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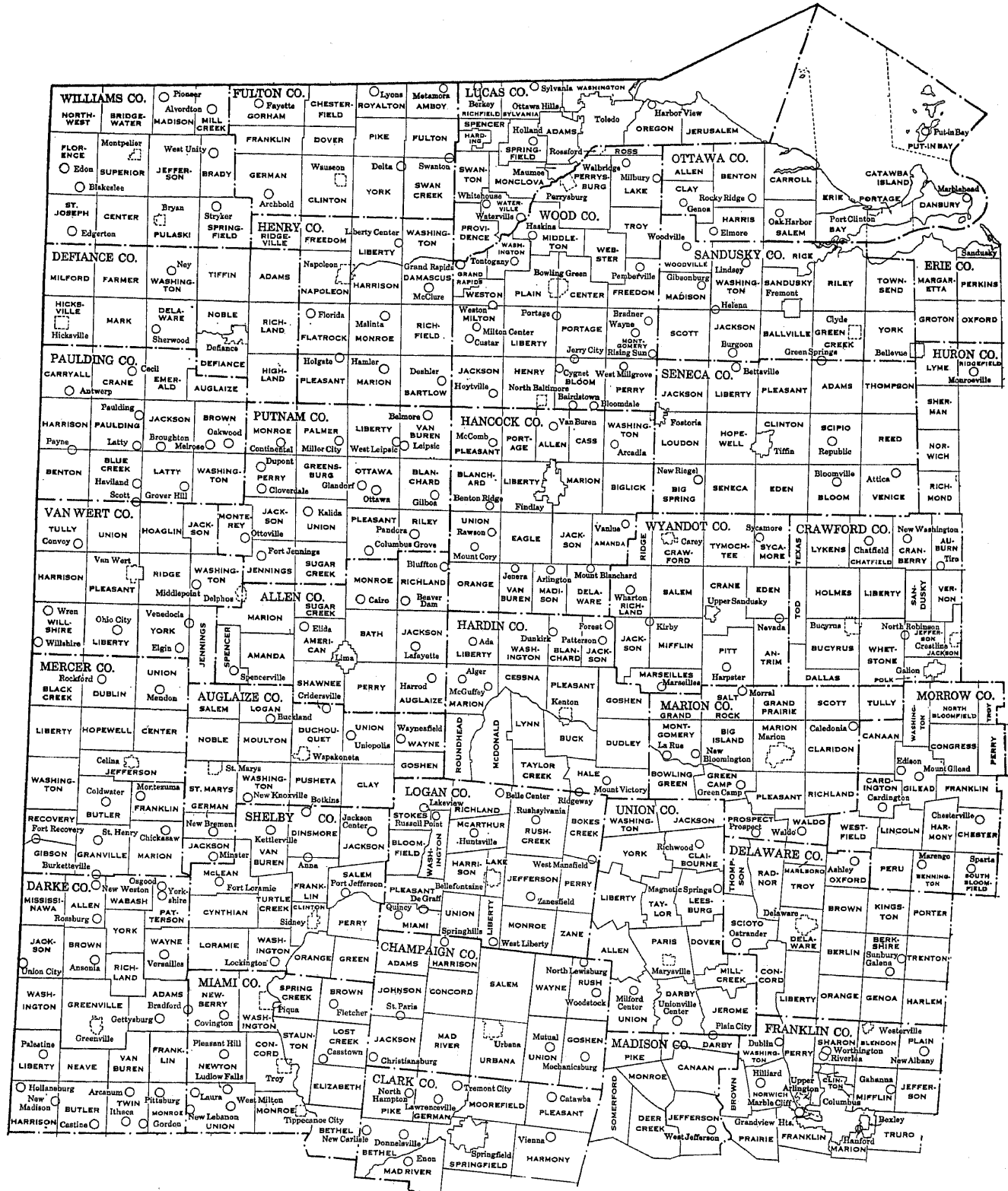

MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNSHIPS

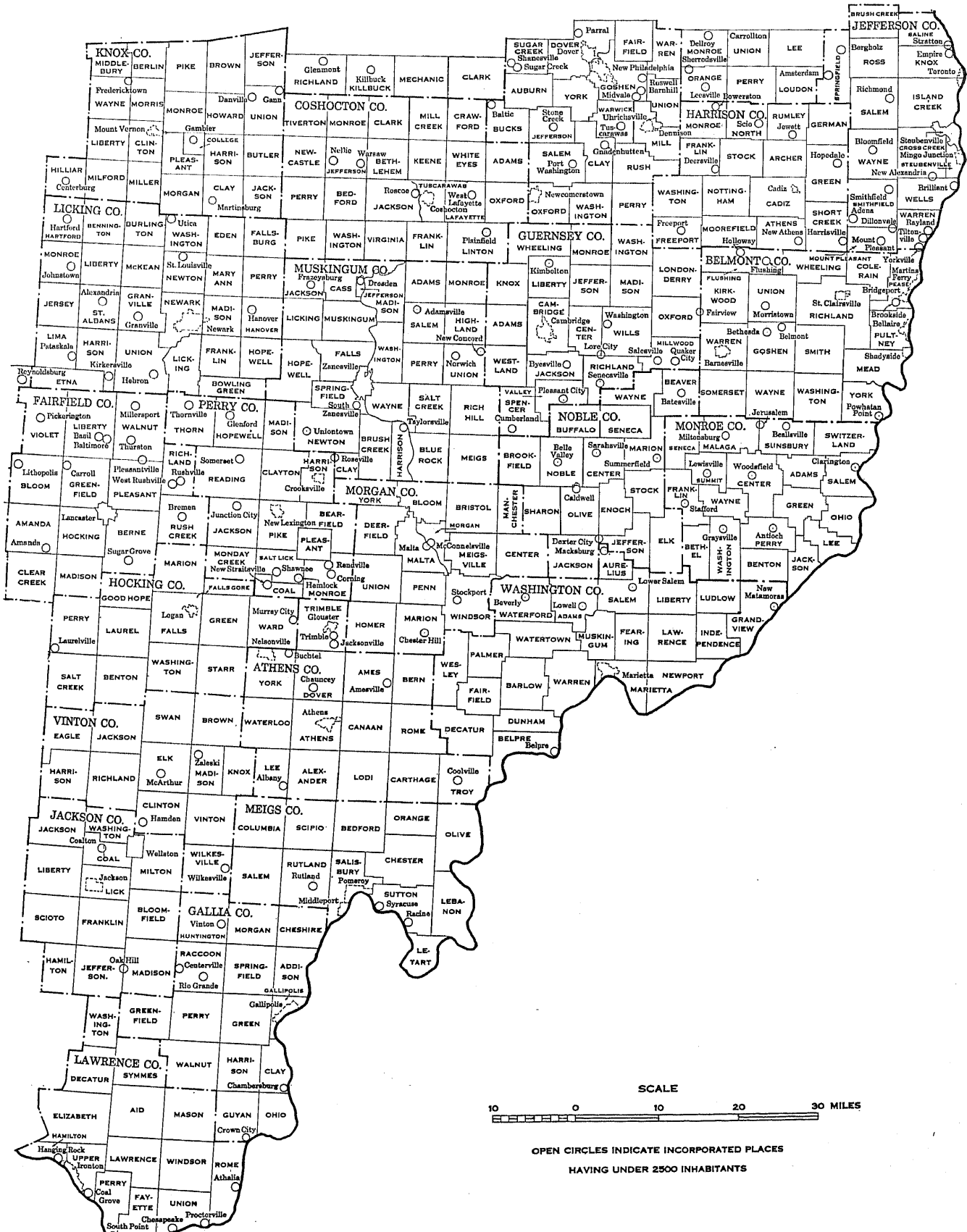

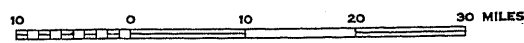
OHIO—SOUTHEASTERN PART

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Ohio was organized from a part of the Northwest Territory in 1802 and was admitted to the Union as the seventeenth State in 1803, with boundaries as at present. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 6,907,612, which represents an increase of 260,915, or 3.9 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 41,122 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 168.0, as compared with 161.6 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Ohio from 1800, the year in which its area was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each

decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Ohio consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Bay was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit; for example, Byesville was removed from the urban list in 1940.

