

Census Taken in January.

The first census taken in the United States was during the administration of George Washington and related solely to population. That census required more than a year's time. Now the census includes not only population, but an enumeration of all stock owned, property owned, debts, cash, and data of scores of matters. With all of this added it is planned to complete the entire census for the United States in 30 days, and have the job all done by February first. H. D. Allert, who is the supervisor for the first district of North Dakota informs us that he plans to have 150 enumerators at work in this district during January. At the present time he has over 100 on contract but is still short about 50. The government pays the enumerators \$6.00 per day.
