AGES FOR DEATH OF SON IN h AEROPLANE CRASH AT SUT-TON, TWO YEARS AGO. The sum of \$50,000 damages for the death of his son, Aber Brian e Karr, killed in an aeropiane crash

at Sutton, on Aug. 24, 1919, is askn ed in an action brought by Alex Karr of Fargo, against Edward Axberg, aviator, formerly of Enderlin, but d now of Fargo. 0 The complaint alleges that the defendant at the time was operating an aeroplane for hire and that in consideration of \$20 he agreed to 4 safely transport the plaintiff's son in a twenty minute flight over Sutìn i ton and vicinity. The complaint cites s that by reason of negligence and carelessness the aviator lost control of the aeroplane in attempting to perform feats and revolutions beyoud his skill, causing the plane to d crash to the ground resulting in ine inries to Brian Karr from which he died shortly afterwards, 8 The complaint further alleges that e the machine operated by Axberg was defective, weak, improperly constructed and assembed, and that the materials of which it was constructed were defective and of insufficient a strength and rigidity.