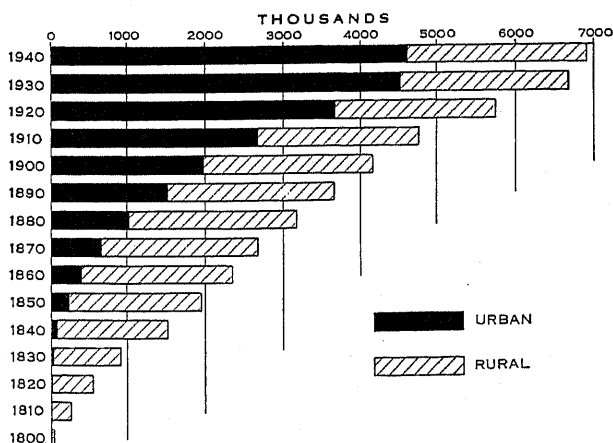

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Ohio is shown by counties, townships, cities, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 to 7-I and for the census tracts of the tracted cities and adjacent areas in tables 8 to 8-E.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are 59 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Cleveland, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 878,336; and Columbus, the capital of the State, had a population of 306,087.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 88 counties of Ohio from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Eighty of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and eight decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with com-

mon economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The following tables give data for the 10 metropolitan districts with central cities in Ohio. Parts of the Huntington-Ashland and Wheeling districts are also situated in Ohio; data for these districts are presented in the bulletin for West Virginia.

Table 7 shows the population of the Akron metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Akron metropolitan district had 349,705 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 346,681. Ravenna township (population, 10,926 in 1940; 9,944 in 1930), in Portage County, was included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time.

during the decade. The Canton metropolitan district had 200,352 inhabitants in 1940, as compared with 191,231 in 1930. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Table 7-B shows the population of the Cincinnati metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Like several others, this district occupies territory in more than one State. In 1940 the Cincinnati metropolitan district had 789,309 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 759,464. District 6, Boone County, Ky., was not included in the metropolitan district in 1940. (The county has been redistricted since 1930, and comparable figures for this area are not obtainable.) The redistricting of Kenton County in 1932 necessitated additional redefinition of the metropolitan district boundaries and resulted in an increase in the area included in the district. The net effect of these two changes was to change the area of the metropolitan district only slightly; the net effect upon the population increase in the district is not ascertainable.

Table 7-C shows the population of the Cleveland metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Cleveland metropolitan district had 1,214,943 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 1,194,989. Beachwood, Highland Heights, Mayfield, Mayfield Heights, Olmsted Falls, and Westview villages, and Olmsted township, all in Cuyahoga County, were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. These new areas had a combined population of 6,618 in 1940 and 5,265 in 1930.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities and sometimes their adjacent areas are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. Through the use of census tract data, comparisons may be made from census to census. Tracts are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area, and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In tables 8 through 8-E the 1940 and in some cases the 1930 population of tracted areas is shown by census tracts. Where no comparative figures are shown for the earlier census, tract figures were not prepared from 1930 census data. In tables 8 and 8-B, respectively, the 1940 and 1930 population of Akron and Cleveland and their adjacent areas is shown by census tracts. The tracted area adjacent to Cleveland includes the remainder of Cuyahoga County. Table 8-A gives 1940 and 1930 tract population for Cincinnati and 1940 data alone for its adjacent area. The tracted area adjacent to Cincinnati comprises the remainder of Hamilton County. The 1940 and 1930 population of Columbus by tracts is given in table 8-C. Table 8-D presents the 1940 population of Dayton and an adjoining area by tracts, and table 8-E gives 1940 tract data for Toledo. All the tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps.

