

MRS. HARRY HUSEL DEAD

Sentinel-Occurder: Mrs. Harry Husel, born in Griggs county and practically all her life a resident of this county, passed away Monday morning at about 8 o'clock at her home in Samborn, not many hours after giving birth to twin boys. Announcement of the death in this community brought a tremendous shock to all who knew the Husel family, for up until only about four months ago they had been five-long residents of this community.

The remains were brought to Coopers town Tuesday and taken to the home of Mrs. Husel's father, E. Michels, from where funeral services will be held this afternoon.

The death of Mrs. Husel, who was formerly Martha Michels, brings sadness to many hearts,—a sadness accompanied by the deepest sympathy for the husband and five children, who are left motherless. The children are: Myrtle, aged 11, Clarence 8, Blanche 7, and the twin boys born early Monday morning. The two infants are said to be doing very nicely.

Martha Michels was born August 29, 1883, being forty years of age at the time of her death. She was the youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Michels and was born in Ball Hill township, where she grew to womanhood and attended school.

At the home of her parents on November 6, 1912, she was united in marriage to Harry Husel. For four years they resided on a farm south of Binford, and for a like period they resided on a farm southwest of Coopers town. Up until last June they were residents of this community. At that time they removed to Samborn where they had comfortably established themselves in a nice home. The death of Mrs. Husel on Monday brought to a close a life which seems ought to have been spared, for this is just the stage when a mother's care is most sincerely needed. Yet the will of the Maker is not to be disputed and each step in life must be accepted as for the best.

In addition to the husband and five children who survive, the deceased leaves her father, three sisters and three brothers. The brothers and sisters are: Mrs. Wm. Trost of Jessie, Mrs. Luther Raleigh of David-son Park, Holman, Ernest, Paul and Mrs. Geo. Stevens, all of Coopers town. Her mother passed away eight years ago and one sister preceded her in death.

All members of the family are here for the funeral excepting the sister in Canada and the father of the departed one, who is detained at Belkfield, this state, by business interests which he has there.
