
FORMER RESIDENT KILLED AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENT

Roy Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. F. M. Johnson, of Hunter, who formerly lived on the Lucht farm, southwest of Binford, was killed in an automobile accident near Arthur, last Saturday forenoon.

Two companions were badly injured. The Dodge touring car in which they were riding at a fast rate of speed turned over and crushed them beneath it. A broken steering wheel is believed to have caused the wreck.

Johnson died about 12 noon, an hour and a half after the accident. The other men were taken to the farm home of F. M. Johnson, where they have been working and are expected to recover. Johnson's chest was badly crushed, the steering wheel evidently having fallen on him. The car was on top of Johnson when help arrived and was badly smashed by the accident.

The men had driven to Hunter for some repairs and were in a hurry to return to the Johnson farm, they told the attending physician. They said Johnson was driving about 40 miles an hour when the accident happened.
