

Y. W. C. A. Campaign For 1919.

The quota for the state was \$7000 of which \$75 was Griggs County's share. The campaign was begun last week with Captains appointed who in turn appointed Squad Lieutenants to help make the canvass. Because of the short time allotted in which to complete the drive, the unfavorable condition of the roads and weather, only the towns were canvassed. The instructions from headquarters were to distribute the subscriptions among as many as possible.

This making a total of \$150.58, double the quota for the county. Because of the absence of the Walum Captain, their canvass was not made until the matter was reported to Mr. Iverson a half hour before train time the last day of the drive. Mr. Iverson responded with Walum's record for action maintained and forwarded their quota that day.
