

BIG CORPORATION PLANNED

\$250,000 Corporation Planned to Succeed Cooperstown Electric Light & Power Co.

Sentinel-Courier: A public service corporation to furnish light heat and power, not only for Cooperstown but also for surrounding towns, and farmers along the route is being planned.

C. S. Christianson, manager of the Cooperstown Electric Light & Power Co., informs us that plans are now being formulated for the organization of the corporation, and that stock, at \$100 per share, will soon be offered for sale.

It is the intention of the new corporation to take over the entire holdings of the present Cooperstown Electric Light & Power Co., and it is hoped to make it a home company by disposing of the bulk of the stock in this immediate neighborhood.

The contemplated public service corporation will furnish light, heat and power for residences and business houses, and by means of high tension lines the service will be extended to towns on the branch as far north as McHenry and to towns on the Great Northern, east of Cooperstown, such as Hope and Finley.

Farmers living along the main route of the high tension lines will also be served, and it is expected many farmers will eagerly take ad-

vantage of the service offered.

Manager Christianson stated on Monday, that much interest is already manifest in the new corporation and that farmers and business men alike, in this and adjoining counties, have signified their intention of purchasing liberal blocks of stock.

The formation of the company, is as yet in the preliminary stage, and while it is impossible at this time to state definitely the territory which will be served, the above outlines the tentative plan.

The main office and headquarters of the corporation, will be in Cooperstown, and anyone wishing a block of stock held for them, or wishing to discuss the matter personally with Mr. Christianson, may call on him at at his office in this city.