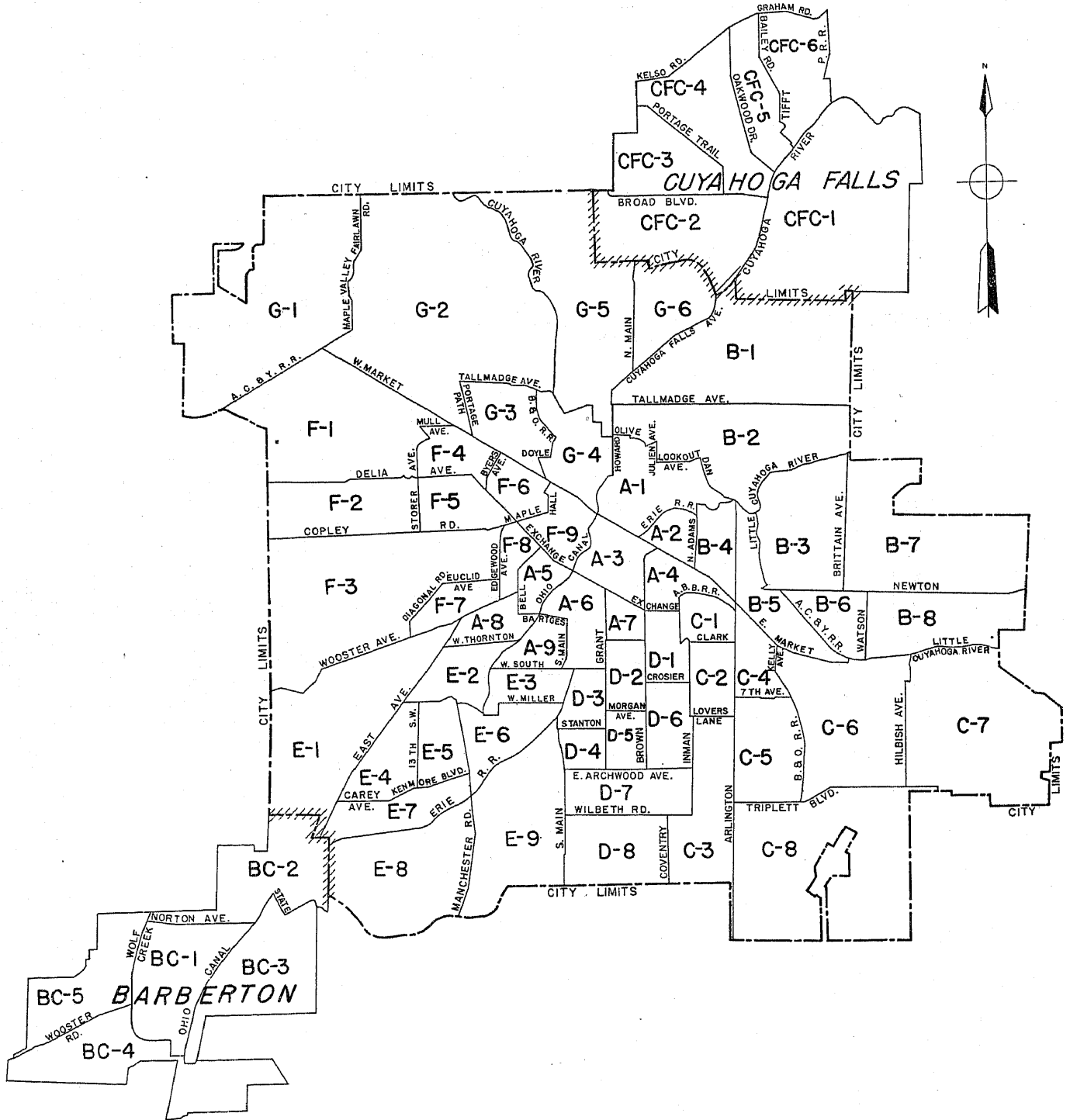

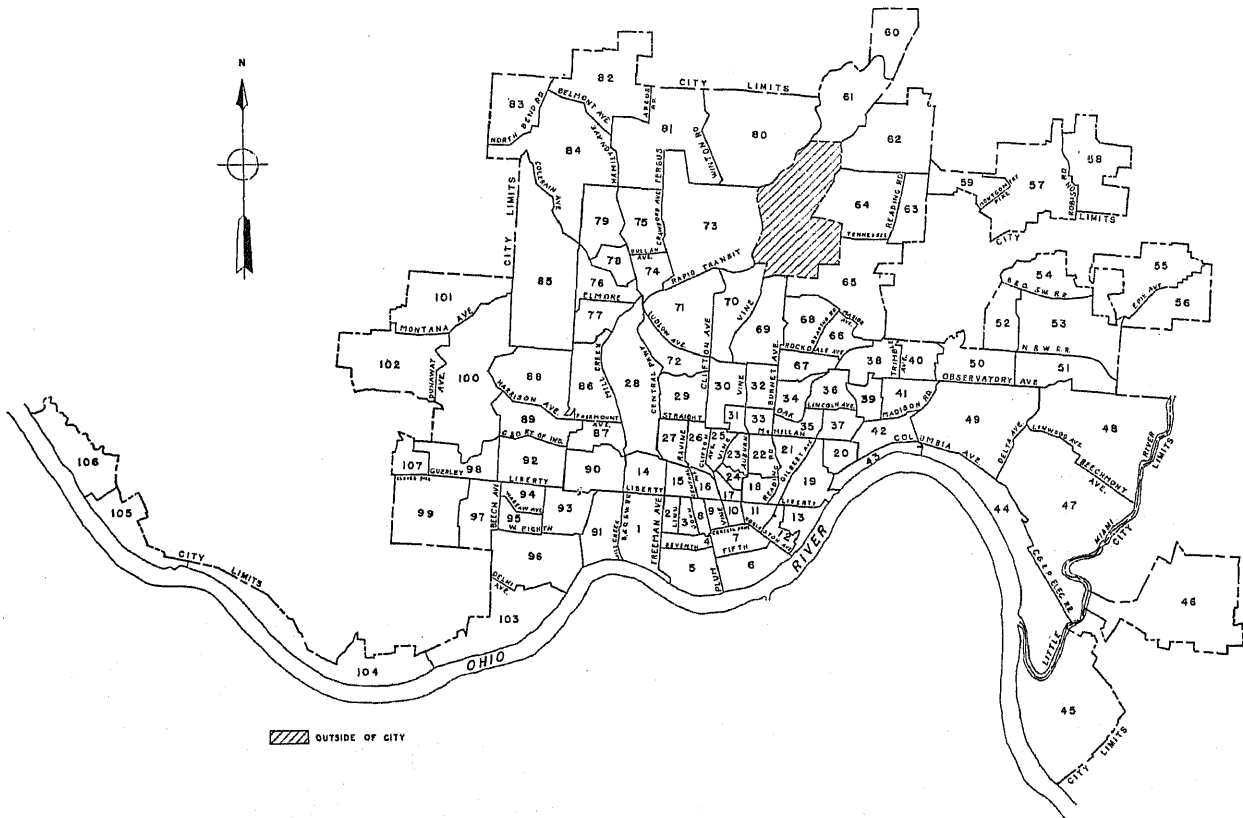

AKRON AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

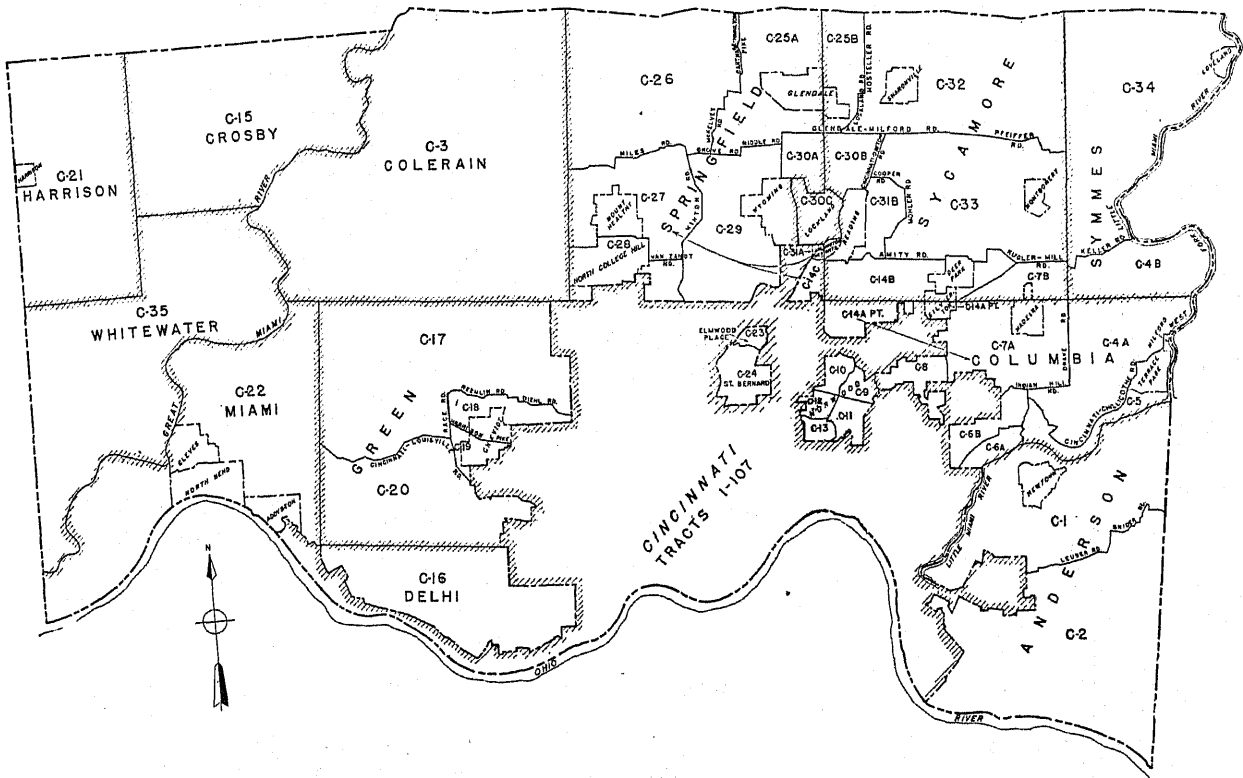


