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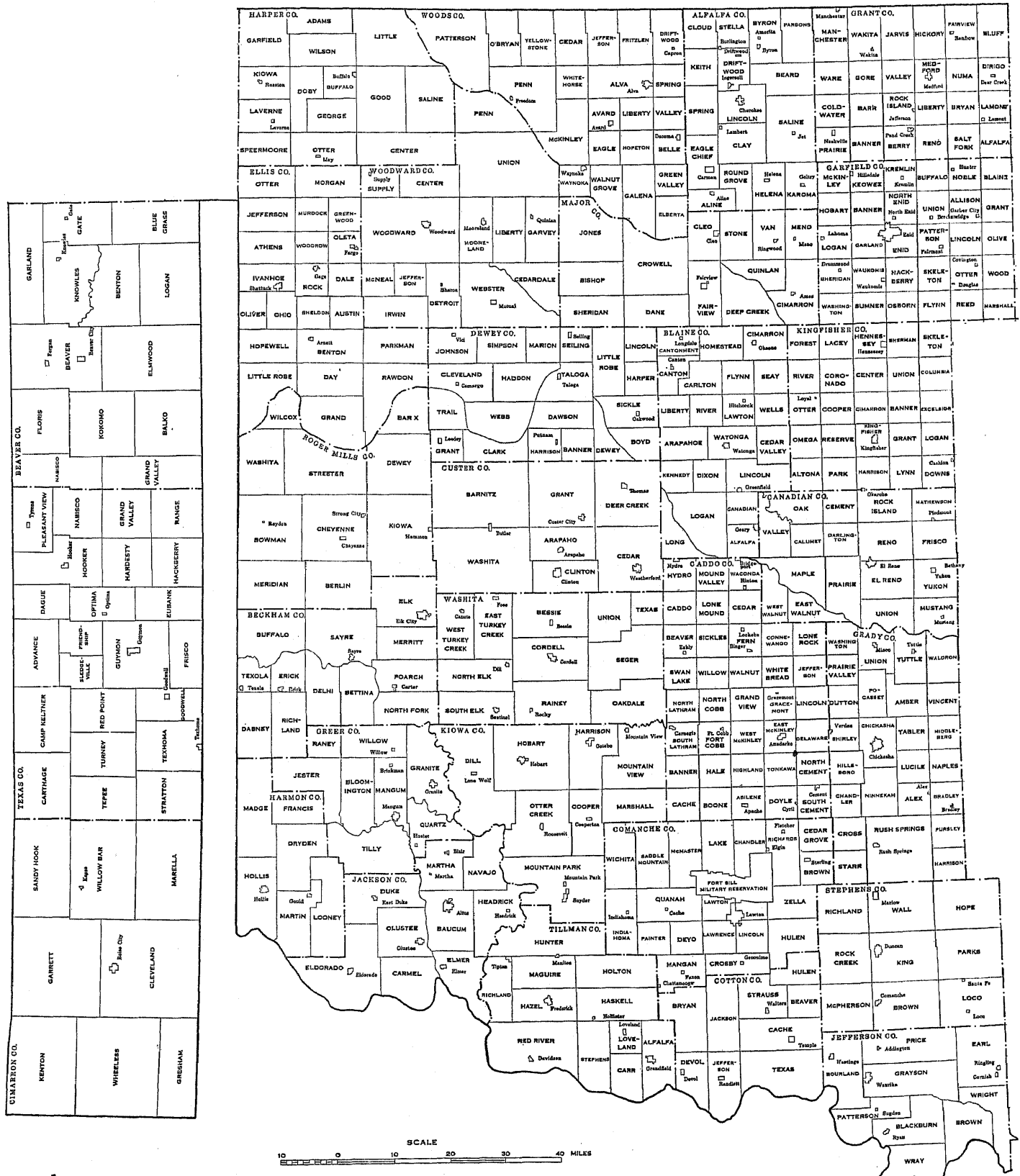
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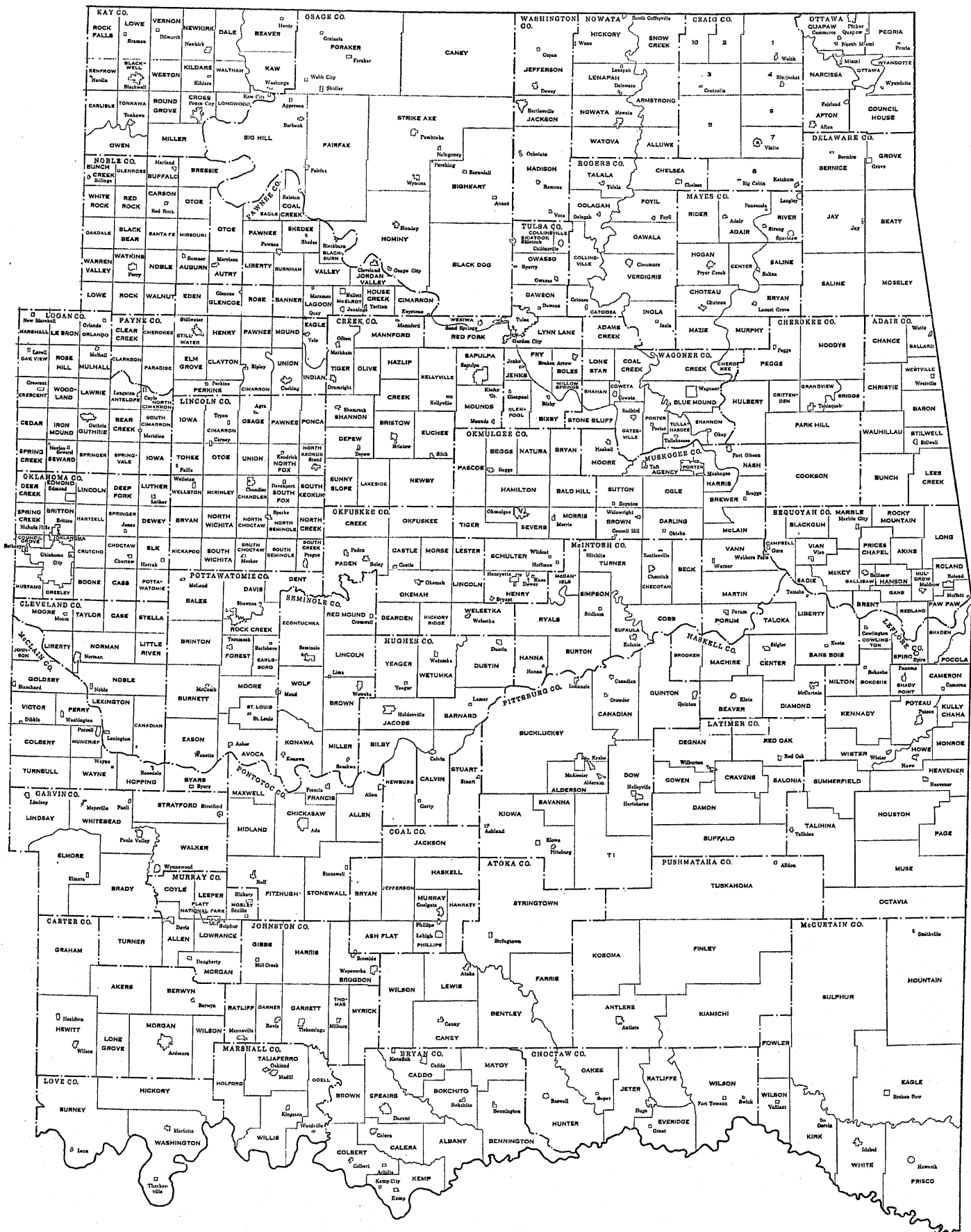

# OKLAHOMA

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—The Territory of Oklahoma was organized in 1890 from the western part of Indian Territory and the Public Land Strip, originally a part of Texas. In 1893 the Territory of Oklahoma was increased by the addition of the Cherokee Outlet, which fixed the present northern boundary. In 1907 Oklahoma Territory and the remaining part of Indian Territory were combined and admitted to the Union as the forty-sixth State with boundaries substantially as at present. The population of Oklahoma on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 2,336,434, which represents a decrease of 59,606, or 2.5 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 69,283 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 33.7, as compared with 34.6 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Oklahoma from 1890, the year in which the Territory of Oklahoma was first

separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. This table also presents the population of Oklahoma and Indian Territory at the special census taken as of July 1, 1907, shortly before the State of Oklahoma was admitted to the Union. The urban and rural population of the State at each decennial census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Oklahoma consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Madill qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940, but not in 1930.

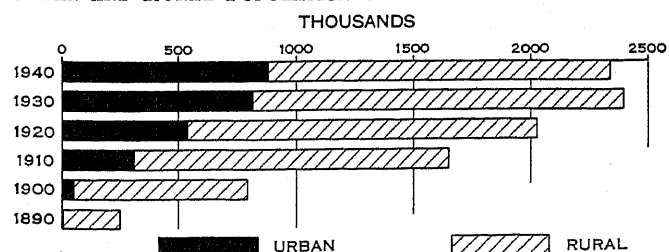

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Oklahoma is shown by counties, townships, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from

previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 and 7-A and for the census tracts of Oklahoma City and its adjacent areas in table 8.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are 21 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Oklahoma City, the capital and largest city, had a population in 1940 of 204,424.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 77 counties of Oklahoma from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Twenty-nine of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and forty-eight decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Oklahoma are the townships, cities, and towns. (Fort Sill Military Reservation and Platt National Park are also classified as primary divisions.) There are 135 cities and 384 towns; all but 2 of these cities (Muskogee and Vinita) and all of the towns are primary divisions. The two cities are coextensive with the townships in which they are located and form secondary divisions of these minor civil divisions.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the secondary cities is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which they are respectively located. Where a city or town is located partly in one county and partly in another, the part in a given county is presented in the regular way as a primary division of that county, and, to make the presentation complete, the population is also shown, in *italics*, for the part outside that county and for the city or town as a whole.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. Only a portion of a minor civil division is included if the minor civil division has a large area and the principal concentration of population is in a small section near the central city with the more remote sections being sparsely settled. In such cases, the unit considered is not the minor civil division but component enumeration districts. (For example, not all of the enumeration districts in Black Dog township of Osage County are included in the Tulsa metropolitan district.) A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Oklahoma City metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Oklahoma City metropolitan district had 221,229 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 202,163. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Table 7-A shows the population of the Tulsa metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Tulsa metropolitan district had 188,562 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 183,207. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

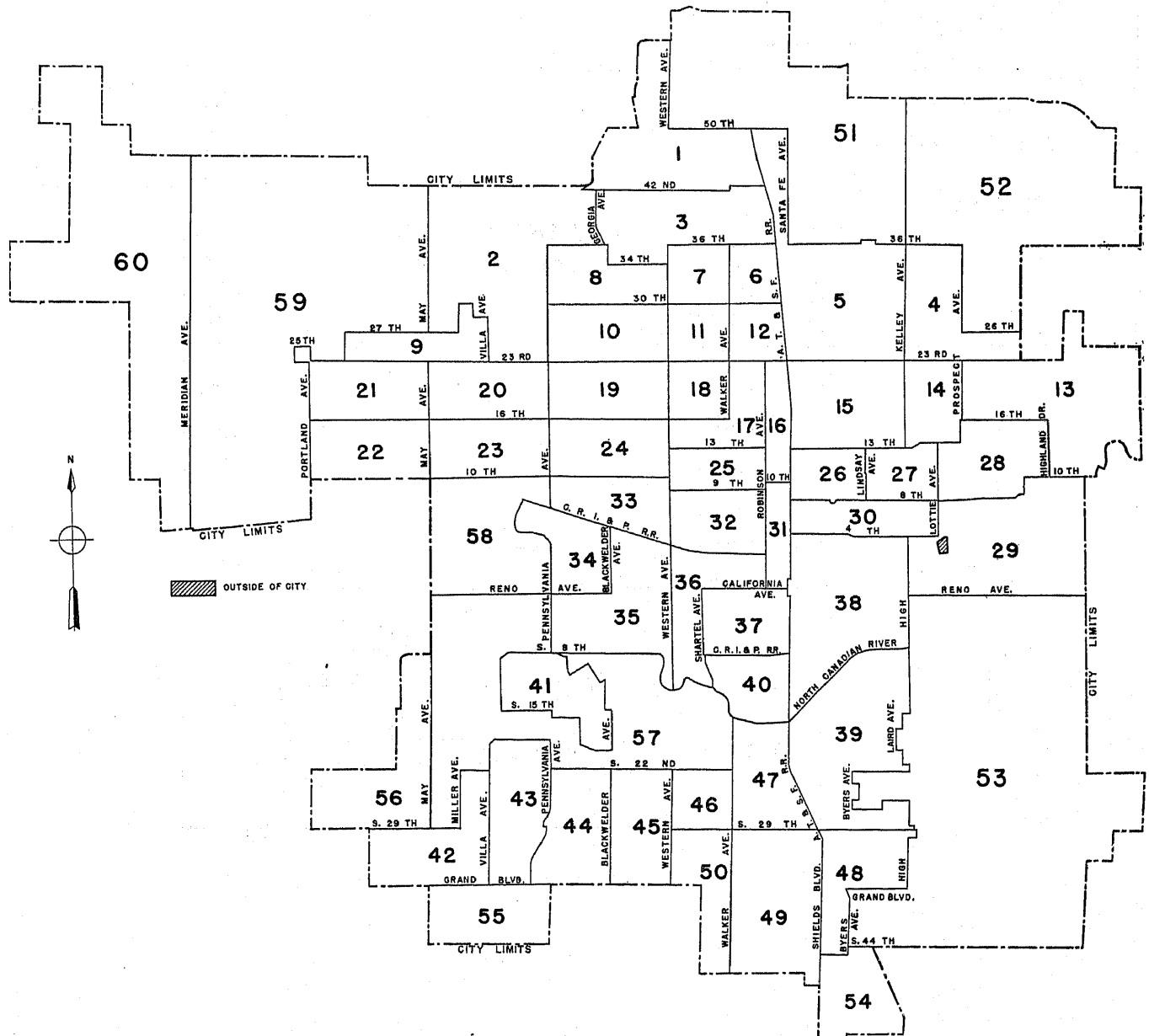
**Census tracts.**—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities (and sometimes their adjacent areas) are subdivided, for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Oklahoma City is shown by census tracts; this table also gives the population in 1940 by tracts of certain adjacent areas, shown on the accompanying maps. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses.

