

PAINTING BEE AT McHENRY

**Front of Tribune Office is Daubed up
With Coat of Yellow
Paint.**

Editor Schley, of the McHenry Tribune, seems to have gotten in bad with some of the people of that community, the result of which was shown Monday morning by a coat of yellow paint applied, not too artistically, to the front of his office.

From reports which have reached The Times, Schley's attitude concerning the address of a crippled Canadian soldier, who spoke at McHenry, a week ago last Sunday, is responsible for the painting fest. Exception was taken to the reading notice advertising the lecture; in which Editor Schley used the following words: "A Canadian soldier will give a lecture at the village hall relative to his **PURPORTED** experience during a nine months retention in German prison camps."

This, with his absence from the meeting and failure to make mention of the address in his next issue, and remarks which he is reported to have made, proved too much for those who have implicit confidence in the Canadian soldier's recital of German frightfulness.
