

MRS. J. C. ETHEN DEAD

Died Tuesday Morning After Brief Illness

Mrs. J. C. Ethen passed to her eternal reward quietly and peacefully at her home south of town, in Warfield township, early Tuesday morning, April 27, after a brief illness.

Mary Anna Karis was born in Rockville, Minnesota, July 17, 1858, where she resided for many years. On April 30, 1878 she was united in marriage to Joseph C. Ethen, still making their home near there, on a farm. Seventeen years later they moved to Richmond where they lived for 5 years, going from there to Cold Springs, where they resided until coming to Binford about ten years ago.

To Mr. and Mrs. Ethen were born nine children, one of whom died in infancy. Those who survive her are Math Ethen, of Cold Springs, Minn.; Mrs. Katherine Korte, of Cold Springs; Mrs. Anna Lepper, of McHenry; Theodore, of Binford; Nick, of Ellis, Minn.; Christ, of Fargo; Louis and Veronica of Binford. Other surviving relatives are two brothers, Christ Karis, of Albany, Minn.; and Peter Karis, of Kimbal, Minn.; three sisters, Mrs. Gustav Keough, of Kimbal, Minn., Mrs. J. Moog, of Sauk Rapids, Minn., and Mrs. Nick Lutgen, of Stickley, Montana.

The remains were taken by the sorrowing relatives to the old home at Cold Springs, Wednesday, where the funeral will be held on Friday morning from the Catholic church.

Mrs. Ethen was a good neighbor and a devoted mother, and was held in high esteem in the community. The cares and trials of earthly life for the good woman are all laid away and she is doubtless now happy in the blessings of the life eternal and immortal.