CINCINNATI AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

Part 1.—Tracts in Cincinnati city



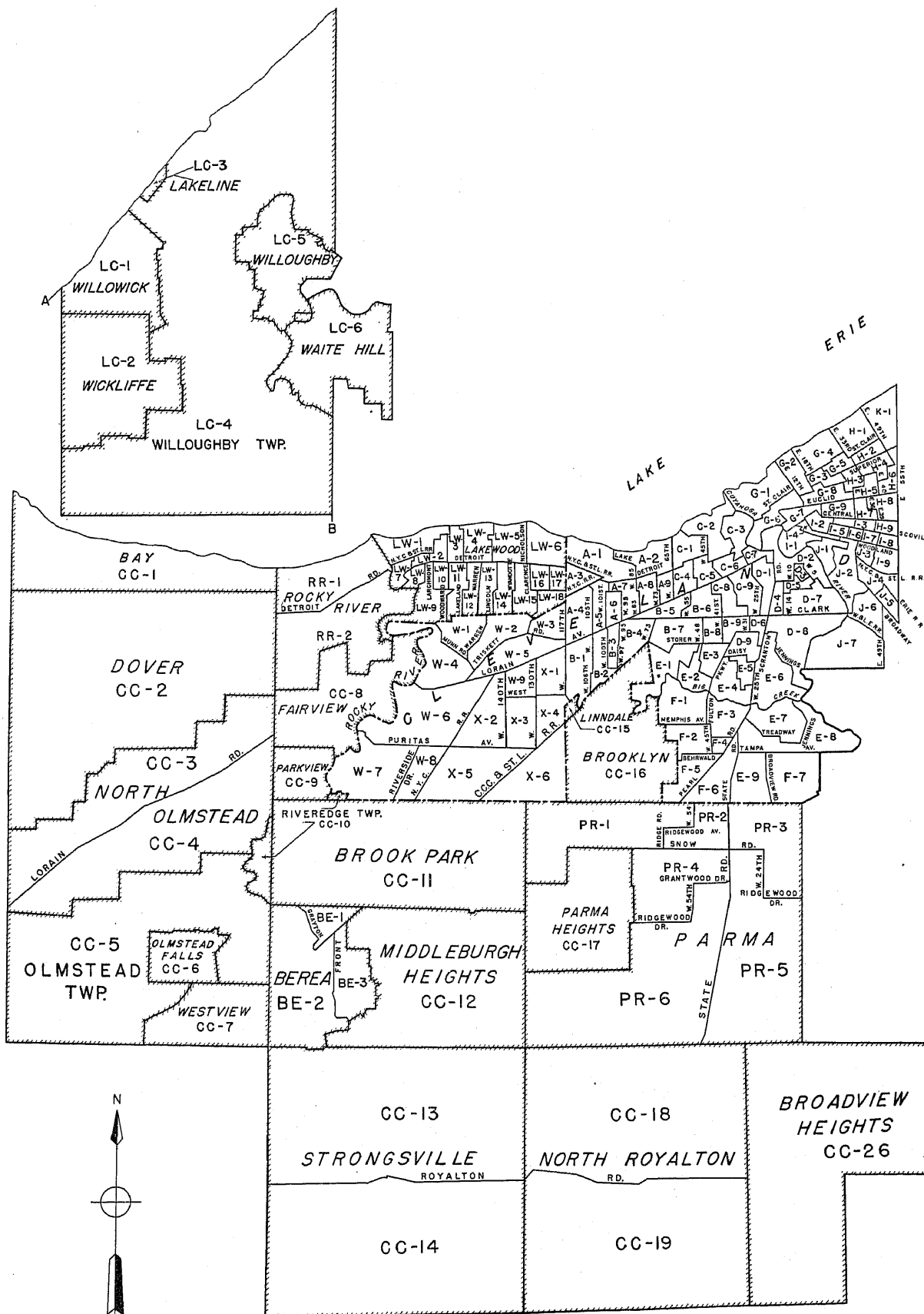

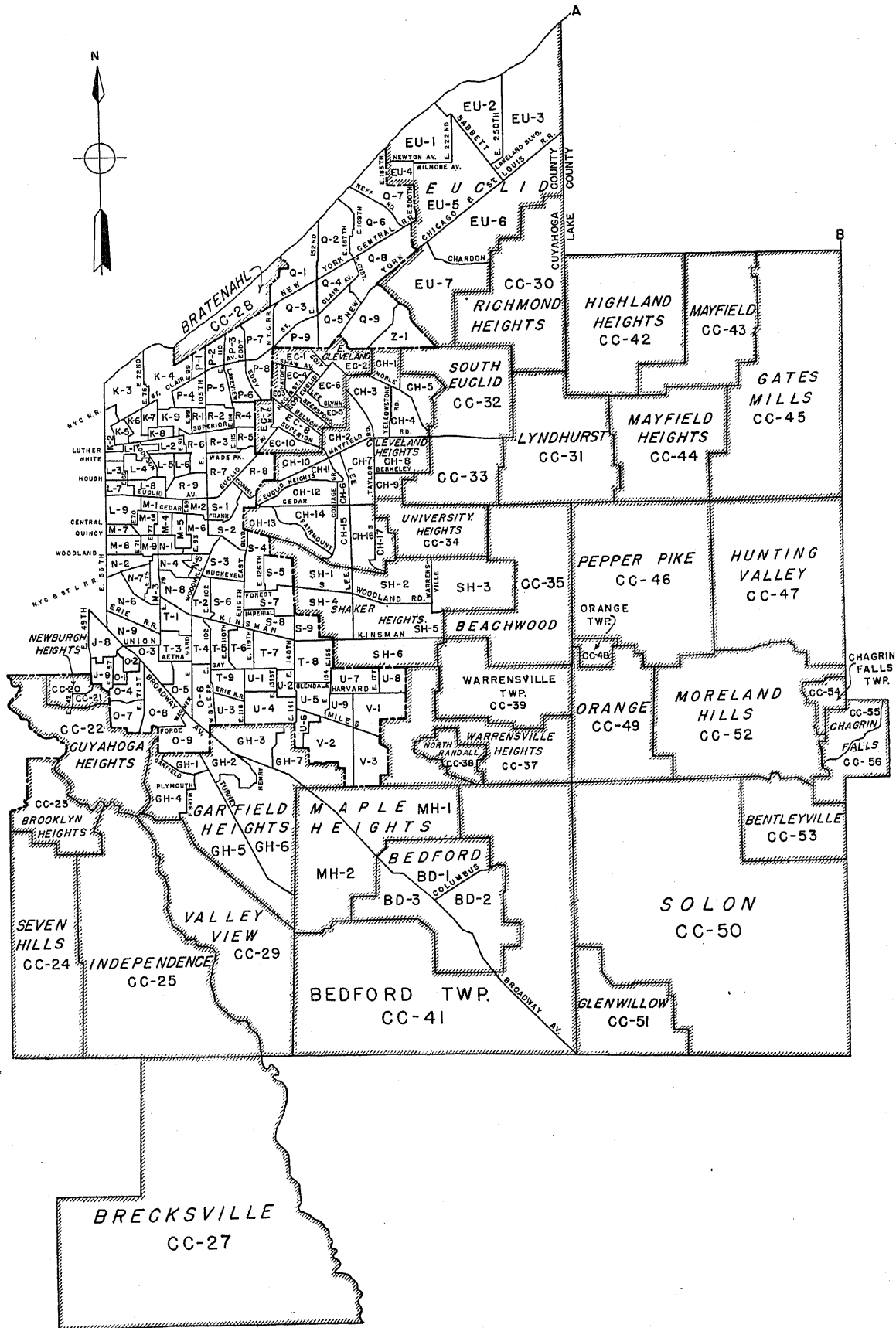
CLEVELAND AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

