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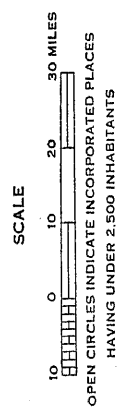
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TENNESSEE—WESTERN PART

MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—CIVIL DISTRICTS

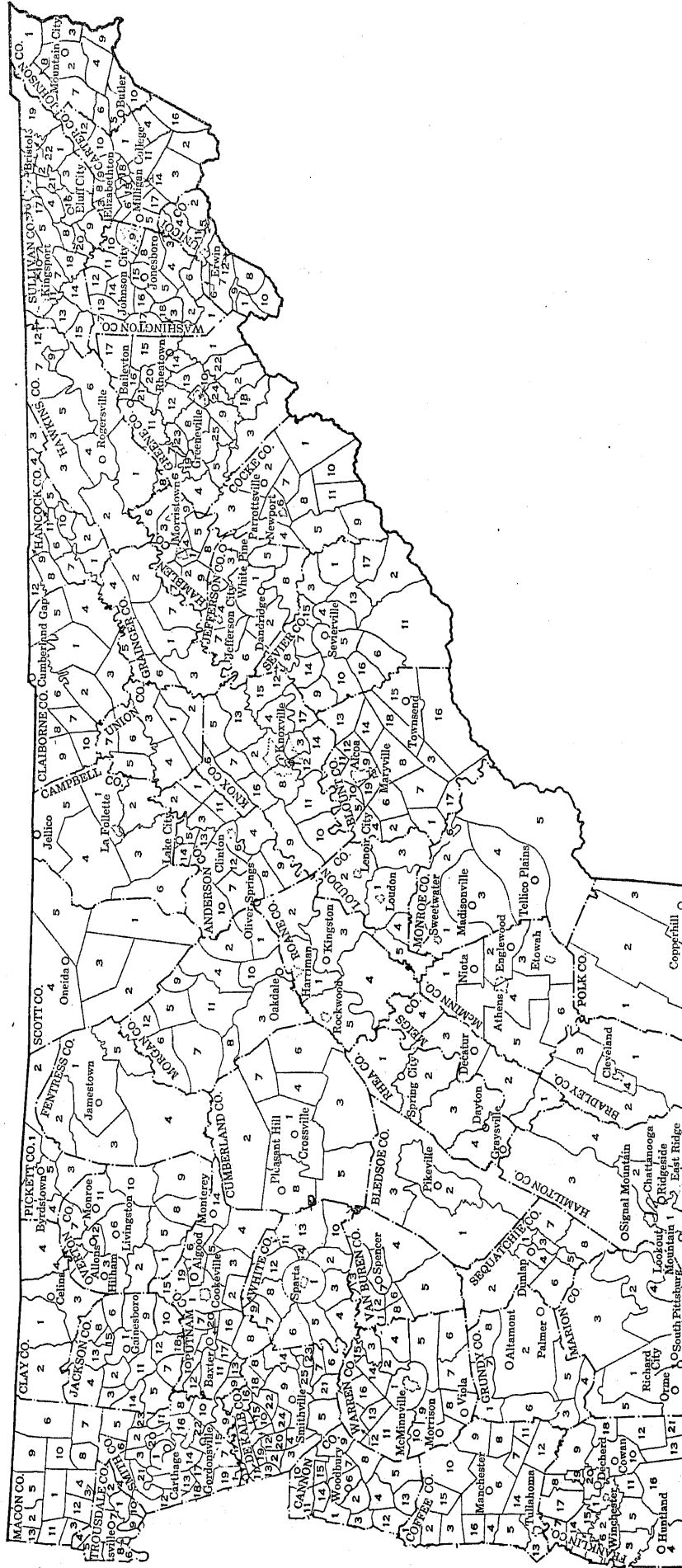

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Tennessee was admitted to the Union as the sixteenth State in 1796 with boundaries as at present. It was organized as a Territory in 1790, at which time it included an area now comprising parts of Mississippi, Alabama, and Georgia. The population of Tennessee on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 2,915,841, which represents an increase of 299,285, or 11.4 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 41,961 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 69.5, as compared with 62.4 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Tennessee from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together

with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Tennessee consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Clinton was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit.

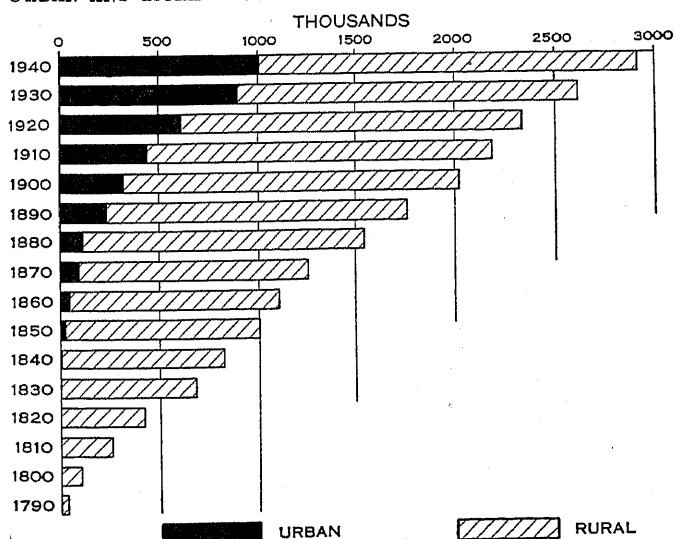

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Tennessee is shown by counties, civil districts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards, and tables 7 to 7-C and 8 and 8-A present data, respectively, for the metropolitan districts and for the census tracts of the tracted cities.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are 12 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Memphis, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 292,942; and Nashville, the capital of the State, had a population of 167,402.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 95 counties of Tennessee from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Of the 60 counties whose boundaries remained unchanged since 1930, 53 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 7 decreased. The information concerning boundary changes is given in the footnotes on table 3. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Tennessee are called civil districts. The incorporated cities and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 42 cities and 179 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of some civil district (or districts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by civil districts, cities, and towns, for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more civil districts in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first district. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. Only a portion of a minor civil division is included if the minor civil division has a large area and the principal concentration of population is in a section in or near the central city, with the more remote sections relatively sparsely settled. In such cases, the unit considered is not the minor civil division but component enumeration districts. (Not all of the enumeration districts in civil districts 1 and 2 of Shelby County are included in the Memphis metropolitan district.) A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Chattanooga metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Like several others, this district occupies territory in more than one State. In 1940 the Chattanooga metropolitan district had 193,215 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 168,589. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Table 7-B shows the population of the Memphis metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and some comparative figures for 1930, together with the increase during the decade. Like several others, this district occupies territory in more than one State. In 1940 the Memphis metropolitan district had 332,477 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 276,126. Bartlett and Germantown towns, in Shelby County, as well as some unincorporated territory in Shelby County were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. The population of this new area is not obtainable for either 1940 or 1930.

In 1940 the Nashville metropolitan district had 241,769 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 209,422. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

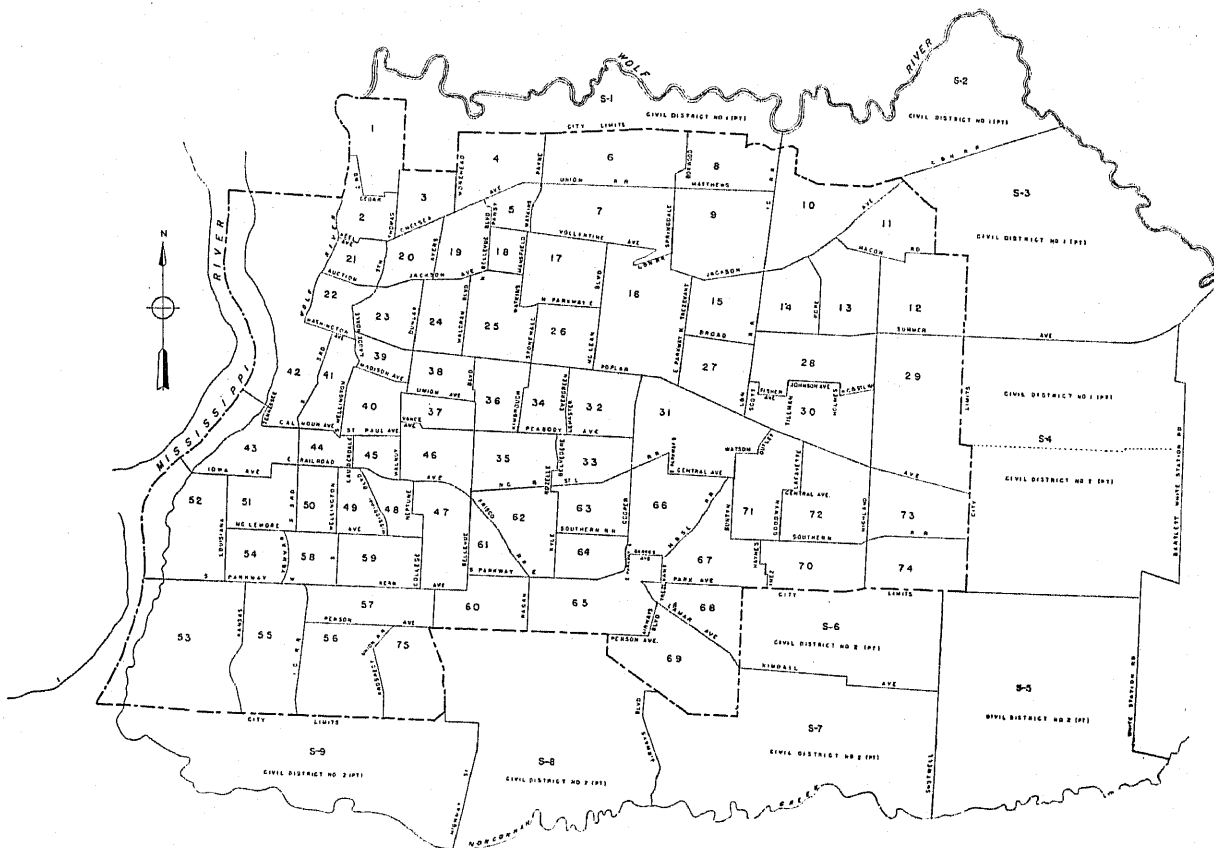
Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities (and sometimes their adjacent areas) are subdivided, through cooperation with a local committee in each case, for statistical and local administrative purposes. Through the use of census tract data comparisons may be made from census to census. Tracts are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for

uniformity in area, and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Memphis and some adjacent areas in Shelby County is shown by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. In table 8-A the 1940 and 1930 population of Nashville is shown by census tracts. All the tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps.

