

MILITARY FUNERAL FOR BINFORD WARRIOR SUNDAY

The remains of Hans Hogle, Binford soldier boy, arrived here last Saturday from Hoboken, N. J., under escort of Private Wayne Fields, of the regular army. The local post of the American Legion took charge of the body upon arrival.

Next Sunday afternoon, at two o'clock, military services for the former service man will be held in Binford. Weather permitting, the services will be held on the indoor base ball park in south Binford, and will be carried out under military rules. Interment will be made in the cemetery west of town.

Rev. Thomas Skjel, of Aneta, will

preach in Norwegian, and Chaplain O'Neill of the Cooperstown American Legion post, will conduct the service of the American Legion. The local post will be assisted by members of Coopertown and McHenry.

All ex-service men are requested to appear in uniform.

Hans Hogle was born in Fillmore county, Minnesota, March 9, 1896. He entered the service in May, 1918, and was sent to Camp Dodge and later to Camp Mills and then overseas. He was attached to Co. I, 140 Inf., 35 Div., and was killed in action on Sept. 28, 1918.
