

BIG COMMUNITY PROGRAM SOON

Two Evenings and One Afternoon of Splendid Entertainment in December.

On Wednesday and Thursday, December 18 and 19, there will be staged in Binford, the first of a series of four entertainments to be offered by the Federated Community association, a state organization conceived and launched by North Dakota people. The purpose underlying the movement is the creation of a finer and more healthy community spirit, the absence of which, in many places, is a distinct handicap to community progress.

The entertainments, all double numbers, will be given by an entertainment company and a lecturer, the latter of whom will give short snappy talks on subjects of general community interest. In every case, however, the entertainment feature will be given special emphasis. The various companies, which rank among the best on the platform, have been selected because of their fitness for this kind of work.

A most unusual feature of this whole undertaking is the extremely low price of admission (ten and twenty-five cents). Nothing equaling these programs in quality has ever been offered before at less than fifty and seventy-five cents. These extraordinary prices have been made possible only by the contributions to the work made by the citizens of Binford.

The program for the first Community entertainment will be given by the Royal Male Quartette and Dr. Shaw.
