The Board proceeded at once to open and read the bids filed with the County Auditor, for the furnishing of the hoist dump bodies for the trucks, also loaders and drags to-wit:

The Four Wheel Drive Auto Co. offered to furnish 3 dump bodies for the 3 F. W. D. trucks for \$2,593.50.

The Wood Hydraulic Hoist and Body Co. offered to furnish 4 dump bodies f. o. b. Chicago for \$2700.09, prices subject to change without notice.

The Heil Co. offered to furnish the 4 hoist dump bodies for a total of \$2,442.00, f. o. b. Milwaukee.
