

XMAS PACKAGES TO SOLDIERS

New Instructions Must Be Followed In Order to Mail Parcels to France.

When you have received an addressed label from a soldier overseas, present it at the Cooperstown post office and receive a carton in which to pack your gifts.

The carton will measure 3x4x9 inches and when packed must not weigh more than 2 pounds and 15 ounces unwrapped.

When you have the carton packed present it again at the Cooperstown postoffice where it will be inspected, wrapped, sealed and labeled by the committee, Mr. Victor Nelson and Chas. Porterville, you must then place stamps upon it sufficient to carry it to Hoboken, New Jersey.

No one can receive a carton who does not present a Christmas parcel label from the man over seas.

This label is the one that must be placed on the package, do not destroy it. The post office will not accept a package without this label.

In event of a label being lost no duplicate can be supplied.

The package must not weigh more than three pounds.

Do not put in any thing liable to spoil.

Do not put in any prohibited article.

No package will be accepted after November 20th.

The cartons are now ready and can be procured at any time at the post office upon presentation of label.

Get your package in early.
