PASSES AWAY

Mayville (Wis.) News: The angel death entered the happy home of the John Ebentier family last Wednesday evening at 11:40 p. m., and took as his victim the wife and mother. Her sufferings were great and of long duration, yet she bore them with true christian fortitude, knowing that eternal award awaited her in eternity.

Mrs. John Ebentier, nee Mathilda Wild, was born in town LeRoy on February 14, 1872, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Wild, early settlers of this county. She spent her girlhood there until her marriage to John Ebentier January 28, 1890, when the young couple left for the then thinly settled North Dakota, where they settled on a large farm. There they resided until six years ago when they retired from active farming and moved to this city and purchased their pretty home on Grove street.

Four children were born to them: Mrs. A. H. Retzlaff of Sheboygan Falls, Miss Ursula and Irvin at home and Arthur at Grace City, N. Dak. Besides these and her sorrowing husband, she is also survived by four sisters, Mrs. John Urban and Mrs. John Youngbeck, of Sutton, N. D., Mrs. Leland Rhodes of Cooperstown, and Mrs. John May of Stanley, Wis.

For the past three years she has been suffering with hardening of the arteries and high blood pressure and altho receiving the tenderest care she closed her eyes in eternal slumber, surrounded by her dear ones Wednesday evening shortly before midnight. She was an active member of the Ladies Sodality of St. Mary's church and of the Womens Relief Corps.

Funeral services were held Saturday morning from the late home with requiem services at St. Mary's Catholic church at 10 o'clock and she was laid to rest in the new parish cemetery, the Rev. Kramer officiating.
