PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO REPORT INCOMES

Penalties will be enforced for failure to report income taxes in the future, says Gerge E. Wallace, state tax commissioner. Eighty thousand blanks will be dispatched to corporations and individuals immediately after the holidays for the income tax return, which must be made by Mar 1. Penalties have not been enforced this year, except in case of fraud, the tax commissioner said, because the law was a new one.
