Reeves of the British army at the opera house here Friday evening will not easily forget the vivid and realistic pictures with a genuine front trench atmosphere which he portrayed in simple English in a manner, possible only by one has actually lived the deeds he is featuring. Though wounded twice one bullet passing through his head and the other passing through his shoulder, and though left on the battle field for two days without aid, he] still lives and hopes to be able to go back to the front as soon as fully recuperated. F. G. Lewis acted as chairman during the evening, and John Sad of Cooperstown gave a brief talk on the coming Red Cross drive. Four appropriate songs were rendered by the school children. Two reels of movies showed our boys in training in France, and the work of the Red Cross. The program closed with the singing of 'Star Spangled Banner."
