

NOLAN HELD TO DISTRICT COURT

FIRST DEGREE MURDER WAS CHARGE MADE AGAINST DETECTIVE

F. W. Nolan, Great Northern detective, held for the shooting of Joseph Bagley, I. W. W., at Hannaford and who died in a Fargo hospital from the wound inflicted, was formally charged with murder in the first degree on being arraigned last Friday before Nels P. Nelson, justice of the peace.

Nolan, about 35 years of age, and whose home is in St. Paul where his mother lives, waived preliminary examination and was held to the Griggs county term of the district court which will set some time next month. C. J. Murphy of Grand Forks is the attorney for Nolan.

Following the shooting, Nolan was held on a charge of assault with intent to kill, which charge was dismissed by John Sad, state's attorney, and the new charge preferred after the coroner's jury at Fargo had held that Bagley came to his death from a wound inflicted by Nolan.