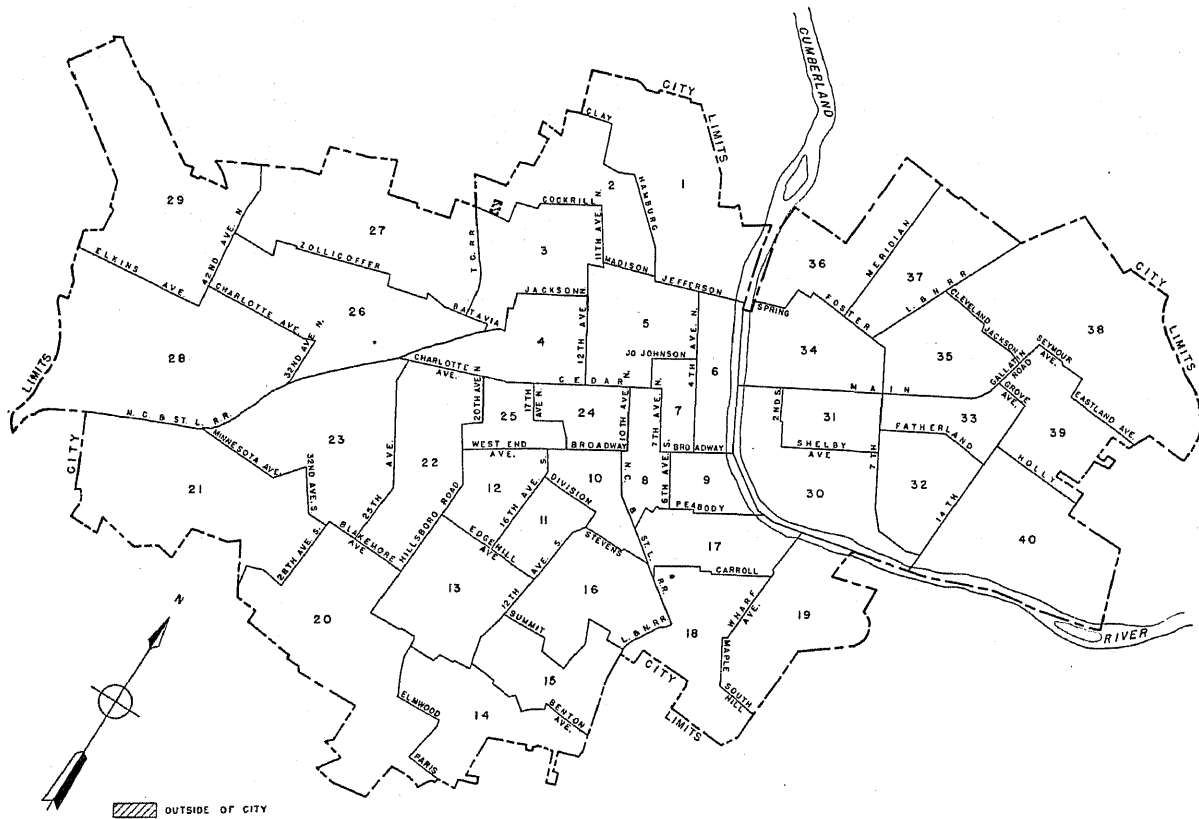

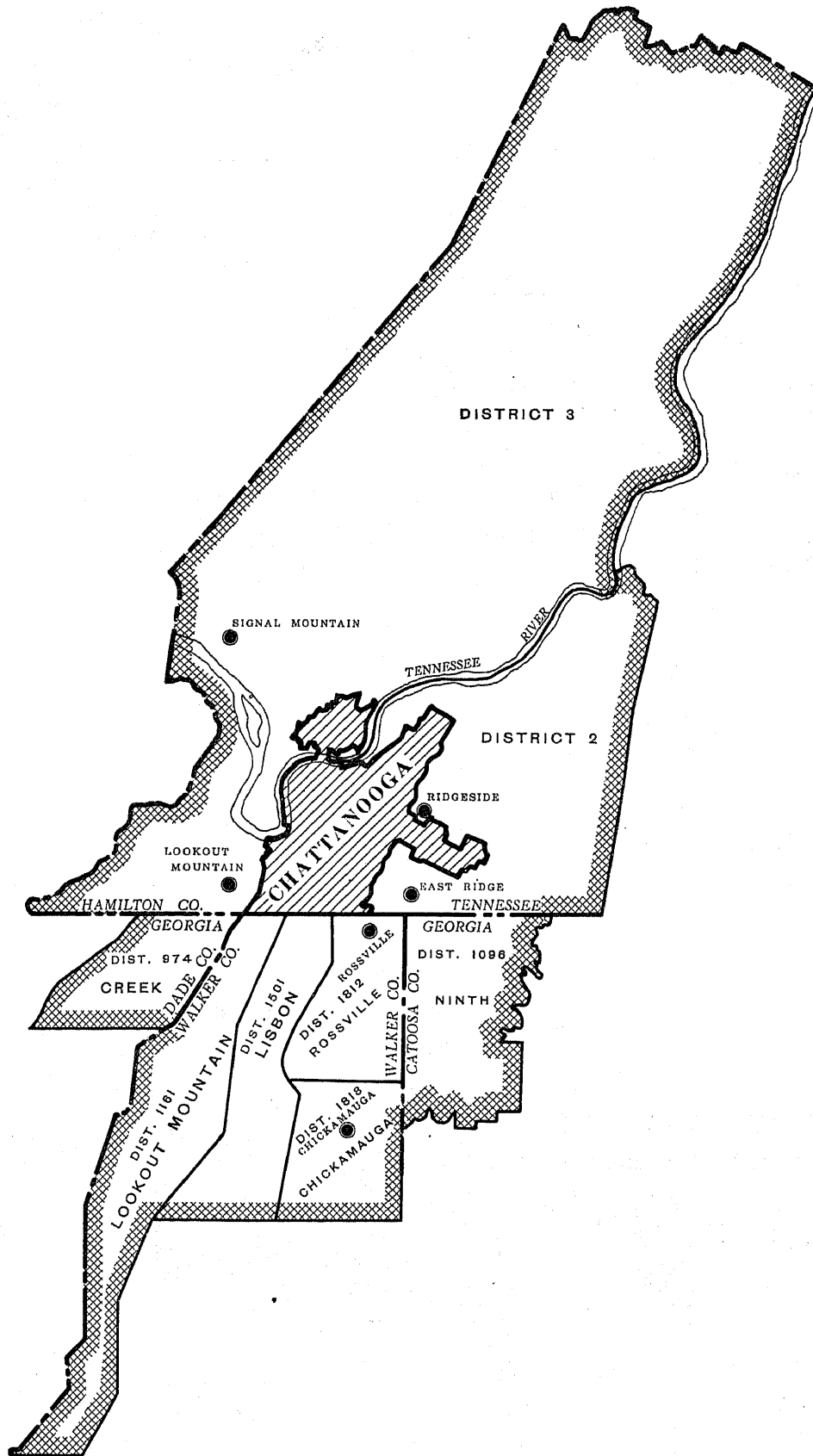

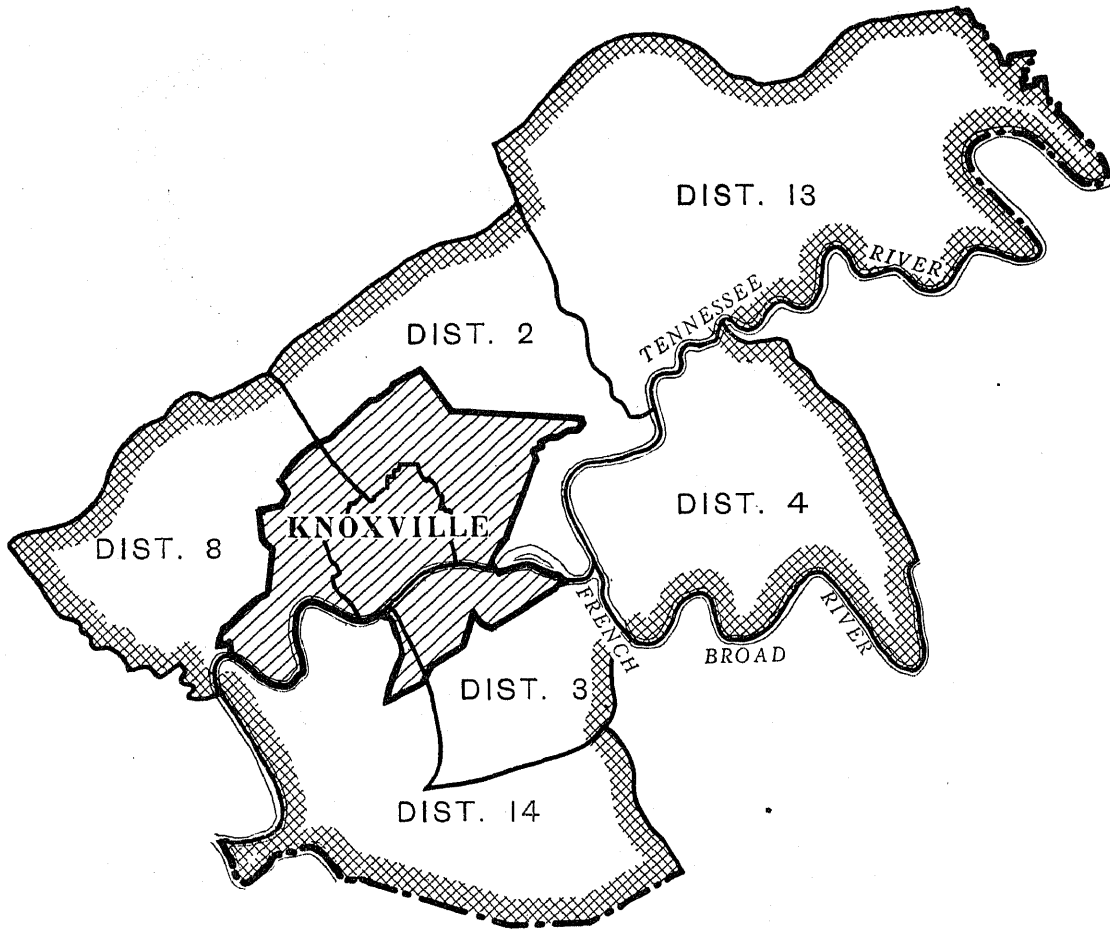
NASHVILLE BY CENSUS TRACTS



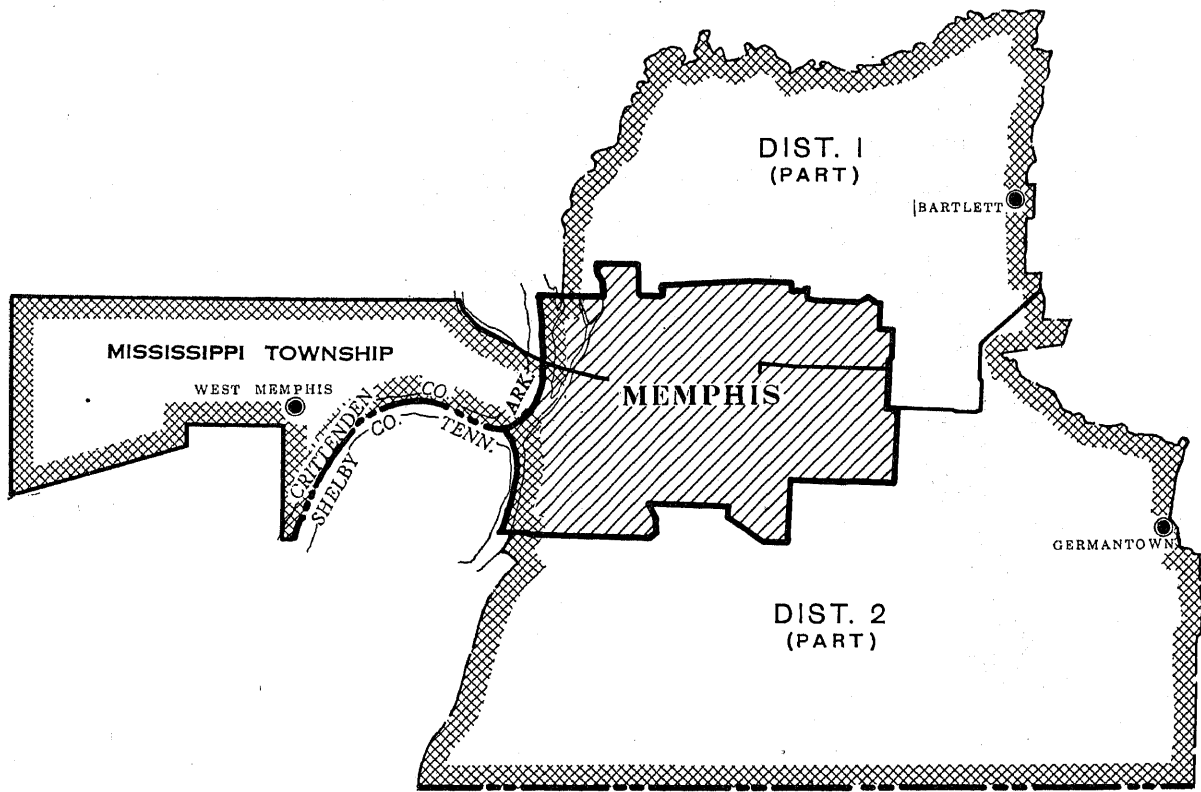
CHATTANOOGA METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



