

# CAUCUS TICKET WAS ELECTED

Otto Pritz, E. F. Ringlee and F. G. Lewis Will Form New Village Board of Trustees.

The village election failed to create enthusiasm which was expected. In only three of the offices did there develop any contest—that of trustee in the first and third wards and assessor. Otto Pritz, who was the nominee for trustee in the first ward, was elected in spite of his declaration that he preferred not to serve. In the third ward, the same circumstance prevailed, Mr. Lewis asking to be relieved of further duties. There were a few scattering votes in addition to those mentioned below:
