Postmaster J. A. Knapp desires to impress upon the patrons of the Binford postoffice the necessity of cooperating with the postal service to the fullest extent in preparing and mailing Christmas parcels by observing the following rules:

Prepay postage fully on all artis | cles.

Address parcels fully and plainly. Place names and address of sender on all mail matter.

Pack articles carefully and wrap e them securely but do not seal them; as sealed packages are subject to postage at the letter rate.

Mail parcels party. They may be marked 'Do not open until Christmas.

Insure valuable parcels.

Written inscriptions such as "Mers l ry Christmas." "Happy New Year," "With Best Wishes" etc., are permissabe on parcel post mail. Letter e prepaid at first class rate may be r sent with parcel post rate provided c they are placed in envelopes securely attached to outside of the package.
