The celebration will mean a county-wide holiday, and every business house in every town will be expected to close up tight on that day and attend the celebration.

Everything on the grounds will be free to the soldiers, and arrangements are being made to give them a feed at the noon hour, or thereabouts. The feed will probably be under the direction of the ladies of the various Red Cross branches of the county.

Those who attend the celebration, however, should take their own lunch, as the feed is intended for soldiers and their wives and sweethearts only.

There will be no profit sharing schemes on the grounds, and all the money taken in by the committee will be used to defray the expenses of the celebration.

centrated in the hands of one official paper selected by the county commissioners at the beginning of the year under the old law, it can collect the usual rates for such service until the term covered by appointment expir-

It is anticipated that the attorney general's ruling will be found applicable also to official city newspapers which have been designated by the municipal commission or council for a period of a year. In a majority of cases the official newspaper is elected at the first meeting following the reorganization of the city commission or council and under the attorney general's ruling the league would not be in position to make its organs official city newspapers until next June. The Brinton bill requires municipalities to publish all proceedings in the official county newspaper providing such newspaper is published within the municipality. But the city newspapers having been selected in the same manner as the official county newspapers, have the same form of contract and it is believed that under the opinion of the attorney general this contract will be held inviolable.

The new state printing and publication commission will meet and organize immediately after July 26, when senate bill 157 becomes effective. It is reported at the capitol that John N. Hagen, commissioner of agriculture and labor, is a candidate for the presidency of the board. Its other members are S. J. Aandahl chairman of the state railway commission, and Secretary of State Hall.