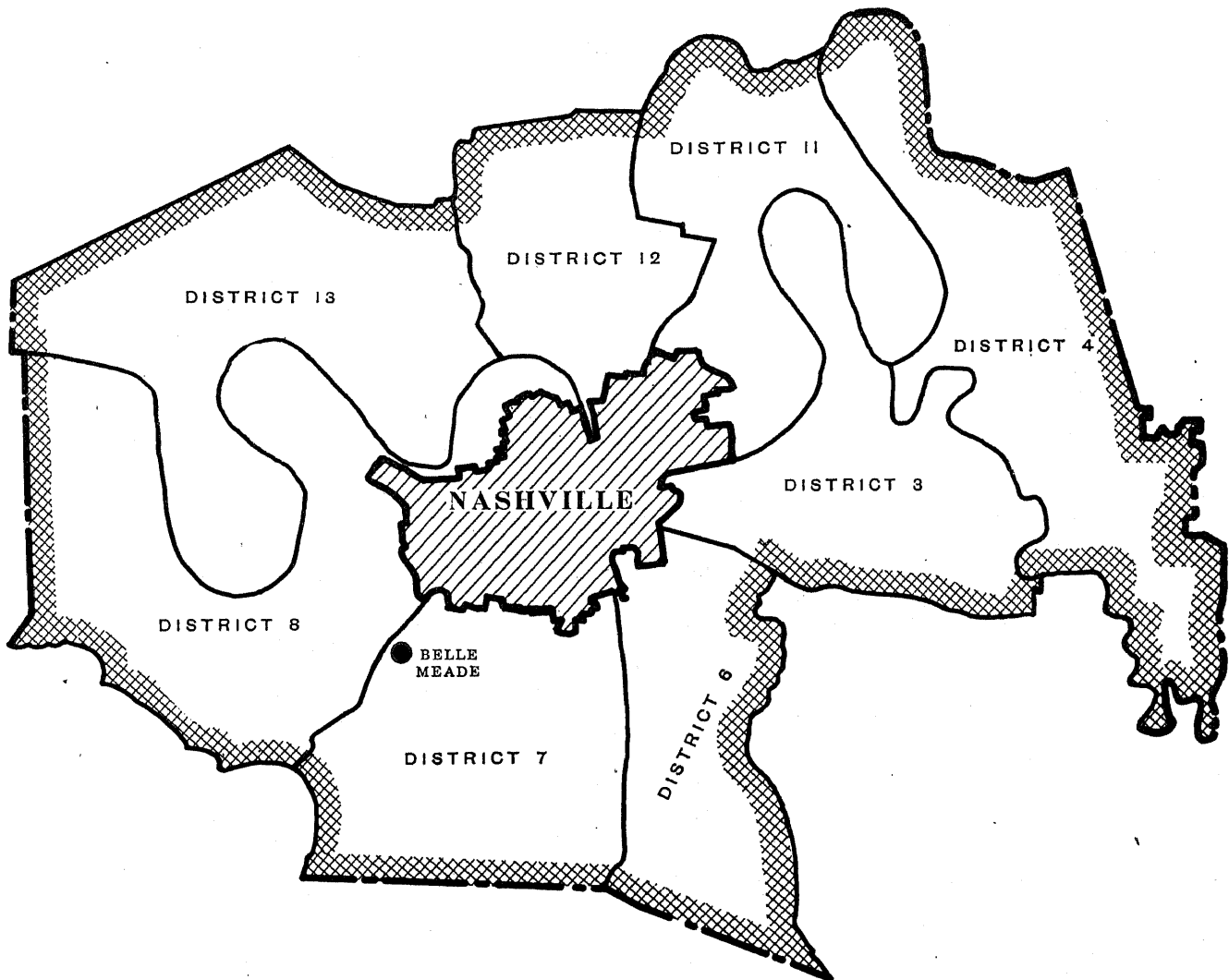

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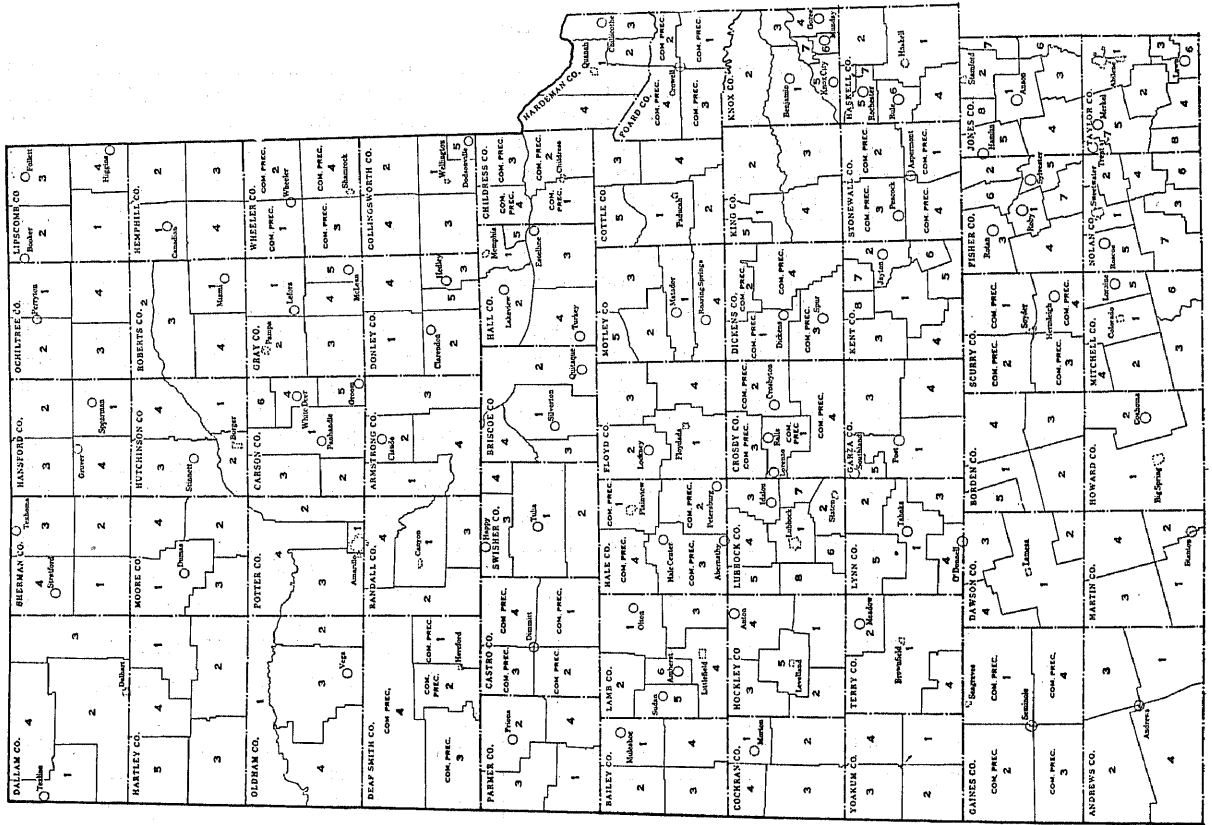

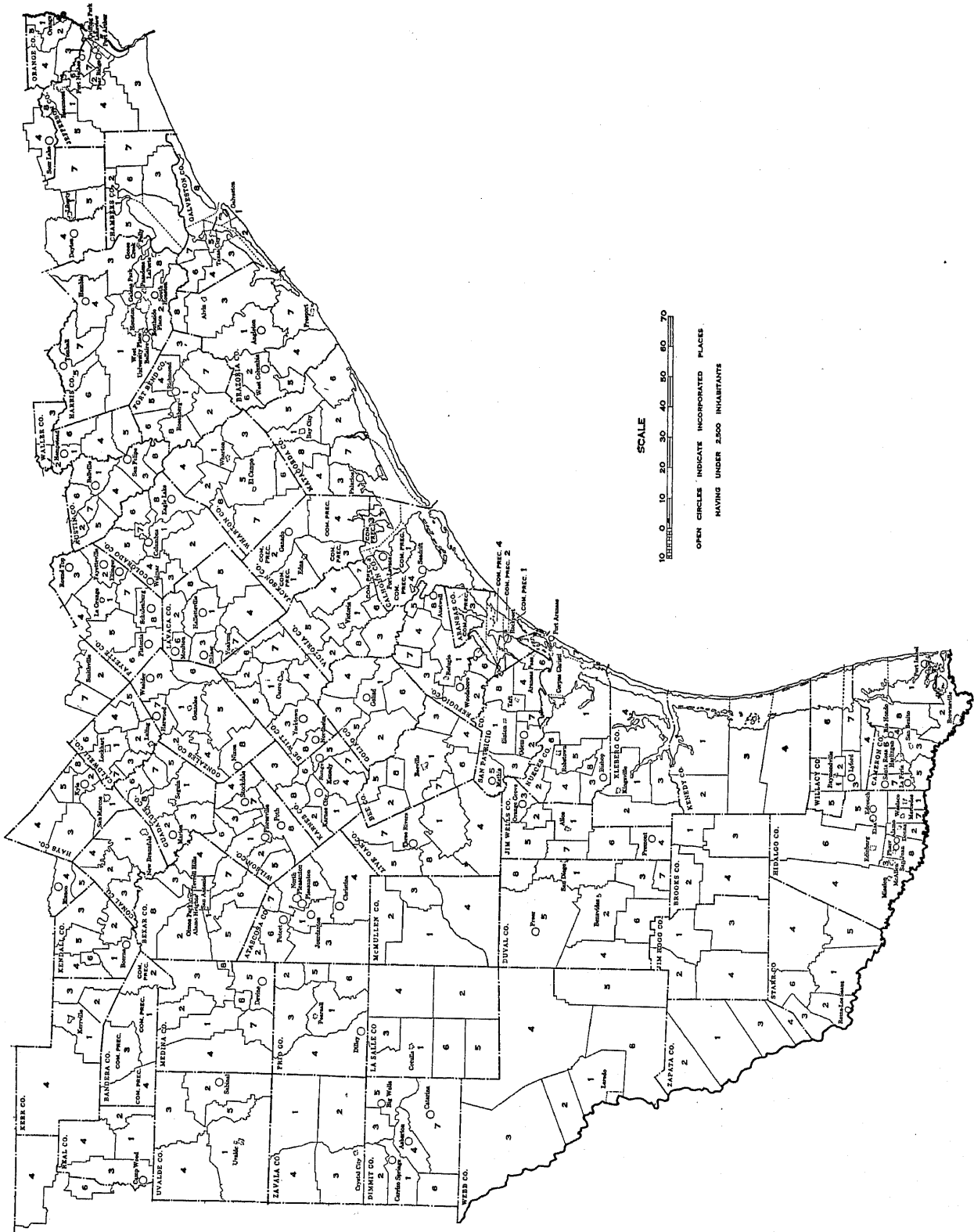

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Texas, originally a part of Mexico, won its independence by revolution in 1835 and 1836, and continued as an independent republic until 1845, when it was annexed to the United States and admitted to the Union as the twenty-eighth State. At this time it included area now comprising parts of Colorado, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Wyoming. In 1850, with the transfer to the United States of the territory lying outside the present State boundaries, Texas assumed practically its present boundaries. Upon the settlement in 1930 of a dispute with Oklahoma over the eastern boundary, Texas assumed its present limits. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 6,414,824, which represents an increase of 590,109, or 10.1 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 263,644 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square

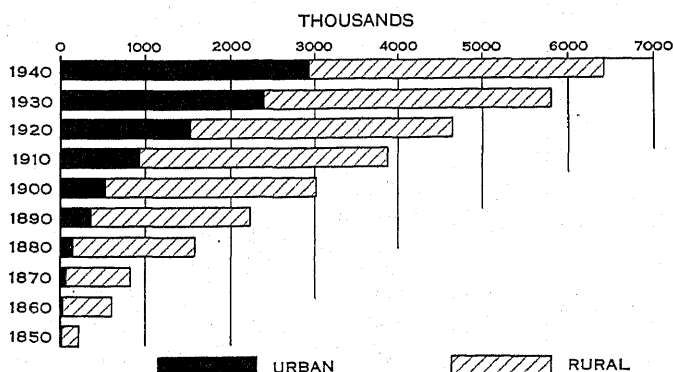
mile in 1940 was 24.3, as compared with 22.1 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Texas from 1850, the year in which its area was first enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Texas consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Dublin qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940 but not in 1930.

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Texas is shown by counties, justices' precincts, commissioners' precincts, cities, towns, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 to 7-J and for the census tracts of the tracted cities and adjacent areas in tables 8, 8-A, and 8-B.

Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.—There are 44 incorporated places in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Houston, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 384,514, and Austin, the capital of the State, had a population of 87,930.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 254 counties of Texas from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. One hundred and thirty-four of these counties increased

in population between 1930 and 1940, 119 decreased, and one (San Augustine) remained constant. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. One county (Loving) was organized from the unorganized county of the same name. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Texas are called justices' precincts or commissioners' precincts, the latter term being used in only a few counties. The incorporated cities, towns, and villages form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 331 cities, 310 towns, and 6 villages. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions forms a part of some precinct (or precincts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by justices' precincts or commissioners' precincts, cities, towns, and villages for the last three censuses. The population of the cities, towns, and villages is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more precincts in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population of the place is given in connection with each county.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. Only a portion of a minor civil division is included if the minor civil division has a large area and the principal concentration of population is in a small section in or near the central city with the more remote sections being sparsely settled. In such cases, the unit considered is not the minor civil division but component enumeration districts. (For example, not all of the enumeration districts in precincts 1 and 2 of El Paso County are included in the El Paso metropolitan district.) A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Amarillo metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940, when it was defined for the first time. In 1940 the Amarillo metropolitan district had 53,463 inhabitants. Comparative figures for 1930 for the area are not available because of the partial redistricting of Potter and Randall Counties.

Table 7-D shows the population of the Dallas metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Part of precinct 6 (population for 1930 not obtainable), which was outside the metropolitan district in 1930, was annexed to precinct 7 in 1937 and is included in the district in 1940.

Table 7-E shows the population of the El Paso metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940, with some comparative figures for 1930. In 1940 the El Paso metropolitan district had 115,801 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 118,461. The redistricting of El Paso County between 1930 and 1940 necessitated a redefinition of the boundaries of the metropolitan district, resulting in a considerable decrease in the area included in the district; the effect upon the population decrease in the district is not ascertainable.

In 1940 the Fort Worth metropolitan district had 207,677 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 174,575. Precinct 2 and parts of precincts 5 and 6 were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. These new areas had a combined population of 11,717 in 1940. A comparable figure for 1930 is not obtainable.

decade. In 1940 the Houston metropolitan district had 510,397 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 339,216. Old precinct 8 and parts of precincts 4, 6, and 7 were annexed to precinct 1 between 1930 and 1940 and were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. The population in 1940 and 1930 of these new areas is not obtainable.

Table 7-I shows the population of the San Antonio metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940, with some comparative figures for 1930. In 1940 the San Antonio metropolitan district had 319,010 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 279,271. The redistricting of Bexar County between 1930 and 1940 necessitated a redefinition of the boundaries of the metropolitan district, resulting in a slight increase in the area included in the district; the effect upon the population increase in the district is not ascertainable.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities and sometimes their adjacent areas have been subdivided, through cooperation with a local committee in each case, for statistical and local administrative purposes. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In tables 8, 8-A, and 8-B the 1940 population of the cities of Austin, Dallas, and Houston, respectively, is shown by census tracts. Table 8-A for Dallas also gives the 1940 population by tracts of certain adjacent areas. All the tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses.

