**Income Tax Form for Farmers is
Complicated Blank Below

The matter of making up returns for the new war tax is a much complicated affair for anyone but that applied to the farmers is more than complicated. From information we are able to gather it will be almost impossible for anyone but an expert to make up a return in proper form.

Collector James Coffey states in a letter that every single person with a net income of \$1000 and every married person or head of a family with a net income of \$2000 is required to make a return. A married man having an income of \$2,500 with two children under 18 years of age will pay on \$100. The tax is two per cent and graduated according to the income of the individual.
