

DOCTOR WINSLOE DIED AT HIS HOME IN COOPERSTOWN

WELL KNOWN VETERINARY AND
AUCTIONEER PASSED AWAY
AT TWO O'CLOCK TUESDAY
MORNING

Word was received in Binford on Tuesday morning of the death of Dr. J. A. H. Winsloe, of Cooperstown, death occurring at two o'clock that morning.

This news came as a great shock to people everywhere in this section of the state, as it can be truthfully said that no man enjoyed a wider acquaintance than did Doc. Winsloe, and no man possessed a more genuine friendship among his acquaintances. His departure means a distinct loss to the community.

He had been in poor health for a number of years, suffering from diabetes, and this, coupled with carbuncles, was the cause of his death.

"Doc," as he was affectionately called by all who knew him, was one of the splendid men of Cooperstown. A benevolent character, with a word of cheer to all, his presence will be sorely missed. His passing away will leave an aching void which time alone can fill.

Funeral arrangements are not complete at this writing. It is to be held at the Masonic Temple in Cooperstown, but the time is not definitely known, owing to the long distance his mother and brother must travel in order to be present.
