

Cattle Rustler Arrested

Wimbledon News: Charged with stealing and selling ten head of cattle belonging to a neighbor, Elmer Hanson is in the custody of the hearing in court.

The young man is about 24 years of age and is the son of Christ Hanson residing in Dover township. On the night of July 9, it is alleged, he entered the pasture of Erick Hier, dahl, a neighbor, and drove out ten yearling steers which he fetched to Wimbledon and sold to the local butcher, O. T. Gronvold, at noon the following day. The young man stated to Mr. Gronvold that his father had sent him to town to market the cattle. The herd brought \$332 and Mr. Gronvold made the check payable to Christ Hanson, who according to the young man's statement, was the owner of the cattle. Young Hanson took the check to the Merchants National bank, endorsed with his father's name and explained that the check should have been made payable to him instead of the father. The check was cashed.

Young Hanson later went to the Fried company and purchased a new Ford car, trading in his old car. He paid only a part of his cash for the car and the balance he kept to "live on" and buy present for his sweet-
