

MRS. OLE ELLEFSON MEETS DEATH IN AUTO ACCIDENT

Aneta - Panorama: Another sad affair occurred this week when on Wednesday afternoon at about 4 o'clock, the Ford car, owned and driven by Alfred Rusten tipped over, pinning its occupants under the car and instantly killing Mrs. Ole Ellefson, who was riding in the rear-seat.

As near as we can learn, the party, consisting of Mr. and Mrs. Ole Ellefson and Alfred Rusten, owner and driver of the car, was coming east near the ten miles southwest of Aneta, when, in cramping his car too sharply in order to avoid going into the ditch, one of the right hand wheels broke and caused the tipover.

After extricating himself from the wreckage, Mr. Rusten secured help from the Peter Gunderson farm and after righting the car, found Mrs. Ellefson had met her death instantly by the dislocation of her neck. The dead woman was brought to the Peter Gunderson farm and Dr. C. E. Bennett was called, who could only examine and proclaim her dead.

Mr. Ellefson, it is reported, suffered only minor injuries to his arm.

The car received a broken wheel, smashed windshield and frame and steering wheel.

Mrs. Carrie Ellefson, who was 37 years old, came to Aneta with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. E. Nelson, while only a young girl and grew to womanhood here. She was twice married and two children by her former marriage, Grace and Elliot Gilbertson, together with her husband, Ole Ellefson, to whom she was married about two years ago, her aged mother, three sisters and three brothers, remain to mourn her sad and tragic demise.
