

FORMER BINFORD WOMAN IS DEAD

MRS. F. W. BAILLES DIES AFTER
OPERATION AT ROCHESTER,
MINN.

Oslo (Minn) Tribune: Again the death angel has visited the vicinity and called from our midst a young woman whose life has been devoted to Christian work. One by one they are gathered and taken home to receive the reward they have earned by their life here on earth.

Mrs. F. W. Bailles, nee Miss Mina Gjelhaug of Bigwoods, answered the call of death Tuesday of last week, September 2, following an operation at a hospital at Rochester, Minn. She never recovered from the operation and death came four days after it was performed.

Mina Gjelhaug was born at Park River, N. Dak., Oct. 27, 1885, being 35 years, 10 months and 5 days of age at the time of her death. After living at Park River for a short while she came to Bigwoods with her family and lived here for some time. Those of her family who remain to mourn her death still make Bigwoods their home.

This young woman was very devoted in the work of the church. Being a graduate of the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago, and having made Christian work her life's work she went on with it alone. On Sept. 10, 1918, she was married to the Rev. F. W. Bailles and together they went on with their work, having made Beloit, Wis., their home until the time of her death.

She leaves to mourn her early death, a husband, Rev. F. W. Bailles, of Beloit, Wis., an aged mother, and two sisters, Misses Karen Gjelhaug and Hanna Gjelhaug of Bigwoods, and two sisters living in the west, namely, Mrs. O. C. Amundson, of East Stanwood, Wash., and Mrs. O. G. Arneson, of Spokane, Wash., and besides her near relatives she leaves many friends to mourn her untimely death.

The remains were shipped from Rochester to this place and interment was made at the Bigwoods cemetery on Wednesday of this week. Her husband preached the funeral sermon, assisted by Mr. Anton Hill, of Alvarado. The funeral was large and many of her old friends gathered at the Bigwoods church to pay their last tribute to the departed.

From out of town, Mrs. O. C. Amundson, of East Stanwood, Wash., Mrs. O. G. Arneson, of Spokane, Wash., Mr. Andrew Korstad, of New Folden, Minn., and a number of friends from Argyle attended the funeral.
