

Ford Carried North Dakota.

Henry Ford carried North Dakota by an overwhelming majority in 1919. That is, in the number of motor cars and trucks in the state.

Out of 91,571 motor cars registered with the motor vehicle registration department last year, 42,081, or a trifle over 51 per cent, were Fords. In trucks the Fords led again, with 757 out of a total of 1,314. Here the ratio was about 54 per cent.

In pleasure cars the companies having over 1,000 cars in North Dakota are Overland, 8844; Dodge 4475; Buick 4175; Chevrolet, 3483; Maxwell, 3414; Studebaker, 2845; Oakland, 1393.

In trucks the nearest competitor of the Ford is the International with 179 machines. Republic is next with 67, Maxwell with 38, Nash 26, Dodge 28, Oldsmobile 23, Overland 23, General Motors 18, and White 12. All others are below 10 in number.