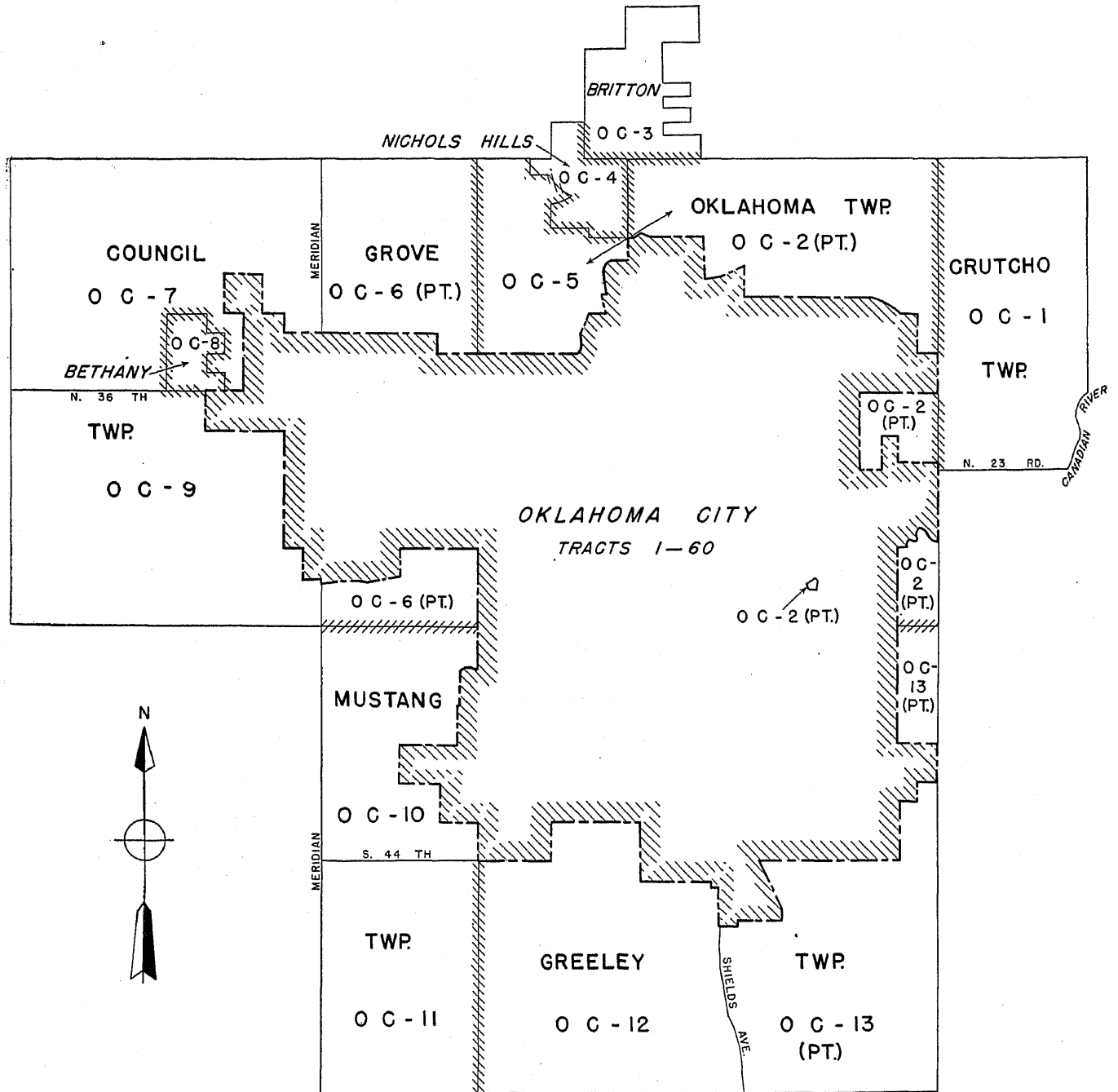

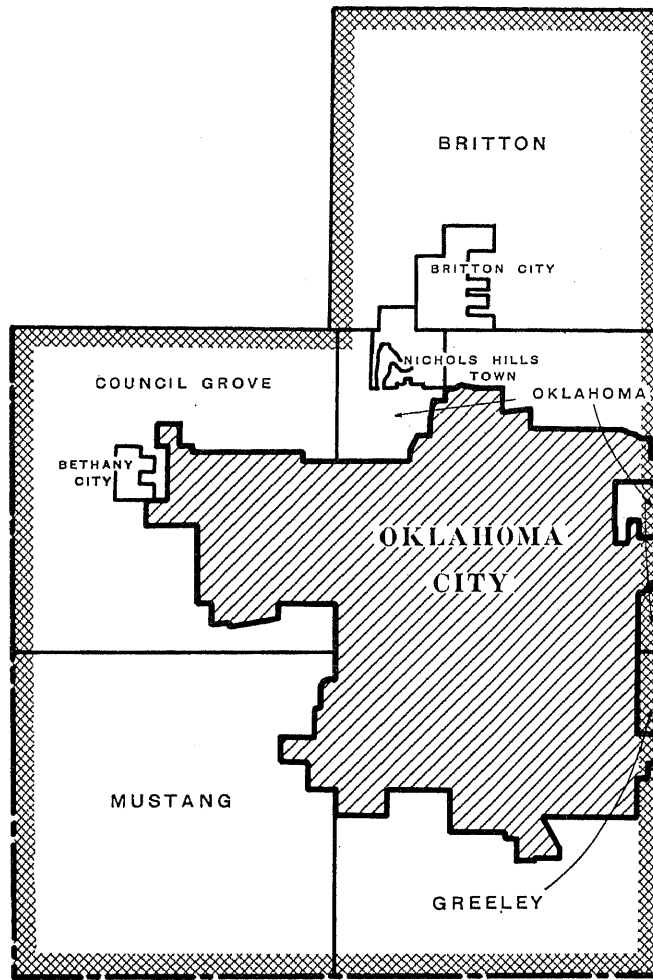


OKLAHOMA CITY AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

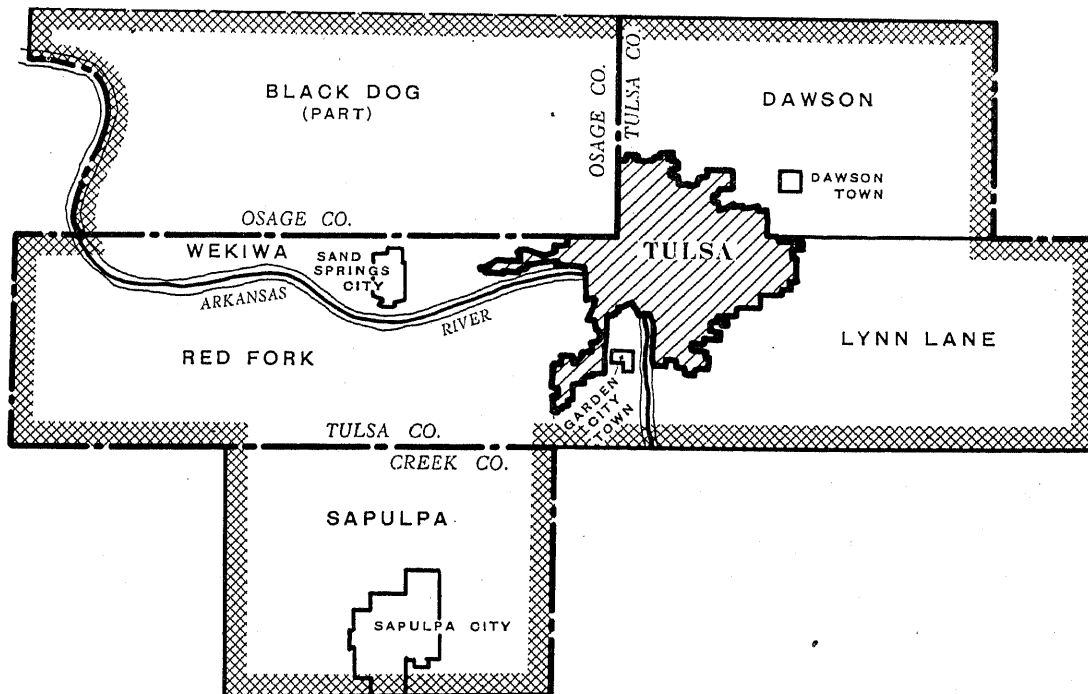
Part 2.—Tracts in Oklahoma County

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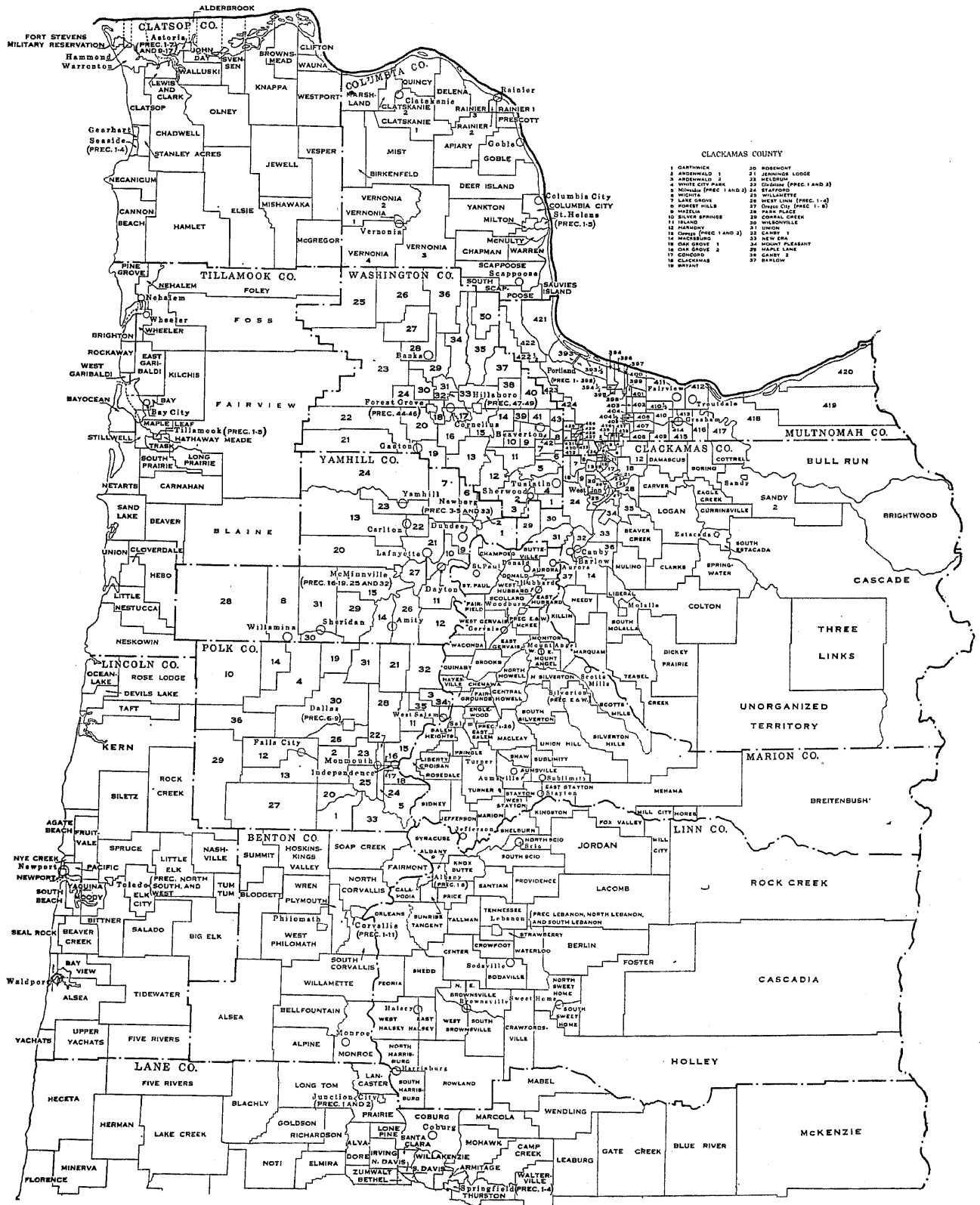
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OREGON—NORTHWESTERN PART  
MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—ELECTION PRECINCTS

