

LOCALS BREAK EVEN IN TWO GOOD GAMES

**SUTTON BEATEN IN 3-1 CONTEST
—ANETA-SHARON TAKES SEC-
OND GAME FROM BINFORD
THIS SEASON—SCORE 6-1**

Binford broke even in the two ball games played since our last issue.

Friday evening, Sutton was handed another defeat by a 3-1 score, and on Tuesday, the Aneta-Sharon team trimmed the locals on the Sharon grounds to the tune of 6 to 1. Kingsley pitched both games for Binford.

The Sutton game was a seven-inning affair, and Kingsley did a good job of keeping the Sutton batters off the bases. He allowed only two hits, both of which were two-baggers, by Kucheman and Melgard.

Sutton scored their lone tally in the fourth inning. After Fallen was retired, Melgard hit for two bases and advanced to third on Meinke's fly to right, and scored on Ehler's error of McAdam's roller

Meinke, Sutton pitcher, was in bad in practically every inning. He was touched for eight safeties, and those coupled with his own wildness netted Binford three runs.

In the Aneta-Sharon game, the locals jumped on Swanman, for two extra base hits in the first inning for one run, and from all appearances, the contest looked like a victory for Binford, but Swanman tightened up and though our boys connected for seven hits during the fracas, it was impossible to push over any more runs.

Aneta-Sharon was held runless until the fifth frame, when an error and two hits netted them two scores. Three more were added in the seventh. Lantz was given first on an error. Halliday, who was having a regular holiday at bat, picked one out and sent it over center and onto the railroad tracks for a home run. Goff was passed, stole second, and scored on an error. Ellingson scored the sixth run in the eighth. He hit for three bases and tallied on Halliday's two-bagger.
