

**NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER OR NOT THE VILLAGE OF BINFORD, COUNTY OF GRIGGS, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, MAY ISSUE BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING AN ELECTRIC LIGHT AND POWER PLANT.**

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Binford, said County and State, having been petitioned by five-eighths of the citizen owners of taxable property in said Village, requesting that the Board of Trustees of said Village purchase or erect an electric light and power plant, and it being resolved by the said Board of Trustees that a Special Election be called for the purpose of bringing the proposition to a vote as to whether or not they, as Trustees of the said Village, may issue bonds to the amount of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00), in denomination of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) each, bearing interest at the rate of Seven (7) per cent per annum, and shall be issued for the purpose of purchasing the electric light and power plant now operating within the corporate limits of the Village of Binford, said County and State, on a form of ballot hereinafter set forth; and said Special Election shall be held on the 16th day of April, A. D. 1920, at the Fire Hall located on Lot Nine (9), Block Five (5), in the Village of Binford, County of Griggs, State of North Dakota, and the polls shall be open from eight o'clock a. m. until five o'clock p. m., on said day and at said place, and for said purpose.

Shall the Village of Binford, a municipal corporation, in Griggs County, State of North Dakota, by its Board of Trustees, issue bonds to and in the amount of \$8,000.00, in the denomination of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) each, bearing interest at the rate of Seven (7) per cent per annum, and issued for the purpose of purchasing the electric light and power plant now operating in the Village of Binford, said County and State, owned by Binford Light & Power Co., and such bonds maturing as follows:
