

## SON OF JOHN LEE

### KILLED BY LIGHTNING

Aneta Pancrama: Last Saturday afternoon at about 4 o'clock, during an electrical storm Olger Lee, the 13-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John G. Lee, residing on a farm near the Cheyenne river about seven miles west of town, was struck by lightning and instantly killed, while his brother, Robert, 11 years old, who was also struck and rendered unconscious, was taken to the McVille hospital for treatment, from which place he returned home the next day completely recovered.

It seems the boys, who had brought afternoon lunch to their father, who was cutting grain, stopped for a short time to do some shocking, when the bolt, which caused the death of the young boy, suddenly struck, killing him instantly and setting his clothes on fire. The father, not seeing the boys but noticing the smoke ran over to find out what caused it and found his two sons, one already dead and on fire and the other just losing consciousness. After quenching the fire of the burning clothes on the older boy, the father attended the younger son and soon had him on his way to the hospital where he quickly recovered.

Funeral service for the deceased was held at the Norway church on Monday, Rev. H. O. Bach officiating.
