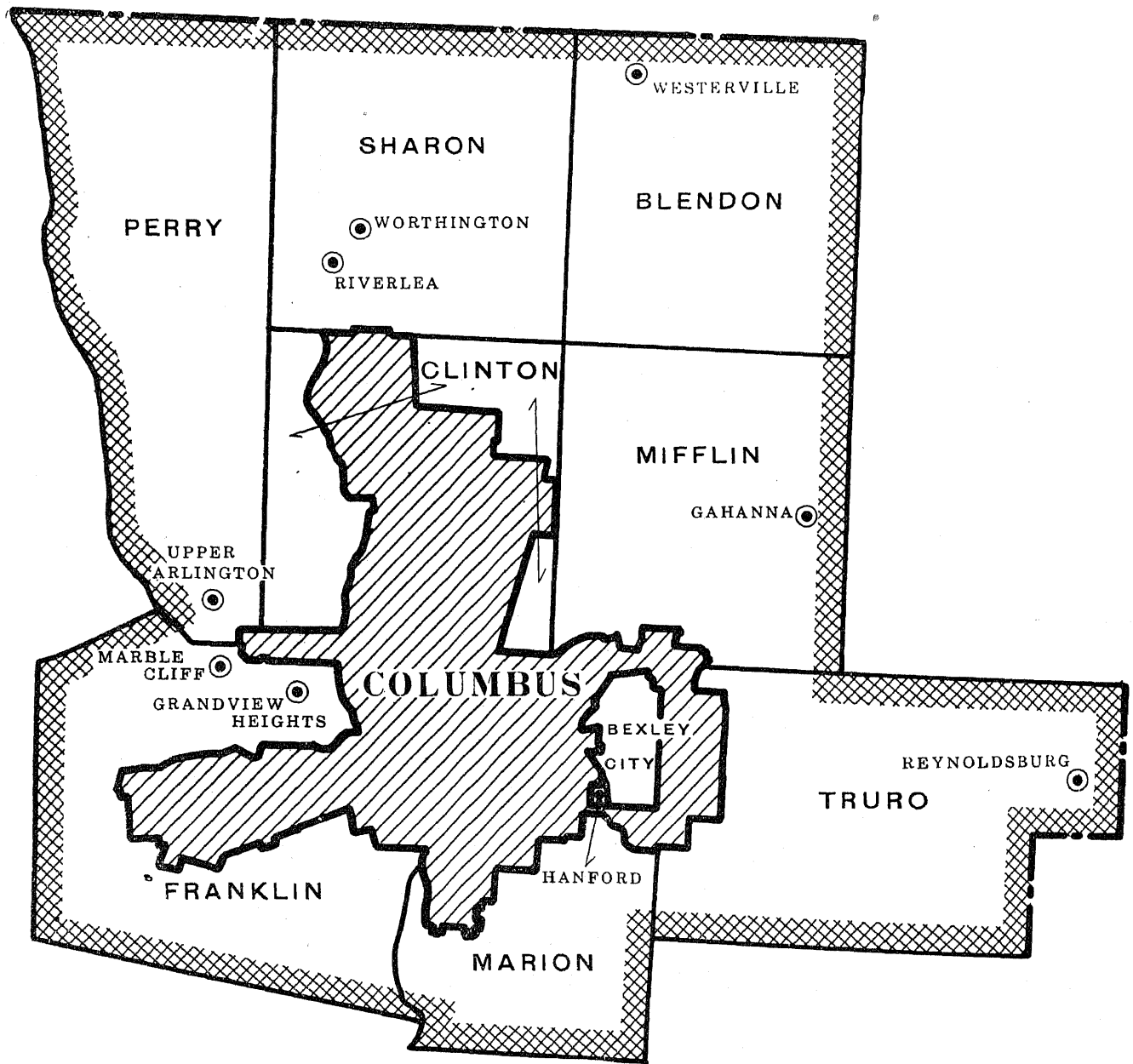


CINCINNATI METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

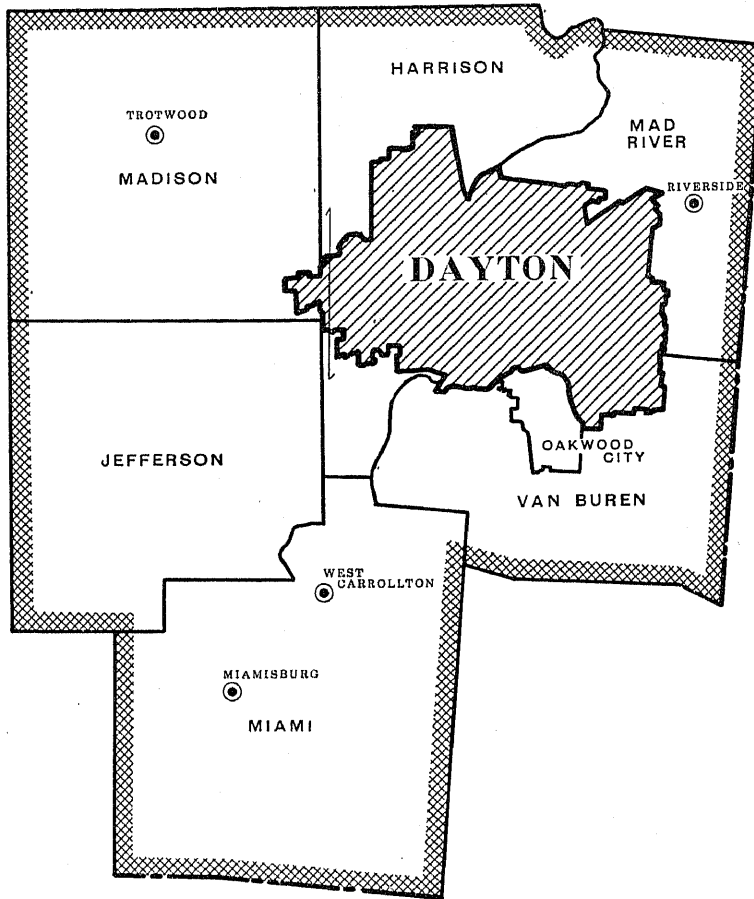




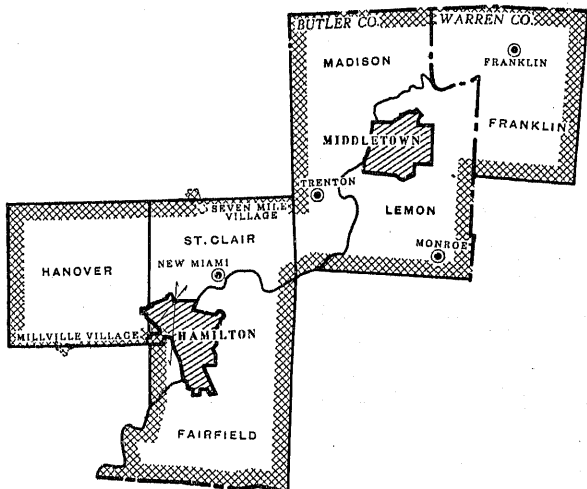