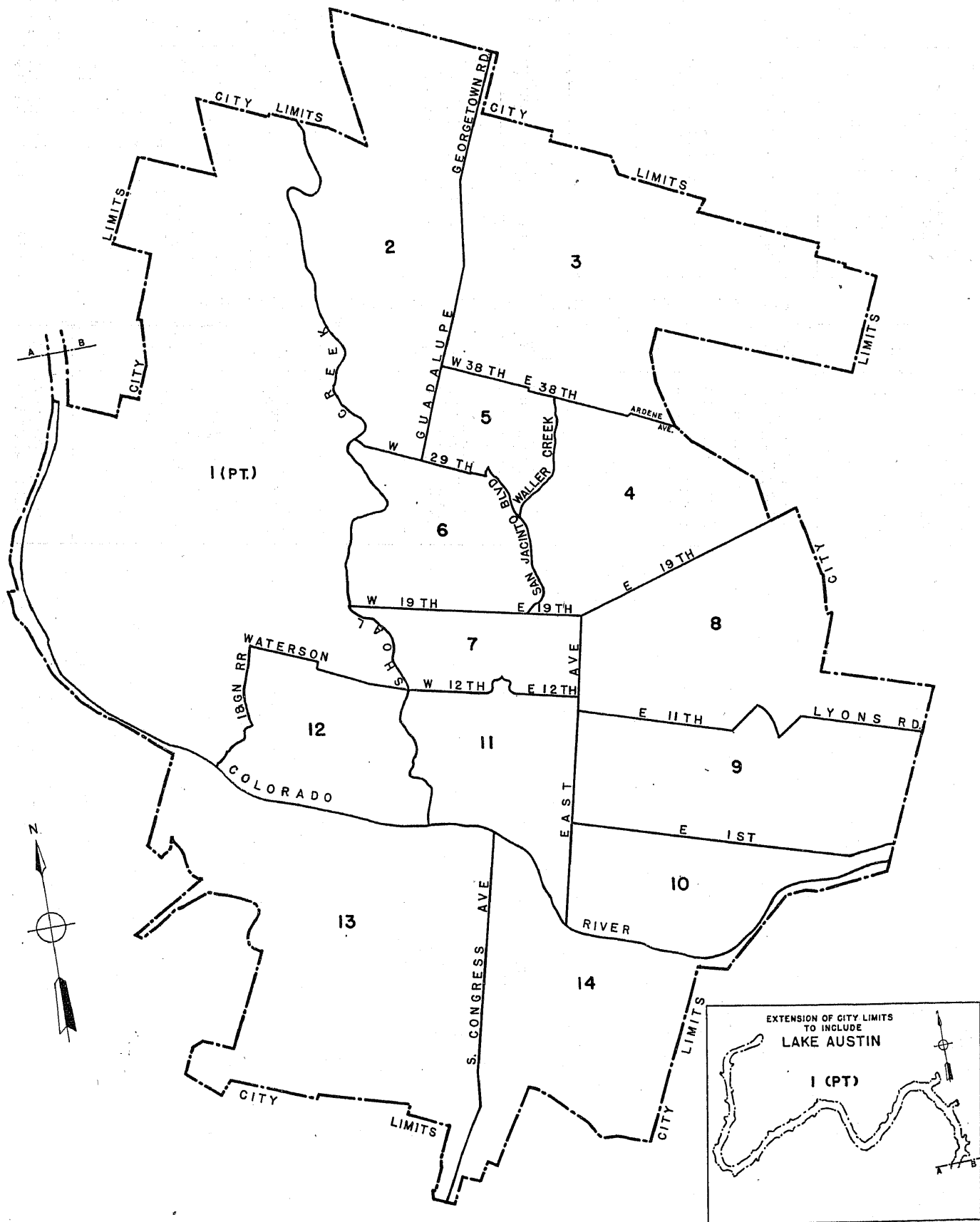

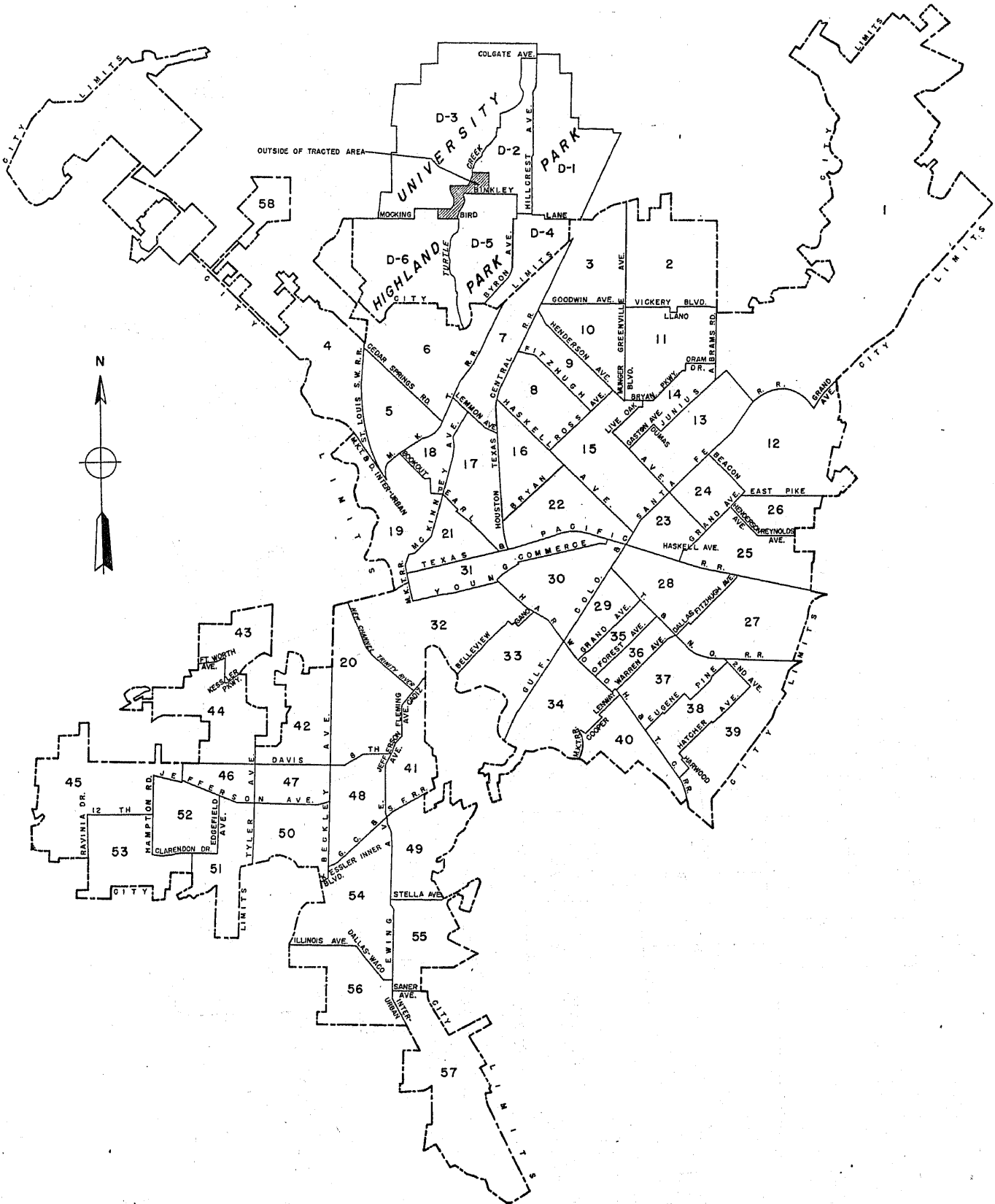

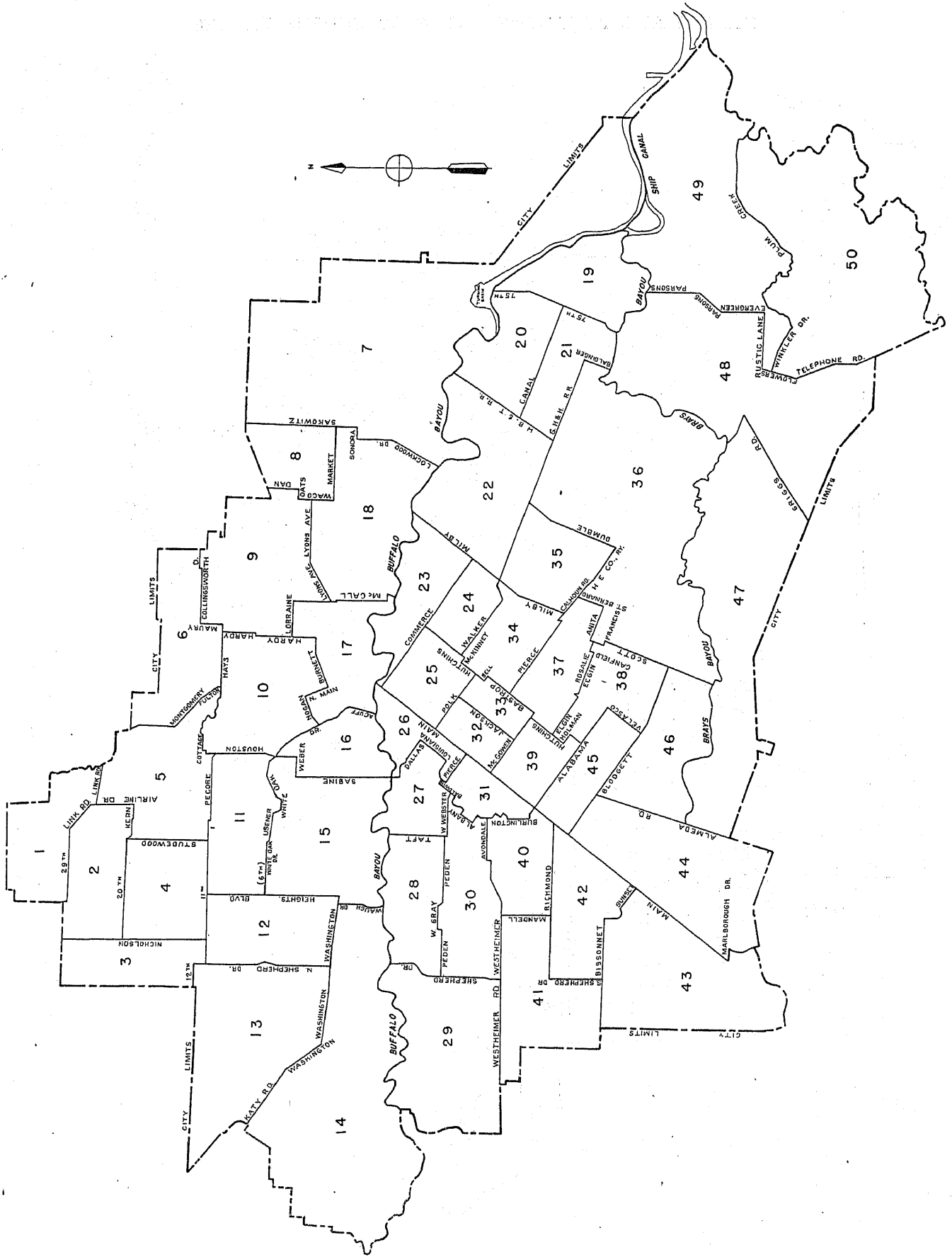


DALLAS AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

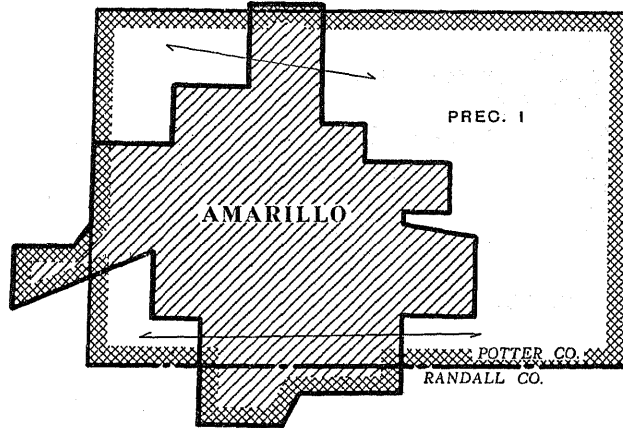

Population of the State.—Utah was organized as a Territory in 1850, and was admitted to the Union as the forty-fifth State in 1896. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 550,310, which represents an increase of 42,463, or 8.4 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 82,346 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 6.7, as compared with 6.2 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Utah from 1850, the year in which the Territory of Utah was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the

State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Utah consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Heber was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit; for example, Eureka was removed from the urban list in 1940.

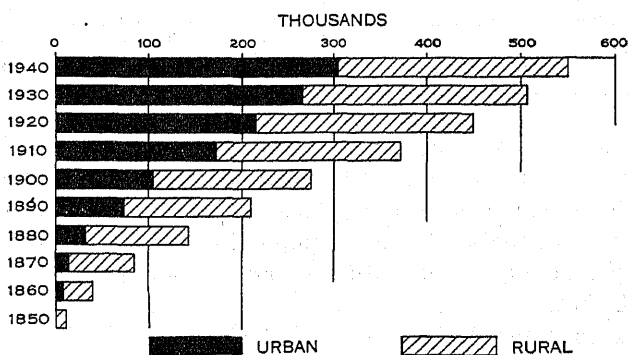

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Utah is shown by counties, election precincts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards, and table 7 presents data for the Salt Lake City metropolitan district.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are four cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase during each decade. Salt Lake City, the capital and largest city in the State, had a population in 1940 of 149,934.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 29 counties in Utah from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Twenty-four of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and five decreased. No new counties have been organized and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1920. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Utah are called election precincts or election districts. The incorporated cities and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 67 cities and 125 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of some election precinct (or precincts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by election precincts, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is

shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more precincts, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct.

Incorporated places.—Table 5 shows the population in 1940 and 1930 of the incorporated places (cities and towns) in Utah. In this table the places are arranged in alphabetical order, each followed by the name of the county in which it is located. In table 6 the population of the cities of 5,000 or more that were returned by wards is shown.

Salt Lake City metropolitan district.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions (including the Salt Lake City district) are included on the basis of special qualifications. Only a portion of a minor civil division is included if the minor civil division has a large area and practically all of the population is concentrated in a small section near the central city with the more remote sections being very sparsely settled. In such cases, the unit considered was not the minor civil division but component enumeration districts. For example, not all of the enumeration districts in precinct 7 of Salt Lake County are included in the Salt Lake City metropolitan district. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit, but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The Salt Lake City metropolitan district is the only one in Utah.

Table 7 shows the population of the Salt Lake City metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase during the decade. In 1940 the metropolitan district had 204,488 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then con-

stituted had a population of 184,451. That part of precinct 7 (1930 population not obtainable) that was annexed to precinct 1 was included in the Salt Lake City metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time.