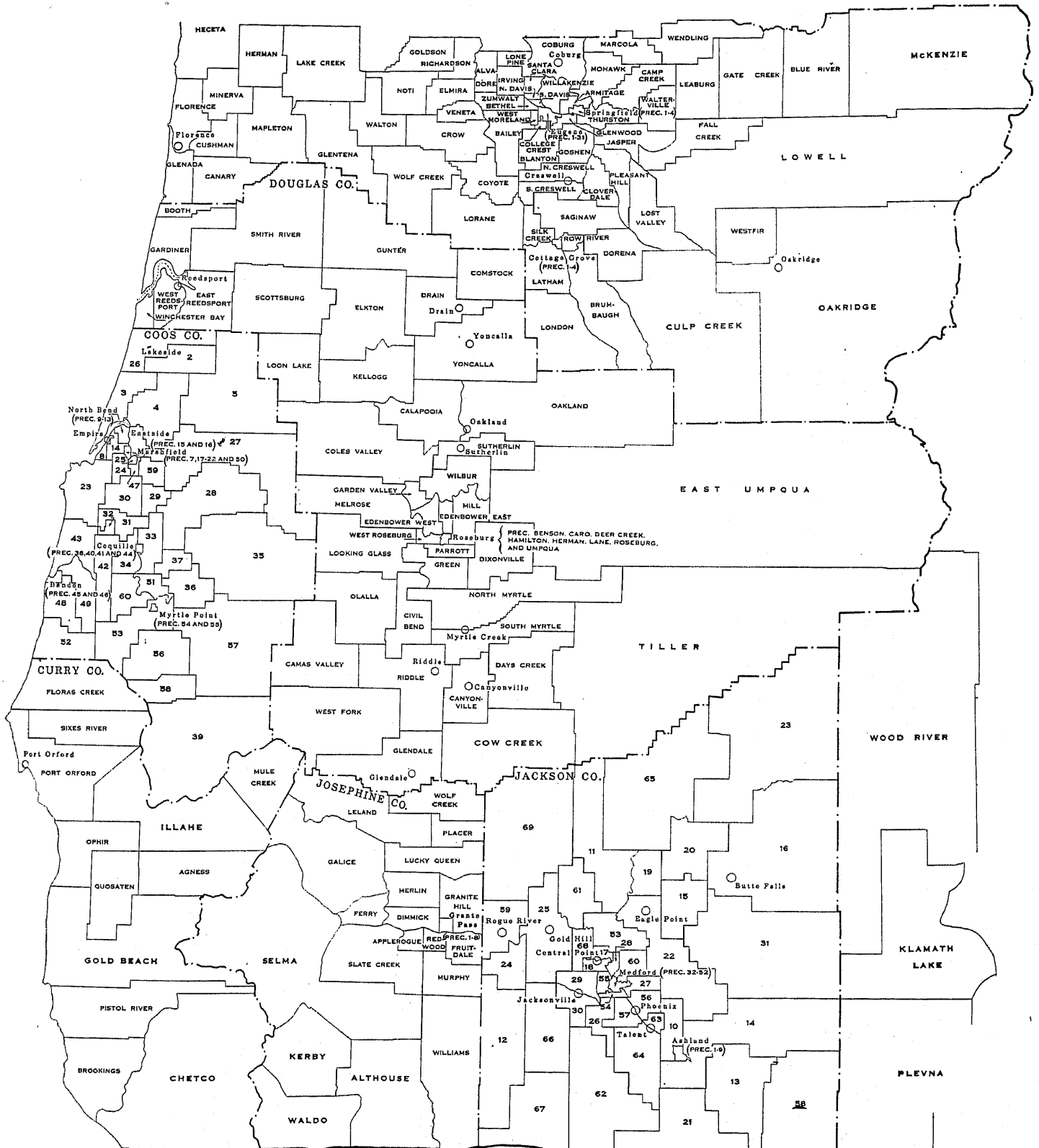

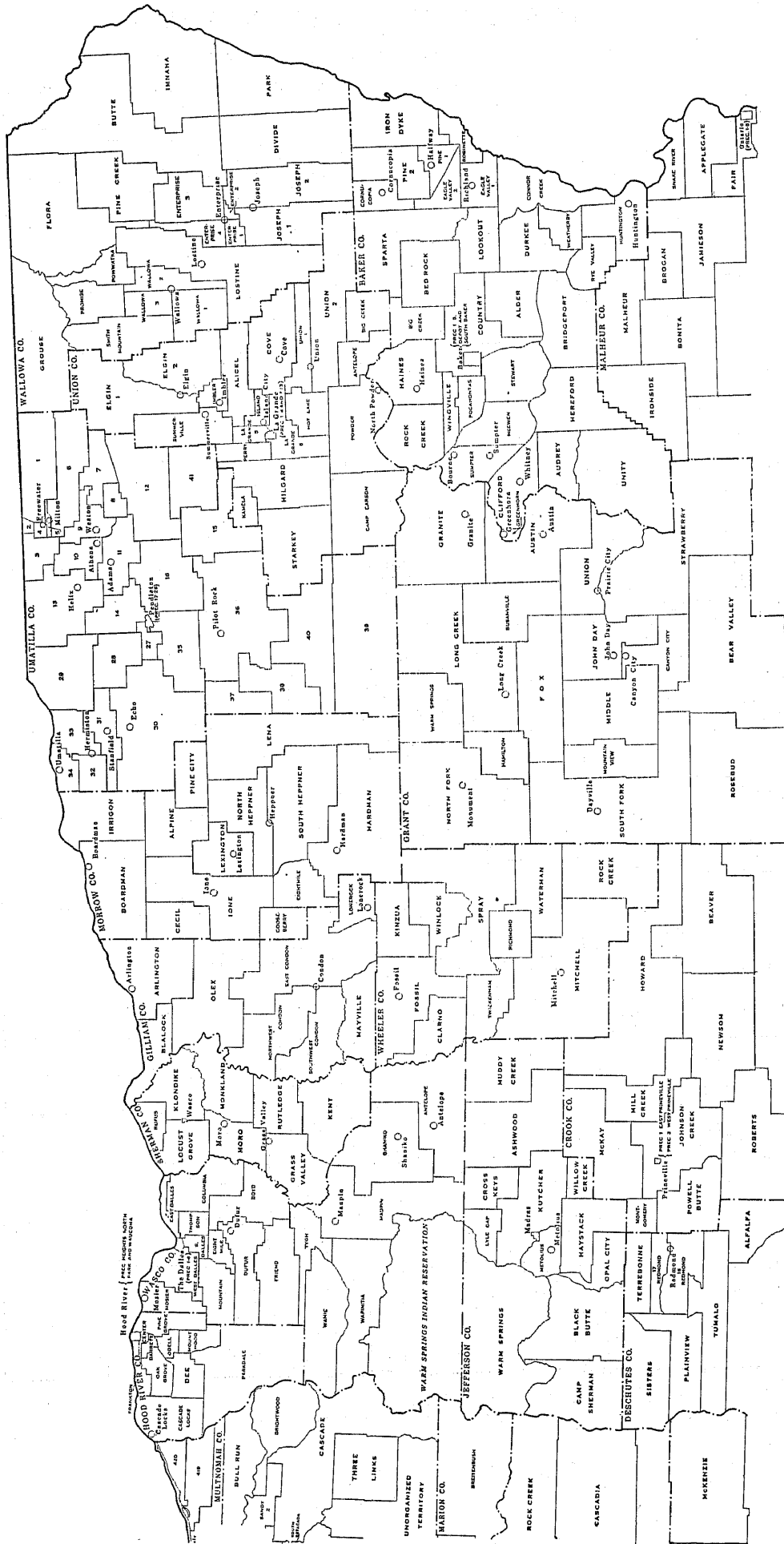

# OREGON

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Oregon was organized as a Territory in 1848, including the area now constituting the States of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and parts of western Montana and Wyoming. The area of the Territory was greatly reduced in 1853 by the organization of the Territory of Washington. In 1859, with the transfer to Washington Territory of the area now comprising southern Idaho, western Wyoming, and a small tract in western Montana, Oregon assumed its present boundaries and was admitted to the Union as the thirty-third State. The population of Oregon on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,089,684, which represents an increase of 135,898, or 14.2 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 96,350 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 11.3, as compared with 9.9 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Oregon from 1850 the year in which the Territory of Oregon was first enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Oregon consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Cottage Grove was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit.

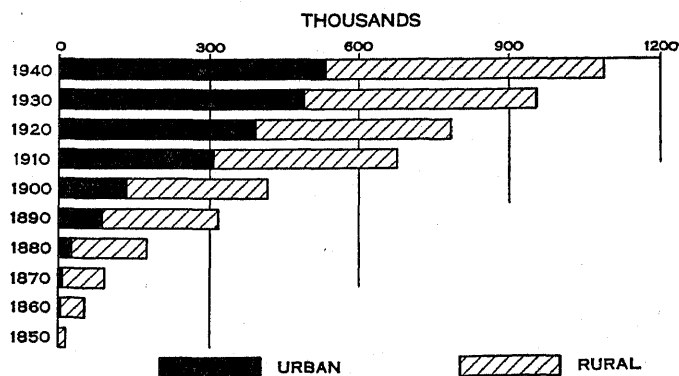

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Oregon is shown by counties, election precincts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards; table 7 presents data for the Portland metropolitan district, and table 8 for the census tracts of Portland.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are seven cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Portland, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 305,394; and Salem, the capital of the State, had a population of 30,908.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 36 counties of Oregon from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Twenty-nine of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and seven decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Oregon are called election precincts. (The Fort Stevens Military Reservation, in Clatsop County, is also classified as a primary division.) The incorporated cities and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 126 cities and 81 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions forms a part of some election precinct (or precincts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by election precincts, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more election precincts the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct. The population of the cities and towns that comprise several entire precincts is presented in roman type, followed by the precinct population in *italics*. The population of the 392 precincts included in the city of Portland is presented separately in table 4-A.

**Portland metropolitan district.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. The metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

The Portland metropolitan district is the only one in Oregon. Like several other districts it occupies territory in more than one State.

Table 7 shows the population of the Portland metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and some comparative figures for 1930, together with the increase during the decade. In 1940 the Portland metropolitan district had 406,406 inhabitants,

whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 378,728. Comparative figures for 1930 are not available for the precincts because of the re-districting of the counties into new minor civil divisions. This re-districting has resulted in a slight net increase in the area of the metropolitan district in 1940, but the effect upon the increase of population in the district is not ascertainable.

**Census tracts.**—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Portland is shown by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. The census tracts for Portland are shown on the accompanying map.

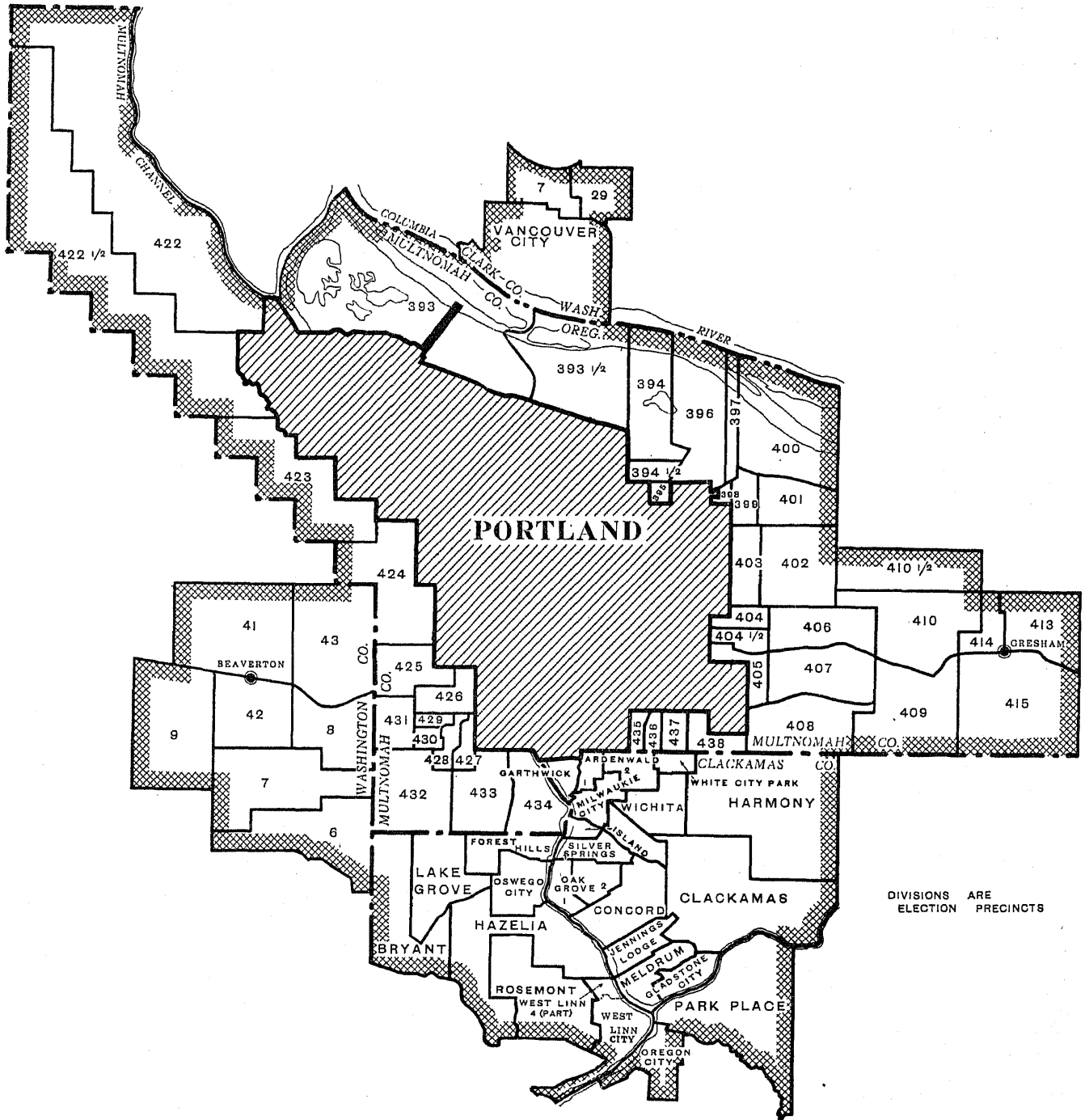

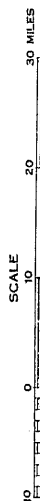
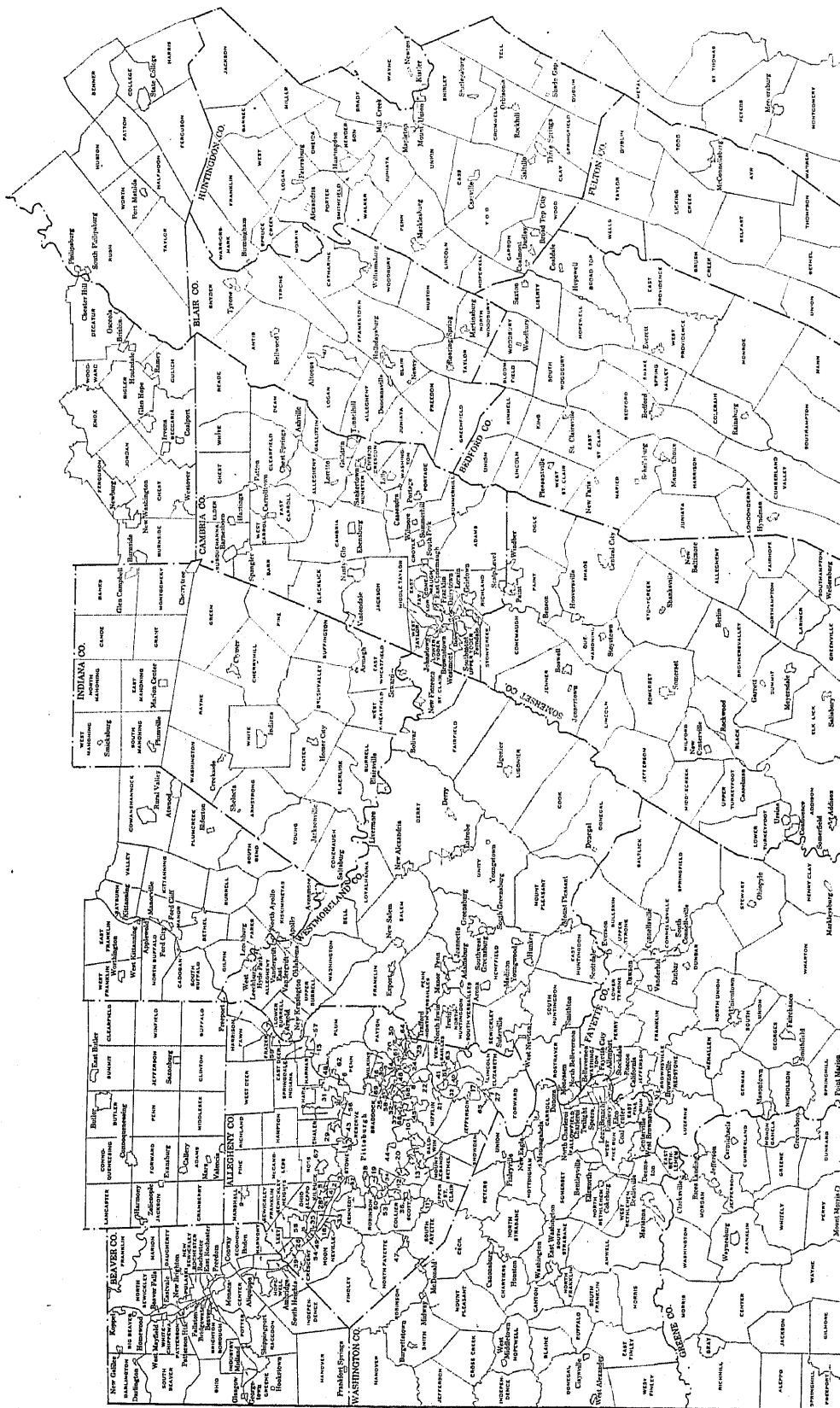
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PENNSYLVANIA—WESTERN PART

