

Nonpartisans Buy Sentinel-Courier.

Sentinel-Courier: A deal was consummated early this week between the Griggs County Farmers Press, a newly organized corporation composed of Nonpartisan league farmers, and the Sentinel Courier, whereby this paper has been purchased by the farmers organization, the transfer of property to take effect September 1.

The Nonpartisan League is organizing newspapers in every county in the state and it is understood that with the completion of the deal at Cooperstown the organized farmers now have a co-operatively owned newspaper in every county seat in North Dakota.

Stock in the newspaper corporation is now being sold in Griggs county and reports from the salesmen indicate that practically all the league members in Griggs county are taking out liberal subscriptions. D. E. Sherper and Sam Altowitz are canvassing the county and report that farmers are enthusiastic over the project. They expect to have several hundred stockholders in the Griggs County Sentinel-Courier.

John C. Moe, a well known and highly respected farmer who lives northeast of Cooperstown, is president of the Griggs County Farmers Press company; Albert Retzlaff, a prosperous farmer residing west of town, is vice-president; and Casper Overby, a farmer of Romness township is secretary and treasurer of the new company.

Walter W. Liggett of Fargo, general manager of the Publishers National Service Bureau, the Nonpartisan League concern that is arranging the deal, was in Cooperstown early in the week with P. L. Aarhus, arranging the details of the purchase and stock selling.