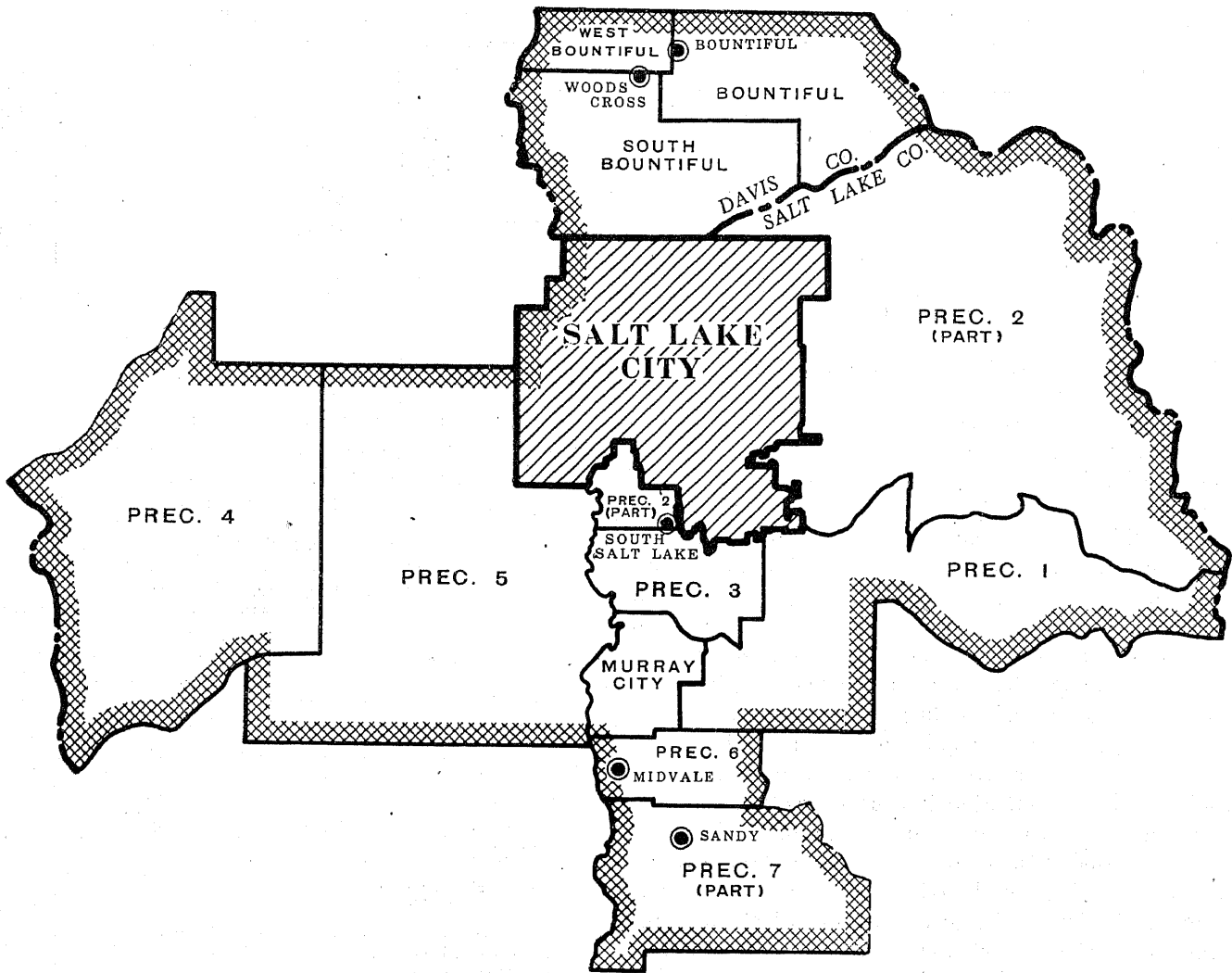

SALT LAKE CITY METROPOLITAN DISTRICT.

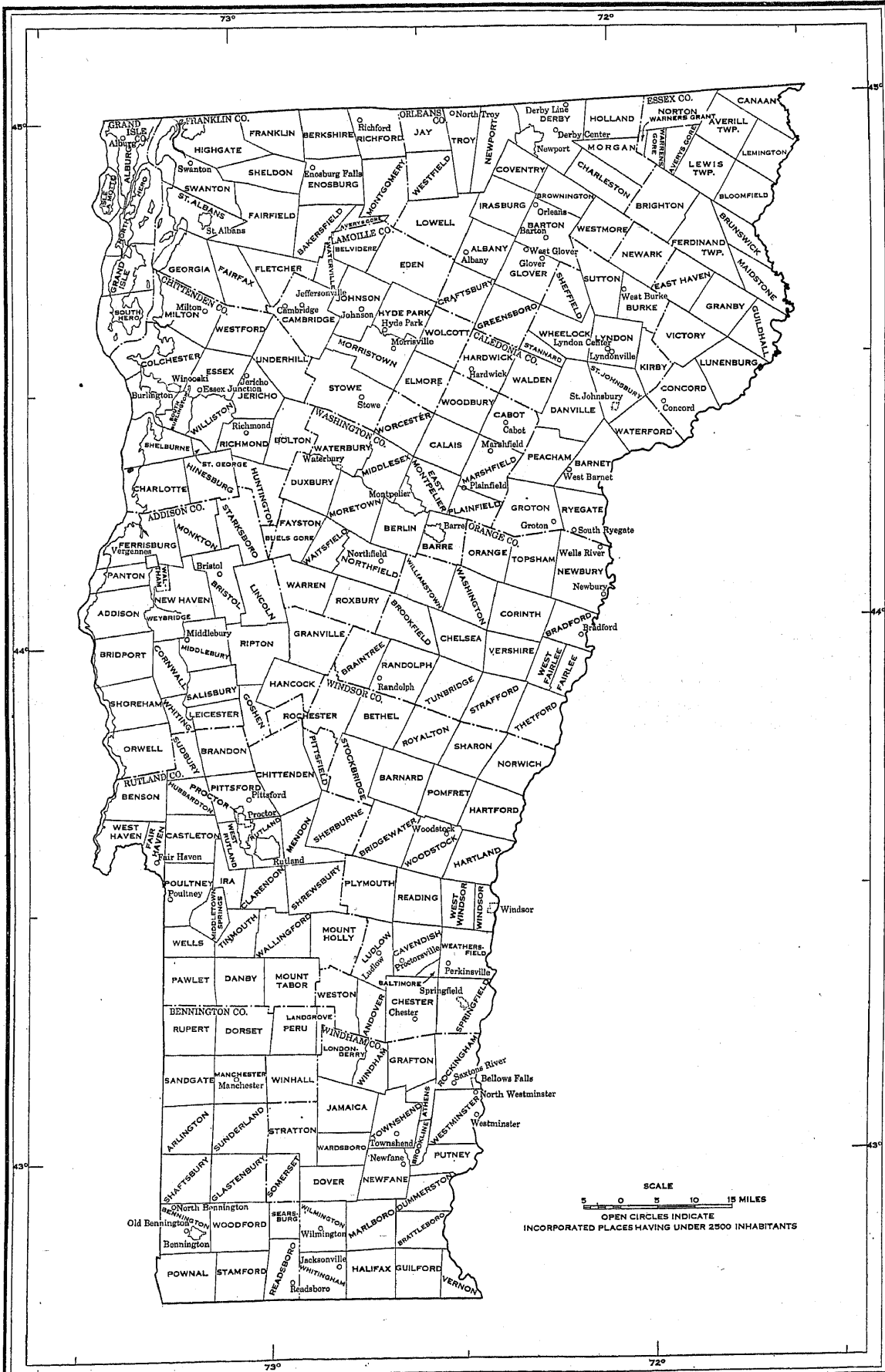

Population of the State.—Vermont was admitted to the Union in 1791 as the fourteenth State and was the first to be admitted after the adoption of the Constitution by the Thirteen Original States. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 359,231, which represents a decrease of 380, or 0.1 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 9,278 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 38.7, as compared with 38.8 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Vermont from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. This table also presents the urban and rural population of the State at

each census. The urban population of Vermont consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more,¹ the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit; for example, Proctor was removed from the urban list in 1940.

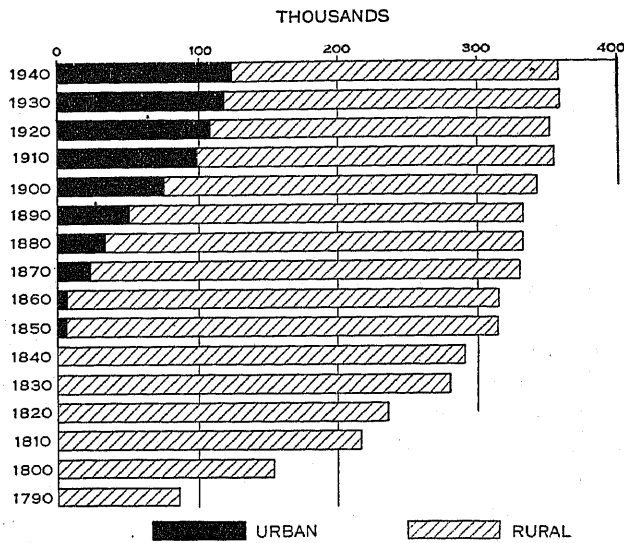

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Vermont is shown by counties, towns, cities, and other minor civil divisions, with figures for villages and some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are three cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows for these cities the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 14 counties of Vermont from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and

differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Six of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and eight decreased. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The counties in Vermont are divided into towns and cities, except in the more sparsely settled areas, where there are several unorganized townships and divisions known as "grants" and "gores," some of which have no population. The incorporated villages form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 8 cities and 67¹ villages.

Table 4 shows for each county the population by minor civil divisions for the last three censuses. The population of the incorporated villages (including Brattleboro, whose incorporation was discontinued in 1927, but whose boundaries are still definitely known) is shown in *italics* under the population of the towns in which the villages are respectively located. Where an incorporated village is located in two or more towns, the total population of the village is given in connection with the presentation for the first town.

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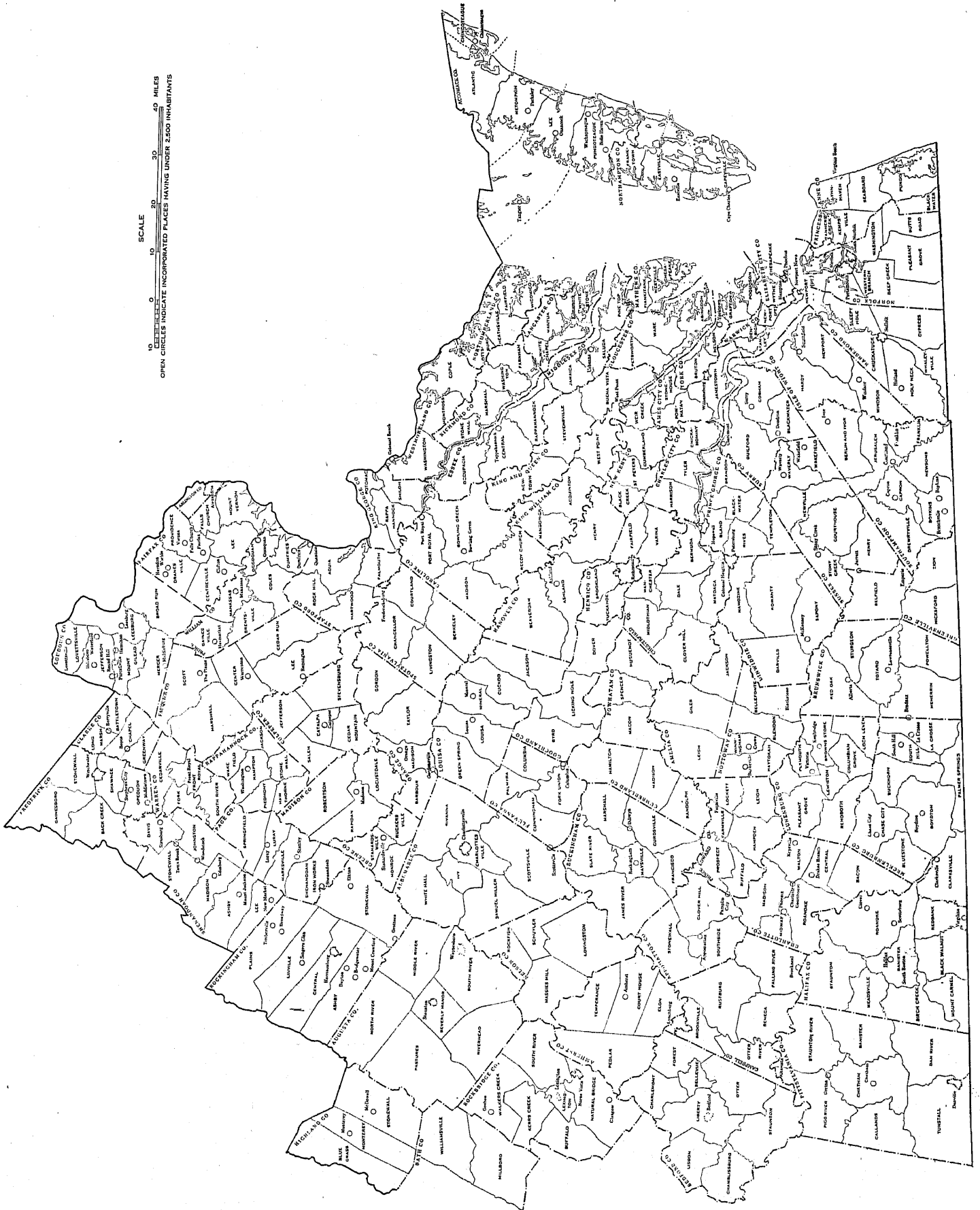
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MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—MAGISTERIAL DISTRICTS

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Virginia, one of the Thirteen Original States, included, in 1790, the areas now constituting the States of Kentucky and West Virginia. The area was reduced in 1791 by the formation of the District of Columbia and in 1792 by the admission of Kentucky into the Union as a separate State; the area was increased in 1846 by the retrocession of the part of the District of Columbia south of the Potomac but was further reduced in 1863 by the admission of West Virginia into the Union as a separate State. In 1866 two additional counties (Berkeley and Jefferson) were annexed to West Virginia, leaving the boundaries of Virginia as at present.

The population of Virginia on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 2,677,773, which represents an increase of 255,922, or 10.6 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 39,899 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 67.1, as compared with 60.7 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Virginia from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. The population shown for 1790 does not include that of the present State of Kentucky. The figures for the other census years are for the State of Virginia as it existed at the given date. Prior to the time at which the State assumed its present boundaries, the population of the present area of Virginia was as follows:¹

1860, 1,219,630; 1850, 1,119,348; 1840, 1,025,227; 1830, 1,044,054; 1820, 938,261; 1810, 877,683; 1800, 807,557; 1790, 691,737.