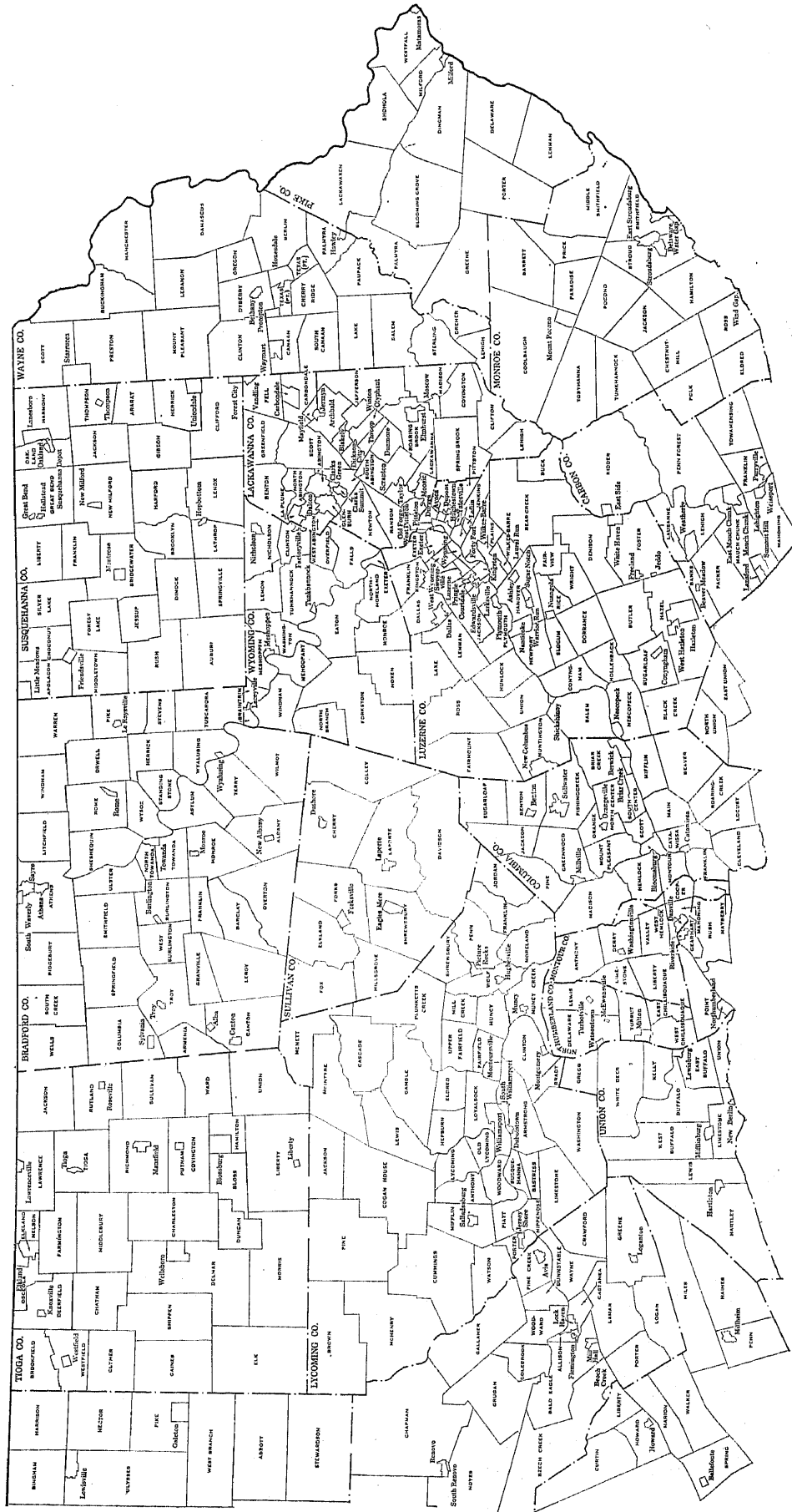

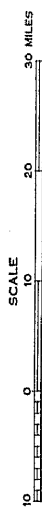

# PENNSYLVANIA

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—Pennsylvania was one of the Thirteen Original States. With the transfer of a small tract of land in its northwestern corner from the Federal Government in 1792, Pennsylvania assumed its present boundaries. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 9,900,180, which represents an increase of 268,830, or 2.8 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 45,045 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 219.8, as compared with 213.8 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Pennsylvania from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in

the accompanying chart. The urban population of Pennsylvania, as defined by the Census Bureau, consists mainly of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more. It also includes the population of 11 townships (not incorporated as municipalities, nor containing any areas so incorporated) that had a total population of 10,000 or more and a population density of 1,000 or more per square mile.<sup>1</sup> The remainder of the population is classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they meet the requirements; for example, Shaler township was classified as urban under the special rule in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they no longer meet the requirements.

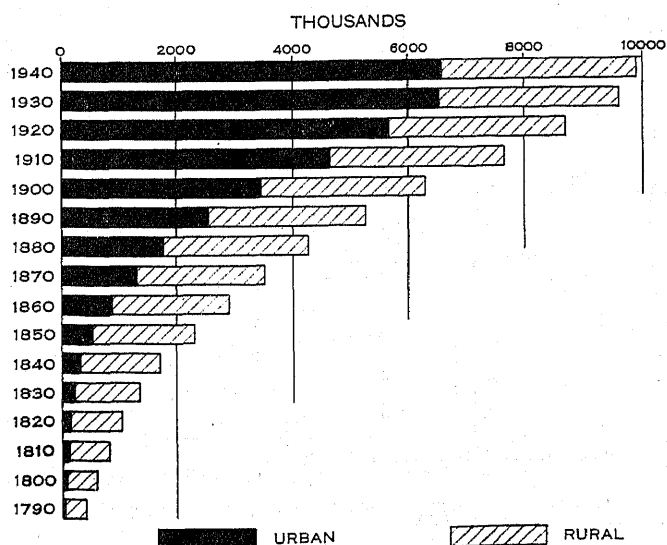

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Pennsylvania is shown by counties, townships, cities, boroughs, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 to 7-J and for the census tracts of Philadelphia and of Pittsburgh and its adjacent areas in tables 8 and 8-A, respectively.

**Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.**—There are 92 incorporated places in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these incorporated places at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Philadelphia, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 1,931,334; and Harrisburg, the capital of the State, had a population of 83,893.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 67 counties of Pennsylvania from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Fifty-eight of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and nine decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and con-

tiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory

in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The following tables give data for the 11 metropolitan districts with central cities in Pennsylvania. Parts of the Trenton, Wilmington, and Youngstown districts are also situated in Pennsylvania; data for these districts are presented in the bulletins for New Jersey, Delaware, and Ohio, respectively.

Table 7 shows the population of the Allentown-Bethlehem-Easton metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Like several others, this district occupies territory in more than one State. The Allentown-Bethlehem-Easton metropolitan district had 325,142 inhabitants in 1940 as compared with 322,172 in 1930. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Table 7-G shows the population of the Pittsburgh metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Pittsburgh metropolitan district had 1,994,060 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 1,953,668. That part of Derry township that was annexed to Latrobe borough, in Westmoreland County, in 1938 was included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. The population of this new area is not obtainable for either 1940 or 1930.

Table 7-J shows the population of the York metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. This district was defined for the first time in 1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase or decrease between 1930 and 1940. In 1940 the York metropolitan district had 92,627 inhabitants, while in 1930 the same area had a population of 87,195.

**Census tracts.**—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities (and sometimes their adjacent areas) have been subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In tables 8 and 8-A, respectively, the 1940 and 1930 population of Philadelphia and of Pittsburgh is shown by census tracts. Table 8-A also gives the population in 1940 by tracts of certain adjacent tracted areas comprising the remainder of Allegheny County; these tracts were not established until after 1930. All the tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps.

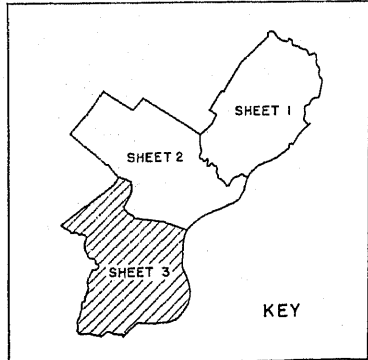
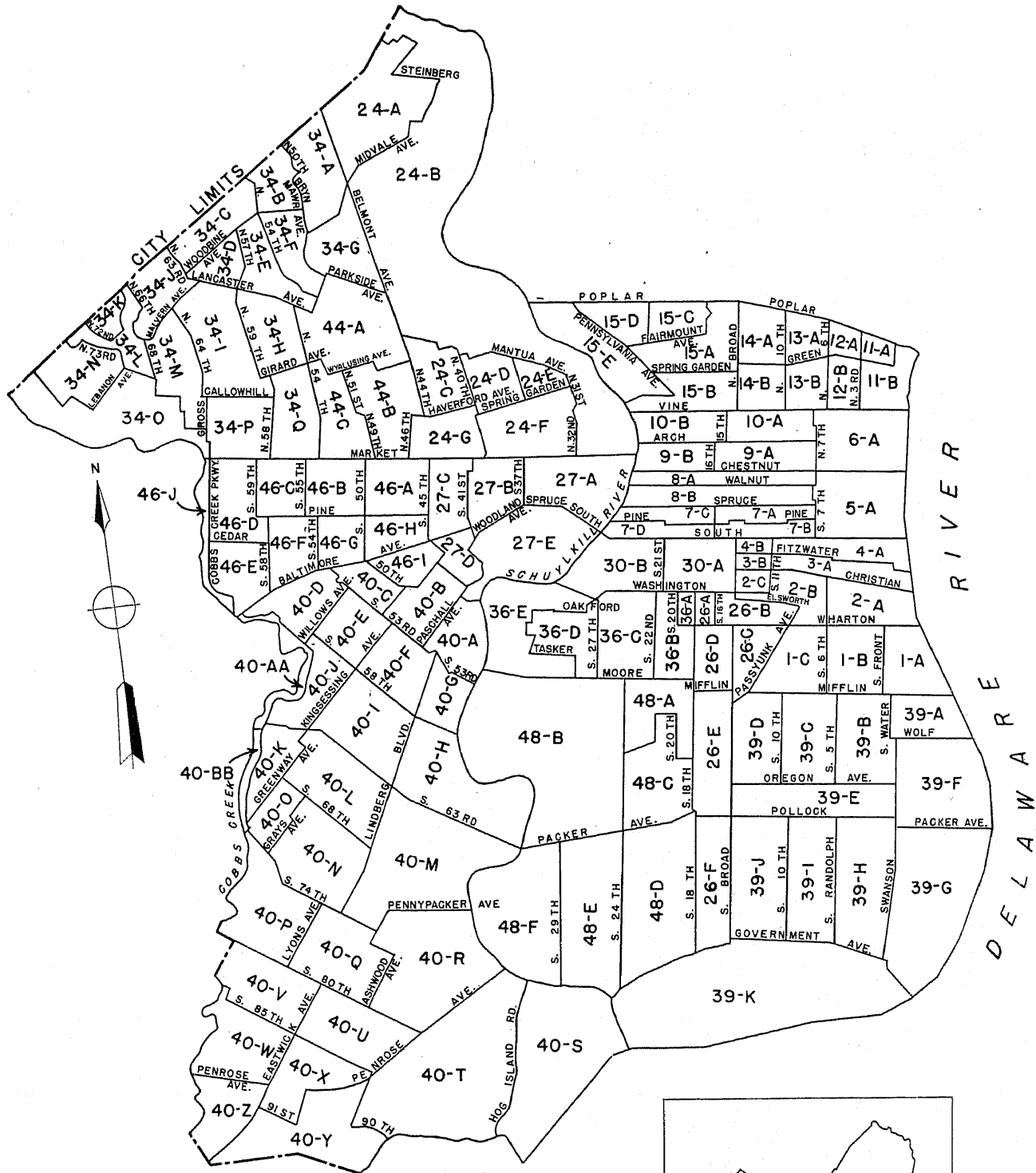

