DEATH FROM WINDOW

of Cooperstown, fell to his death on the morning of August 2, from the nineteenth floor of a hotel in Chicago. He suffered a fracture of the skull which caused his death a few moments after his body was found dying on the roof of an adjoining building 10 floors below by another guest at the hotel.

I. Sommerman of Brooklyn, N. Y.,
a guest in another room, saw the
pajama-clad body of Mr. Nye hurtle
past his window and land on the roof
below. He called B. J. Bowman, the
manager of the hotel, who summoned the police. Mr. Nye was dead by
the time a physician reached his side.
According to reports, pillows on the
window ledge of Nye's room indicate
that he was sleeping on the broad sill
and rolled out.

apolis until a year ago. He was a brother of former Mayor Wallace G.

Nye and has two sons residing in the city, C. I. Nye and P. O. Nye.

Mr. Nye came to Minneapolis in August, 1920, and with his brother and F. E. Coughlin established The No. hsider, a North side neighbortood weekly. He was the editor of the paper until he moved to Janesville, Wisconsin, in May, 1922.

He has a son at Cooperstown and another at Hortonville, Wis, and a daughter at Charter Oak, Iowa.