Part 1.—Tracts in Cleveland and in Cuyahoga and Lake Counties



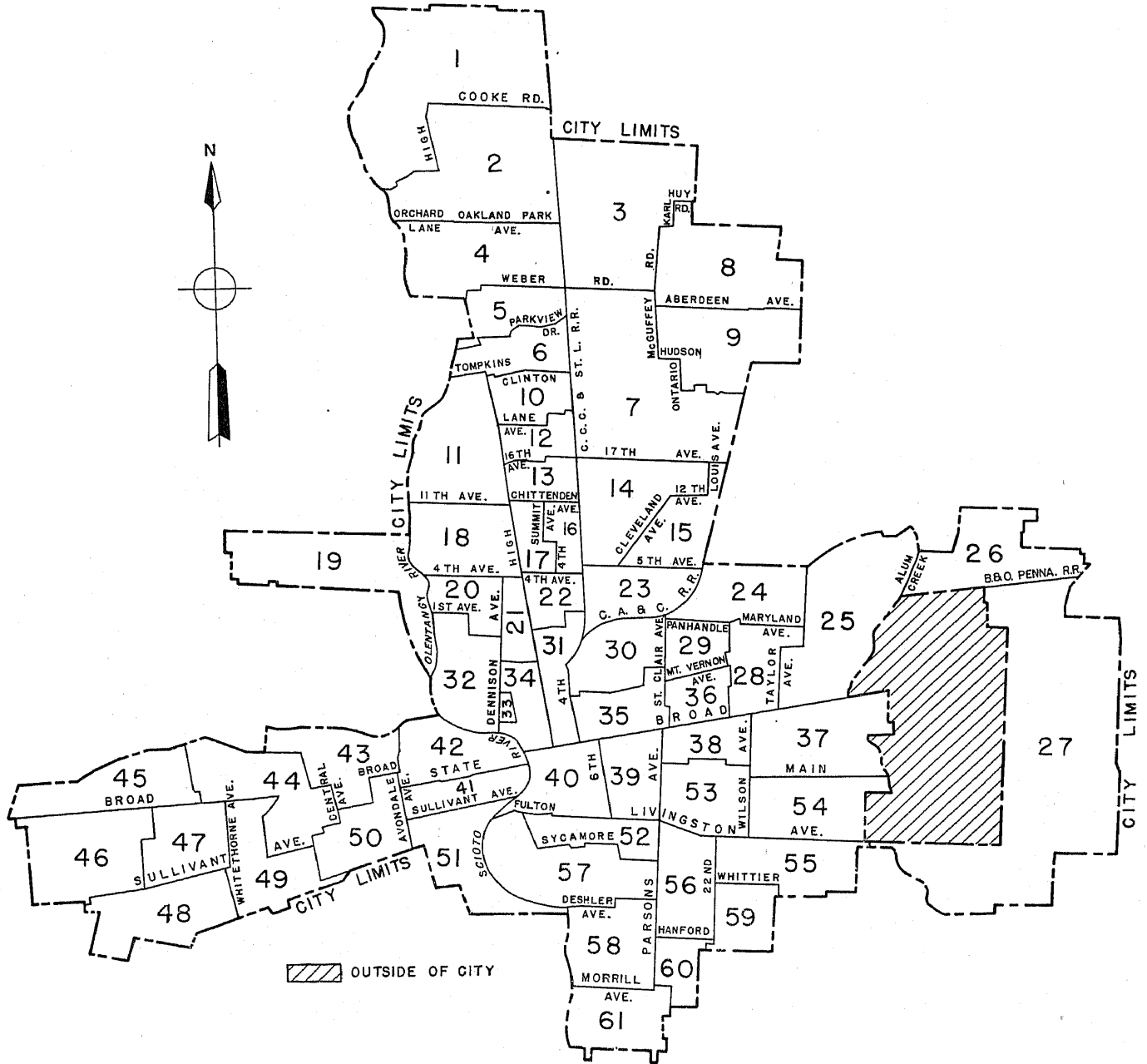

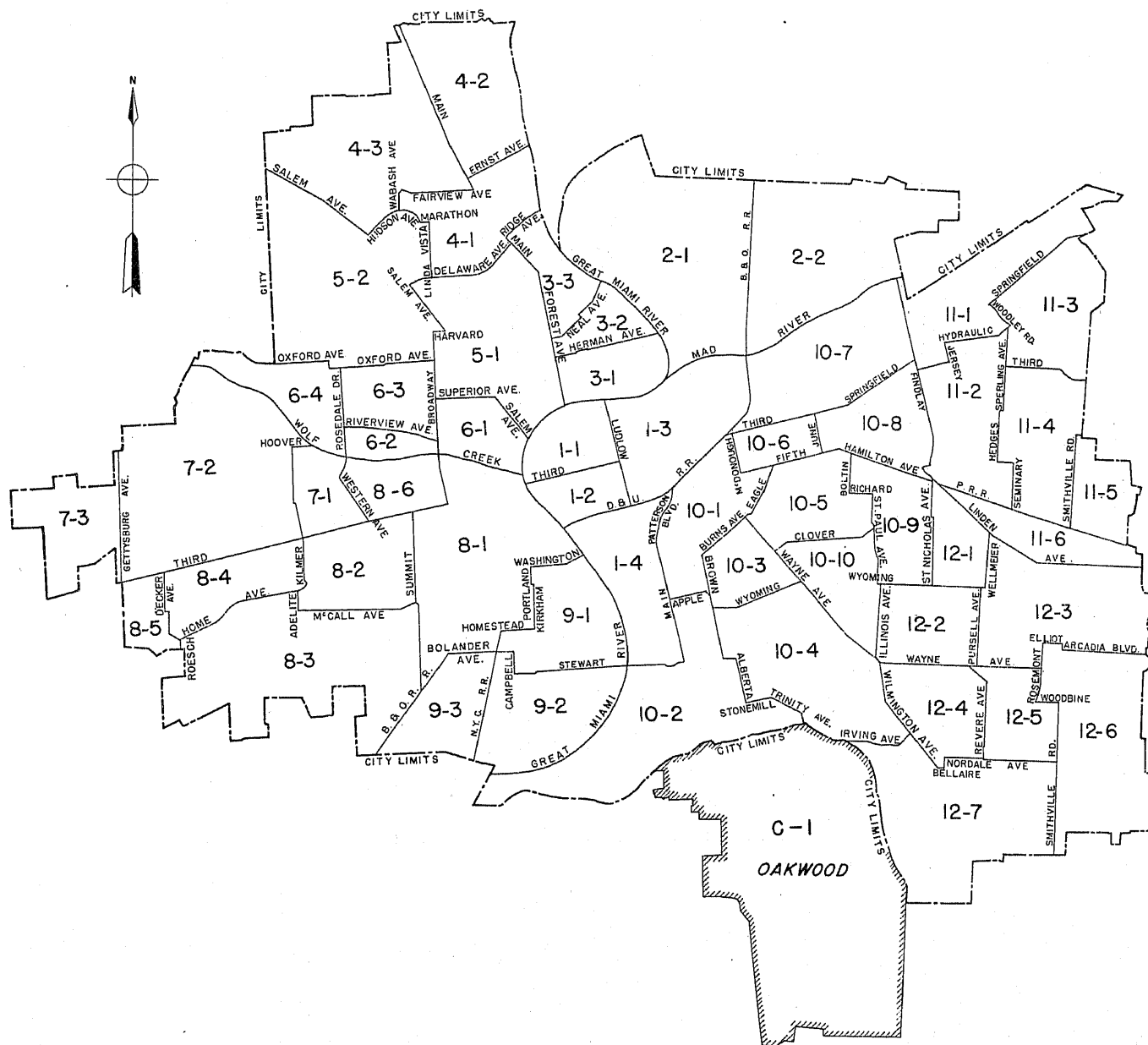

COLUMBUS BY CENSUS TRACTS

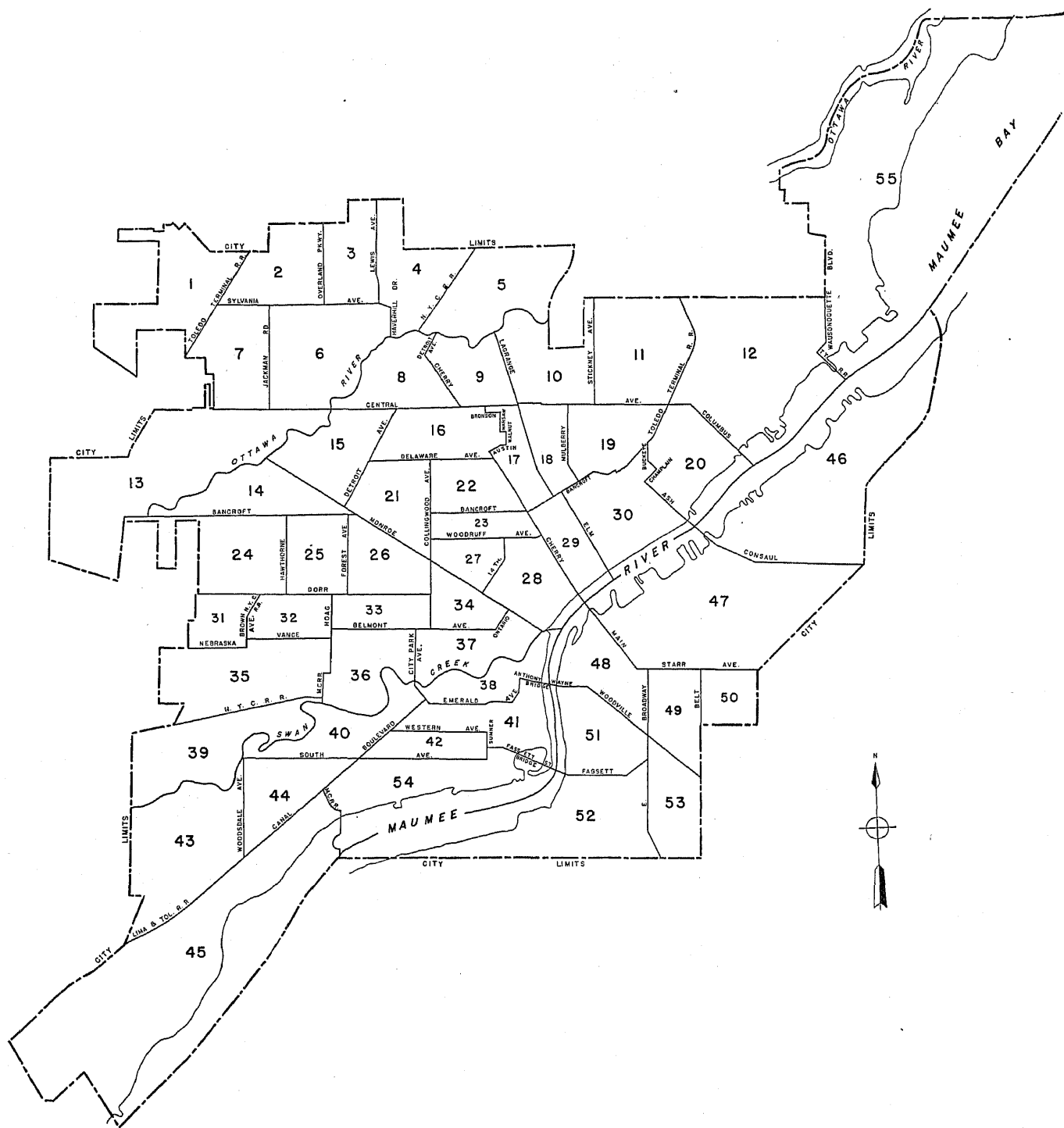