PHILADELPHIA BY CENSUS TRACTS—Part 2



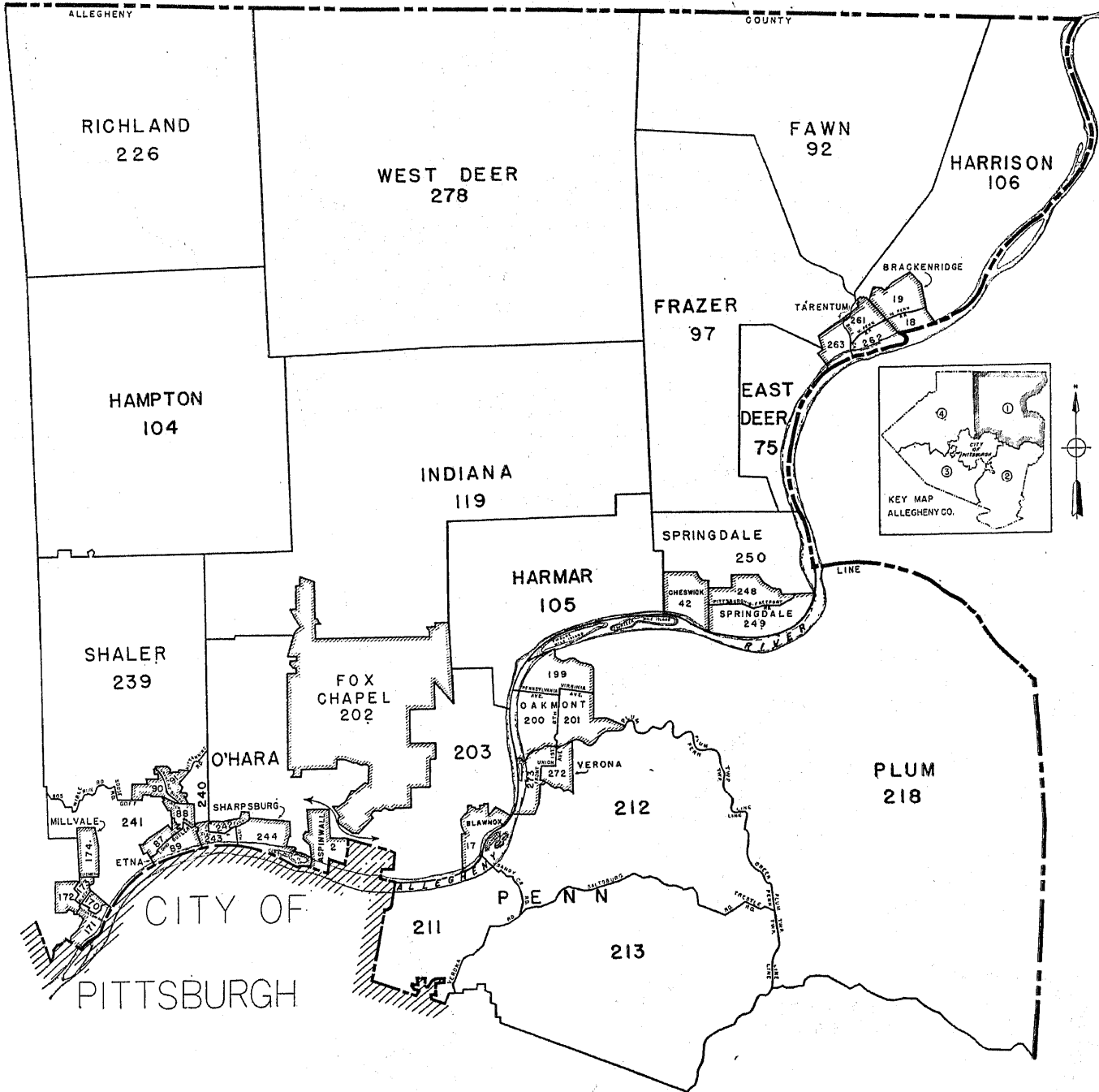
PHILADELPHIA BY CENSUS TRACTS—Part 3





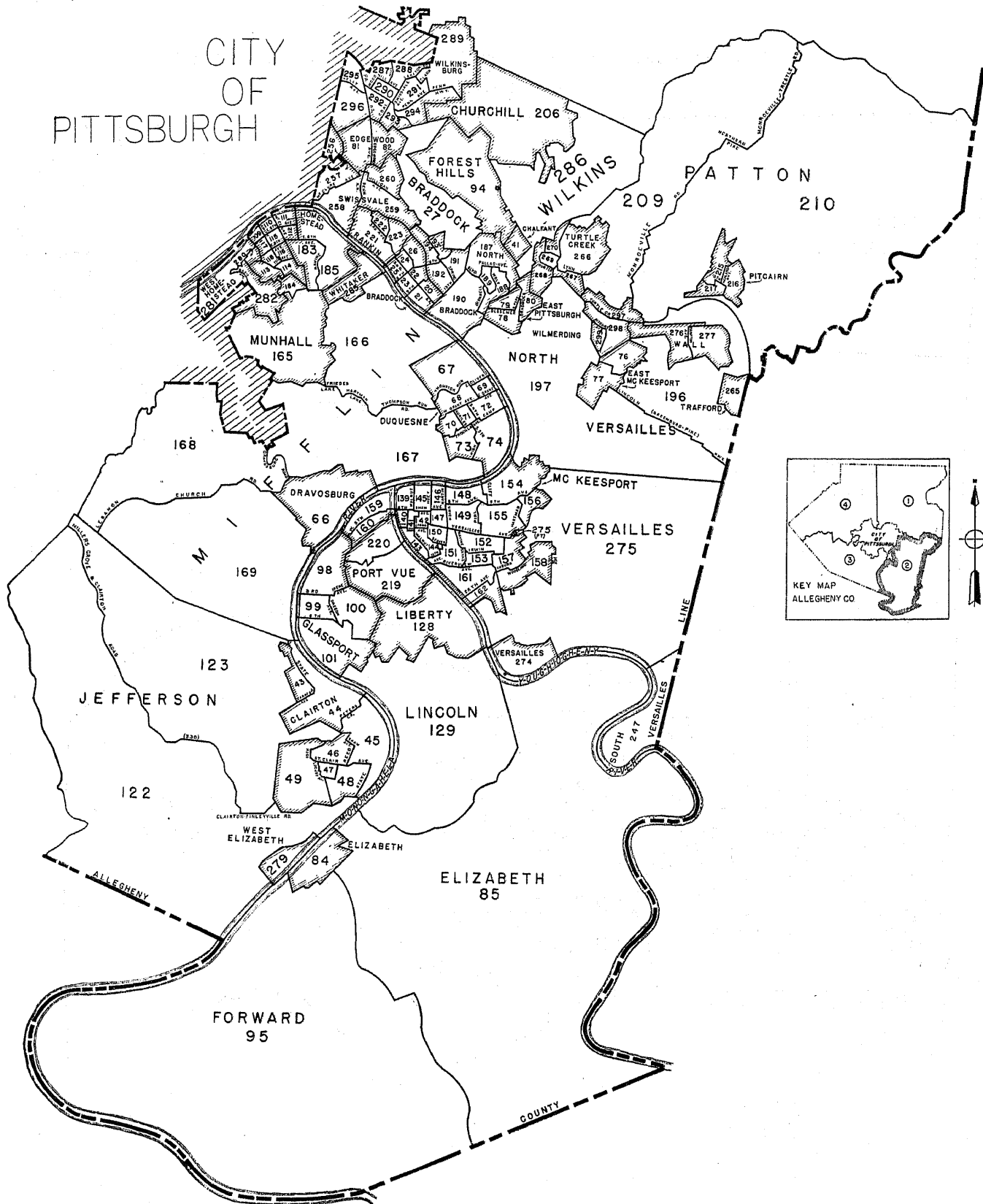


AREAS ADJACENT TO PITTSBURGH, BY CENSUS TRACTS  
TRACTS IN ALLEGHENY COUNTY—Part 1



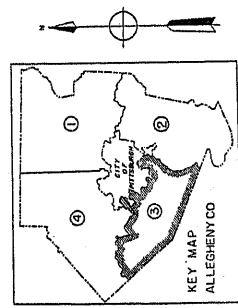
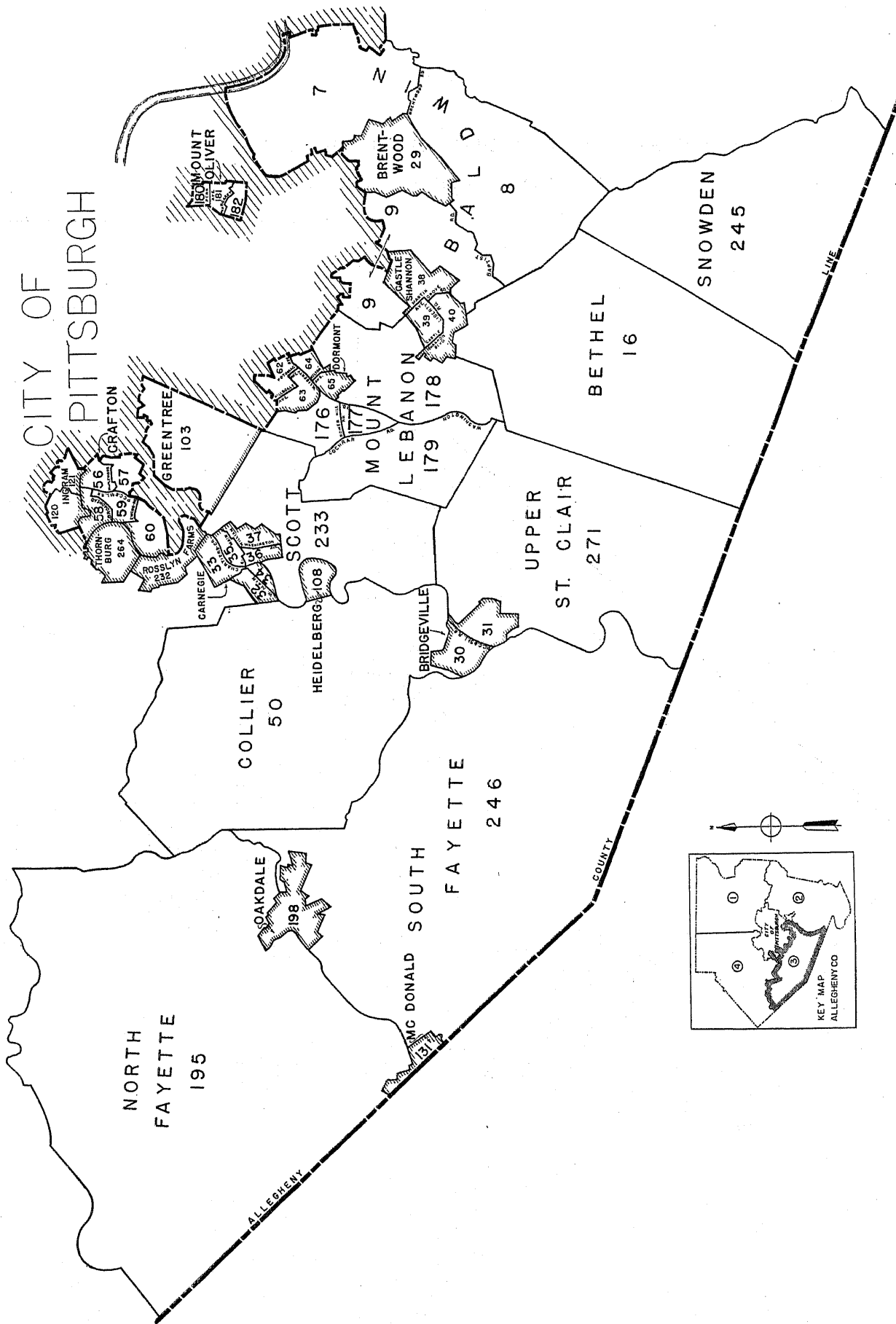

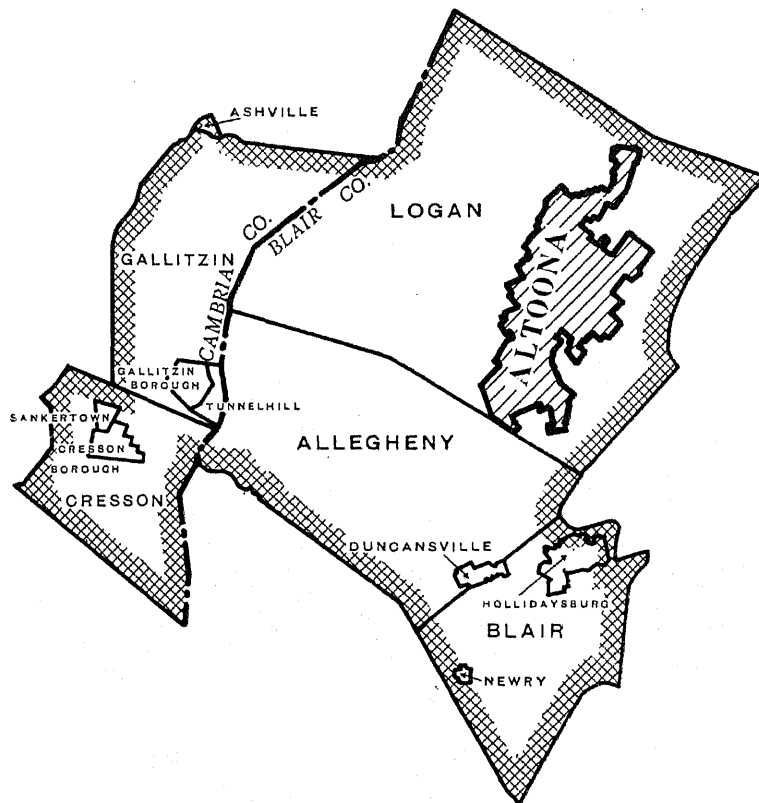

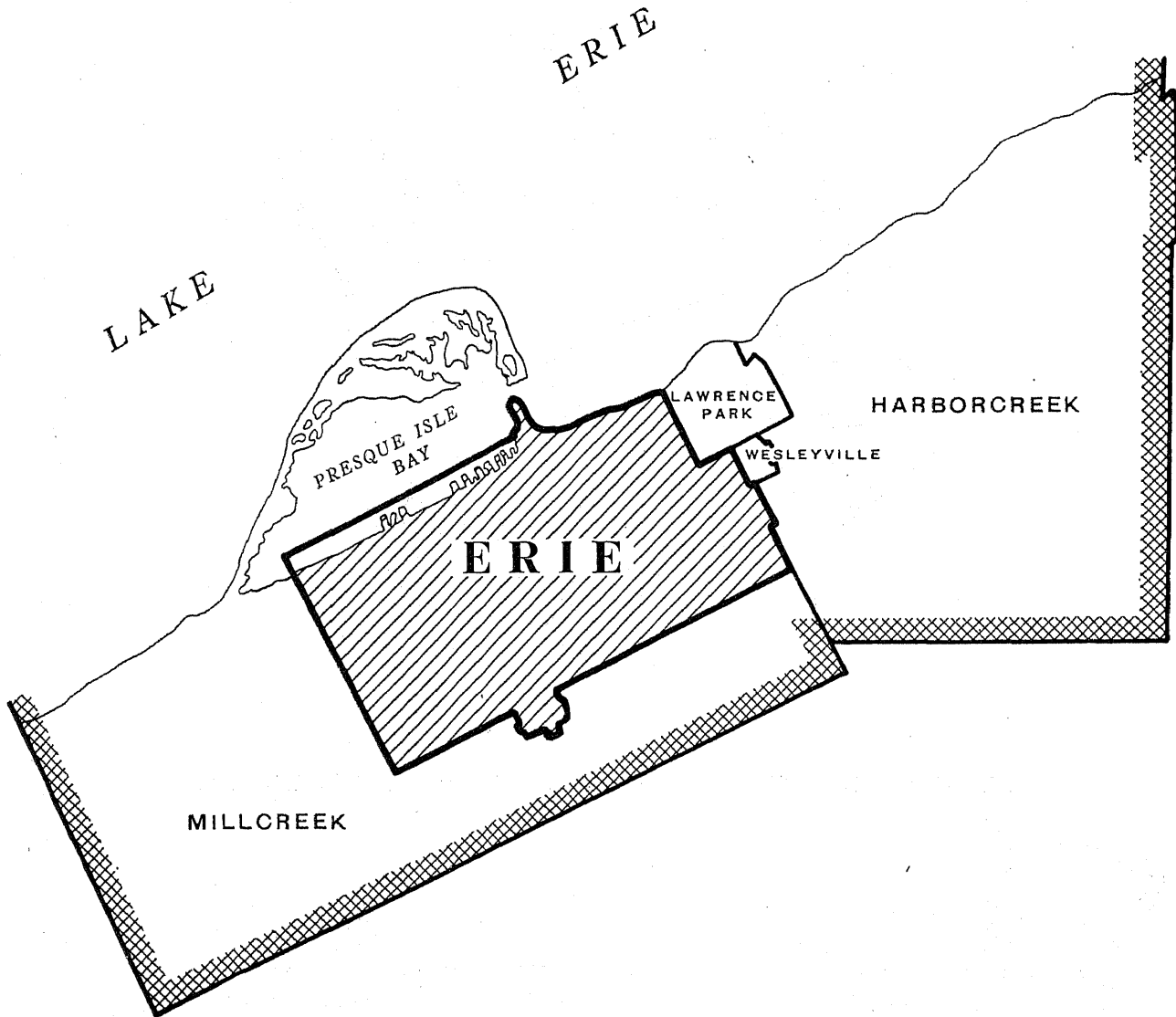
ALTOONA METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



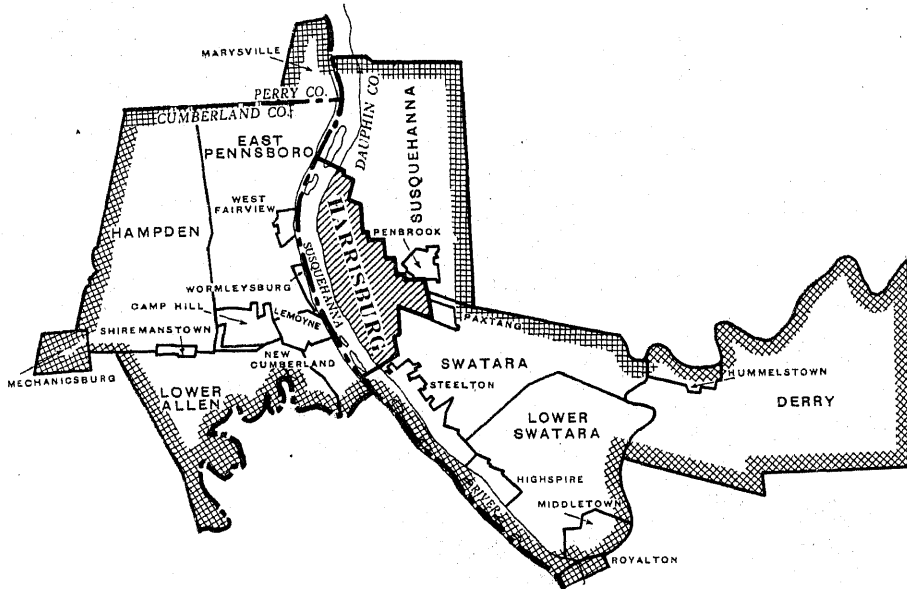
ALLENTOWN-BETHLEHEM-EASTON METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

