

A Remarkable Story.

Recently the body of Jean LeRue, a French trapper, was found in a hollow tree near LeSueur, Minn. The body was not decayed, but was mummified, dried up and was easily recognized by former friends. LeRue disappeared in August, 1862, during the Indian uprising, says Mr. Boen, janitor at the court house in Ada, who lived there. He became frightened and took over \$700 in money and his rifle and fled into the woods. He was never seen again. When the tree was cut down last month and his body found, they also found his rifle, bullet pouch, powder horn and \$783.50 in money. They also found a diary which LeRue always kept and the last entry stated: "Cannot get out; surely must die. If ever found send all my money to my mother, Madame Suzanne LeRue, near Tarascon, France."