DAYTON AND ADJACENT AREA BY CENSUS TRACTS

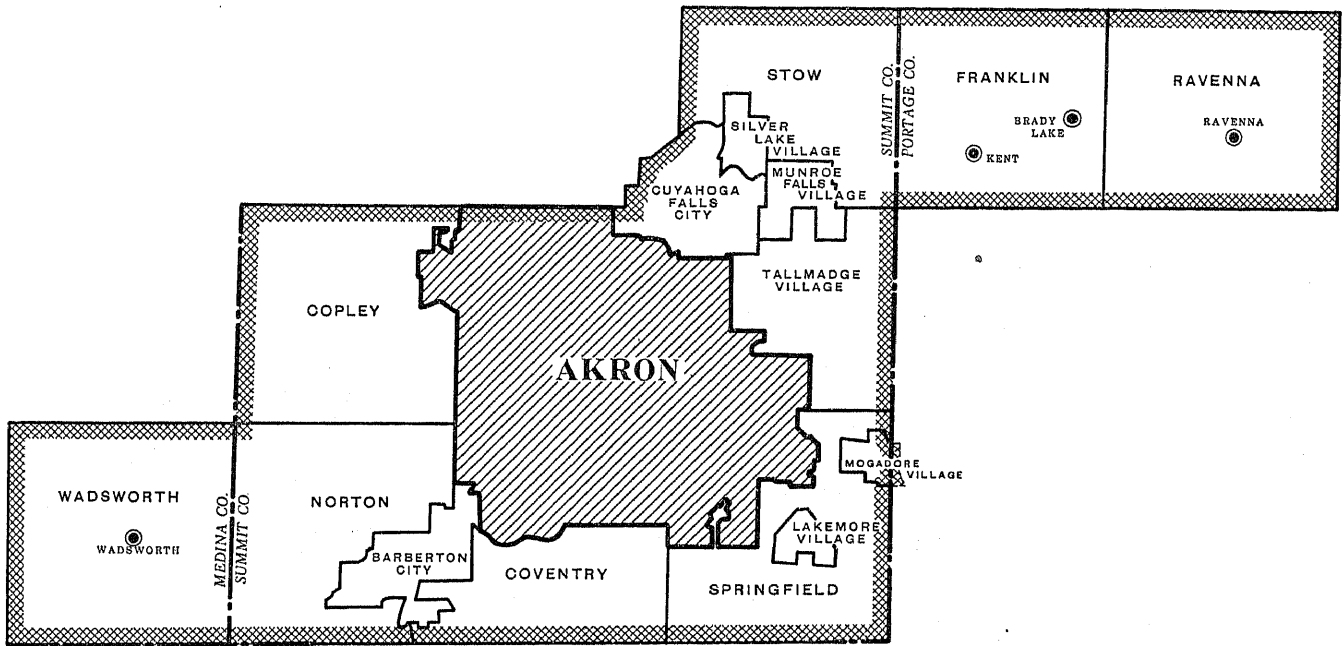

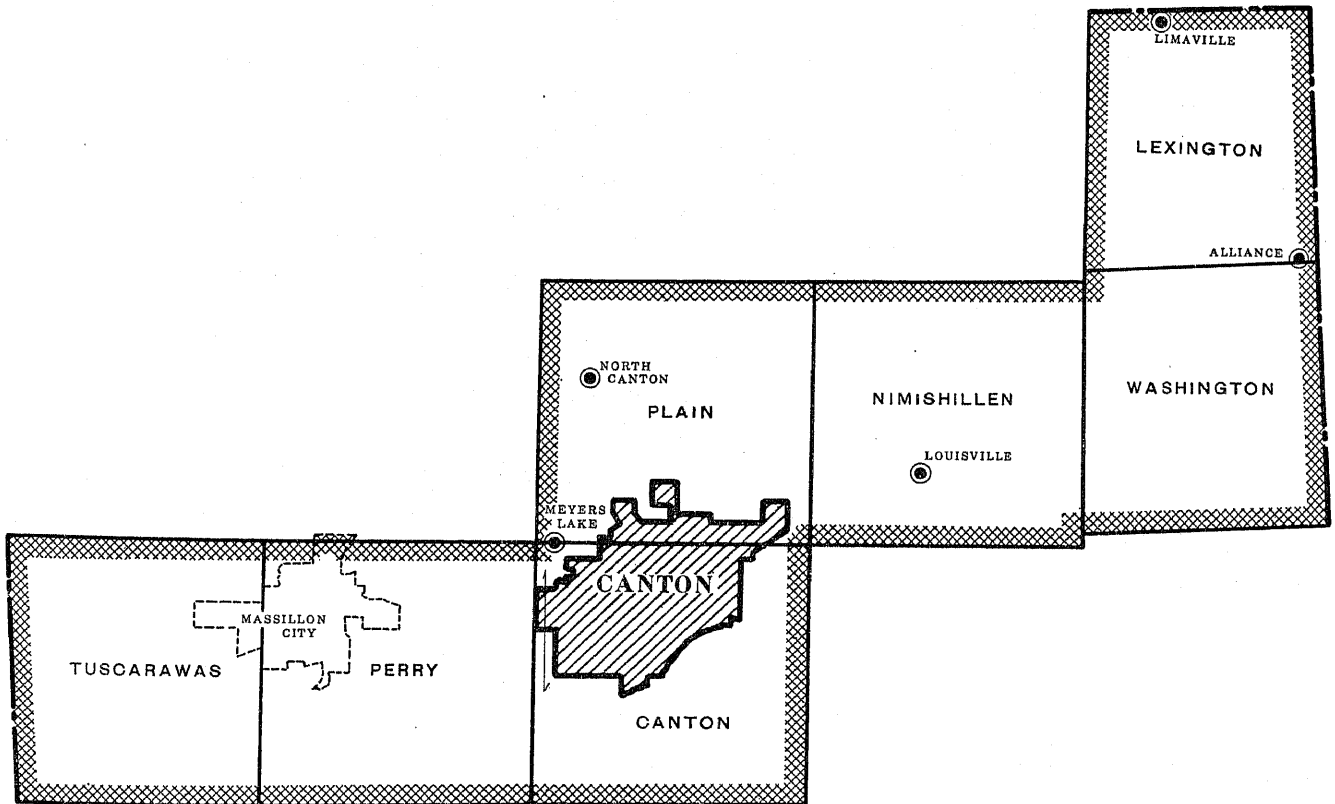
TOLEDO BY CENSUS TRACTS



AKRON METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

