**Auction Sale Next Thursday Will be
Big Event—Judge Cole of
Fargo Will Speak.**

Extensive preparations are nearing completion for the big Red Cross carnival and auction sale to be held in Binford, next Thursday, May 23.

The executive committee of the local branch, assisted by others, have practically finished the canvass of the district assigned to us, and everywhere the solicitors have met with eagerness on the part of the people to do their share towards making the venture an unqualified success. From noon and continuing all afternoon, lunch will be served in the opera house.
