After an interval of two weeks, death has again visited the home of Frederick Olson, near Red Willow lake, this time Mr. Olson, the last member of a family of four, being called to his eternal rest. Mrs. Olson passed away on May 21st, and two children, a boy and a girl, are some years deceased. Frederick Olson was born in Lillehammar, Norway, in May 1850, and was 74 years of age at the time of his death on June 5th, 1924. He came to America in 1874 and lived near Pelican Rapids, Minnesota, for several years before coming to Griggs county. In 1903 he filed on the homestead near Red Willow lake where the family has since made their home. Mr. Olson has been poorly for some time, and with the additional care and worry during Mrs. Olson's illness, he continued failing. On Wednesday he went to the home of his neighbor, Chas. Rix, and asked Mrs. Rix to bake him a cake. That day he came to town with Mr. Rix, and upon their return home, he was invited to stay. During the night he became ill and next day the doctor was called. But Mr. Olson passed away after being ill 24 hours. Brights Disease and leakage of the heart were the causes of death. Funeral services were held from the Bethlehem church in Willow, Saturday afternoon, Rev. L. M. Halling officiating as pastor.