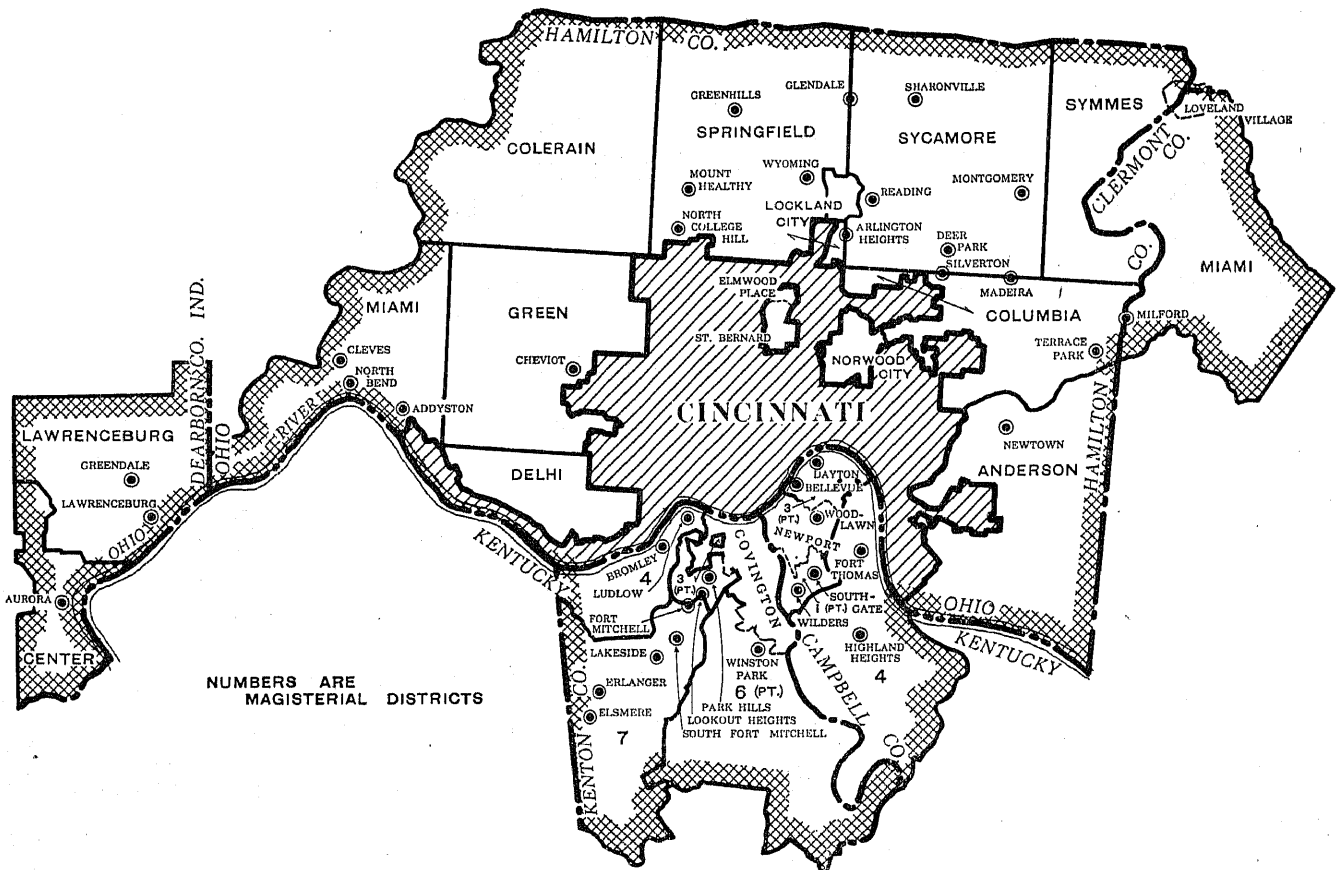


CANTON METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

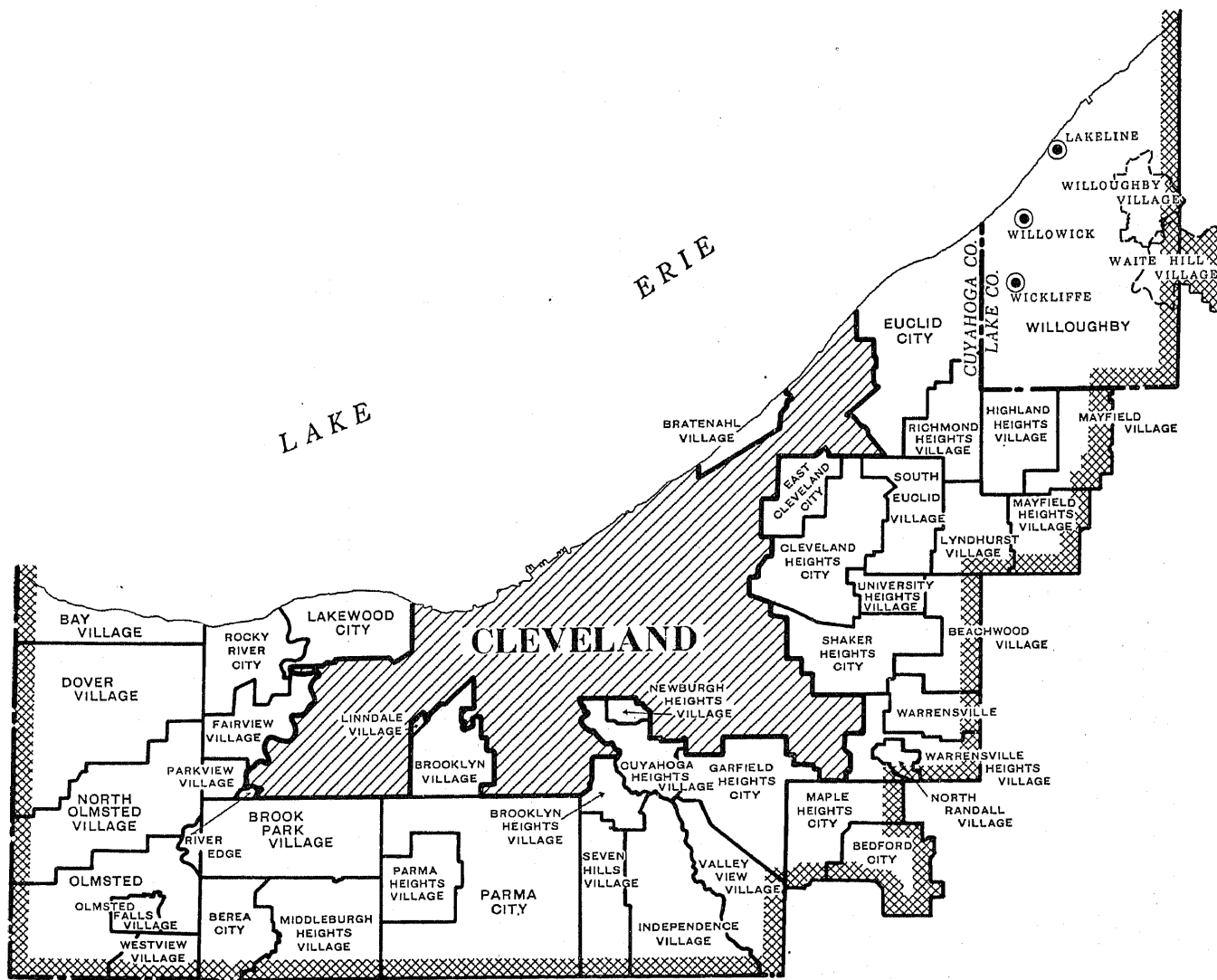

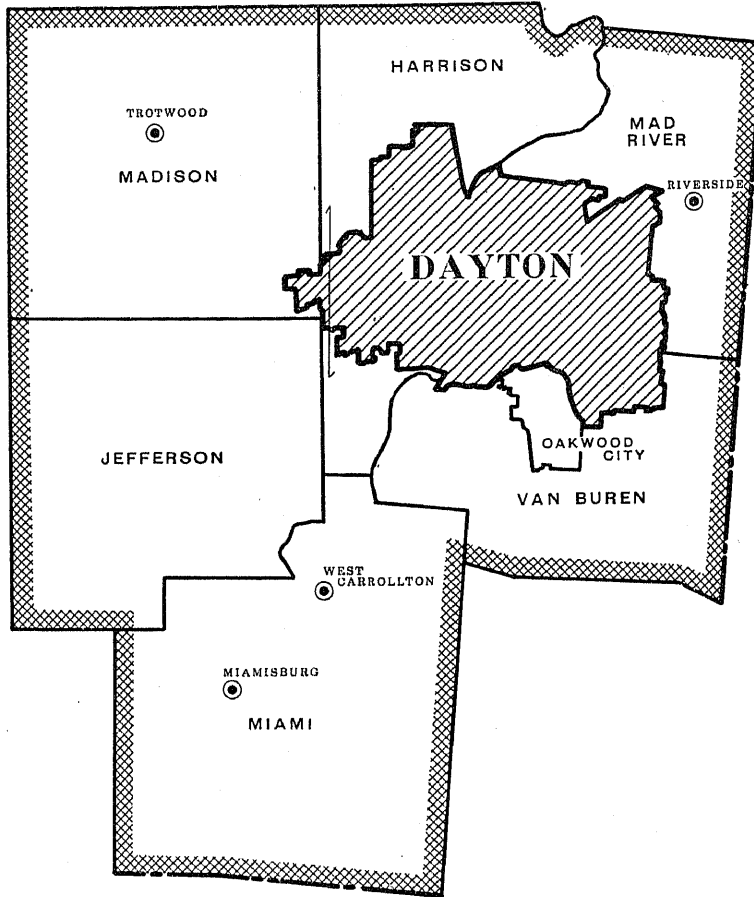