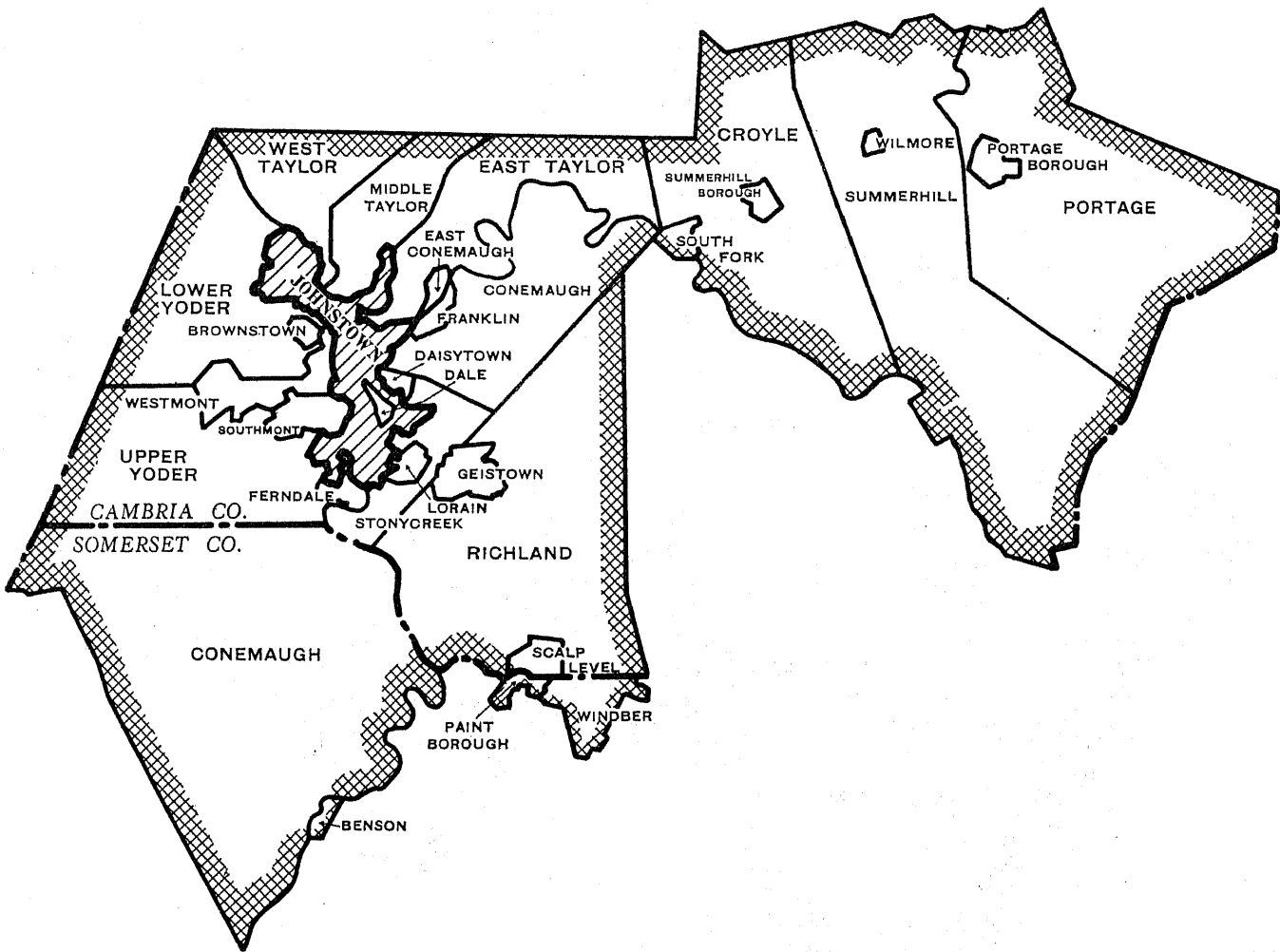


HARRISBURG METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

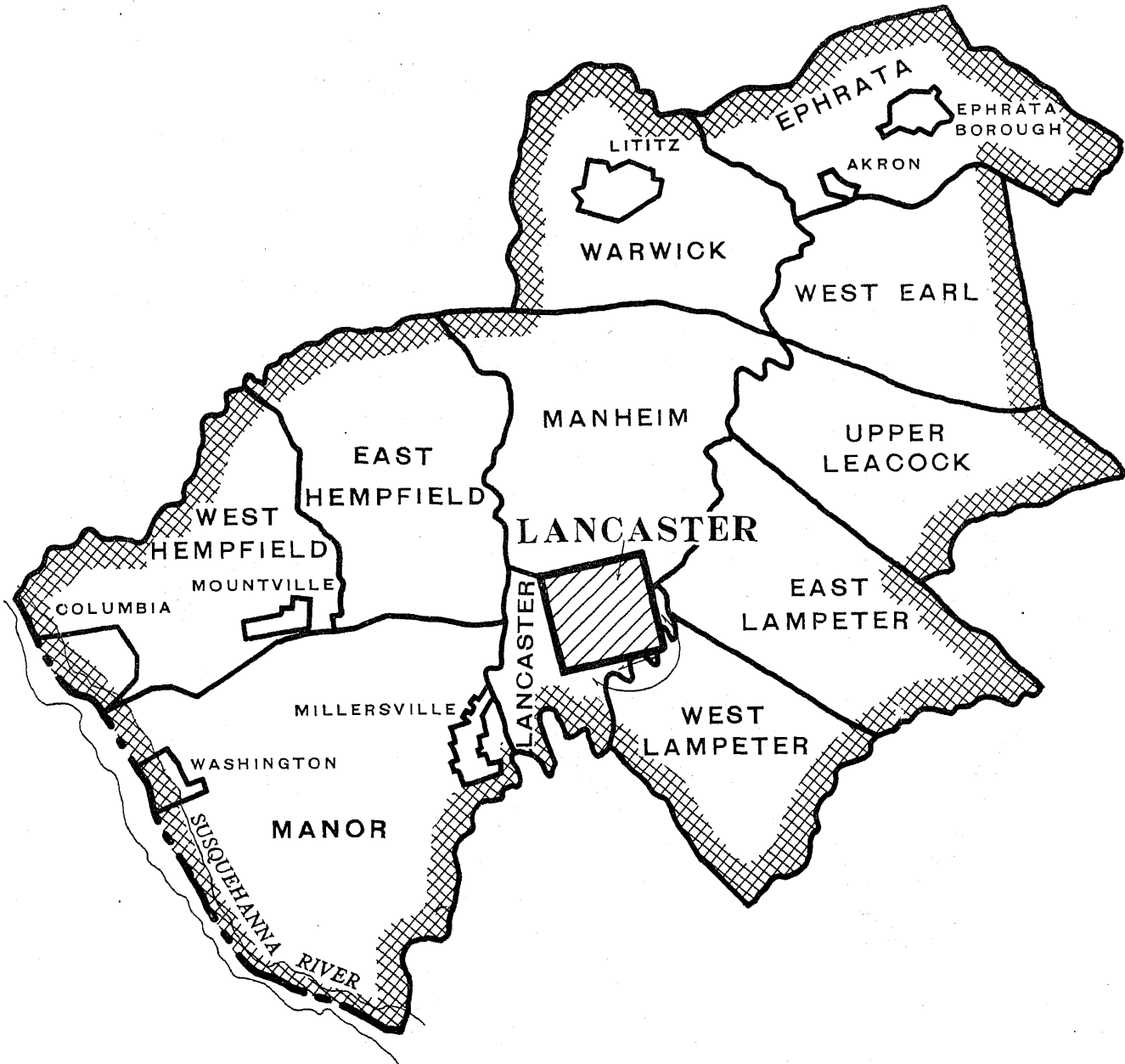




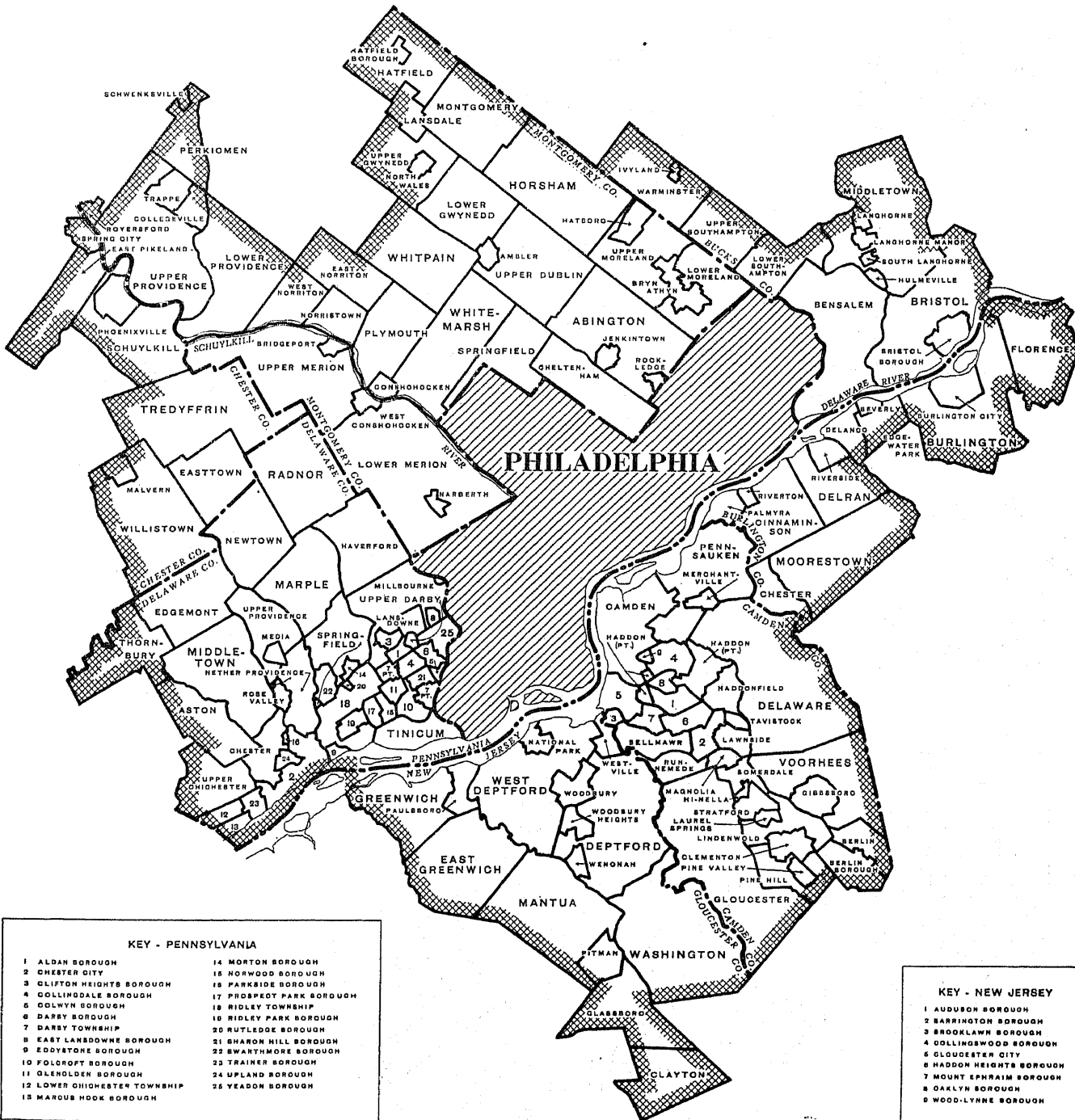
JOHNSTOWN METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