The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Virginia, as defined by the Census Bureau, consists mainly of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more. It also includes the entire population of Arlington County. (This county, which is a suburb of Washington, D. C., is governed as a unit, without districts or other subdivisions, and in a way combines the functions of county and city or district, somewhat as do the independent cities of Virginia. It is classified as urban by extension of the special rule which provides urban classification for a township containing no incorporated place and having more than 10,000 inhabitants and a population density of more than 1,000 per square mile.) The remainder of the population is classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Pocahontas qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940 but not in 1930.

¹ Corresponding figures given for the "present area of Virginia" in Reports of the Fifteenth Census (1930), vol. I, p. 1117, did not include the population of the area retroceded by the District of Columbia.

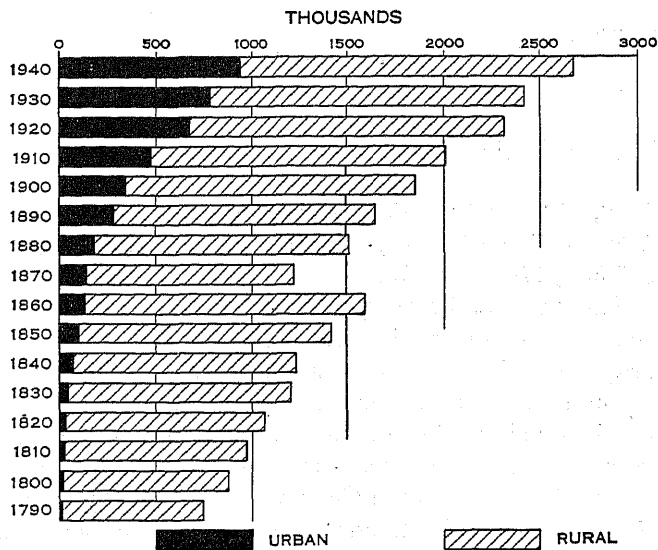

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Virginia is shown by counties, cities, magisterial districts, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7, 7-A, and 7-B and for the census tracts of Richmond in table 8.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are 15 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Richmond, the capital and largest city, had a population in 1940 of 193,042. The other cities in this size-group are, in order of population, Norfolk, Roanoke, Portsmouth, Lynchburg, Newport News, Alexandria, Danville, Petersburg, Charlottesville, Staunton, Winchester, Suffolk, Martinsville, and Fredericksburg. The last two cities are included in this size-group for the first time.

Counties and independent cities.—Table 3 shows the population of the 100 counties and the 24 independent cities of Virginia from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county or city and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Of the 92 counties whose boundaries remained unchanged since 1930, 59 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 33 decreased; of the 16 cities whose boundaries remained unchanged, 13 increased and 3

decreased. The information concerning boundary changes is given in the footnotes on table 3. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930. The independent cities, which have the status of counties, are presented separately at the end of the table. In the independent city presentation, *italics* are used for the figures representing the population of two cities (Martinsville and South Norfolk) before they became independent, to indicate that the figures, having already been counted once, are not to be added in with the counties and the other independent cities to make the State total.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Virginia are called magisterial districts. The incorporated towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 193 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions forms a part of some magisterial district (or districts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by magisterial districts and towns for the last three

censuses. The population of the towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the towns are respectively located. Where a town is located in two or more magisterial districts in the same county, the total population of the town is shown in connection with the presentation for the first district. Where the town is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county. The 24 independent cities which have the status of counties are omitted from this table. Data for these cities are shown in table 3.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The following tables give data for the three metropolitan districts with central cities in Virginia. Part of the Washington, D. C., district is also situated in Virginia; data for this district are presented in the bulletin for the District of Columbia.

Table 7 shows the population of the Norfolk-Portsmouth-Newport News metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Norfolk-Portsmouth-Newport News metropolitan district had 330,396 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 273,233. Kempsville magisterial district, Princess Anne County (population 7,609 in 1940; 5,509 in 1930) and Lynnhaven district (population 7,070 in 1940; 5,252 in 1930), were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time.

In 1940 the Richmond metropolitan district had 245,674 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 220,513. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

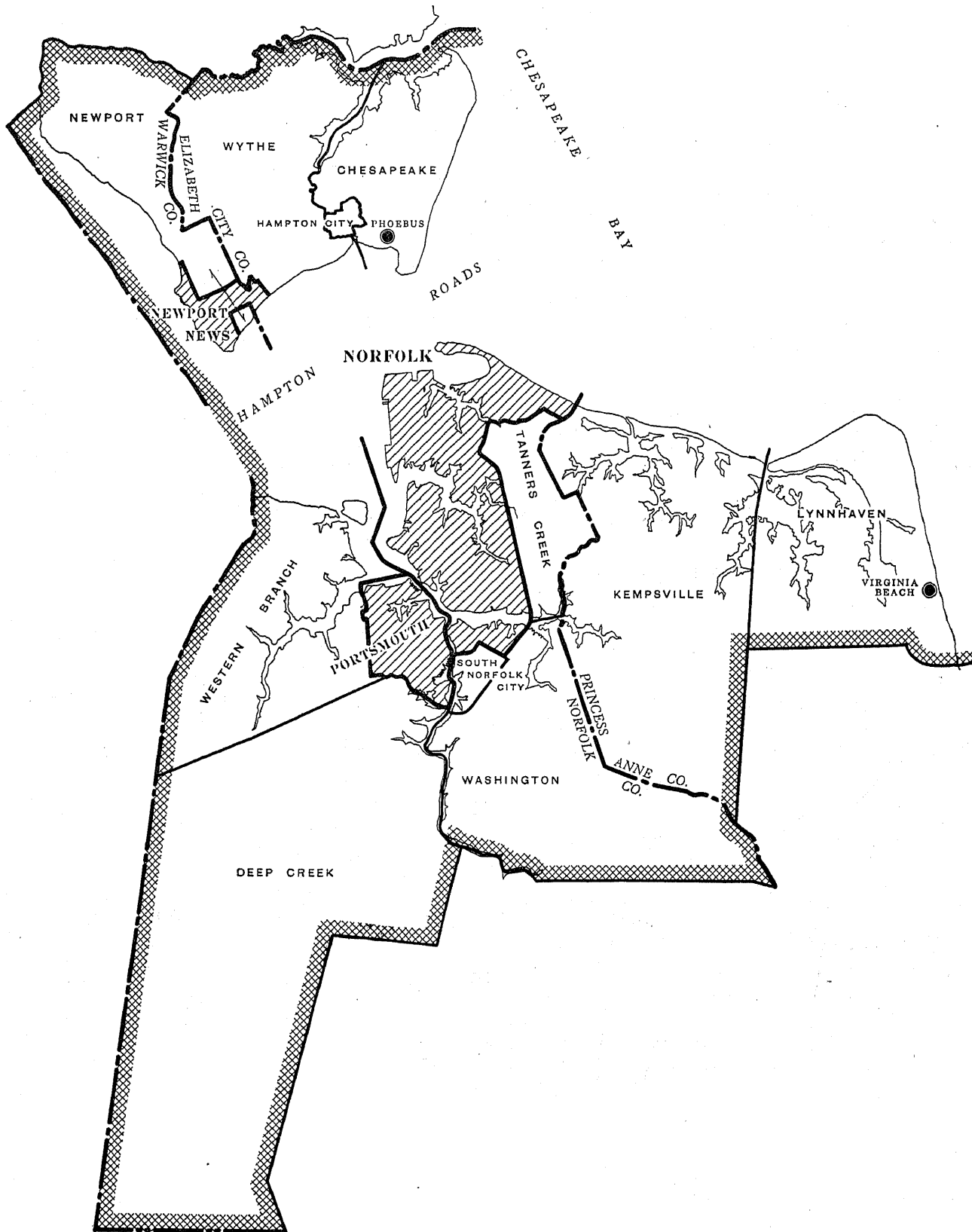
Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Richmond is shown by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. The census tracts for Richmond are shown in the accompanying map.

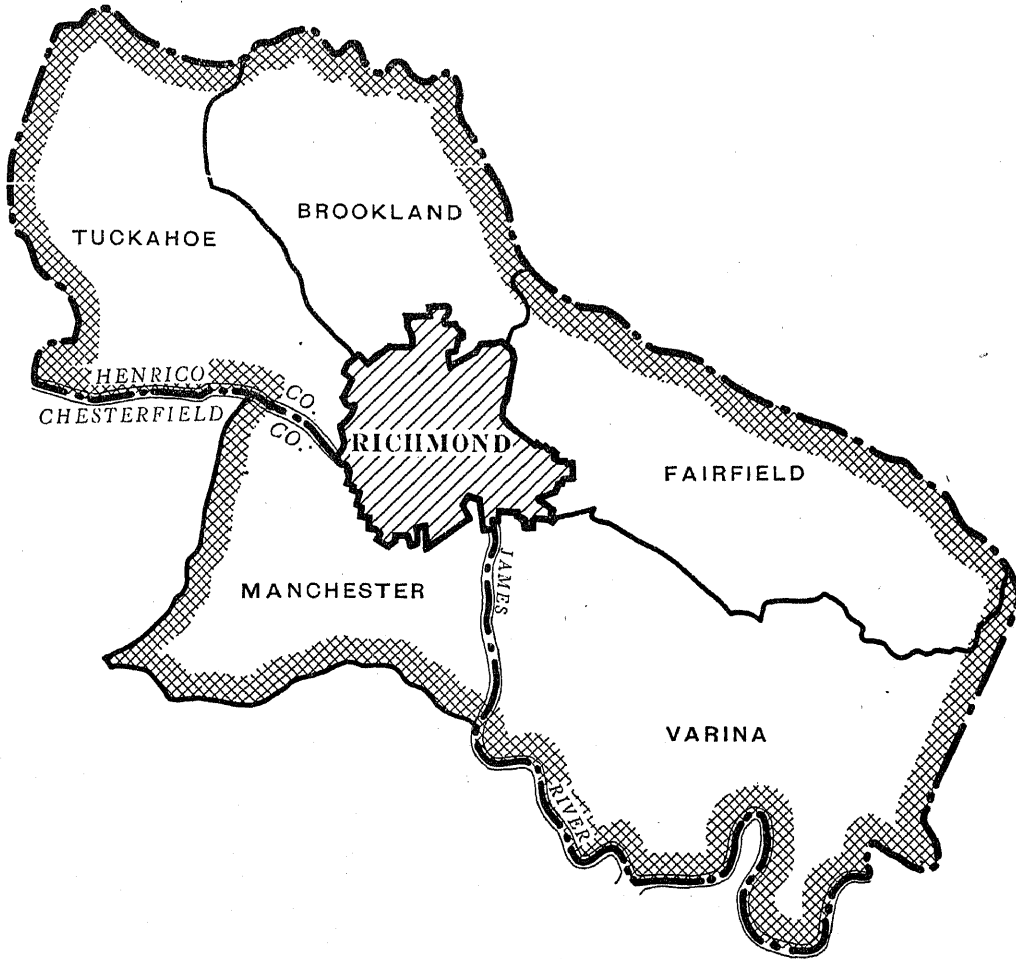

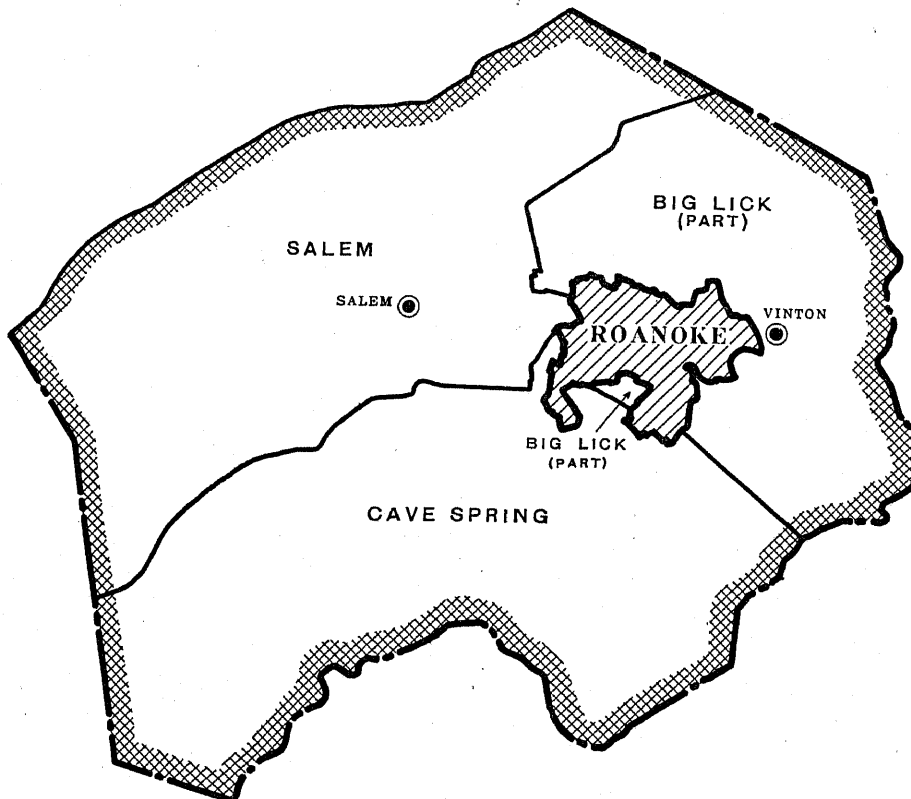
NORFOLK-PORTSMOUTH-NEWPORT NEWS METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

