

A Letter From Peter P. Idsvoog.

Los Angeles, Cal.,

Nov. 15, 1919.

Dear Sir:

As I am now enjoying the fine sunshine of Los Angeles, I will send you a few words and ask you to send your valuable Nonpartisan paper to me here, so I can see how you are getting along in Binford.

I had a fine trip all the way out here and I will say that the Dodge car did well. It never refused to climb any hill or turn a curve when it was mostly needed. Had good roads most of the way, and except for a half day's rain in Missouri, it was dry, but some places stony and rough.

It was 2820 miles from Coopers-town to Los Angeles by the road I took, and I made it in 24 days, using 140 gallons of gasoline. Stopped at several places along the way, and took a trip by rail up to the Grand Canyon of Arizona, as the road was too rough to drive up there.

Hoping these lines will find yourself and all in Binford in the best of health and spirits, I am
