

I. V. A. MEETING

There was a meeting of members of the local unit of the I. V. A. held in Binford last Saturday, at which D. A. Goplin was elected chairman and C. E. Peterson, secretary-treasurer, and C. E. Peterson was appointed a delegate to go to the state convention at Bismarck, Feb. 11. D. A. Goplin was selected as alternate.

Preparations are being made for the special state meeting of the Independent Voters Association to be held in Bismarck next Friday. The meeting will consist of the state executive committee and delegates from the various units of the association. The following day Lincoln's birthday, a celebration will be staged in honor of the men who are still living who were members of the North Dakota constitutional convention, as well as the members of the 1917 legislature who opposed the notorious house bill 44.

The meeting of the I. V. A. will have to do with the campaign plans for the 1921 and 1922 campaign period. The association's regular biennial meeting at which the election of the committee men and officers take place is held in even numbered years and therefore will not be held until the winter of 1922.

The celebration in honor of the makers and defenders of the constitution will be given in the form of a program of speeches and appropriate music in the Bismarck auditorium on the afternoon of February 12th, and a banquet in the Grand Pacific hotel in the evening of the same day. All who are interested may take part. The celebration in the auditorium is free; banquet tickets cost \$1.00 per plate. Applications may be sent to the Grand Pacific hotel at Bismarck until noon, February 10th.
