

MRS. N. J. JACOBS DEAD

Mrs. Nicholas J. Jacobs passed away peacefully Tuesday evening, at the home of her son, John Jacobs, following an illness of two weeks. She had been confined to her bed since Monday, Feb. 6, pneumonia being the cause of her death.

Dorothy Poster was born in Kenosha, Wisconsin, on January 6, 1858, having reached the age of 64 years. On September 29, 1876, she married Nicholas Jacobs at Waseca, Minn. To this union five children were born, who survive her. From Waseca they moved to Chaffee in 1900, then to Coopersdown in 1905, where they operated the Gimblett farm until 1917, when they came to Binford. Since last fall Mr. and Mrs. Jacobs have made their home with their son, John, and family.

The children who mourn the loss of their mother are, Mrs. Mary Cronk-hite, of Stuart, Iowa; John and George, of Binford, Mrs. Dorothy Lathrop, of Minneapolis, and Mrs. Elizabeth Abel, of Fargo. All the children are here but Mrs. Cronk-hite, who was unable to come.

Besides the children, three sisters and one brother survive. They are, Mrs. J. B. Coyle, of Detroit, Minn., Mrs. J. H. Carr, of Minneapolis, Mrs. Albert Smith, of Red Wing, Minn., and John Poster, of Waseca, Minn.

At this writing no arrangements have been made as to the time of the funeral on account of the storm raging that has tied up traffic. As soon as the weather moderates the funeral will be held from the Catholic church at Jessie.