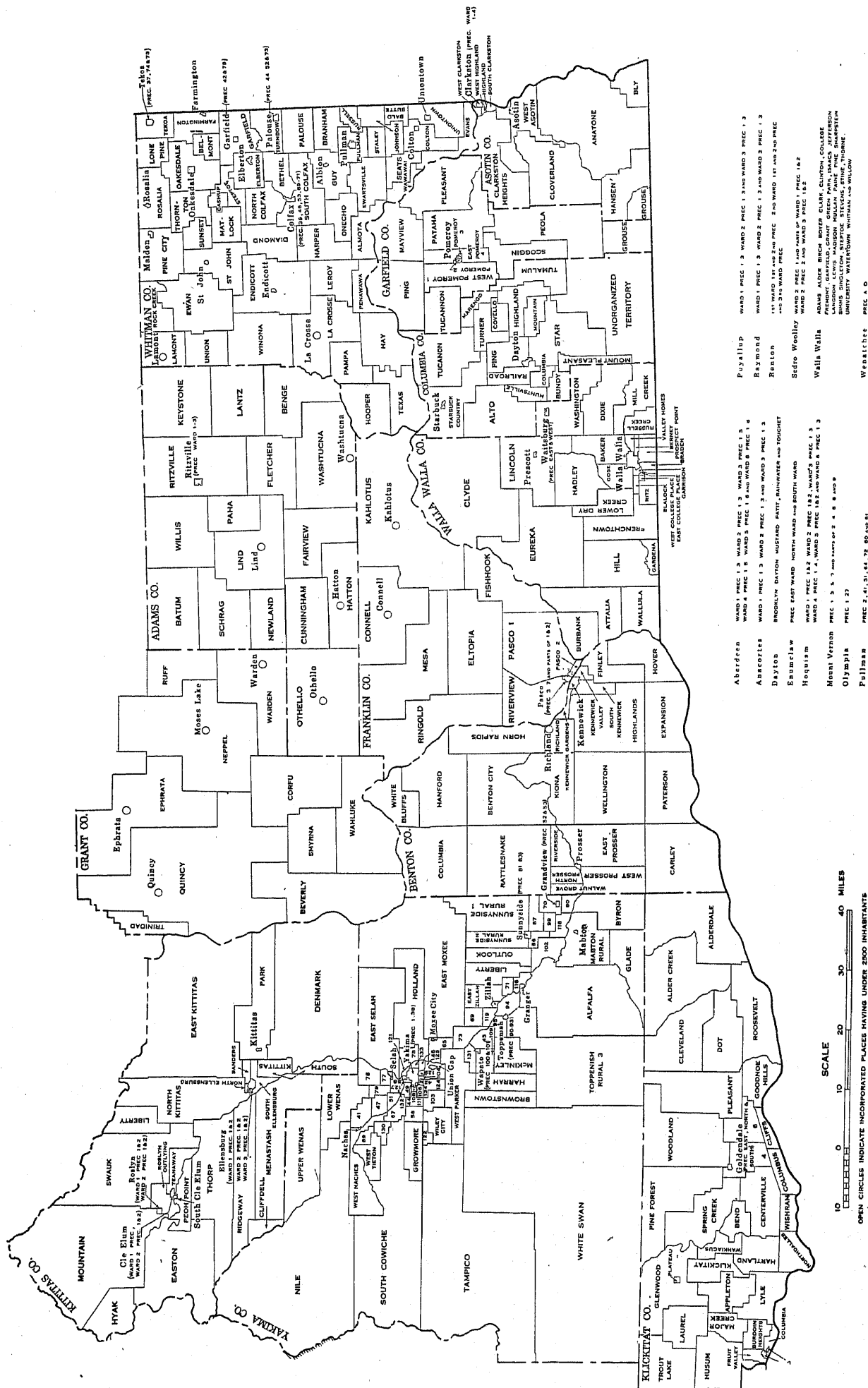
WASHINGTON—WESTERN PART

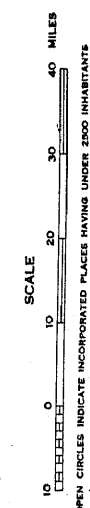

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Washington was organized as a Territory in 1853 from part of Oregon Territory, and included an area now comprising the States of Washington, northern Idaho, and part of Montana. In 1859, upon the admission of Oregon as a State, the remaining portion of Oregon Territory, comprising the rest of Idaho and parts of Montana and Wyoming, was added to the Territory of Washington. The area of the Territory was reduced to the present limits of the State in 1863, upon the organization of Idaho Territory. Washington was admitted to the Union in 1889 as the forty-second State.

The population of Washington on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,736,191, which represents an increase of 172,795, or 11.1 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 66,977 square miles. The average number of inhabit-

ants per square mile in 1940 was 25.9, as compared with 23.3 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Washington from 1860, the year in which the Territory of Washington was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Washington consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Pullman city qualified as urban in 1910 and 1930, but not in 1920.

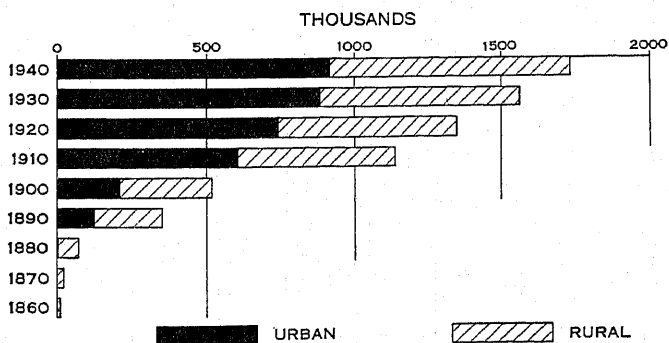

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Washington is shown by counties, election

precincts, townships, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7, 7-A, and 7-B and for the census tracts of Seattle in table 8.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are 14 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Seattle, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 368,302; and Olympia, the capital of the State, had a population of 13,254.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 39 counties of Washington from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Thirty-four of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and five decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Washington are the election precincts, townships, and some of the cities and towns. (Only Spokane and Whatcom Counties have townships, cities, and towns as primary divisions, though there is also one township in King County.) In several counties there are additional types of primary divisions (in Kitsap County, the U. S. Navy Yard; in Pierce County, Fort Lewis Military Reservation, McNeil Island, and part of Mount Rainier National Park; and in Whatcom County, Lummi Indian Reservation). There are 67 cities and 155 towns, of which 5 cities and 12 towns are independent of precinct or township organization and form primary divisions of the counties. The remaining

cities and towns, each of which, ordinarily, is a part of some precinct (or precincts), form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by precincts, townships, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns that constitute secondary divisions is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions (precincts) in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more precincts the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct. The population of the cities and towns that comprise several entire precincts is presented in roman type, followed by the precinct population in *italic* type.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Seattle metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940, with some comparative figures for 1930. In 1940 the Seattle metropolitan district had 452,639 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 420,663. The redistricting of King County between 1930 and 1940 necessitated a redefinition of the boundaries of the metropolitan district, resulting in a slight change in the area included in the district; the effect upon the population increase in the district is not ascertainable.

Table 7-A shows the population of the Spokane metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Spokane metropolitan district had 141,370 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district had a population of 128,798. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Table 7-B shows the population of the Tacoma metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Tacoma metropolitan district had 156,018 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 146,771. The redistricting of King County between 1930 and 1940 necessitated a redefinition of the boundaries of the metropolitan district, resulting in a slight decrease in the area included in the district; the effect upon the population increase in the district is not ascertainable.

Part of the Portland metropolitan district is situated in Washington. Data for this metropolitan district are presented in the bulletin for Oregon.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 popu-

