

Mrs. M. C. Lier passed away Tuesday morning, at her home in Mose, after an illness of several week's duration. She had been suffering from an attack of winter asthma, and her condition had been so poorly for the past month or more that she couldn't lie down, but had to sit propped up in an armchair where she could breathe easier.

Corine Leir was born in Birid, Norway, January 2, 1853, where she grew to womanhood. She was married to Mr. Leir, who survives her, September 15, 1876. They came to America in 1878 and settled on a farm near Pigeon Falls, Wisconsin, where they lived prior to coming to North Dakota in 1899. They have made their home at Mose since then.

Eight children were born to this union, of whom five are living. They are Christ Leir, of McHenry, Mrs. Oscar Greenland, of Binford, Mrs. Walter Gratias, of Saskatoon, Canada, Ludvig and Joseph, both of Mose.

Resides the husband and children, two sisters and two brothers survive her. They are Mrs. Gina Hagen of Iowa, Mrs. Ed Amundgaard, of Argyle, Minnesota, Ben Bendickson, of Pigeon Falls, Wisconsin, and Ludvig Bendickson of Seattle, Washington. Mrs. Leir had nineteen grandchildren.

The funeral was held today from the home of the deceased at Mose, and interment made in the cemetery north of town.

Several people from Binford went to Mose to attend the last sad rites of the departed, among them being the Lutheran church choir, who sang at the funeral services. Rev. L. M. Halling was the officiating clergyman.
