Stores Must Close at Six O'clock.

The U. S. Fuel Administration has ordered that all stores and other places of business devoted to the purchase, sale or exchange of goods, wares and merchandise, which are lighted, heated or warmed through the direct or indirect consumption of coal or petroleum or their products, shall not be kept open on Sundays, nor before the hour of 8 o'clock in the morning or after 6 o'clock in the evening, on week days, except Saturday evenings when the hour of closing may be extended to 10 o'clock p. m.

Drug stores, news and confectionery stores shall not be affected by the provisions of this order nor shall stores heated through the exclusive use of wood.

The above went into effect November 1st and will remain in full force until March 31st 1916. Violations are subject to the penalties provided in the Act of Congress of the United States, known as the Lever Act, approved August 10.
