

THE UNITED WAR WORK CAMPAIGN

**Griggs County Will Be Asked to
Contribute \$21,000.00 - Loosen
Up With a Smile.**

A campaign is being started in the County this week to raise money for the seven organizations which, besides the Red Cross, are caring for our soldiers. In the interest of economy and better service these seven societies, namely, the Young Men's Christian Association, Young Women's Christian Association, the National Catholic War Council, (the Knights of Columbus) Jewish Welfare Board, the War Camp Community Service, the American Library Association, and the Salvation Army have so organized their efforts that there is no duplication or overlapping of work and they are uniting in making a single appeal to the American people for the necessary funds to keep going.

The original sum fixed to be raised was \$170,500,000, but the coming of peace and the opening up of new territory for the occupation of the allied armies has made it necessary to increase that amount by 50 per cent. Griggs County's allotment was originally \$13,600 and is now raised to \$21,000. This seems like a large amount of money to raise, but the need is tremendous and urgent; freedom has been saved to the world at a cost of some ten millions of lives; the last call of its kind; and surely we shall not be slackers now that victory has been won for us by our boys. We owe them all this and more.

Some of our neighboring counties have already gone over the top in this drive. The solicitors will know pretty near what is the fair amount for each one to subscribe. I am sure that all will respond nobly in the same spirit that our boys have offered their lives.