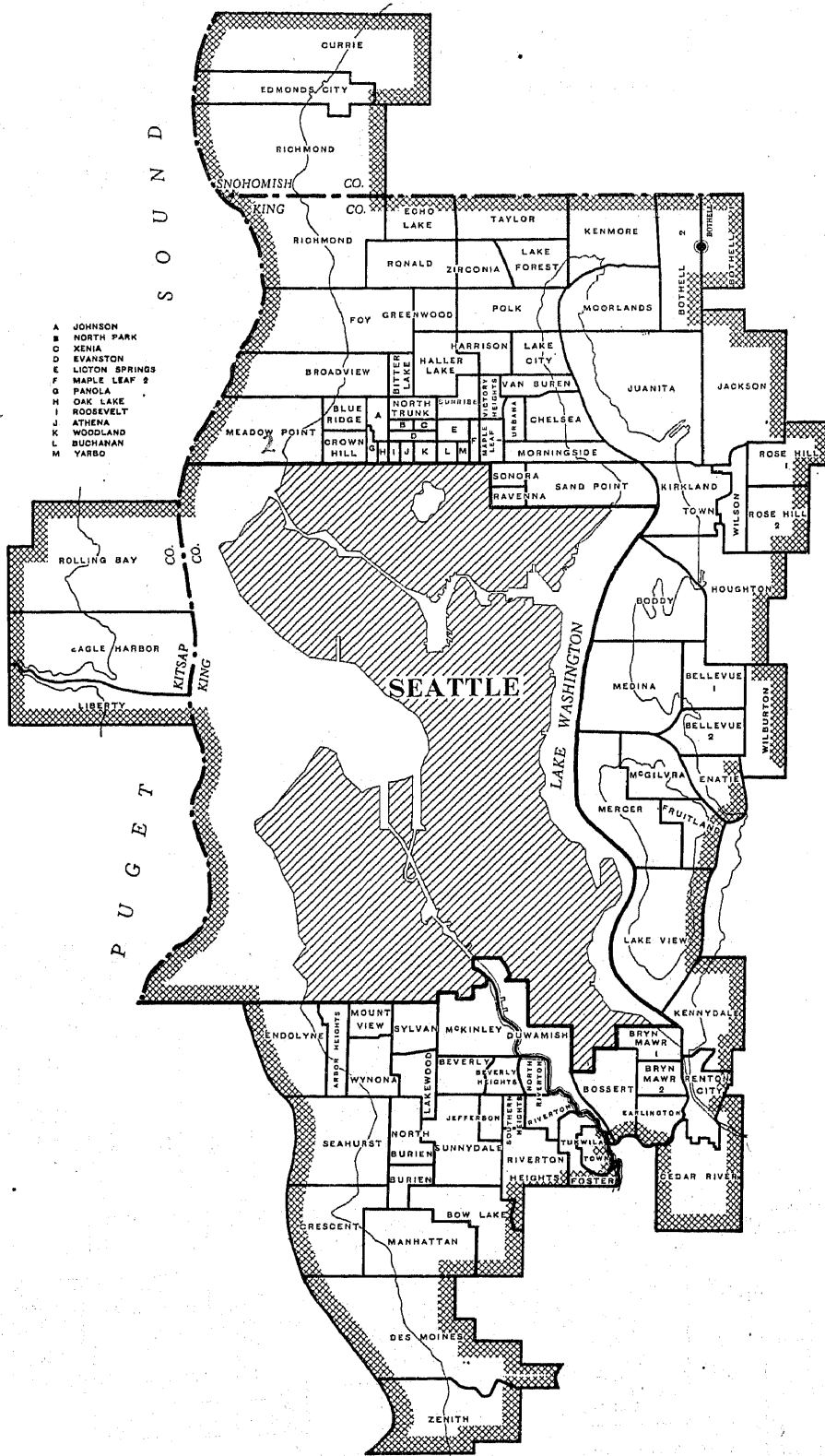

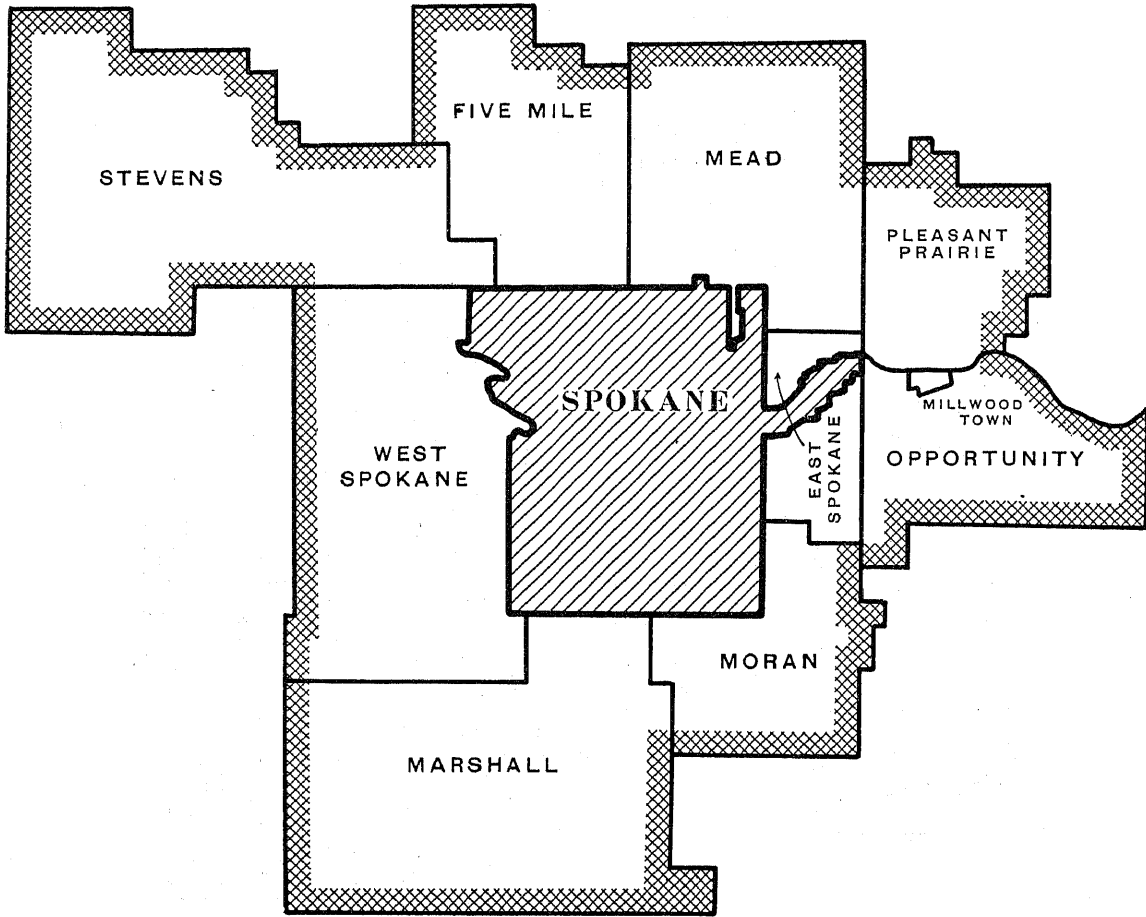

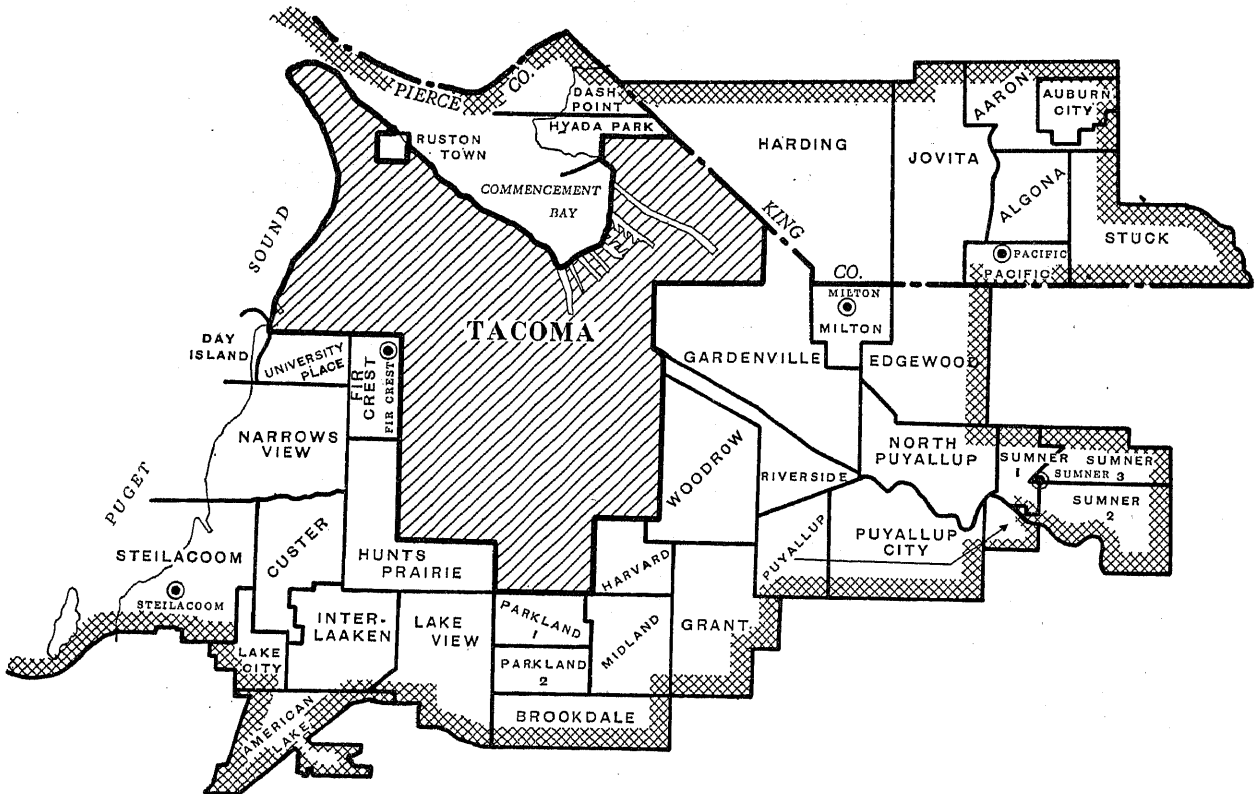
SEATTLE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

Population of the State.—West Virginia, originally a part of Virginia, was admitted to the Union in 1863 as the thirty-fifth State. In 1866, with the annexation of two additional counties (Berkeley and Jefferson) from Virginia, the boundaries were established as at present. The population of West Virginia on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,901,974, which represents an increase of 172,769, or 10.0 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 24,090 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 79.0, as compared with 71.8 in 1930.

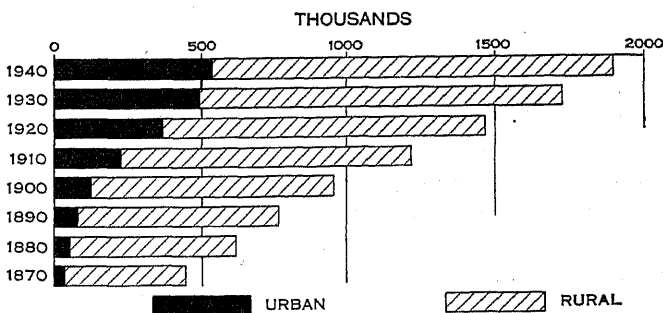
Table 1 shows the population of West Virginia from 1870, the year in which its area was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The population at each census prior to

1870 of that part of Virginia which was later taken to form West Virginia, was as follows: 1860, 376,688; 1850, 302,313; 1840, 224,537; 1830, 176,924; 1820, 136,808; 1810, 105,469; 1800, 78,592; 1790, 55,873. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of West Virginia comprises all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Charles Town qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940 but not in 1930.

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of West Virginia is shown by counties, magisterial

districts, cities, towns, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of places by wards, and tables 7, 7-A, and 7-B present data for the metropolitan districts.

Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.—There are 12 incorporated places in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these incorporated places at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Huntington, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 78,836; and Charleston, the capital of the State, had a population of 67,914.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 55 counties of West Virginia from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Forty-nine of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and six decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in West Virginia are called magisterial districts. The incorporated cities, towns, and villages form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 53 cities, 147 towns, and 7 villages. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of some magisterial district (or districts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by magisterial districts, cities, towns, and villages for the last three censuses. The population of the cities, towns, and villages is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more districts in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first district. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Charleston metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase during the decade. In 1940 the Charleston metropolitan district had 136,332 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 108,160. That part of Nitro town in Pocatalico district, Putnam County, was included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. Nitro has been incorporated since 1930 so that its 1930 population is not available.

Table 7-A shows the population of the Huntington-Ashland metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Like several other districts, it is located in more than one State. In 1940

the Huntington-Ashland metropolitan district had 170,979 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 163,367. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Table 7-B shows the population of the Wheeling metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. This district also occupies terri-

tory in more than one State. In 1940 the Wheeling metropolitan district had 196,340 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 190,623. That part of Clay district, Marshall County, W. Va., that is outside of Moundsville city (population: 1,372 in 1940; 1,437 in 1930) was included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time.

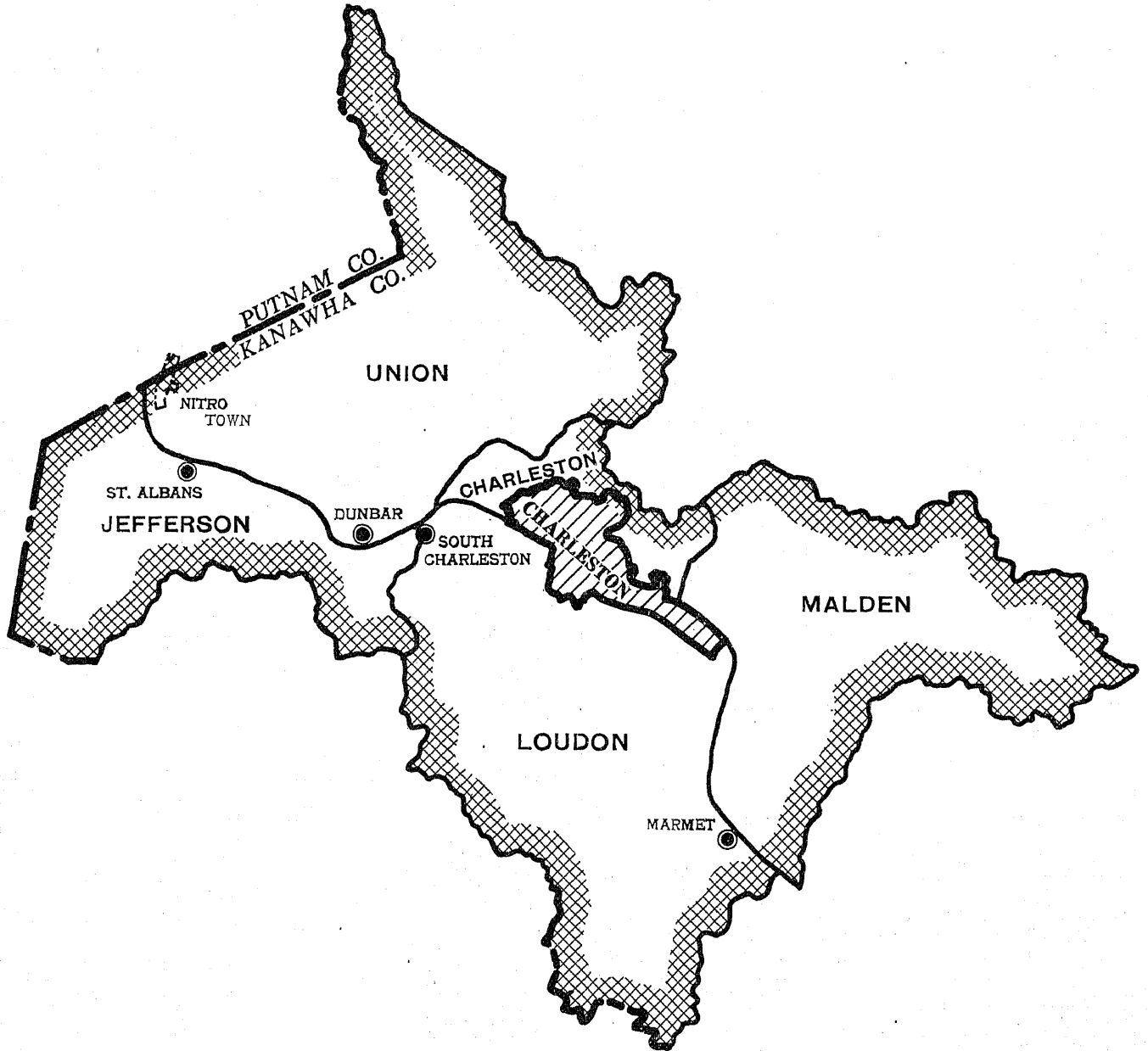

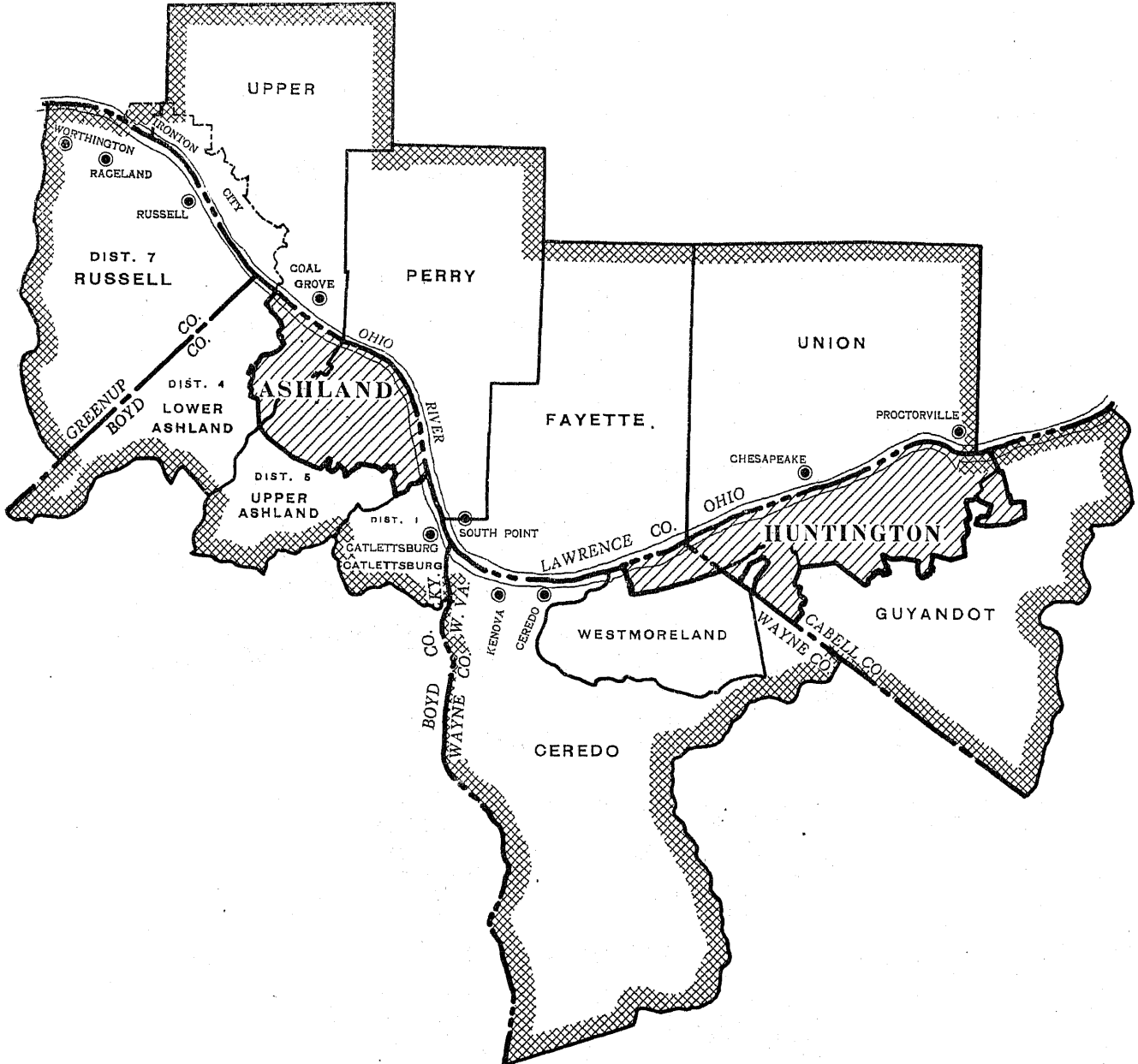