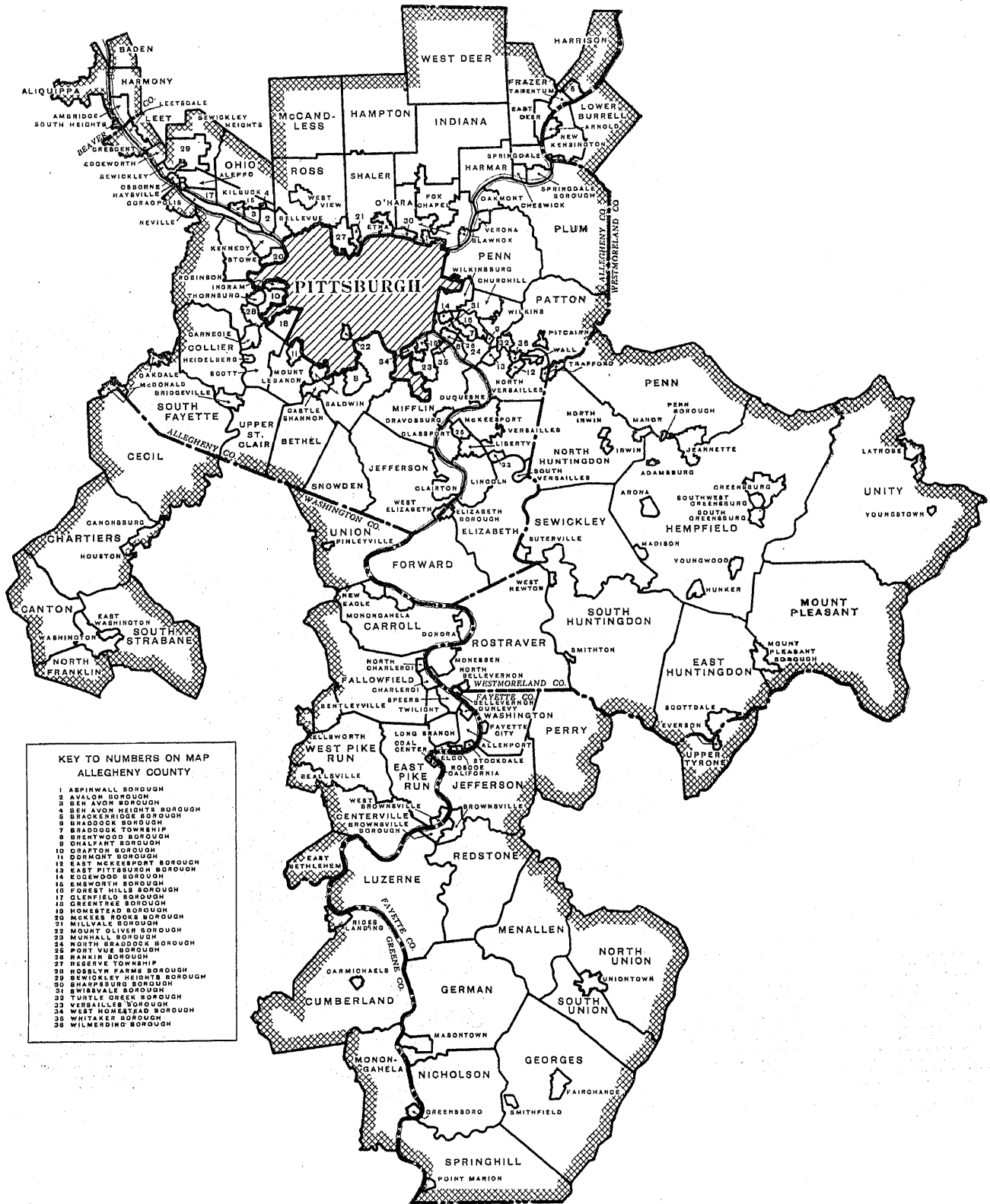


PHILADELPHIA METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

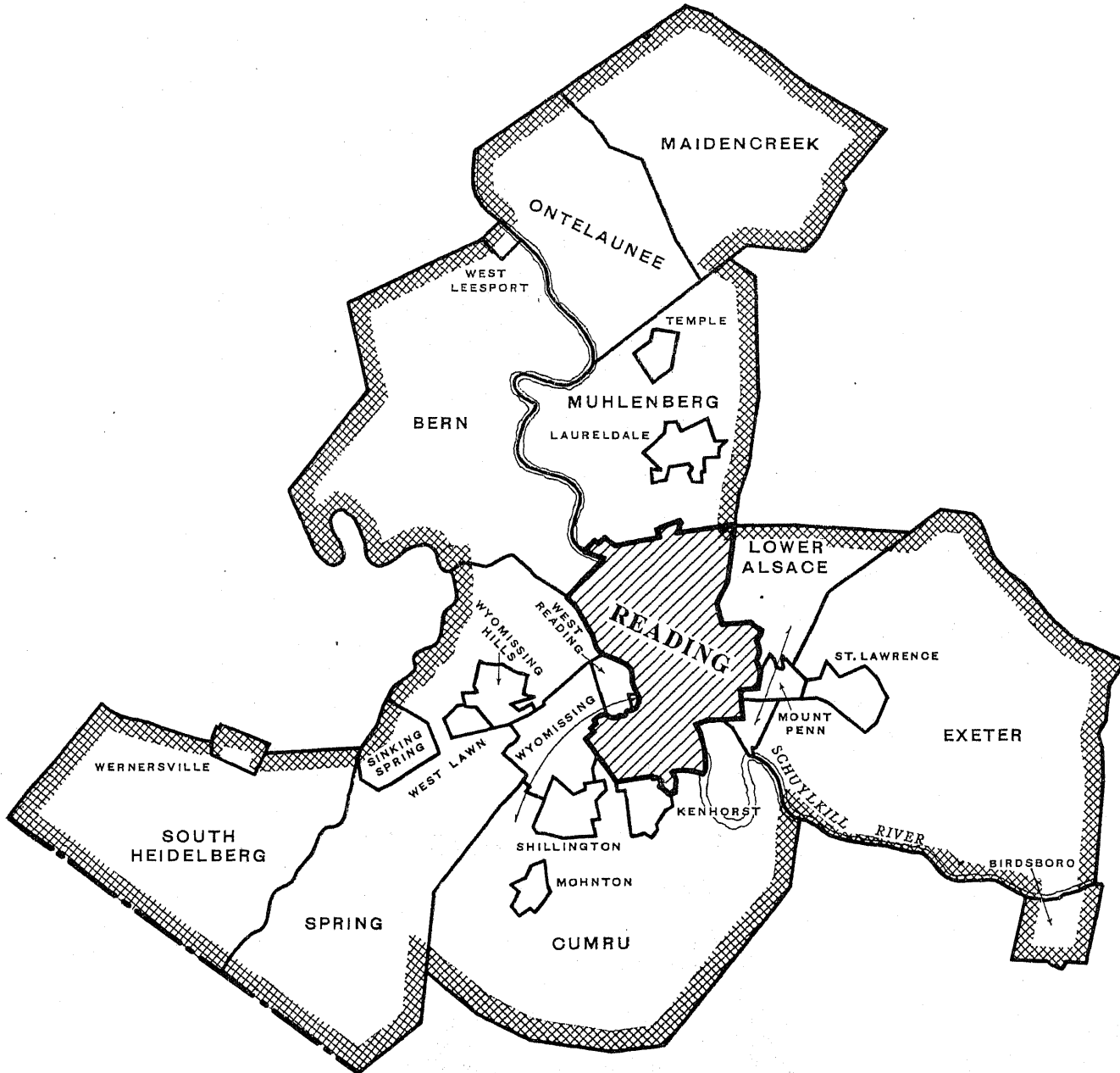

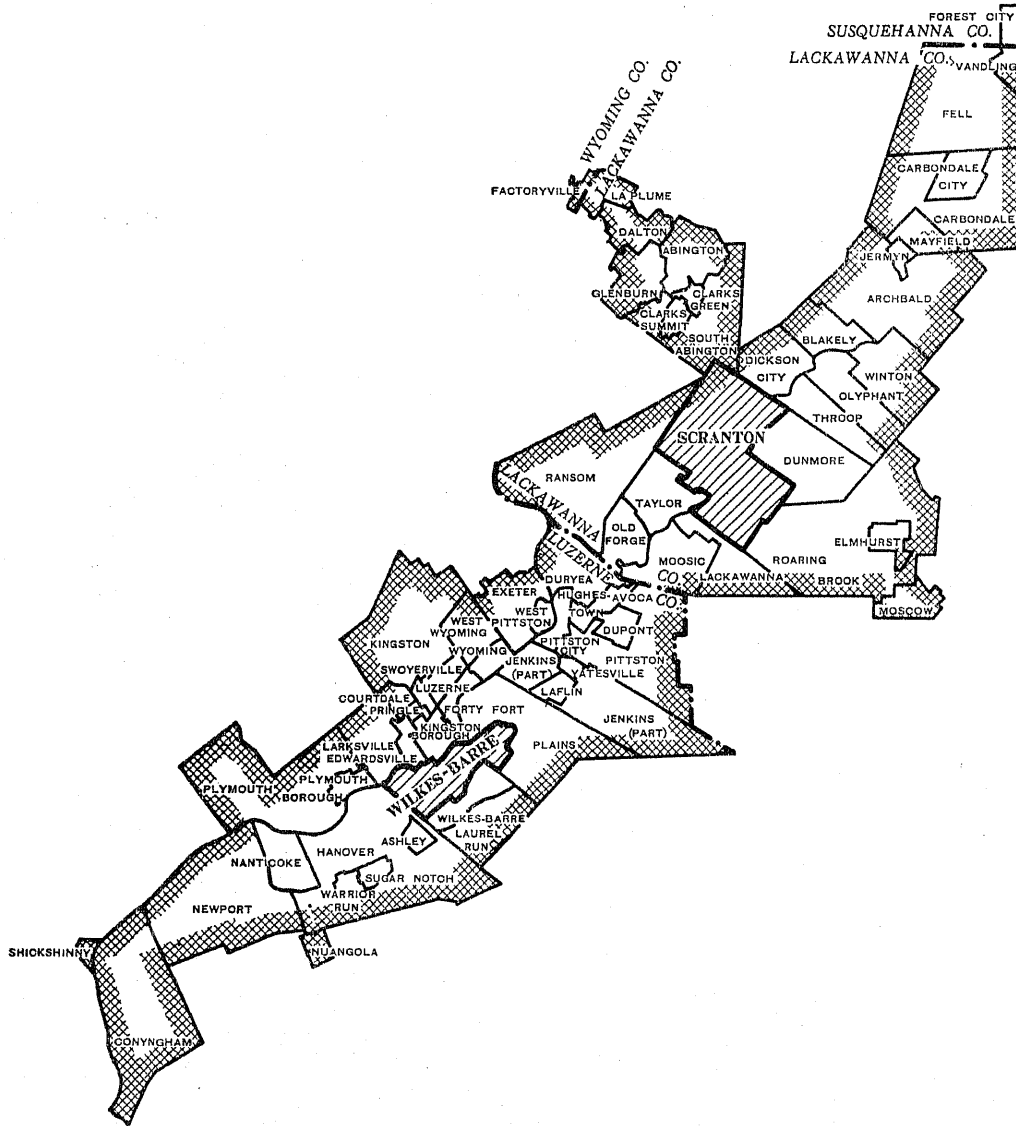

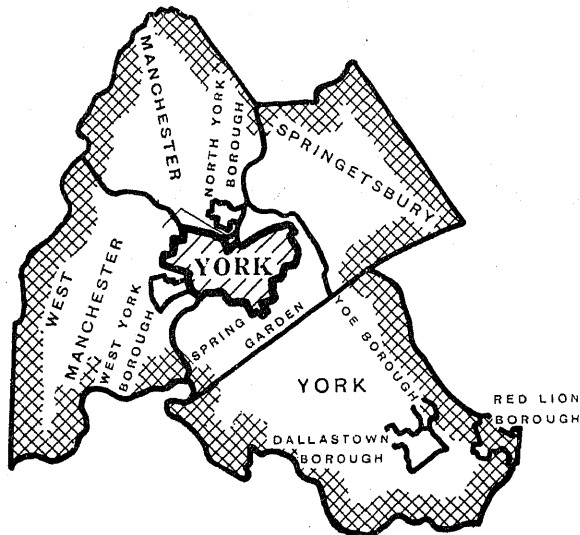

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Rhode Island was one of the Thirteen Original States. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 713,346, which represents an increase of 25,849, or 3.8 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 1,058 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 674.2, as compared with 649.8 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Rhode Island from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The Census Bureau ordinarily defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, the remainder being classified as rural. In three of the New England States, however, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, and New Hampshire, conditions are exceptional in that the compactly built portions of the towns (townships) are not separately incorporated

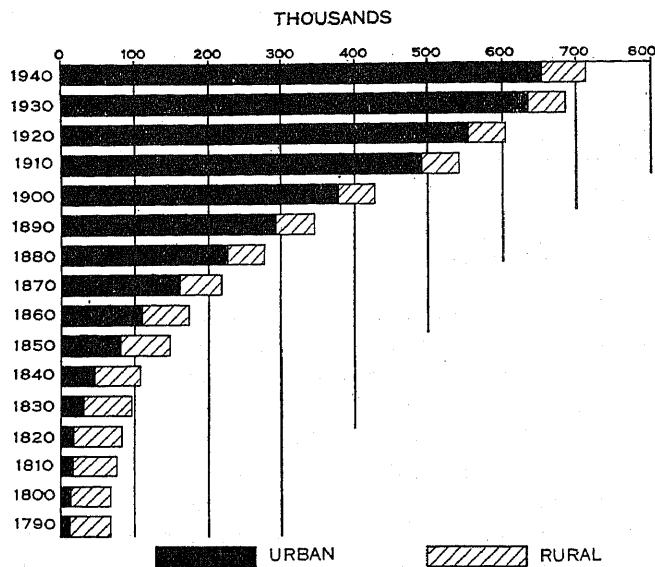
or politically distinct in any way from the open country within the same town; nor is it the usual practice to incorporate even the larger places as cities until they attain a population considerably in excess of 10,000. Consequently, if only the cities were counted as urban, the classification would be quite inadequate. A special rule has therefore been set up for these States, which places in the urban classification, in addition to the regularly incorporated cities, those towns in which there is a village or thickly settled area having more than 2,500 inhabitants and comprising, either by itself or when combined with other villages in the same town, more than 50 percent of the total population of the town. In 1940, there were 12 such towns, as compared with 13 in 1930. (Warwick town was incorporated as a city in 1931.) The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they meet the requirements, and places may likewise be taken off the urban list when through decline in population they no longer meet the requirements.

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Rhode Island is shown by counties, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous

censuses. Table 6 gives the population of the cities by wards, and tables 7 and 8 present data, for the Providence metropolitan district and for the census tracts of Providence, respectively.

Cities.—There are seven cities in the State, all of which have a population of more than 25,000. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The figures shown for the earlier censuses represent, in many cases, the population of the town prior to its incorporation as a city. Providence, the capital and largest city, had a population in 1940 of 253,504.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the five counties of Rhode Island from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. All five of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Rhode Island are the cities and towns. There are no secondary divisions. There are 32 towns in the

State, some of which include rather large unincorporated villages, the population of which is not separately shown because they have no officially established boundaries. Table 4 shows the population of each county by towns and cities for the last three censuses.

Providence metropolitan district.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

The Providence metropolitan district is the only one with a central city in Rhode Island. Like several other districts, it occupies territory in more than one State. It was set up as a separate district for the first time in 1940, having been combined with other areas in 1930 and 1920 as a part of the Providence-Fall River-New Bedford metropolitan district.

Table 7 shows the population of the Providence metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase during the decade. In 1940 the metropolitan district had 711,500 inhabitants while in 1930 the same area had a population of 690,631.

**Census tracts.**—Census tracts are small areas, having a population usually between 3,000 and 6,000, into which certain large cities are subdivided, for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a

view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in size; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the population of Providence is shown by census tracts for 1940 and 1930, and the boundaries of the tracts are indicated on the accompanying map.

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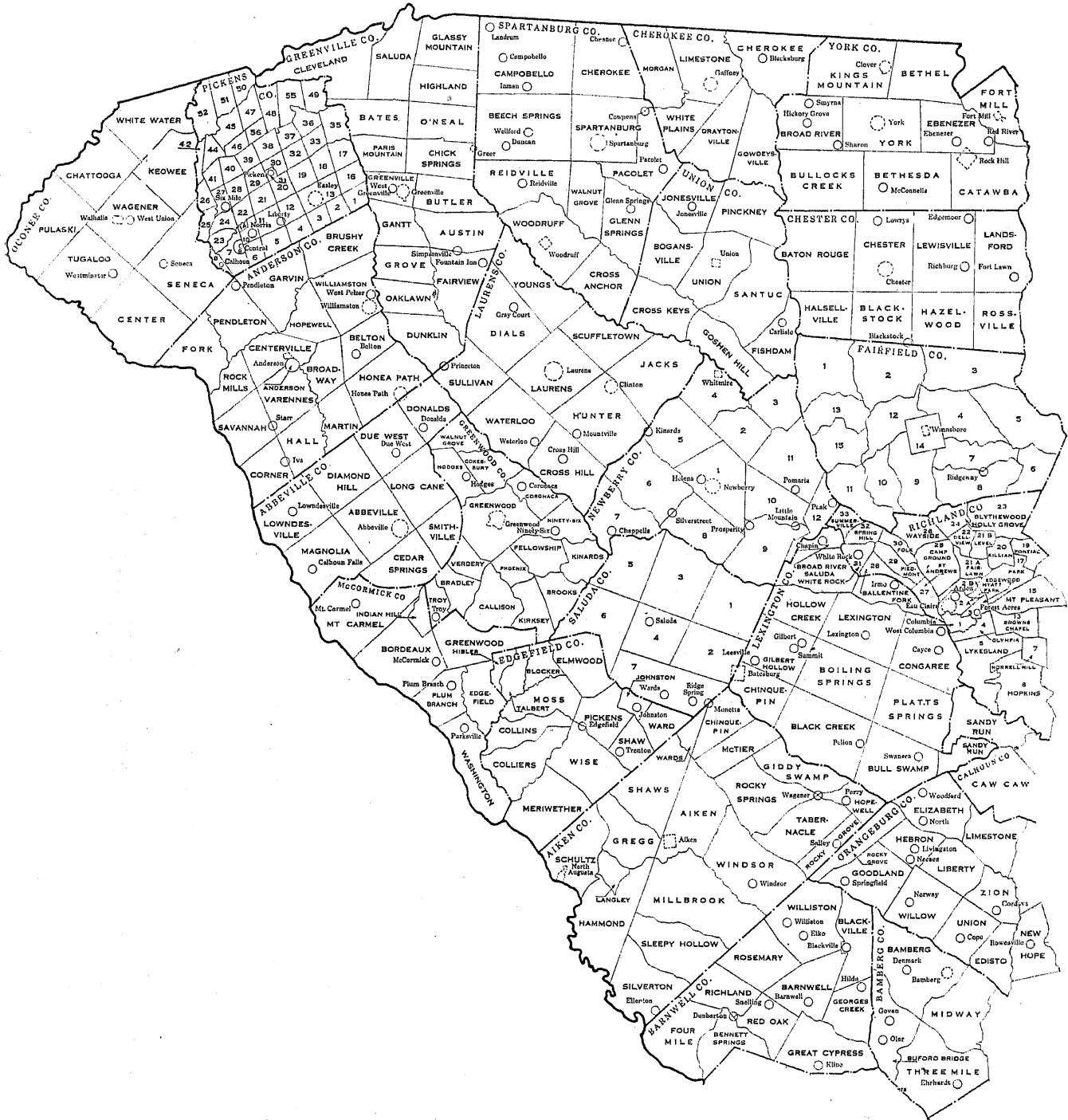

