

PROGRAMS MAKE HIT AT SUTTON

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS TO AP-
PEAR IN BINFORD DEC-
EMBER 10 AND 12.

The first number of the Community programs which have been secured again for Binford, will appear on Friday, December 10 and Sunday, Dec. 12, with a possible performance on Saturday, Dec. 11. The programs this season are secured by the guarantee of about 20 persons, members of the Binford Community club.

The same company which will come to Binford, appeared in Sutton recently, and the Sutton Reporter has the following to say of the programs held at that place:

The Federated Community entertainments by the Adams Trio and the lectures by Dr. F. W. Weber proved quite an innovation to the people of this vicinity. The three programs were well attended, their quality being attested by the fact that the audience was larger with each succeeding number.

The trio was composed of Miss Hazel Ekholm of Red Wing, Minnesota, violinist; Miss Marion Hill of Minneapolis, pianist and soloist; and Miss Hazel Zimmerman of New Hampton, Iowa, reader. Miss Ekholm proved to be a violinist of extraordinary ability and winning personality. Miss Hill is one of the best pianists in lyceum work and Miss Zimmerman, as a reader, shows a remarkable personality. Dr. F. W. Weber is a community expert and is one of the original men in the organization. His three years of service give him an inexhaustible fund of definite material of value to any community. Mr. Weber's message emphasizes the joy of life, the beauty of our world. He believes success, prosperity, opulence is our birthright. It is the attitude of mind that makes our condition. Communities

are prone to talk of their limitations weaknesses and quarrel instead of its strength and praiseworthy things.

Traveling with these people was Miss Mary Quinlan, a representative of the Rumford Home Economics department. She is a graduate of the Chicago university, held a position as Red Cross dietitian and has been engaged in settlement work in Chicago. At her second afternoon meeting practically all of the women of Sutton were present. She is a fluent speaker and presented her work in an able manner. This work that is being done by the Rumford people seems to be much appreciated, and is a case where consumer and producer may get together for mutual benefit.

The Federated Community association is nonpolitical and nonsectarian. They emphasize the social recreation, industrial and agricultural life of the community, state and nation. They emphasize good fellowship and clean citizenship as their slogan all through.

A movement is already started to arrange for another series of entertainments to be given by other companies belonging to the association, some time in the near future.
