

# GLENFIELD TAKES INITIAL GAME OF SERIES--SCORE 9-4

## LOCAL TEAM PLAYS MISERABLE BASE BALL IN FIRST CLASH AGAINST THE GLENFIELD AGGREGATION

Eight errors were responsible for Binford's defeat in their first clash of the season with the Glenfield ball club, at Glenfield, last Sunday, by a 9-4 count. Five out of the eight errors were bunched in the fourth inning and coupled with one hit gave the opposing team five runs in that game. Of the nine runs for Glenfield, two were earned, and three of Binford's runs were earned. Had errorless ball been played Binford would have won—but what's the use of lamenting or cooking up alibis. Glenfield scored in the first inning. Johnson, first up, hit for two bases, but reached three on the hit when Alm dropped the ball on the throw to that base. Heaney and Reed were easy outs. Johnson scored on Koenig's hit. Koenig was caught at second on the play.

Another run was marked up in the second by Glenfield. Gipson hit safe, Fredrickson advanced the runner to third with a safe one. Kennedy struck out. Alm erred on Kennedy's roller, permitting Gipson to score.

Then came the fatal fourth. Koenig, first up, hit for two bases. Errors followed on the next four men. Then two put-outs, and another error, and the third out. Result—five runs.

Two more were counted in the seventh on hits by Heaney, Reed and Fredrickson.

Binford scored once in the fourth. Olson got on thru Reed's error, and took third on Peterson's hit, and scored on Doc Ringlee's fielder's choice. Three runs were chalked up for the locals in the eighth, on hits by Olson, Peterson, Olstad and A. Ringlee.

The score sheet shows six hits for Binford and nine for Glenfield. Gipson struck out 10 and Olson and Olstad four. Eight errors by Binford, and three for Glenfield.

Other Sunday games resulted in the defeat of Cooperstown by Hannaford, score 11-2. McHenry gives Grace City terrible drubbing—11 to 2.