SOUTH CAROLINA—NORTHWESTERN PART

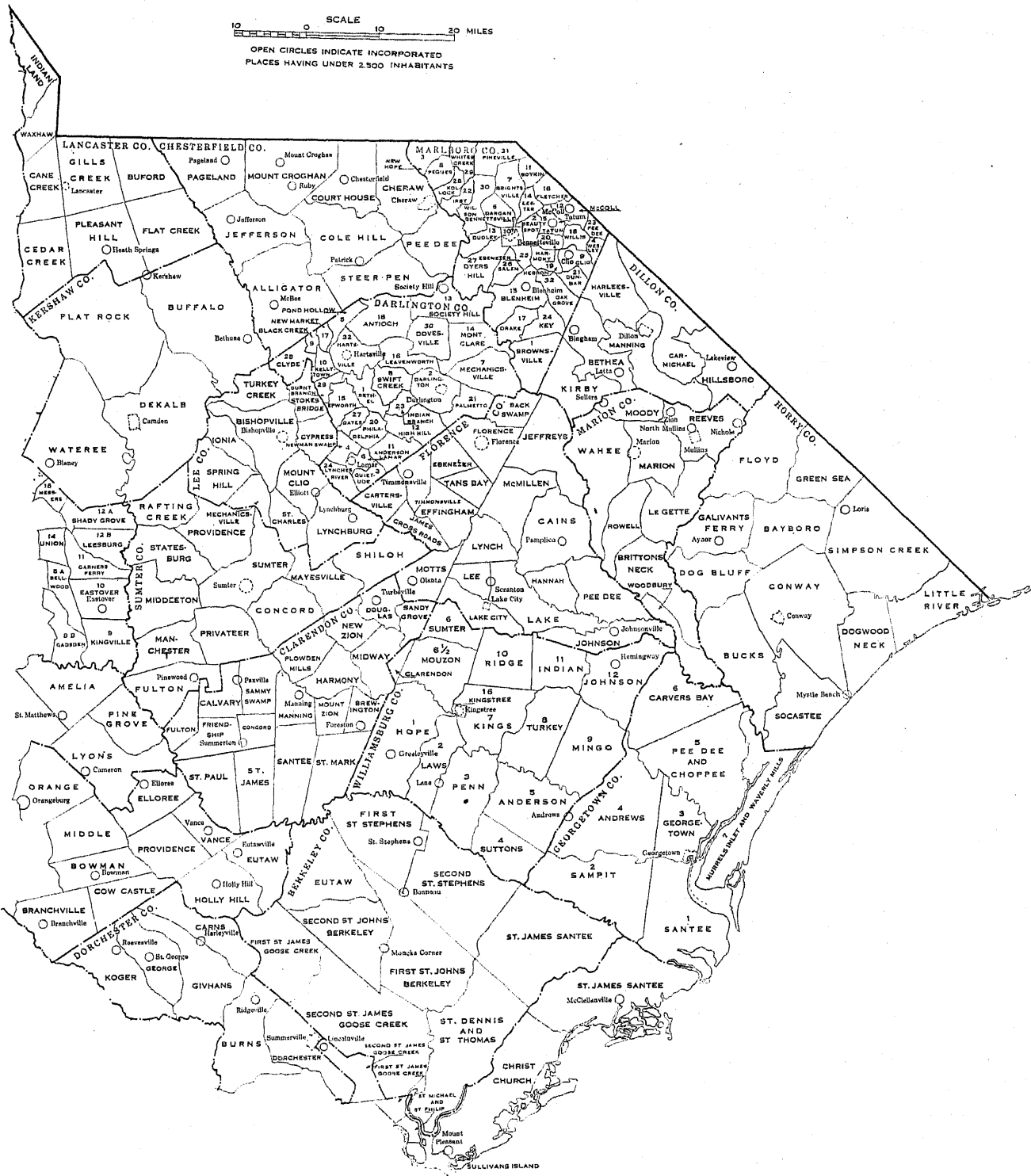
MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNSHIPS AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS

# SOUTH CAROLINA

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—South Carolina was one of the Thirteen Original States. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,899,804, which represents an increase of 161,039, or 9.3 per cent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 30,594 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 62.1, as compared with 56.8 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of South Carolina from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each

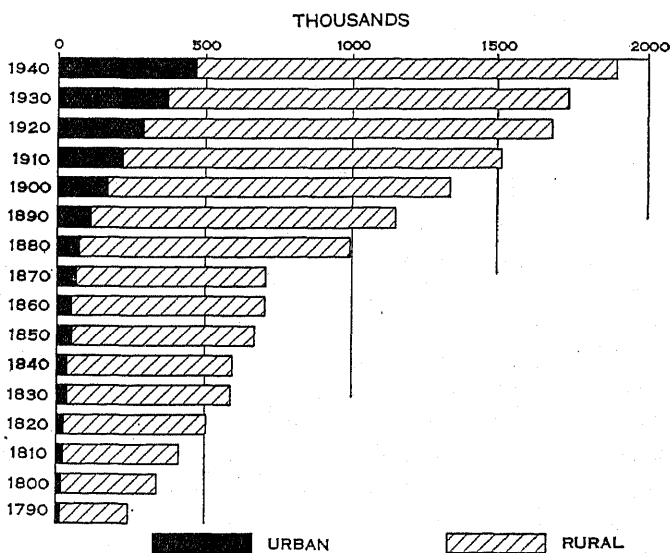
census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of South Carolina consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Bamberg was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit.

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of South Carolina is shown by counties, townships, school districts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards. Data for the Charleston and Columbia metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 and 7-A, respectively.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are 10 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Charleston, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 71,275; and Columbia, the capital of the State, had a population of 62,396. The other eight cities in this size-group are, in order of population: Greenville, Spartanburg, Anderson, Florence, Sumter, Rock Hill, Greenwood, and Orangeburg. The last was included in this size-group for the first time.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 46 counties of South Carolina from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier

census reports. Thirty-five of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 11 decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in South Carolina are the townships and school districts, and one city (Charleston). (Only Darlington, Marlboro, Pickens, and Richland Counties are subdivided into school districts.) The cities (other than Charleston) and the incorporated towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 21 cities and 227 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of one or more townships or school districts.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, school districts, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns (except Charleston) is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more townships or districts in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first township or district. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile.

In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Table 7 shows the population of the Charleston metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. This district was defined for the first time in 1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase between 1930 and 1940. In 1940 the Charleston metropolitan district had 98,711 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the same area had a population of 79,760.

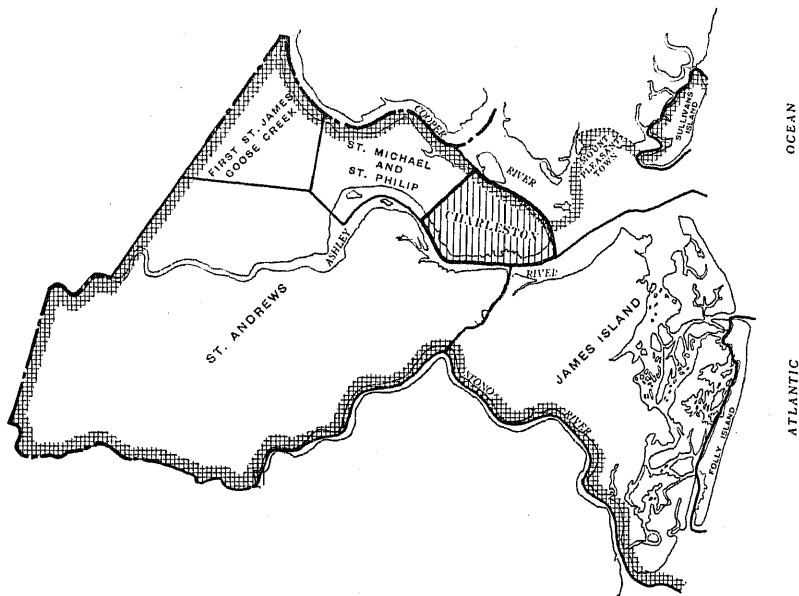

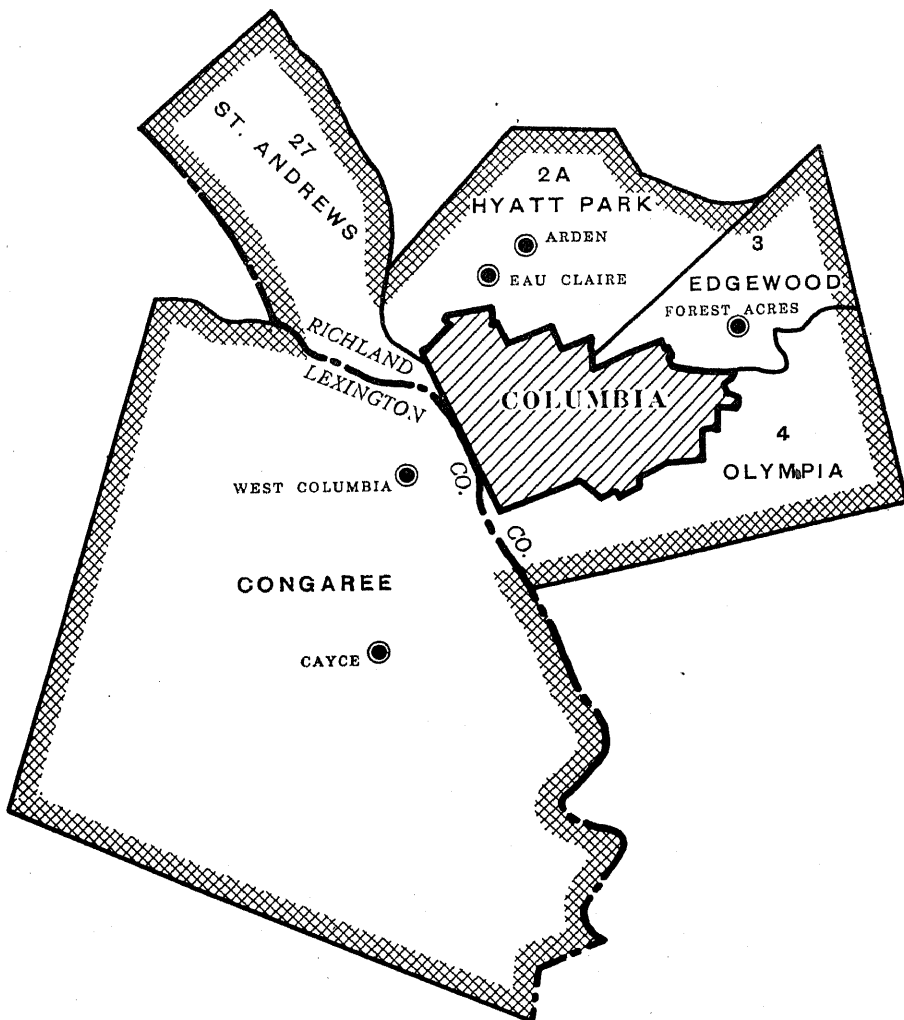

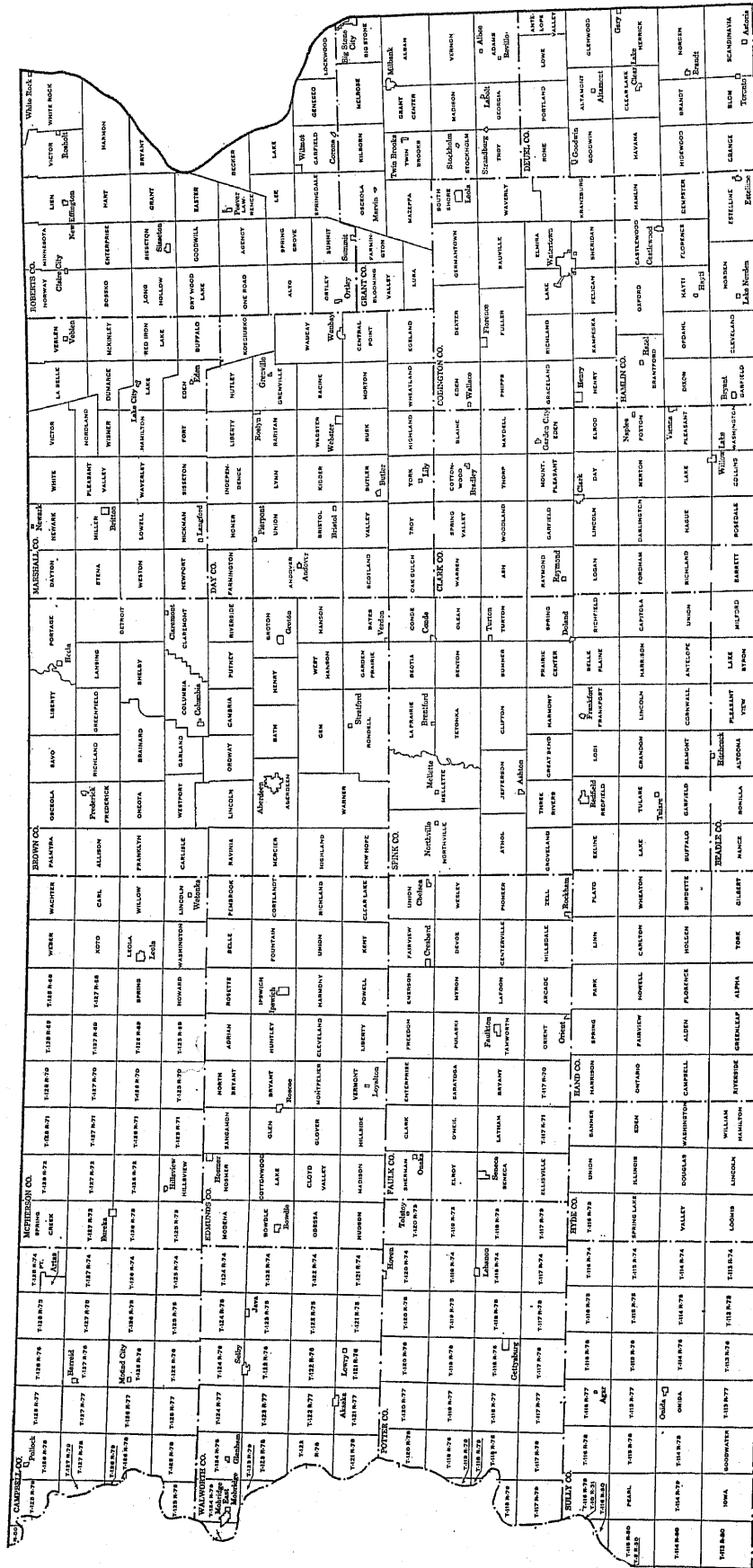




NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

# SOUTH DAKOTA

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—South Dakota was organized as a State from a part of Dakota Territory and was admitted to the Union in 1889, with boundaries as at present.

The population of South Dakota on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 642,961, which represents a decrease of 49,888, or 7.2 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 76,536 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 8.4, as compared with 9.1 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of South Dakota from 1870, the year in which the Dakota Territory was first enumerated by areas that can be grouped to produce the area of the State at the time of its admission, to

1940, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of South Dakota consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Canton was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit; for example, Redfield was removed from the urban list in 1940.

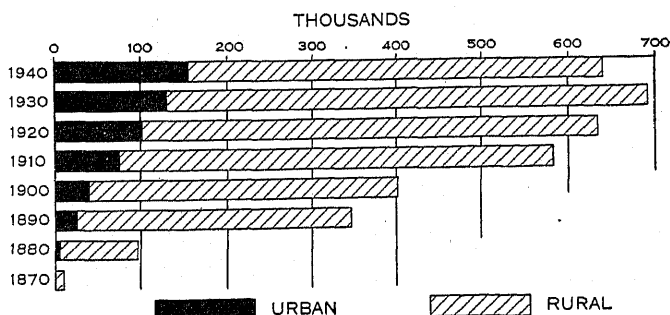

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of South Dakota is shown by counties, townships, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are six cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Sioux Falls, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 40,832. Pierre, the capital of the State, had a population of 4,322.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 69 counties of South Dakota from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Five counties are unorganized, and,

for judicial purposes, are attached to other counties. Nine of the counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 60 decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in the county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

**Minor civil divisions.**—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the organized counties in South Dakota are called townships, cities, and towns. (One military reservation, Fort Meade, and one park, Wind Cave National Park, are also classified as primary divisions.) There are 140 cities and 163 towns. There are no secondary divisions.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, cities, towns, and other minor civil divisions for the last three censuses. Where a city or town is located in two or more counties, the part in the given county is presented in roman type as a primary division of that county. To make the presentation complete, the population for the part outside that county and for the city or town as a whole is shown, in *italics*.
