

PIONEER WOMAN PASSES ON TO HER REWARD

Another name is stricken from the ever lessening roll of our old settlers in the passing of Mrs. Lisbet Amundson, of Lenora township, at the ripe old age of 85 years, nine months and two days. Mrs. Amundson was taken ill about five years ago when she suffered two strokes of paralysis, from which she has been helpless since.

Lisbet Anderson was born in Hamar, Norway, on January 7, 1838. She was united in marriage to Erick Amundson, and some years later emigrated to America in 1881 and homesteaded in Kingsburg county, near Sioux Falls, South Dakota. In 1886 the family moved to Griggs county and settled on a farm in Lenora township.

Seven children were born to this union, four of whom are living. Three daughters are deceased, and Mr. Amundson passed away in Feb. 1902. Those living to mourn the death of their aged mother are August and Ludvig, of Binford, Emil and Mrs. H. H. Kolcen, of near Aneta.

Funeral services are being held today (Thursday) from the Ottawa church at 2 o'clock.
