

COUNTY IS ASKED TO RAISE \$340,000

Chairman Greenland Is Optimistic Over the Prospects of Securing Our Quota in the Victory Loan Drive.

"The boys showed how they could fight; we will show how to pay."

That's the attitude Oscar Greenland, county chairman of the Liberty Loan committee, has regarding the drive which is scheduled to commence next Monday morning. Furthermore, he stated, "Binford will be prepared to announce at 12:01 a. m., April 21, that its quota has been subscribed."

At the time this is printed, the quota for the different townships and villages has not been arranged. The county's allotment is \$340,000—which is more than in any of the previous loans. Binford's share of this is likely to be about \$14,000.00. But this amount is not going to be difficult to raise, judging from the sentiment expressed by many.

Except for the appointment of the chairmanship in a few precincts, the county organization is complete and ready to "hit the trail" early Monday morning. Owing to the busy season on the farms, an effort will be made to finish the job in the towns first, in order to enable some of the solicitors to aid their co-workers in the country, who will be rushed with seeding operations.