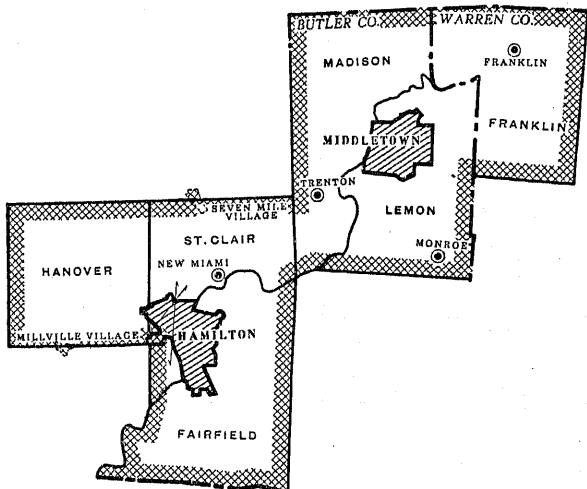
COLUMBUS (OHIO) METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



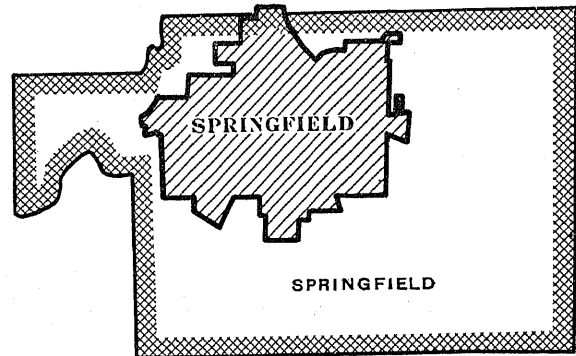

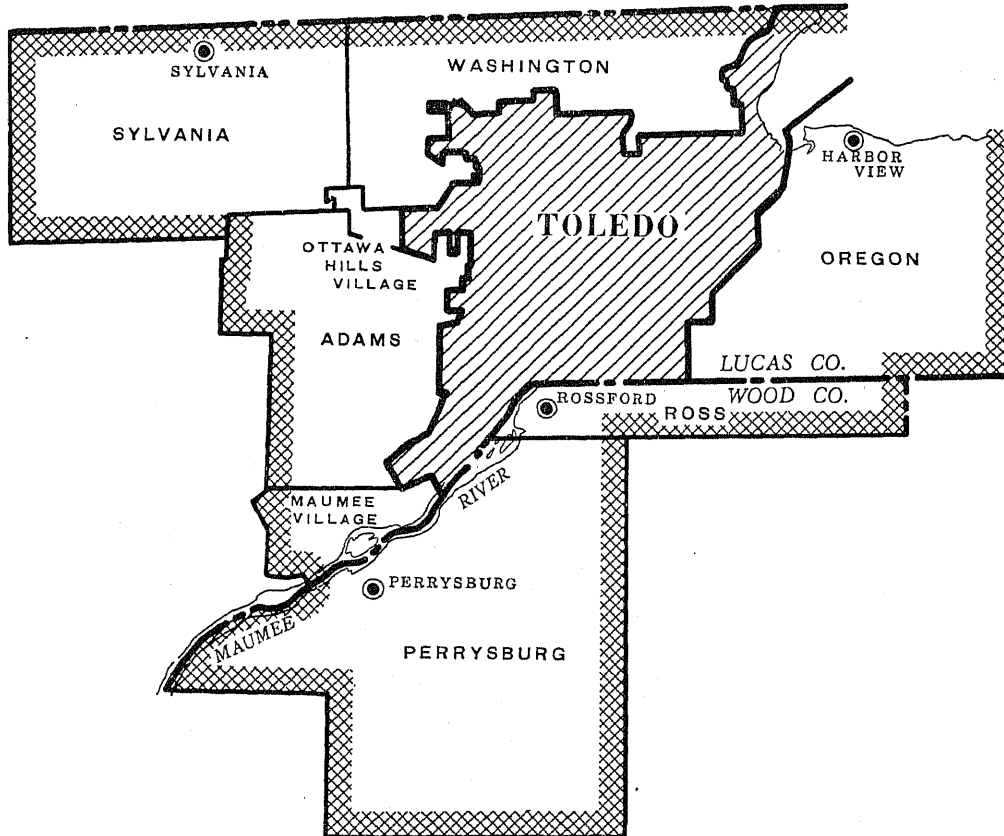
