

LOCALS LOSERS IN TWO GAMES

Cooperstown Won Lake Game 5-1,
Aneta Took Long End of
6 to 4 Count.

The locals lost to the Cooperstown team at the Home-Coming celebration at Red Willow lake last Sunday, Score 5-1.

Binford got their lone tally in the second inning. Ellingson was passed stole second, and scored on Johnson's hit to center. At other times during the game chances for runs were bright, but the hits were not forthcoming at the proper time and some poor base running worked against us.

Cooperstown scored three times in the fifth round. A hit batsman two hits and two errors contributed. Two more were added in the ninth. Another hit batsman followed by two two-baggers did the business.

Borchardt was on the mound for the home team. Wickham, who has just returned from France, started the game for Cooper. "Wick" showed up well considering that he hasn't had much opportunity to work. He retired after the fourth inning and was replaced by Kingsley. Both Wickham and Kingsley have been engaged by Cooperstown for the rest of the season and two better men are hard to find.

Pitching honors were about evenly divided. Borchardt allowed nine hits and struck out eleven. Wickham and Kingsley had 12 strikeouts and were touched for nine safe blows.

Binford got a score in the fourth. Ellingson was safe on Gronley's error, Thorn forced Ellingson at second. Thorn pulled another one of his daredevil base-running stunts and got away with it. In his steal for second the throw went to the outfield and Thorn to third. In the attempt to cut him off at that base the ball again went wild and Thorn continued merrily on his way home.
