STRONG APPEAL FOR NURSES

Capt. Frank Edwards Makes an Eloquent Appeal for Girls to Enlist as Student Nurse.

Bismarck, Aug. 28.—Capt. Frank Edwards made a most eloquent appeal for student nurses for the United States army student nurse reserve in his talk at the Auditorium last evening. He told of the magnificent service the English women have given, working in hospitals and munition factories, doing the most arduous and uninteresting kinds of work. He said the women who had thus volunteered to help their country in her hour of peril were the daughters of Great Britain's most respected families. They were girls who came from sheltered and beautiful homes. They work long hours and their work is devoid of excitement or spectacular effect. He says that because of this service and sacrifice the men of England have been able to "hold the line." He appeals to the women of North Dakota to respond in like manner to this call of the government for the nursing service.

Rev. Buzelle told of the sacrifice the boys are making in giving up their school work to go with the army. He says they can finish that when the war is over. He says that parents must encourage their girls to do likewise.

Up to this time only four girls in Griggs county have applied for admission as student nurses. One of them Miss Sorenson, has withdrawn her application, which leaves only three. Hannaford has supplied two nurses aids.

Miss Tillie Eastwold, Miss Mary Frigaard and Miss Skjelset are those who have enlisted in the nurse reserve, and in doing so they have displayed the same patriotic spirit which prompts the boys to noble deeds.

Griggs county's quots of student nurses is four. Over in Steele with the same quots, more than 30 have registered.

The country is calling to the girls of Griggs county to do their part in the great conflict. Are the Griggs county girls slackers? Will they fall to respond?
